1. No device or structure shall be used from or out of 1. No device or structure shall be used from or out of which native game may be taken or killed on or near Lake Ellesmere, in the Canterbury Acclimatisation District, except a cylinder not exceeding 2ft. 6 in. in length and open at both ends, or a hut made of scrub or rushes, or a mudhole, or a mimi. No such device or structure shall be placed, put, set out, erected, planted, or used in any part of the said lake in which the water is more than 24 in. in depth: Provided that boats concealed or hidden in the vegetation growing along the margin of the said lake may be used, but growing along the margin of the said lake may be used, but such boats shall not be dressed or covered in any way: Provided also that boats not dressed or covered in any way may be used to recover native game previously shot.

2. No live birds of any species shall be used as decoys on

or near the said lake.

3. No person or persons shall put or place more than twenty-five decoys on any area of less than one hundred

yards square in or upon the said lake.

4. No person shall take or kill more than 150 head of native game in any one season within the Canterbury Acclimatisation District.

4. No doe or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorising any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

6. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section one hundred and forty-one of "The Land Act, 1908" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the regulations dated the four-teenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eight, under section seventy-two of "The Land Laws Amendment Act, 1907," and do hereby declare that the following shall be the terms and conditions under which land set apart in aid of the establishment of the wood-pulp industry for paper-making may be leased and occupied, and declare that such revocation and the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the day of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette: land Gazette:-

REGULATIONS.

- 1. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the con-
- in which is situated the land set apart under section 141 of the said Act.

 2. The total area selected by the applicant shall be subdivided by the Board, at the expense of the lessee, into blocks, not exceeding 1,000 acres each, and the lessee shall have the right to select the particular block he desires to utilise first, the remaining blocks being retained as reserves for future utilisation; but no person shall be granted a lease or leases over more than 30,000 acres of such land in the aggregate, including in such computation all reserved areas.

 3. On compliance with the necessary conditions the lessee shall be entitled to a lease of the block he desires to utilise.

 4. Every such lease shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in Form No. 1 in the Schedule to these regulations.

 5. No lease shall be for a period exceeding twenty-one years, nor shall any lease contain a right of renewal.

 6. The lessee shall have no right to cut on any of the reserved blocks until he shall have systematically cut out and used to the satisfaction of the Board all timber on the area first selected.

All such blocks that have been cut out and used by the lessee to the satisfaction of the Board shall become reserves for future utilisation under these regulations so soon as the lessee is permitted by the Board to occupy and use any reserved block in lieu thereof for immediate utilisation, and has been granted a lease of such reserved block.

Not more than one block in any area leased under these regulations shall be used or occupied by the same person or company at the same time for the purpose of cutting or utilising any of the timber thereon, and all timber on each block shall be systematically cut out and used to the satisfaction of the Board before any timber is cut or utilised on another block.

 9. Water-rights may, however, be granted at the same time over more than one block in any area so leased to the

The lessee shall have the right to cut timber for the making of wood-pulp only, or for the erection of buildings, fences, water-races, &c., necessary for the proper working and utilisation of the wood-pulp industry, and for domestic purposes, but shall have no right to cut or remove for any other purpose, or to sell, any timber except in the form of wood-pulp.

- 12. The lessee shall, within one year from the date of his lease, commence the erection of the machinery required in connection with the establishment and working of the woodpulp industry, and failure to do so shall entail forfeiture of his lease.

The property leased shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by any person duly authorised or appointed by the Commissioner; and the lessee shall give to the person making such inspection all such information and assistance as may be required to enable a full report to be given to the Commissioner or Board, as the case may be.

- 18. The lessee shall keep a book or books in which he shall record each day the number of cords of timber cut and the amount of wood-pulp manufactured, and such book or books shall at all times be available for inspection by the Commissioner or officer appointed by him.

If the lessee fails to keep the plant working continuously, or to work and use the timber on the land leased by him in a manner satisfactory to the Board, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Board, cancel the lease after not less than three months' notice to the lessee of the intention to do so

On application to the Warden (if the land is situated within a mining district) or to the Commissioner (if the land is outside a mining district) the lessee may be granted the right to utilise the water-power of any stream within the total area leased, with or without payment of rent therefor, for any term not exceeding the unexpired balance of the term of his lease.

8. If the lessee fails to keep the plant working continuously, or to work and use the timber on the land leased by him in a manner satisfactory to the Board, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Land Board, after not less than three months' notice, cancel the lease.

EARTHQUAKE SEAMANSHIP.

EARTHQUAKE SEAMANSHIP.

On Monday morning, 26th December, between 5 and 6 o'clock, all Italy was shaken by severe earthquakes. The seismic disturbance was most violent in Calabria and Sicily, and the great loss of life and destruction of property which occurred were accompanied by marine disasters caused by seismic sea-waves. According to the descriptions that have been given, after the earthquake the sea at first receded for some distance from the shores of Calabria and Eastern Sicily, and then a great wave 32 ft. high advanced upon the shore with appalling power and destructiveness. This is the stream! shore with appalling power and destructiveness. This is the usual march of events in connection with far the greatest number and most dangerous kind of seismic sea-waves, and hence it is important that the attention of mariners should be drawn to such characteristics of the phenomena as will lead to the taking of adequate precautions against their

effects.
Great multitudes of people live in cities by the sea and are subjected to the dangers arising from seismic sea-waves, and yet, if a place of refuge exists, they usually have ample time to escape; and even the ships in the harbour will generally be safe if they promptly put to sea on the first sign, after the earthquake, of the withdrawal of the water, which always indicates that the sea-bottom has sunk. Thus by the study of the lews of the physical world and the diffusion the study of the laws of the physical world and the diffusion of the resulting useful knowledge a great measure of safety may be secured from some of the most dreadful forces in nature, and in the course of time the interests of civilisation may be enormously conserved.

Aristotle correctly associated scismic sea-waves with earthquakes; and even Homer assigned these great disturbances of the sea to Poseidon's trident, which was also the means employed for raising up islands from the bottom. The withdrawal of the water from the shore after an earthquake and its return as a great wave was familiar to Aristotle, and is implied in his description of the pathetic calamity of the destruction of Helike in 373 B C., which was due to the subsidence of a portion of the sea-bottom in the Gulf of Corinth. There are two general classes of seismic sea-waves. The first is due to the sinking of the sea-bottom, and is characterized by a withdrawal of the water after the earthquake, to be followed later by the return of a great wave; and the second is due to the uplift of the bottom, and is characterized by the sudden rise of the sea without any previous with-

second is due to the uplift of the bottom, and is characterized by the sudden rise of the sea without any previous withdrawal from the shore. Most of the historical inundations of the sea have been due to waves of the first class. The phenomena usually noted are: First, an earthquake; second, after a short interval, the sea is noticed to be draining away, laying bare the bottom where it is ordinarily deep enough for ships to anchor; third, after an interval of an hour or so, the sea is seen to be returning as a mighty wave, washing everything before it, and thus carrying ships shoreward and stranding them; fourth, having once swept the shore, the sea again withdraws and lays bare the harbour as before, and after about the same interval again returns as a second great wave. This periodic movement of the sea may be kept up for quite a while, and sometimes quiet is not restored for a day or two. Among the well-known historical sea-waves of the first class which might be mentioned we shall cite only a few typical cases—as that which overwhelmed Helike in 373 B.C.; the waves of Callao in 1724 and 1746; the wave of Arica in 1868 and Lucious is in 1724 and 1746; the wave following the Lisbon earth-quake in 1755; the waves of Arica in 1868, and Iquique in nn 1724 and 1740, the wave following the Lisbon earthquake in 1755; the waves of Arica in 1868, and Iquique in
1877; the wave on the Japanese coast in 1896. In all these
cases the water first withdrew from the shore—not suddenly,
but slowly, as in the draining away of a tide, though somewhat more rapidly. This, of course, indicated that the
sea bottom had sunk, and the water was draining away to
fill up the depression in the level caused by the falling of
the bottom. When the currents meet at the centre an
elevation is produced by their mutual impact, and when
this collapses under gravity the first great wave comes
ashore. The elevation then subsides into a depression as at
first, and the currents again flow in and force up the level a
second time; and, with the second collapse, another wave is
sent ashore; and so the oscillation of the sea continues,
sometimes for a day or two, before it finally quiets down.

Seismic sea waves of the second class are produced by the
uplift of the sea bottom into ridges or submarine plateaus
and islands. In such cases the water rises suddenly without
previously withdrawing from the shore.

The most disastrous in its effects of any of the examples
of the first class is that which occurred in connection with

The most disastrous in its effects of any of the examples of the first class is that which occurred in connection with the Lisbon earthquake in 1755. The seismic disturbance to which this wave was due occurred under the sea off the coast of Portugal in latitude 30° north and longitude 11° west. The water drained out from the land to such an west. The water drained out from the land to such an extent that the bed of the River Tagus was left dry, and, half an hour after the most severe shocks were over, a series of waves 30 ft. to 60 ft. in height broke on the shore, and, sweeping over the land, caused the death of 100,000 persons and enormous destruction of property. These waves extended along the coast, engulfing the villages for several miles to the south and reaching as far as Morocco. The shock was felt at Oporto, Cadiz, Madrid, and Funchal, and waves were propagated throughout the Atlantic to the coasts of America. At Cadiz the wave rose to 60 ft., at Madeira to 12 ft., and the sea was so disturbed 120 miles west of St. Vincent that vessels were violently shaken and men standing on deck were thrown down.

on deck were thrown down.

The great earthquake of Lima, on 28th October, 1724, was marked by a withdrawal of the water from the coast, followed by a wave which is reported to have been 80 ft. high, and which swept over Callao. Twenty-three ships in the harbour were sunk, and four were carried far inland; and a similar course of events occurred after the earthquake of

On the coast of Chile in 1835, after the earthquake shock, the sea retired, and then returned in a series of three waves 20 ft. high, the reflex action of which swept everything towards the sea.

towards the sea.

After an earthquake on the coast of Peru and Chile in 1868, due to a submarine disturbance, large waves were generated which inundated the country for several miles inland, destroying several towns, and causing the death of 25,000 people. At Arica the U.S. [Name illegible] was carried to a position a quarter of a mile inland, from which she was removed still further inland by a wave of inundation attending the great earthquake at Iquique in 1877. In connection with this latter disturbance, the water was withdrawn from the shore to the extent of about 70 yards, and the waves which afterwards devastated the coast are stated to have

been from 20 ft. to 80 ft. high. The effects were observable over almost the whole of the Pacific Ocean; in the Samoan Island the sea rose from 6 ft. to 8 ft.; in New Zealand and Australia the oscillations ranged in amplitude from 3 ft. to

20 ft.; and in Japan from 5 ft. to 10 ft.
On 15th June, 1896, a world shaking submarine earthquake occurred in Tuscarora Deep, the trough-like abyss in the bed of the ocean just eastward of Japan. After the characteristic withdrawal of the water, the coast was inundated over a length of 300 miles by waves said to reach to the height of 50 ft. A two-masted schooner was washed 500 yards inland. The destruction of life and property was very great. The disturbance was not felt by boats some dis-tance out at sea, and fishermen knew nothing of the disaster

that had occurred until their return to the coast.

The lesson to be impressed upon mariners in the light of these experiences is that the chances of safety to shipping are much increased by proceeding to sea, if practicable, immediately after the occurrence of an earthquake; and this is especially to be enjoined if the water of the harbour is found to be draining away after the shocks of earthquake have been felt. In the open ocean seismic sea-waves are not generally dangerous to vessels, because their very great length and moderate height gives them a gentle slope, and their period is very much longer than that of ordinary sea-waves.

By a study of the charts of deep-sea soundings throughout the world it can be told quite closely what the expected state of seismic activity of any given region should be, for wherever there are very deep oceanic troughs situated adjacent to mountainous ridges, culminating either above or below the surface of the ocean, disturbances of the crust of the earth are likely to be prevalent. In these regions the

the earth are likely to be prevalent. In these regions the forces of nature are, in fact, generally engaged in building up the ridges by forcing under them material pushed from beneath the undermined floor of the adjacent deepening

Although the Mediterranean Sea, the Azores, the West Indies, and the west coast of South America are districts of seismic activity, it is generally recognised by investigators that the most active regions of seismic disturbances are along the Aleutian, Kurile, and Japanese Islands, and in the East Indies. Major Dutton, U.S. Army, in his book entitled "Earthquakes in the Light of the New Seismonth of the Meditary manning the tempendous power of the mighty earthlogy," mentions the tremendous power of the mighty earthquakes in the Aleutian region, and also calls attention to the prevalence of seismic sea-waves following the earthquakes. In the Bakerian lecture to the Royal Society, 1906, Professor Milne treats of great earthquakes, and says that "the most active district is at present that of the East Indies."

After great earthquakes in the Aleutian region new islands are frequently raised from the sea, and several new volcances have broken out within historical time. Seismic sea-waves of the first class frequently follow, the water first withdrawing from the range of islands toward the trough to the south and then returning later as a great wave. This shows that the sea-bottom to the south sinks after the earthquakes by which the region is visited. As the islands and, quakes by which the region is visited. As the islands and, in fact, the whole mass of submarine mountains are uplifted by the disturbance and the sea-bottom afterwards sinks, it seems that lava is expelled from beneath the trough and pushed under the adjacent range. The bed of the sea then gives down to fill up the partial cavity from which the molten rock has been expelled.

METEOROLOGICAL SUMMARY FOR FEBRUARY, 1909.

EXCEPTING on the south-eastern coast of the North Island of New Zealand, the rainfall was everywhere much below the average, and the weather may be summed up as hot and dry. This, following upon two unseasonably damp and cold months, was not only generally agreeable, but also highly beneficial to the interests of the farmer and grazier, though it was said rain was much required in some parts.

During the greater part of the month anticylonic pressure held sway everywhere, and, though mild southerlies prevailed, the winds were generally light and variable. With such conditions land and sea breezes are usually experienced with day and night—from sea to land during the day, and from land to sea during the night—but Mr. T. R. Ryan, who resides at the Mountain House, Mount Egmont (3,140 ft. in altitude), remarked that the wind followed the sun around, which he regards as a sure sign of fine weather on the mountain.

The outstanding feature in a meteorological record was the storm in which the s.s. "Penguin" was unfortunately wrecked near Cape Terawhiti on Friday night, 12th February. A cyclonic disturbance of unusual magnitude made its appearance off East Cape, and impinged upon an anticyclonic area then developing over the South Island. A hard S.E. gale swept up the east coast and through Cook Strait, with thick weather as far as Taranaki. The mingling of the warm vapour-laden atmosphere of the cyclone with the cooler anticyclonic breezes caused the rain to come on as a thick mist, which developed into a continuous and cold rain, which was particularly heavy in the Hawke's Bay District. The following records show this intensity in points (100 = 1 in.):—

At Waituna West, near Feilding, Mr. J. Guylee remarked that "February was a beautiful summer month—in fact, the first summerlike one in the season. Rainfall very light; the grass, &c., kept green, although a change was noticeable. The creeks were drying up rapidly, probably owing to the drying winds earlier in the season preventing any soakage into the ground when the rainfall was heavier."

Mr. James Pearce, of Pahautanui, near Wellington, noticed that moss and slime in the streams had more appearance of growth than at any time in the previous summer.

At Otira, on the west coast of the South Island, Mr. T. E. White observed: "The weather during February has been settled and very hot. It has had its effect on the district, as most of the smaller streams are dry, and larger rivers are dry for considerable distances. As far as our records show it has been the driest month experienced here."

The weather was very hot and dry in Central Otago, only one light rainfall being experienced in most parts of that district.

At Bushy Park, near Palmerston South, Mrs. McKenzie noted on 1st March: "Fine harvest month. Most of the crops are down, though some fields are still standing. Stacks are appearing, and carting will soon be general."

Our Gore observer, Captain A. A. Scott, remarked: "A very fine month. Feed plentiful, and splendid harvest weather."
