And whereas the said Council has, in terms of subsection three of section fourteen of "The Public Bodies' Leases Act, 1908" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), requested that the said Order in Council may be revoked:

And whereas the Ashburton County Council is a body of persons having power to lease land held in trust, reserved, or set apart for public purposes, and has requested the Governor in Council to declare it to be a leasing authority within the meaning of the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the aforesaid Order in Council of the sixteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, but without prejudice to anything heretofore done thereunder; and, further, in compliance with the aforesaid request of the said Ashburton County Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the above-recited powers, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council as aforesaid, doth hereby order and declare that the said Ashburton County Council is a leasing authority within the meaning of "The Public Bodies' Leases Act, 1908."

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Public Works Act, 1908," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that the roads described in the Schedule hereto shall, on and after the date of this Order in Council, be district roads.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that portion of road in the Kinloch Settlement, in the Canterbury Land District, Little River Road District, Akaroa County, being part of the Hikuraki Road, commencing at a point about 300 links to the westward of the water-race reserve, between Sections 18 and 24, Block V, Akaroa Survey District (being the terminus of that portion of the Hikuraki Road which was declared a district road by Order in Council in *Gazette* No. 28, page 1138, of 9th April, 1908), and extending generally in a south-westerly direction through and abutting on Section 24, and terminating at the sea-beach at the southernmost portion of Section 17, Block V, Akaroa Survey District, being a distance of 1 mile 26 chains, or thereabouts.

Also all that portion of road in the Kinloch Settlement, in the Canterbury Land District, Little River Road District, Akaroa County, being part of the Gap Road, commencing at the junction of the Peraki Road with it on the eastern boundary of Section 21, Block VI, Akaroa Survey District (being the terminus of that portion of the Gap Road which was declared a district road by Order in Council in *Gazette* No. 28, page 1138, of 9th April, 1908), and extending generally in a south-westerly direction along the eastern boundary of Section 21, and through Section 23, and terminating at the north-eastern corner of Section 27 and the northernmost point of Section 28, Block VI, Akaroa Survey District, being a distance of 1 mile 13 chains, or thereabouts.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, George Keir Austin, of St. Kilda (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under "The Harbours Act, 1908" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore in order to erect and maintain thereon a boatshed in Otago Harbour; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 3866, two sheets), in duplicate, showing such shed and the place in the said harbour where it is intended to erect it, and the area of foreshore intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the licensee on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a boatshed; such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore shown on the said plan marked M.D. 3866 (sheet 2).
3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council, pay to the Minister the sum of two pounds ten shillings, and thereafter an annual sum of ten shillings, such annual payments to date from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

5. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, and the licensee may be required to remove the boatshed at his own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

6. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which may be sustained by any vessel or boat in passing the boatshed, or by contact with it, and which may be occasioned by any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

7. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinafter set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said boatshed for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause three of these conditions; or
- (4.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege hereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined; and upon such revocation the Minister may cause the said boatshed, and all other erections or buildings thereto belonging, to be removed, and may recover the costs incurred by any such removal from the licensee.

8. The erection of the boatshed shall be deemed to be an acceptance by the licensee of the conditions of this Order in Council.
