IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1908," I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do by this notification prohibit for one year from the twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nine, the taking or killing of the paradise duck (*Casarca variegata*), a bird indigenous to the said Dominion of New Zealand: Provided, however, that the said bird may be taken or killed in the Otago Acclimatisation District and the Southland Acclimatisation District for a period of fourteen days from the first day of May until the fourteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nine, both days inclusive.

And provided further that the total number of the said paradise ducks which may be taken or killed in the said acclimatisation districts by any one person during the said period of fourteen days shall not exceed six birds.

Notice of Intention to change the Purpose of a Portion of a Reserve in the Wellington Land District.

WHEREAS by "The Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may declare his intention to change or alter the dedication of any public reserve now or hereafter vested in His Majesty or the Governor for any of the purposes named in Class II of the Second Schedule to the said Act, whether the same be granted or not; and if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to change the purpose of such reserve or any part thereof from the purpose or presumed purpose for which it was set apart to any other purpose, the Governor may, by notice gazetted, declare his intention to make such change, and in such notice declare the manner and terms in which the same is intended to be so made:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908," aforesaid, declare my intention to change the specific purpose of the portion of the reserve described in the second column of the Schedule hereto from that named in the first column of the said Schedule to that named in the third column of the said Schedule.

Amending Regulations for Adjustment of Compasses.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 201 of "The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908," that the Minister may from time to time make regulations for the adjustment of compasses, and the transmission of deviation tables, and the keeping and inspection of compass-error register-books:

And whereas regulations for the adjustment of compasses were made on the 14th day of March, 1906, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 15th day of the same month:

And whereas it is desirable to amend such regulations: Now, therefore, I, John Andrew Millar, Minister of Marine, do hereby make the following regulation amending the said regulations of the 14th day of March, 1906:—

REGULATION.

The standard compass of vessels not exceeding 50 tons register plying within the limits set forth in the Schedule hereto need not be placed on deck, but may be placed in some other suitable position, and the compass of such vessels need not be furnished with appliances for taking observations and bearings unless the master or owner is required by a Compass Inspector to furnish such appliances.

Amendments of Regulations under which Commissions in the British Army may be obtained by University Candidates.

IN the regulations under which commissions in the British Army may be obtained by university candidates, issued with Army Order 191 of 1907, and contained in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 13th February, 1908, the following amendments have been made by Army Order 312 of 1908, and are published for general information.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH COMMISSIONS IN THE ARMY MAY BE OBTAINED BY UNIVERSITY CANDIDATES, ISSUED WITH ARMY ORDER 191 OF 1907.—AMENDMENTS.

FOR paragraph 10 substitute—

10. In addition to the academic qualifications specified in paragraph 5, a candidate for nomination must present certificates of military qualifications, practical and theoretical.

In this connection—

(1.) He will be required during his residence at the university, in addition to undergoing the military instruction, which will form a part of the curriculum of his studies, to be an "efficient" member of the Senior Division, Officers' Training Corps (should there be a unit of that corps at the university to which he belongs), also to be attached to a Regular unit for a minimum period of six consecutive weeks, and to obtain a satisfactory certificate as to his proficiency (Appendix III).

- (a.) Under special circumstances, or in a case where there is no unit of the Officers' Training Corps at the university, a candidate will be required to be attached to a Regular unit for six consecutive weeks in each of two consecutive years, or twelve consecutive weeks in one year, and obtain satisfactory certificates as to his proficiency (Appendix III). Before such attachment a candidate will be required to have been instructed in squad drill, as laid down in Infantry Training, under arrangements made by the university to which he belongs.
- (b.) For a candidate who is an officer of the Special Reserve of Officers, the probationary period of training with a Regular unit will count as the equivalent of the attachment in (a), and such candidate will not be required to be a member of the Officers' Training Corps.
- (c.) Application for attachment to a Regular unit should be made, through the authorities of the university to which a candidate belongs, to the Secretary, War Office. Arrangements will then be made, firstly, for his appointment to a commission on the unattached list for the Territorial Force, and, secondly, for his attachment to a Regular unit. In the case of such an unattached officer, the compulsory provision of uniform will be limited to the provision of the service dress, with sword, &c.
- (d.) In the case of a student at a colonial university, an attachment for six consecutive weeks in each of two consecutive years, or twelve consecutive weeks in one year, will be required, which attachment may be to a Regular unit or to a unit of the Permanent Forces of the colony. Before such attachment, a candidate will be required to have been instructed in squad drill, in accordance with Infantry Training, under arrangements made by the university to which he belongs.
- (e.) The attachment of a student at a colonial university will be arranged between the university authorities and the general officer commanding-in-chief, or colonial authorities, as the case may be. Certificates similar to those required from candidates from universities in the United Kingdom must be obtained (Appendix III).
- (f.) During these periods of attachment no candidate will be eligible for an outfit allowance, nor will he receive either pay or allowances from Imperial Army funds.

(2.) He will be required to qualify in military subjects at an examination which will be held, commencing on the last Tuesday in March and on the second Tuesday in October of each year at the several universities, under instructions from the War Office.

METEOROLOGICAL SUMMARY FOR MARCH, 1909.

THE main features in the weather-conditions of March were somewhat similar to those of February. The weather was on the whole warm, and the winds light. Cyclonic movements principally affected the North Island and the north-east coast of the South. Westerly wave-areas of low pressure were not quite so much in evidence as usual, and while country with an easterly aspect had a total rainfall much above the average, on the western side and in the southernmost parts of the Dominion the rainfall was less than the normal.

A dry period was broken up on the 12th instant, when rains fell in the South Island from a small westerly wave of low pressure, which was followed by a large cyclonic movement from the north which traversed the North Island. This rain was most beneficial. On the 13th and 14th, with the rise of the barometer, thunderstorms occurred in Taranaki, and accounted for some heavy rainfalls in the interior of the North Island.

On the 8th the centre of a cyclonic disturbance passed northward of New Zealand, and was followed by a westerly wave of low pressure over the South Island on the 20th. These two disturbances resulted in much unsettled weather and some heavy rains, forming the maximum for the month at several stations.

On the 28th a cyclone of unusual extent appeared to the north-east of the North Island, and apparently united to the eastward of New Zealand with a westerly area of low pressure on the 31st. This cyclone traversed the east coast, and caused very heavy rainfalls between East Cape and Balclutha, and particularly in the neighbourhood of Christchurch, where a remarkable flood occurred, some streets being under water and houses inundated. While Hokitika on the west coast had less than half the normal, Christchurch on the coastal plains on the eastern side of the Alps had over three and a half times more than the average, a total of 6.47 in., which has only twice been exceeded in the records for that city. 3.16 in. fell on the 29th, and Lincoln had 2.30 in. at the same time. The total rainfall for the month also at Lincoln was 2.08 in. less than that of Christchurch.

The 28th and 29th were fine generally in the extreme south, and Mr. J. Geary, of Riverton, remarks that a splendid display of aurora australis occurred at this time; and the first frost occurred at Riverton on the 29th. Mr. H. B. Devereux's report from Waihi for March is particularly interesting, and is as follows:—

“ This period, like the same month for 1908, has been remarkable for its excessive rainfall.

“ The mean temperature was also above the normal.

“ On the 29th we experienced the heaviest twenty-four-hourly rainfall which has been recorded here, and a review of the conditions, both antecedent and subsequent, are particularly interesting.

“ On Sunday the 28th the prognostics were remarkably ominous, the sky was overcast (pallium), and the detached cumulo-stratus underlying was peculiarly waviform; and the famous “ pocky ” cloud, said to be an infallible sign of storm in the Orkneys, was continually in evidence. Further, a heavy swell was coming in from the E.S.E., which was evidently the forerunner of an approaching cyclone, and this conclusion appears to have been justified.

“ Rain started on Sunday night, and by daylight on 29th heavy rain had set in.

“ Between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. the fall was phenomenal, as the rates of fall below will show:—

“ A reference to the barogram will show the remarkable waviform trace, and there is no doubt that a cloudburst occurred about 10 a.m., perhaps more than one.

“ After noon the river rose at a phenomenal rate, and soon all former flood-levels were passed, and had the rain not eased off the damage would have been serious. As it was a large area of country was inundated, and several buildings on the flat were almost submerged.

“ At 1 p.m. there was an electrical discharge in the east which was undoubtedly of the nature of a thunderbolt, and which was evidently associated with a great atmospheric upheaval. I was so confident of this that on Monday of this week I rode out to the coast, and found in a valley undoubted evidence of a cloudburst. An extraordinary scene of destruction was viewed. For a radius of a mile innumerable landslips were to be seen, but the most noticeable feature was the long distances which boulders, soil, and trees had been transported. The stream-bed was almost unrecognisable, and had carried large boulders and *débris* right down to the sandhills, through which it had cut a fresh outlet. Everywhere was evidence of an exceptional rainfall. A resident in the valley states that the whole thing occurred within twenty minutes, and that the water came down in a solid wall. Luckily the wind-force at the time was never above that of a moderate breeze. Residents further down the coast report abnormal falls and damage.”

The exceptional character of the weather is also well brought out in the report of Mrs. J. J. McKenzie, of Bushey Park, Palmerston South, which is as follows:—

“ The long, dry spell lasting from 17th February ended on the 12th March with a fine rain of 44 points. The barometer had been falling steadily for seven days, but the sky remained cloudless and the weather very warm. Only the flies crowding into the house foretold the coming of the rain. The morning of the 12th was warm and sunny, but after midday the clouds gathered, and by 6 p.m. a fine drizzle filled the air, increasing to a heavy downpour at 6.30, and in a quarter of an hour the dusty roads were in puddles. The night was warm and windless, and by eleven o'clock the rain was practically over, a beautiful sunny morning following.

“ On the afternoon of the 18th a thick drizzle from the N.E. came on, increasing to heavy rain during the night, showing a fall of 55 points in the morning. The thick rain continued all day and most of the night of the 19th, and when morning came—fine and dead calm, but still overcast—another 146 points was added to the score. The weather was warm all the time, the temperature never falling below 56°. On the night of the 27th (Saturday) the weather changed, and a clear cold night with a minimum temperature of 44° was succeeded by a rather dull chilly day, with wind from S.W. Next day was beautifully fine and warm (71°), but about 8 p.m. rain began to fall out of what seemed almost a clear sky. It was only a shower, but the morning broke very wet, with violent wind from the S.E., veering during the day to the N.E., and during the evening round to the N.W. At times the rain was almost torrential, and the atmosphere thick with mist. Before 5 p.m. the rain-gauge showed 1.40 in. since 9 a.m. It then eased off, but a thick mizzle continued, the total fall being 2.27 in. The wind, which sometimes blew with the force of a gale, uprooted a good-sized gum-tree. The morning broke fine and calm, with the barometer, which had fallen rapidly, still going down. Twenty-one points fell again on the night of the 31st, but there was no flood.

“ The early part of the month was ideal for harvesting, and though there are still a few stooks to be seen, the bulk of the crops was got in in fine condition, and the late rains have brought away a fine growth on the pastures.”

Generally the weather was most seasonable and beneficial for agriculture and pastoral life. The warm and dry weather at the commencement allowed the harvest and fruit to be garnered. The rainfall later caused a great growth of grass, and softened the land for ploughing.

In some cases I regret to say the observers do not observe the rule to record the rainfall to the previous day's date, so that difficulties arise in the office in preparing the rainfall maps. A rainfall day is the twenty-four hours previous to 9 a.m.—thus, on the 1st of the month the rainfall, measured at 9 a.m., must be registered to the last day of the past month and added in with the total for that period.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of 6, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
