TN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908," I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration district known as the Wai-apu District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Waiapu and Tokomaru Bay Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names, as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act, 1908." And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine.

A PROCLAMATION.

TN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1908," I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage district known as the Waiapu District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised with-in the said district is hereby divided anew into two mar-

riage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows :-

WAIAPU DISTRICT.

All that area bounded towards the north and east gene-rally by the sea from Cape Runaway to the south-eastern corner of Waipiro No. 5 Block at the mouth of the Waihuru Stream; thence towards the south generally by the southern boundaries of Waipiro No. 5 and Kaupeka-a-Haumia Blocks to Te Matai Stream; thence by that stream to its confluence with the Mangahawini Stream; thence by the last-mentioned stream to the south-eastern corner of the Poroikamoana Block; thence by the southern boundary of that block and part of the southern boundary of Rakauatautini B Block to the Pauariki Stream; thence by that stream to the north-eastern boundary of Tckomaru D Block; thence by that block to the Onetehunga Stream; thence by that stream to its confluence with the Taumutu Stream; thence by the said Taumutu Stream and Small Grazing-run No. 53 to the road at the north-western corner of Run No. 92; thence by the southern boundary of Run No. 92 to Te Pora Stream; thence by that stream to the easternmost corner of Paparoa No. 1 Block; thence by the south-eastern boundary of the last road head to the south the south-eastern boundary of the southern boundary of Run No. 92 to Te Pora Stream; All that area bounded towards the north and east genethence by that stream to the easternmost corner of Paparoa No. 1 Block; thence by the south-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned block to the Mata River; thence by the right bank of that river to a point opposite the mouth of the Whakoau Stream; thence across the river, by the said Whakoau Stream, and the northern boundary of Huiarua No. 2 Block to Ohinepaka Trig. Station; and thence by a right line to Cape Runaway, the place of commencement.



Amending Regulations for the Leasing of Land within the Thermal-springs District.

W HEREAS it is enacted by section 15 of "The Maori Land Laws Amendment Act, 1908," that, notwith-standing anything to the contrary in "The Thermal Springs Districts Act, 1908," the Governor may from time to time delegate to the Maori Land Board for the Waiariki District any of his powers under the last mentioned Act in so far as they relate to the leasing of land under the said Act: And whereas the said Board has, for the purpose of ex-ercising such powers, adopted, by resolution, regulations bearing date the 8th day of May, 1909, and published in the *Gazette* and *Kahiti*, each of the 20th day of May, 1909: And whereas it has been found expedient to add to such regulations:

regulations: Now, therefore, the said Board doth hereby add to the

said regulations in the manner following, that is to say :-

By the addition of the following new regulation after

By the addition of the following new regulation, which shall apply to all lands classed by the Board as third class lands :

"THIRD-CLASS LAND.

"46. The term fixed by any lease of third-class land shall be for such period as the Board may decide upon, and the lease may, if the Board thinks fit, contain covenants for such right of renewal and compensation for improvements and such other covenants as may be determined upon. SUMMARY FOR AUGUST, 1909.

THE rainfall was very heavy at times during the month, and especially over the North Island, where, taken as a whole, it was about 75 per cent. above the average, and over the South Island about 30 per cent. above the average, for previous years.

Strong westerly winds prevailed, and four areas of westerly low pressure passed, two extensive ones in the first half of the month, and two smaller in the latter part, which chiefly affected the South Island. A cyclonic movement passed over the North Island on the 1st and 2nd. Snow fell on high country on the 7th and 17th. The weather was, on the whole, mild and humid, mean temperatures being generally about two degrees above the average for the month.



SPECIAL ORDER MAKING TRAFFIC BY-LAW.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon it by "The Town Boards Act, 1908," "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1908," "The Public Works Act, 1908," Corporations Act, 1908," "The Fublic Works Act, 1908, and the various Acts amending the same, and all other Acts and powers whatsoever in this behalf enabling, the Board of the Town District of Ngaruawahia doth hereby make and ordain by special order the by-law following, to come into force on the 1st day of November, 1909 :

By-law No. 4.-Bridges.

No person shall take, lead, ride, or drive any horse, engine, agricultural or other machine or vehicle of any nature over any bridge of a greater span than ten feet under the control of the Ngaruawahia Town Board at other than a walkingpace.

No person or persons shall cross more than thirty head of cattle at one time over the Waipa River Bridge at Ngaruawahia.

Any person who shall, after the coming into operation of this by-law, commit a breach of same shall, on con-viction thereof, be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £5.
