HEREAS by section fifty-five of "The Native Land Settlement Act, 1907," it is enacted that where the Commission referred to therein recommends that any land declared to be subject to Part II of the said Act, or any part of such land, should be leased to Maoris, the Governor may, by Order in Council, authorise the Board of the district in which the land is situated to act as agent of the Maori owners of the said land for the purpose of leasing the same to Maoris in accordance with the provisions of Part II of the said Act: said Act :

And whereas the lands specified in the Schedule hereto have been declared to be subject to Part II aforesaid, and the said Commission has recommended that such lands should be leased to Maoris :

By-law for New Zealand Government Railways.—Regulating the Weight of Cereals and Agricultural Produce to be carried in any Sack.

DURSUANT to and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 10 (e) (iv) of "The Government Railways Act, 1908," I, John Andrew Millar, the Minister of Rail-ways, do hereby make the following by-law regulating the weight of cereals or other agricultural produce to be carried in any sack, and imposing a penal rate of charges for excess in respect of such weight; and I hereby declare that this by-law shall come into operation on 1st February, 1910, from which date By-law No. 63 of the by-laws gazetted 10th June, 1909, will be revoked :—

# By-law.

1. The maximum weight of any class of cereal or other agricultural produce contained in any one sack to be carried by railway shall be 200 lb.

Any sack of any class of cereal or other agricultural pro-duce containing a greater weight than 200 lb. shall be charged for at four times the ordinary rate of freight.

Regulations for the Manufacture of Methylated Spirits pre-scribed.

Department of Trade and Customs, Wellington, 16th November, 1909. I subsurption of section 35 of "The Customs Law Act, 1908," I, George Fowlds, the Minister of Customs for the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the regulations under "The Methylated Spirit Act, 1907," dated the 11th day of January, 1908, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the 16th day of January, 1908, and in lieu thereof do hereby prescribe the following regulations for the manu-facture, use, and sale of methylated spirits ; provided that, notwithstanding the revocation of the regulations hereinbe-fore regulations, and mineral naphtha of a specific gravity not less than 0.800 ordered before the publication of these regulations in the New Zealand Gazette, or at such time thereafter as may be specified by the Minister, may be used on the basis heretofore obtaining under the said regulations of the 11th day of January, 1908:—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. No spirits shall be methylated which are of a lower

No spirits shall be methylated which are of a lower strength than 50 per cent. overproof.
 No wood naphtha or pyridine shall be used for the purposes of methylation which have not been reported on by the Chemical Expert to the Customs Department, and approved by the Secretary of Customs.
 (1.) Samples of wood naphtha or pyridine to be submitted for approval must be drawn and sealed in the presence of an officer of Customs; the vessels containing the naphtha or pyridine must also be sealed prior to delivery from Customs control.
 (2.) Samples must not be less in quantity than a half.

(2.) Samples must not be less in quantity than a half-pint, and must bear on the label the marks and numbers of the packages of importation, the name of the country of origin, and the initials of the officer in whose presence they were drawn.

were drawn. 4. No wood naphtha shall be approved which is of a less strength than 60 o.p. by Sikes hydrometer, and which is not sufficiently impure to impart to rectified spirit when mixed therewith in conjunction with pyridine, in the proportions specified in these regulations, such nauseousness as will, in the opinion of the Chemical Expert, render the mixture in-capable of being used as a beverage or of being mixed with

potable spirits of any kind without rendering them unfit for human consumption.

  5. Pyridine must comply with the following tests :—

  (a.) Colour : The colour of the pyridine should not be darker than that of a solution of 2 cc. decinormal iodine solution per litre of distilled water.

Behaviour towards cadmium chloride : 10 cc. of a solution of 1 cc. pyridine-bases in 100 cc. water are treated with 5 cc. of a 5-per-cent. aqueous solution of water-free fused cadmium-chloride and vigorously shaken, and distinct crystalline separation must soon appear. 10 cc. of the same pyridine-bases solution should give a white precipitate with 5 cc. of Nessler's reagent.
  (c.) Boiling-point: If 100 cc. of pyridine-bases are distilled in the following manner at least 90 cc. should have passed over at 140 deg. C. 100 cc. of pyridine are placed in a copper flask, with short neck, of 180-200 cc. capacity, and the flask placed on an asbestos plate with a circular opening of 30 mm. diameter. The flask bears a fractionating tube, 12 mm. wide and 170 mm. long, provided with a bulb. It is joined to a Liebig condenser by a side tube set in 1 centimetre above the bulb; the water envelope of the condenser should be at least 400 mm. long. In the upper opening of the fractionating tube a officially verified thermometer, showing the temperature range of 200 deg. C., is fixed so that its mercury reservoir occupies the centre of the bulb. The distillate passes over per minute; the distillate passes over per minute; the distillate is caught in a glass cylinder divided mercury reservoir occupies the centre of the bills. The distillation is so carried on that about 5 cc. of the distillate passes over per minute; the distillate is caught in a glass cylinder divided into cubic centimetres. At 75 deg. C. and normal barometer pressure of 760 mm. at least 90 cc. of distillate should have passed over. If the barometric pressure during the distillation is not 760 mm., a correction of 1 deg. Titration: 1 cc. of pyridine-bases dissolved in 10 cc. water is treated with normal sulphuric acid until a drop of the mixture produces a dis-tinct blue border on Congo paper, which soon disappears. Not less than 10 cc. solution should have been head for the appearance of this surface. have been used for the appearance of this reaction. For the preparation of Congo paper, filter-paper is immersed in a solution of 1g. Congo red per 1 litre of water and dried.

Every manufacturer of articles approved under these regulations shall keep a book, in which he shall enter all "Methylated spirit W.P." received by him immediately on receipt thereof; he shall also, immediately upon de-livery from Customs control, enter the quantity of spirit used to dissolve or treat such materials as are enumerated in paragraphs 4 and 5, or such other materials as may from time to time be permitted. permitted.

permitted. (4.) "Methylated spirit W.P." for the manu-facture of varnishes, lacquers, and polishes shall be mixed with and have in solution, before delivery from Customs control, at least 2 per cent. by weight of either shellac, copal, resin, or other material approved by the Minister. Spirit so treated is not to be delivered until the ma-terials added have had time to come into solu-tion. tion.

(5.) "Methylated spirit W.P." for the manu-(5.) "Methylated spirit W.P." for the manufacture of veterinary medicines shall be mixed, while under Customs control, with the ingredients approved for such medicines, time being allowed before delivery for solution, percolation, or maceration where necessary.
(6.) Every manufacturer of veterinary medicines made with methylated spirit shall cause each packet containing the same, and every bottle, tin, or other receptacle filled upon or delivered from his premises for sale, to be distinctly labelled—

"For veterinary use. Made with lated spirit." methy

(7.) The premises of every holder of "Methy-lated spirit W.P." shall be open to inspection by an officer of Customs, who shall be permitted to examine the book referred to in paragraph (3), and to check the balances shown therein with the stock of methylated spirit in hand.

7. One shilling and sixpence per hour will be charged for the services of an officer of Customs when such services are

the services of an officer of Customs when such services are required to supervise the manufacture or delivery of methy-lated spirit, "finish," or veterinary medicines. 8. Every person who commits any breach of these regu-lations shall, except as otherwise provided for under "The Customs Law Act, 1908," be liable to a penalty not ex-conding £20 ceeding £20.
