A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Council of the County of Collingwood has, by resolution adopted at an ordinary meeting thereof, requested that the name of the locality situated in the County of Collingwood and known as "West Wanganui" be altered to "West Haven":

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by "The Designation of Districts Act, 1908," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the locality now known as "West Wanganui" shall be and the same is hereby altered to "West Haven," and do assign the lastmentioned name to such locality accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the inlet of the sea now known as "West Wanganui Inlet" shall be and the same is hereby altered to "West Haven Inlet," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such inlet accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and ten, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the than six months after the first publication thereof in the Gazette.

In the above table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at each of the four centres.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 640, against 576 in November—an increase of 64. The deaths in December were 241—an increase of 61 on the number in November. Of the total deaths, males contributed 147, females 94. Sixty two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 25.73 per cent. of the whole number; 47 of these were under one year of age.

There were sixty-one deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: ten men, 65, 66, 68 (two), 70, 73, 74, 77, 79, 87, and five women, 65, 71, 72, 73, 74, died at Auckland; seven men, 68, 69, 70, 72, 75, 78 (two), and four women, 65, 69, 71, 83, at Wellington; sixteen men, 65, 66 (two), 68 (three), 70, 73, 75 (two), 77 (two), 79, 80 (two), 88, and two women, 75, 80, at Christchurch; and eleven men, 65, 67, 68, 73, 75, 77, 78 (two), 80, 81, 90, and six women, 65, 66, 67, 70, 74, 79, at Dunedin.

Arrivals and Departures in 1909.

Registrar-General's Office, Wellington, 19th January, 1910.

Tables showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1909, with totals for the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The total number of persons who arrived in the Dominion during 1909 was 38,650, as compared with an annual average of 30,847 for the previous ten years. The departures from New Zealand during the year numbered 33,931, the annual average being 22,647. The excess of arrivals over departures for the past year was 4,719 persons, a number considerably below the decennial average (8,200).

According to returns furnished by the Immigration officers, 11,184 persons arrived from the United Kingdom, and 2,676 persons departed therefor during the year. From the Commonwealth of Australia the arrivals are returned as numbering 25,548 persons, and the departures thereto as 28,995 persons. Arrivals and departures from and to other countries were 1,918 and 2,260 persons respectively.

Of the 38,650 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 4,407, or 11.40 per cent. of the total, were children—i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 33,931 departures the children numbered 2,786, or 8.21 per cent.

SUMMARY FOR NOVEMBER, 1909.

EXCEPT in the Hawke's Bay district, the rainfall was below the average in nearly all parts of the Dominion. Although over the South Island westerly winds prevailed during the first half of the month, the rainfall on the West Coast was only about one-third of the average. In the latter part of the month easterly winds prevailed over the South Island, and the East Coast had showery weather, while the West Coast was remarkably dry. Rainfalls were generally heaviest on the 1st and about the 20th, and in the last week of the month over the Hawke's Bay district. The month was free from great storms, but there were several short gales in parts of the country.

BY-LAW No. 5 OF THE WAIMEA COUNTY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Counties Act, 1908," The Public Works Act, 1908," and every other statutory or other power in that behalf enabling it, the Council of the Waimea County by special order hereby

the Council of the Waimea County by special order hereby makes the following by-law for the purpose of the good rule and government of the Waimea County:—

1. This by-law may be cited as "By-law No. 5," and shall be read and construed with and as part of By-law No. 1 of the Waimea County, made by special order on the 8th day of September, 1904, and confirmed on the 14th day of October, 1904, and which said By-law No. 1 is hereinafter referred to as "the said by-law."

2. Sections 75, 76, 79, 80, and 82 to 90, both inclusive, of the said by-law are hereby repealed.

3. The following provisions are substituted in lieu of the

the said by-law are hereby repealed.

3. The following provisions are substituted in lieu of the said sections hereby repealed:—

(a.) No person in charge of any four-wheeled vehicle which together with the load thereon weighs any of the weights specified in this section shall drive such vehicle or cause or allow the same to be driven drawn or propelled by any means whatsoever upon any road unless such vehicle when so being driven drawn or propelled as aforesaid shall have tires upon all of its wheels of the following widths—namely, three tons or over three tons and under four tons, tires not less than 3 in. in width; four tons or over four tons and under five tons, tires not less than 4 in. in width; five tons or over five tons and up to six tons, tires not less than 5 in. in width.

(b.) No person in charge of any two-wheeled vehicle

and up to six tons, tires not less than 5 in. in width.

(b.) No person in charge of any two-wheeled vehicle which together with the load thereon weighs any of the weights specified in this section shall drive such vehicle or cause or allow the same to be driven drawn or propelled by any means whatsoever upon any road unless such vehicle when so being driven drawn or propelled as aforesaid shall have tires upon its wheels of the following widths—namely, one ton and a half or over one ton and a half and under two tons, tires not less than 3 in. in width; two tons or over two tons, tires not less than 4 in. in width.

4. Section 98 is hereby amended as follows, namely:—

(a.) By striking out the words "five barrels of cement" in the thirteenth line of section 98 in the printed copy of the said by-law (as originally printed), and substituting in lieu thereof the words "six barrels of cement."

(b.) By striking out the words and figures "12 bags

(b.) By striking out the words and figures "12 bags (4 bushel) of wheat" in the sixteenth and seventeenth

(4 bushel) of wheat " in the sixteenth and seventeenth lines of section 98 of the said printed copy of the said by-law, and substituting in lieu thereof the words and figures "10 bags (4 bushel) of wheat."

5. Every person who shall do, or cause to be done, or be concerned in doing, anything contrary to any provision of this by-law, or who shall omit to do anything required to be done by such person by any such provision, shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law, and shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5) sterling.

6. This special order and by-law (No. 5) shall come into force on the 1st day of February, 1910, and shall apply to the whole county.
