There is a large increase in the area of peas in Marlborough, and of maize in Auckland and Taranaki.

The grain-crops in most districts have ripened with extreme rapidity, and the bulk is now in the stock or stack, while a large quantity is already threshed. The yields are, in general, very disappointing, considering the early promise of an unusually abundant harvest. The hot winds in December not only caused premature ripening, but also injured much of the straw, so that the rain at the beginning of January did not benefit the crops nearly as much as was hoped. Caterpillars did damage in several districts, and the small birds levied their usual toll. Hessian fly appeared in several localities, but it was not serious. Continued absence of rain in Southland is calculated to have diminished the yield of oats by 15 per cent., and in Central Otago from the same cause the crops are a failure.

On the other hand, there are in all the principal districts many excellent crops; the wet weather at the end of January caused little loss in yield, and the discoloration of the grain and seeds is much less than was feared. There is, however, a large proportion of small and shrivelled grain. The yields have now to be set down at much lower estimates than those formed from the appearance of the crops at the dates of the December and January reports. Threshing is not sufficiently advanced to enable the actual yields to be computed, but the present estimates may be confidently expected to be realised.

The rains in January were of incalculable benefit to the pastures and fodder and root crops, and the prospects for autumn and winter feed are highly satisfactory. Oats sown for winter and spring feeding have made good progress.

Potato-disease has reappeared, but only in the earlier districts is the damage, so far, of much magnitude. The various pests and diseases of the turnip have not yet manifested themselves to any alarming extent, but in some localities rape has been badly blighted.

By the inclusion of the suburbs the rate is lowered at each of the four centres. It will be observed that Auckland has the highest rate, Christchurch next highest, Wellington and Dunedin following. The birth-rate for the Dominion last year was 27.29 per thousand. Auckland and Christchurch are thus over the average, Wellington and Dunedin below it.

The birth-rates for two of the central boroughs last year show a fall when compared with 1908. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognised as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 631, against 640 in December—a decrease of 9. The deaths in January were 227—a decrease of 14 on the number in December. Of the total deaths, males contributed 119, females 108. Sixty-nine of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 30.40 per cent. of the whole number; 61 of these were under one year of age.

There were sixty deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Eight men, 65, 75, 77 (two), 79 (two), 85, 88, and five women, 65, 67 (two), 72, 75, died at Auckland; four men, 65, 69, 75, 82, and four women, 70 (two), 73, 80, at Wellington; nine men, 66, 68, 72, 73 (two), 75 (two), 77, 86, and thirteen women, 66, 67 (two), 68, 74 (two), 78, 81 (three), 82, 83, 94, at Christchurch; and ten men, 67, 73 (three), 75, 76 (two), 79, 81, 85, and seven women, 68 (two), 70, 74, 75, 76, 79, at Dunedin.

Teachers' Certificate Examinations, 1910.

THE following lists contain statements of the principal
results of the examinations held in January. In the
preparation of the lists consideration has been given to
candidates' successes at previous examinations for teachers'
certificates and at University examinations, of which due

candidates' successes at previous examinations for teachers' certificates and at University examinations, of which due notice has been received.

The first list (I) contains the names of the successful candidates for Classes A, B, C, and D. Teachers' certificates will be issued to such of these as have produced satisfactory evidence of age and good character, have passed the special medical examination prescribed, and have fulfilled the necessary conditions as to length of service and efficiency in teaching. The second list (II) gives the names of those who have passed the examination for a certificate except in one or two subjects. Those candidates for the Class C examination who, though not entitled to be placed in the second list, passed in a "section" under clause 26 of the Regulations, are included in the third list (III). In the fourth list (IV) are given the names of the candidates whose work has been deemed worthy of special mention, in accordance with clause 40.

The next examination will take place in January, 1911, beginning about the 5th day of the month. Notice must be sent to the "Inspector-General of Schools, Wellington," so as to reach him not later than the 30th September. Candidates that have obtained "partial pass" must observe this rule equally with other candidates, and must not expect to receive any further intimation of the date at which the notices become due.
