A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1908," I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a borough under the said Act on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and ten; that the name of such borough shall be the Borough of Te Kuiti; that the said borough shall be an undivided borough; and that the number of Councillors to be elected thereto shall be nine, exclusive of the Mayor.

And I do further proclaim and declare that John Tammadge, of Te Kuiti, shall be the Returning Officer to conduct the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said borough; and that the said John Tammadge shall be the Town Clerk and the person to prepare the district electors roll for the purposes of the said first election.

And, lastly, I do proclaim and declare that the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said borough shall be held on Wednesday, the fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and ten; and that the first meeting of the Council of the said borough shall be held on Friday, the sixth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and ten, at half past seven o'clock in the afternoon, at Hattaway's Hall, at Te Kuiti.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north generally by Te Kumi No. 3 Block and the crossing of a road from the southernmost corner of the said Te Kumi No. 3 Block to the Mangaokewa Stream; thence across and by that stream to a point in line with the north-western boundary-line of Section No. 2A, Block XV, Orahiri Survey District; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of that section, by its north-western boundary-

line and the north-western boundary-line of Section No. 1, Block XV aforesaid, and by Allotment No. 5 of Section No. 11, Block XVI, Orahiri Survey District, to the road at its south-eastern corner; thence towards the north-east by a right line to the northernmost corner of Te Kuiti No. 7; thence by Te Kuiti No. 10 Block to the north-western boundary of Te Kuiti No. 11 Block; thence towards the south-east by the last-mentioned block to the Mangaokewa Stream; thence towards the east generally by a line across that stream, and by its left bank to Pukenui No. 2D4 Block; thence by the last-mentioned block to a branch railway-line to ballast-pit; thence by the said branch railway-line to the Main Trunk Railway; thence by the said railway-line to the north-western boundary of Pukenui No. 2N Block; thence towards the south-east by the last-mentioned block and the crossing of a road at its north-western corner; thence towards the south-west generally by a right line to the northernmost corner of Pukenui No. 2D7 Block; thence by Pukenui No. 2T Block to the westernmost corner of Pukenui No. 2D Block; thence by a right line to Trig. Station A (Te Whaukotuku); thence by a right line to a point called Wharekakaka, on the eastern boundary of Tapui-Wahine 1c Block; and thence by Tapui-Wahine 1c and 1A Blocks to the southernmost corner of Te Kumi No. 3 Block to the place of commencement.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifth day of March, 1910.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto is required for a certain public work, to wit, a Native school:

And whereas the Native owners have agreed to make a free gift of the said land to His Majesty the King, and it has been made to appear that such agreement is sufficient for the purposes intended to be effected thereby:

And whereas by partition order of the Native Land Court, bearing date the fourteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eight, certain aboriginal Natives are declared to be the owners of the Te Huruhi No. 5E Block, within which the said land is situated:

And whereas, as required by "The Public Works Act, 1908," a map has been prepared showing accurately the position and extent of the said land:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Public Works Act, 1908," and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that the land shown upon the said map, and described in the Schedule hereto, is hereby taken for the purposes of the said Native school, and shall vest in His Majesty the King, as from the twenty-second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-fourth day of March, 1910.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE SIR J. G. WARD, K.C.M.G.,  
PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the thirteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 11, of the twenty-first day of the same month, John Webster, of Opononi, was licensed to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Opononi, in Hokianga Harbour, as shown on plan marked M.D. 1491, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington, in order to erect and maintain thereon a wharf, to be erected in accordance with plan marked M.D. 1492, and deposited as aforesaid, for the term of fourteen years, computed from the date of the said Order in Council, on the terms and conditions therein expressed:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 4, of the twenty-third day of the same month, certain dues and rates were prescribed to be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf:

And whereas the licensee in the year one thousand nine hundred and three made application for a fresh license, and the same was granted for a term of seven years:

And whereas the said license has been, with the consent of the Minister of Marine, transferred to Messrs. Alfred Andrewes, George Andrewes, Frank Andrewes, and Arthur Edmund Andrewes, trading under the style or title of "A. S. Andrewes and Sons" (hereinafter called "the licensees"):

And whereas the licensees have applied for a fresh license under "The Harbours Act, 1908" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a term of seven years, and it is advisable to grant the same, and to prescribe the dues and rates which shall be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of using the aforesaid wharf in connection therewith, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, on and after the date of publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*, shall be taken by the licensees for the use of the said wharf.

The Order in Council licensing John Webster to occupy the foreshore and land below low-water mark, dated the twentieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and three, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 31, of the twenty-fourth day of the same month, is hereby revoked.

**FIRST SCHEDULE.**

CONDITIONS OF MANAGEMENT.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined in "The Shipping and

Seamen Act, 1908," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

3. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

4. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at their own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

5. Any person authorised by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring them within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

6. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1908," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, by the Harbourmaster at Hokianga, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for seven years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known registered office of the licensees in New Zealand.

10. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said wharves or either of them may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part.

11. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensees shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of two pounds ten shillings, and thereafter an annual sum of one pound in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

12. In case the licensees shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinafter set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharves for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause three of these conditions,

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

EVERY person who shall use the wharf for landing goods, or whose goods are stored in any shed on the wharf, shall pay to the licensees wharf-dues in respect of the landing, storage, receiving, and delivering such goods, as follows, that is to say,—

(a.) For all goods (except such as are hereinafter provided for) landed, stored, received, or delivered, at weight or measurement, according to shipping usage.

*Licensing Alexander McKay to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore of Mangonui Harbour.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-fourth day of March, 1910.

Present :

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE SIR J. G. WARD, K.C.M.G.,  
PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Alexander McKay, of Mangonui (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under "The Harbours Act, 1908" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore of Mangonui Harbour, in the County of Mangonui, in order to maintain thereon a building to be used as a store, warehouse, and offices, erected in the position shown on and in accordance with the plans marked M.D. 3027 (three sheets), and deposited in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the licensee on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans marked M.D. 3027 (three sheets) so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining thereon a store, warehouse, and offices, erected in accordance with the said plans, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the maintenance of such store, warehouse, and offices, which are shown on the plans marked M.D. 3027, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of two pounds ten shillings, and thereafter an annual sum of eight pounds in advance, such annual payments to date from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said store, warehouse, and offices without payment.

5. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned store, warehouse, and offices in good order and repair.

6. Any person authorised by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said store, warehouse, and offices and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such store, warehouse, and offices, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made, as the case may be.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1908," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee.

10. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said store, warehouse, and offices for the purposes aforesaid; or
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause two of these conditions,

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council, without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

*Amended Regulations.—Leave of Absence.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-fourth day of March, 1910.

PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Civil Service Act, 1908," and of all other powers and authorities thereunto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations as to leave of absence in the public service made by Order in Council dated the twenty-ninth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and four, and also regulations one to five of the regulations made for the same purpose by Order in Council dated the twentieth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations respecting leave of absence of officers of the public service of New Zealand, and doth direct that such regulations shall come into force on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and ten:—

REGULATIONS.

*Leave of Absence.*

1. Every officer in the public service, whether permanently or temporarily employed, may be granted by the Minister in charge of the Department leave of absence for recreation, on the following scale:—

- (1.) When an officer has served for fifteen years or upwards, not exceeding three weeks in each year.
- (2.) When he has served less than fifteen years, not exceeding two weeks in each year.

2. The granting of any such leave of absence shall be subject to the express conditions:—

- (1.) That the behaviour of the officer has been in every way satisfactory;
- (2.) That the total intermittent leave during the previous twelve months has not exceeded five days;
- (3.) That absence from illness or accident has not exceeded one week; and,
- (4.) More generally, that his official duties have been properly performed.

Any or all of the days of absence in excess of the number of days allowed for intermittent leave or sick-leave may be deducted from the annual leave of absence granted for recreation.

3. No officer shall be entitled to claim leave of absence as a right, and if for any cause the head of the Department thinks such leave ought not to be granted, he may refuse the same in any case, subject to the approval of his action by the Minister.

4. An officer failing to avail himself of the annual leave provided for will not on that account be entitled to a more lengthened leave in any subsequent year unless under special circumstances approved by the Minister.

5. In cases of absence from illness or accident for any period extending over two days a medical certificate shall be supplied, but heads of Departments or other responsible officers may require that a certificate be supplied forthwith. The certificate should state the nature of the illness or accident.

6. All existing regulations as to leave of absence of officers of the public service not hereinbefore revoked are hereby modified in so far as they are inconsistent with these regulations.

7. These regulations shall apply to all Departments of the public service, except the Government Railways Department.

*Notice of Intention to change the Purpose of Portion of a Reserve in the Canterbury Land District.*

The property to be known as Ladbroke Settlement, recently purchased by the Government under the Land for Settlements Act, is situated on the Christchurch-Southbridge branch railway, the nearest railway station thereto being Ladbroke's, which is three-quarters of a mile from the property and eleven miles from the City of Christchurch. GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The areas for selection are situated in Hauraki Plains, and, generally speaking, lie along the foreshore of the Firth of Thames between Waitakaruru and Piako Rivers, and also extend some ten miles up the western bank of the latter river.

Access to Waitakaruru is gained from Waerenga and Pokeno Railway-stations by road, and the same point can be reached from Thames by boat or steamer.

The Piako River is readily reached by launch, &c., from Thames, and launches ply for hire for many miles up this river. Suitable small wharves are either erected or in course of erection at various points on the river where roads touch same. A road is now completed leading to Kerepehi from Turua and Netherton, &c. Other access roads are also under construction. The lands are all partly drained swamp lands, and generally the lands immediately between the Waitakaruru-Piapiroa Road and the Firth of Thames, and between the Piako River and Piapiroa Road and Puhanga Canal, consist almost entirely of very good alluvial clay-deposit, on sandy pumice formation. The clay-deposit is from 25 ft. to 35 ft. in depth. Many of the sections are very rich, and show an entire absence of peat, but some of them have a little peat varying to 2 ft. in depth. The vegetation includes heavy and light manuka, flax, puroa-grass, and raupo, with in some instances a little mangrove.

The lands to the south and west of the Waitakaruru-Piapiroa Road, Piapiroa Road, and Puhanga Canal consist of a peaty soil, varying from 2 ft. to 8 ft. in depth, but resting on good alluvial clay-deposit. These sections will greatly improve in the future.

The lands on the east bank of the Piako River are of excellent quality, the soil being rich alluvial clay-deposit, and the vegetation consisting of raupo, puroa-grass, &c., with a certain amount of bush, as shown on plan.

Attention is drawn to the fact that rough sleeping-provision will be made at Piapiroa by the Department for intending

selectors, who must, however, provide their own blankets and provisions. Various launches ply for hire between Thames and Waitakaruru and Piako, every day on tidal conditions.

Artesian bores have been and are being sunk on the Hauraki Plains, and intending selectors may inspect same and receive all information on ground.

Guides will be stationed at different points on the ground to show selectors the various sections, but, generally speaking, selectors will not have the slightest difficulty in locating each section themselves from the plans.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The Town of Pipiroa is situate in Hauraki Plains, on the west bank of the Piako River. The nearest access is by launch or steamer, &c., from Thames, which is distant about seven miles. GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

church to Dunedin, about eighty-nine miles from Christchurch, or eleven miles from the seaport town of Timaru.
