HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Civil Service Act, 1908," and "The Public Service Classification and Superannuation Act, 1908," and of all other powers and authorities thereunto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor of the Do-minion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations respecting leave of absence and travelling-allowances of officers of the public service of New Zealand, and doth direct that such regula-tions shall come into force on the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

REGULATIONS.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

1. EVERY officer in the Civil Service may be granted leave

EVERY officer in the Civil Service may be granted leave of absence for recreation on the following scale :-
 When an officer has served for fifteen years or upwards, not exceeding three weeks in each year.
 When he has served less than fifteen years, not exceeding two weeks in each year.

 The granting of any such leave of absence shall be subject to the express conditions that the behaviour of the officer has been in every way satisfactory, that intermittent leave has been for a minimum number of days only, that absence from illness has not exceeded one week, and more generally that his official duties have been properly per-formed.

3. No officer shall be entitled to claim leave of absence as a right, and if for any cause the head of the Department thinks such leave ought not to be granted, he may refuse the same in any case, subject to the approval of his action by the Minister.

4. An officer failing to avail himself of the annual leave provided for will not on that account be entitled to a more

lengthened leave in any subsequent year unless under special circumstances approved by the Minister. 5. In cases of absence from illness or accident for any

5. In cases of absence from liness or accident for any period extending over two days a medical certificate is necessary, but heads of Departments or other responsible officers may require that a certificate be supplied forthwith. The certificate should state the nature of the illness or accident.

TRAVELLING-ALLOWANCES AND TRAVELLING-EXPENSES.

 (2.) Such allowances shall include meals and porterage.
 7. Travelling-allowances shall be paid only where an officer is necessarily absent from his headquarters at night; but, for all journeys where an officer is not obliged to be absent at night, actual expenses will be paid to an amount in no case exceeding the full daily rate above authorised for personal expenses, on production of a statement giving details of the nature of the charges, with dates, places, and to mhere raid

details of the hattre of the charges, with dates, parts, and to whom paid. 8. The two preceding regulations shall not apply to cases in which a temporarily higher rate shall be specially sanc-tioned by a Minister; nor shall anything in these regulations preclude Ministers from specially authorising temporary special rates or amounts for travelling, to meet special cases, a bitbarte as hitherto.

9. Cost of transport by land or sea will be paid by the Government, or, when paid by the officer travelling, the same will be recouped to him on production of vouchers; but no vouchers for such expenses will be required for sums of less than 5s., and vouchers for railway fares will not be required if the railway travelled upon and the extent of the journey is stated.

All vouchers for travelling allowances or expenses must be made out in detail on the proper Treasury form, signed and certified by the claimant, and certified as correct by the head of his Department or other authorised authority.

11. The nature of the duty on which the officer is stave-ling shall be stated on the voucher. 12. No officer is to travel without the authority of the

head of his Department.

GENERAL.

13. All existing regulations as to leave of absence and travelling-allowances of officers of the public service are hereby modified in so far as they are inconsistent with these regulations.

14. These regulations shall apply to all Departments of the public service, excepting the regulations regarding leave of absence, which shall not apply to the Government Rail-ways Department.

Empowering Native Land Court to inquire and ascertain who are the Natives beneficially entitled under the Trust ex-pressed in the Title to Allotment 154, Parish of Te Puna.

WHEREAS by section fifteen of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order, from time to time confer on the Native Land Court, as established by the said Act, juris-diction in any matter or question referred to in such Order exclusively affecting the rights of Natives in any real or personal property: And whereas a Crown grant was issued on the twenty-fourth day of August. one thousand eight hundred and seventy, for, *inter alia*, the land described in the Schedule hereto to Maungapohatu and Te Wanakore, aboriginal chiefs, in trust for the Pirirakau Tribe, their heirs and assigns: And whereas it is expedient that the Native Land Court should be empowered to inquire and

ascertain who are the Natives beneficially entitled under the trust recited in the said grant, and in what shares or

the trust recited in the said grant, and in what shares of proportions: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him as afore-said, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that the investigation and determination of the names of the Natives beneficially entitled under the said trust, and the relative shares and proportions in which such names of the Natives beneficially entitled under the said trust, and the relative shares and proportions in which such Natives are so entitled, and of any matter or question which may arise in relation thereto, or which it shall be necessary to determine for the purpose aforesaid, shall be and the same are hereby brought within the jurisdiction of the said Court. And it is hereby declared that this Order is made under the provisions in that behalf of "The Native Land Court Act, 1894," and "The Land Titles Protection Act, 1908," and that this Order shall operate accordingly as a consent of the Governor in Council to the proceedings hereby authorised. hereby authorised.

ground in Division 2 wherein an interment has already been made of one body only and prior to a second interment therein. The price for a grave 4 ft. by 9 ft. to be £1. After purchasing monuments may be erected. 2. A sexton will from time to time be appointed by the Board, whose duty it will be to dig all graves required in the cemetery; and no other person will be allowed to dig graves therein without the express permission in writing of the Board. 3. No interment shall be made without a warrant for that purpose obtained from the officer appointed by the Board to issue such warrants.

4. In the case of any intended interment, the person having the management or control of the same shall make application in writing for a warrant for such interment to the officer appointed by the Board to issue such warrants, and such officer is hereby authorised to grant a warrant upon payment of such of the undermentioned fees as may be applicable :... applicable :-

RUSSIAN TABTARY.

VLADIVOSTOK APPBOACH.—FIXED AND FLOATING MINES.— CAUTION.—The following information concerning mines in the approaches to Vladivostok, derived from reliable Japanese and Russian sources, has been received from the command-ing officer of the U.S.S. "Charleston":— During the late war the Japanese laid about 700 mines in a skirmish-line between Rimsk Korsakov and Askold Islands in addition to these plonted by the Presion. We attempt

in addition to those planted by the Russians. No attempt has been made to remove many of these mines, which may consequently still be in place. The work of removing them all was not concluded in 1908, as Notice to Mariners No. 40 (1846) of 1907 states was the hope in 1907, nor is the work concluded yet.

A channel, which is believed to be perfectly clear, extends over $\frac{1}{2}$ mile westward of Askold Island, and from there to Skruiplev Island in the middle of the eastern entrance to

Skriptev Island in the induction of the castern centralice to the Eastern Bosporus. Vessels bound to or from Vladivostok should use the eastern entrance to the Eastern Bosporus, whatever the port of departure or destination, passing northward of or within 1 mile to the westward of Askold Island. The statement made in Notice to Mariners No. 40 (1846) 5 1007 that all the mines within 5 miles of Askold Island

of 1907, that all the mines within 5 miles of Askold Island have been removed, is not correct. Both the Russian and Japanese naval officers continue to

exercise unusual precautions in the matter of lockouts, and do not take any chances with floating objects which may be sighted. Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

TWO scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maori boys not over sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination: the other, to be called the junior scholarship, is open to all Maori boys under fifteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have attended a Native school or schools under the control of the Education Department, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory. The scholarships are open to Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Appendix to the Native Schools Code, 1908. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 6th and 7th of December, 1909. 1909.

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present them-selves for examination. In the above table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four oities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christohurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christohurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place. The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Dunedin, but raises it at Christohurch.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 622, against 640 in July—a decrease of 18. The deaths in August were 203—a decrease of 52 on the number in July. Of the total deaths, males contributed 102, females 101. Forty-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 20.69 per cent. of the whole number; 35 of these were under one year of age.

There were seventy-five deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Nine men, 65, 69, 75 (two), 79, 82, 83 (two), 87, aud eight women, 66, 67, 71 (two), 74, 78, 81, 88, died at Auckland; two men, 66, 79, and four women, 67, 71, 87, 89, at Wellington; thirteen men, 65 (two), 68, 71, 74, 75, 79, 81 (two), 82, 89, 90, 92, and nineteen women, 66 (three), 67, 68, 69 (two), 70, 72 (two), 76 (two), 78 (two), 80, 84, 85, 89, 92, at Christchurch; and ten men, 68, 69, 71, 72, 74, 76, 78, 79, 87, 89, and ten women, 66 (two) 69, 71, 73, 74, 75, 79, 82, 86, at Dunedin.
