Allocating Land reserved and taken for a Railway to the Purposes of a Road near Greenlane.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto forms part of land taken for the purposes of the Kaipara-Waikato Railway, and it is considered desirable to allocate such land to the purposes of a road:

And whereas it has been certified by the Minister of Railways that such land is not required for railway purposes: And whereas such land is situated in the Remuera Road District, the local authority of which has assented to the issue of this Proclamation:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor is of opinion that the said local authority can conveniently construct and maintain the said road:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities in me vested by section one hundred and ninety-seven of "The Public Works Act, 1908," and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall, upon the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, become a road, and that the said road shall be under the control of the Remuera Road Board, and shall be maintained by the said Board in like manner as other public highways are controlled and maintained by the said Board.

Altering the Middle-line of the Catlin's River Railway.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS under the provisions in that behalf of section one hundred and eighty-eight of "The Public Works Act, 1908," the middle-line of a further portion of the Catlin's River Railway was defined by a Proclamation dated the fourteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twentieth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and eight: And whereas it has been found necessary in the construction of such railway to alter such line in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the aforesaid section one hundred and eighty-eight, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke so much of the Schedule to the said Proclamation as defines the middle-line of the said portion of railway beyond the point marked 29 miles on the plan numbered P.W.D. 24986 referred to therein; and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-line of the part of the said portion of railway commencing from the said point marked 29 miles aforesaid shall be as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Amending Regulations regarding keeping Trout in Freezing or Cool Chambers during Close Season.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

THE HONOURABLE JAMES CARROLL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the sixth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 76, of the eighth day of the same month, regulations were made regarding the possession during the close season of trout of any species:

And whereas it is desirable to amend the said regulations:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section eighty-three of "The Fisheries Act, 1908," and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, do hereby amend the said regulations in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Clause 1. Delete the following words: "subject to the restrictions as to weight hereinafter imposed."

Clause 2. After the words "situated with," in the fourth line, insert the words "his name and postal address."

Clause 3. After the words "deposited therein," in the seventh line, insert the words "and if found legally deposited shall then at once authorise the manager, or person in charge of the chamber, to deliver same without further reference to him."

Clause 4. Delete the words and figures "fifty-six (56) pounds," and insert in lieu thereof "1 cwt. (one hundred-weight)."

Clause 5. Delete the following words: "The manager of the freezing or cool chamber shall forthwith submit to such secretary or fishery officer a statement of the number and weight of trout delivered in accordance with such authority."

Authorising Native to mortgage Land under Section 6 of "The Native Land Laws Amendment Act, 1897."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this sixth day of September, 1909.

Present :

THE HONOURABLE JAMES CARROLL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section six of "The Native Land Laws Amendment Act, 1897," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, authorise any Native owning land in severalty to mortgage such land to any lending Department of the Government, and that in such case the mortgage shall operate in all respects as if the mortgagor were other than a Native, and accordingly none of the restrictions, limitations, or provisions of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894," or any other Act affecting Native land, or lands owned or held by Natives, shall apply, anything in any such Act to the contrary notwithstanding: And whereas Hira Parata, of Waikanae, in the Provincial District of Wellington, in the Dominion of New Zealand, being the owner in severalty of the block or parcel of land mentioned and particularised in the Schedule hereto, has applied to be allowed to mortgage the said block of land: And whereas by certificate bearing date the nineteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and nine, under the hand of Walter Edward Rawson, Esquire, a Judge of the Native Land Court of New Zealand, and the seal of the said Court, it was certified that the said Hira Parata possesses, irrespective of the land proposed to be mortgaged, other land sufficient for his maintenance:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorise the said Hira Parata to mortgage the land set out in the Schedule hereto to the Public Trust Office, being a lending Department of the Government as aforesaid.

WHEREAS by Order in Council bearing date the fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and eight, the blocks or parcels of land known as Rakautahi Nos. 1L, 2B (interests in), 3B No. 1, 3B No. 2, 3B No. 3A, 3B No. 3B, and 5B (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the said land") were declared to be subject to Part I of "The Native Land Settlement Act, 1907":

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under "The Harbours Act, 1908" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Akaroa Borough Council (hereinafter called "the Council") has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore, and the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore, in order to erect and maintain thereon baths in Akaroa Harbour; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington, marked M.D. 3400 (three sheets), showing the place in the said harbour where it is intended to erect such baths, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the same, and the area of foreshore or land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the Council on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby license and permit the Council to use and occupy those parts of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto which are particularly shown and delineated on sheet one of the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon baths in accordance with sheets two and three of the said plans, such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say,—

1. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark required for the construction of the baths as shown and delineated on sheet one of the said plans as aforesaid.

2. The foreshore and tidal land included in this license shall be used solely for bathing purposes.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council, the Council shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister an annual rental of one shilling payable on demand.

4. The Council shall, during the subsistence of this Order in Council, provide and maintain proper and sufficient baths, with all necessary appliances and conveniences thereto, as will enable the public to use and enjoy the same, and all other advantages hereby conferred in respect of the use and occupation of the foreshore and land below low-water mark, and with or without any charge for the same, and under such regulations for the decent and orderly use thereof as the Council may make; provided that no such charge as aforesaid shall be made until after the same has been approved by the Minister.

5. A printed copy of the regulations affecting the use of the said baths, and advantages as aforesaid, shall be put up by the said Council in such baths.

6. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years,

computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

7. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council.

8. In case the Council shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or

(2.) Cease to provide or maintain the said baths for the use of the public for bathing purposes,

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

9. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

10. The construction of the baths shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the Council of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

Examining Telegraph Codes.

THE following is published for the information of persons telegraphing in code language:—

1. The telegraph administrations of the United Kingdom, France, and Germany have been designated by the International Telegraph Conference of Lisbon, on behalf of the International Telegraph Union, and in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 2 of Article VIII of the International Telegraph Regulations, for the purpose of examining codes and vocabularies of code-words, or of syllables intended to be used in the formation of code-words. Thus, persons concerned can obtain an assurance that their codes or vocabularies are in conformity with the requirements of the aforesaid paragraphs. This assurance is given by means of a certificate.

2. Persons desirous of submitting codes for examination on behalf of the International Telegraph Union should apply to the Secretary, General Post Office, Wellington. Applicants must forward with their applications, at their own expense, three copies of each code to be examined. These copies will remain the property of the three administrations.

3. Codes may be submitted in manuscript, provided that they are legibly written, but in the case of those which it is intended subsequently to print, a final certificate will not be issued until after a printed copy of the code has been sent to each of the three administrations, and it has been ascertained that this copy is in conformity with the documents which were examined.

4. Applicants must furnish any particulars which may be considered necessary to explain the method of formation of the code-words which they desire to use. No information as to the meanings attached to the words is required. Unpublished codes, as well as any particulars furnished by applicants, will be regarded as confidential.

5. It is desirable that codes should be submitted without delay, and, if possible, before the 1st January, 1910.

6. The attached extract from the International Telegraph Regulations shows the conditions to which code-words must conform.

7. The decision of the administrations as to the refusal of a certificate is final. The administrations will, however, endeavour, as far as possible, to afford the persons concerned an opportunity of modifying their codes in order to obtain a certificate.

8. The certificate will apply solely to the code in respect of which it is issued, and will lapse if the code is modified without approval.

9. The submission of codes for examination is optional. Codes which are not certificated will continue to be available, in so far as they are in conformity with the regulations.

10. The administrations will not be liable for any loss or damage which may be incurred or sustained in consequence of anything done or omitted to be done in connection with the approval or non-approval of any code, or the issue or non-issue of any certificate.

EXTRACT FROM INTERNATIONAL TELEGRAPH REGULATIONS.

Article VIII.

1. CODE language is that which is composed of words not forming intelligible phrases in one or more of the languages authorised for telegraphic correspondence in plain language.

2. The words, whether genuine or artificial, must be formed of syllables capable of pronunciation according to the current usage of one of the following languages: German, English, Spanish, French, Dutch, Italian, Portuguese, or Latin. Artificial words must not contain the accented letters ä, å, à, é, ê, ñ, ò, ù.

Codes intended for correspondence in code language may be submitted to the telegraph administrations designated for the purpose, with a view to allow those concerned to obtain an assurance that the words contained in codes fulfil the conditions of the present paragraph.

3. Words in code language must not be longer than ten characters according to the Morse alphabet, the combinations ae, aa, ao, oe, ue, being counted as two letters each. The combination ch is also counted as two letters in artificial words.

4. Combinations not fulfilling the conditions of the two preceding paragraphs are regarded as language in letters having a secret meaning, and are charged for accordingly. Nevertheless, those which may be formed by the union of two or more words in plain language contrary to the usage of the language are not admitted.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of 6, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
