A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the twenty-second day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and gazetted on the same date, the theretofore-existing Boroughs of Invercargill, Gladstone, Avenal, North Invercargill, and East Invercargill were constituted one united borough by the name of the "Borough of Invercargill":

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1908," do hereby proclaim and declare,—

1. That the said United Borough of Invercargill be an undivided borough.

2. That the Council of the said United Borough of Invercargill shall consist of twelve Councillors, exclusive of the Mayor.

3. That until one uniform system of rating shall be brought into force throughout the whole of the said United Borough of Invercargill rates may be made and collected separately in each or any of the parts of the said united borough consisting of the previously existing boroughs upon the systems of rating in force in each of those parts respectively immediately before the constitution of the said United Borough of Invercargill.

Revoking the Proclamation declaring Portion of the Endowment of the Hokitika Harbour Board to be subject to the Provisions of the Mining Act.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, the lands described in the Schedule hereto, being portion of the endowment of the Hokitika Harbour Board,

constituted by "The Hokitika Harbour Board Act, 1876," were made subject to the provisions of the laws relating to mining: And whereas it is deemed desirable to revoke the said Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Mining Act, 1908," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation, as from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and ten; provided that such revocation shall not affect any mining privilege then existing in respect of the lands described in the Schedule hereto.

Netting in Taieri River and Mouth.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of March, 1910.

THE HONOURABLE JAMES CARROLL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the twenty-third day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and the twenty-first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* Nos. 76 and 92, of the twenty-ninth and twenty-fourth days of the same months respectively, regulations were made prohibiting the use of nets at the mouth of or entrance to any river or stream:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke such prohibition so far only as relates to the Taieri River and the mouth thereof, and to make regulations relating to the use of nets, imposing conditions and restrictions on the taking of fish, and providing for the more effectual protection of fish therein:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section eighty-three of "The Fisheries Act, 1908" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the prohibition of the use of nets made by the hereinbefore-recited Orders in Council, in so far as relates to the Taieri River and the mouth thereof, but not further or otherwise, and doth hereby make the following regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall put, throw, drag, draw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, dragged, drawn, or placed, any net of any description (except a landing-net) in the Taieri River:

Provided that this regulation shall not prohibit the use of nets for the taking of indigenous fish at the mouth or entrance of such river.

2. Any officer of the Otago Acclimatisation Society appointed under Part II of the said Act is hereby empowered, for the enforcement of these regulations, to enter and examine any boat or boats engaged in fishing in the Taieri River or the mouth thereof in cases where there is reason to believe that trout are being taken illegally.

Licensing the Leyland-O'Brien Timber Company (Limited) to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore of Wharekawa River as a Site for Timber-booms.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of March, 1910.

THE HONOURABLE JAMES CARROLL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twelfth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 19, of the nineteenth day of the same month, the Leyland-O'Brien Timber Company (Limited), (hereinafter called "the company"), was licensed to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark of Wharekawa River, Thames County, for the purpose of using and maintaining thereon timber-booms, erected in accordance with plans marked M.D. 2062 (two sheets), and deposited in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington, for a period of fourteen years from the twelfth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six:

And whereas the company has made application for a fresh license under "The Harbours Act, 1908" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a term of two years, computed from the expiry of the term of the said first-mentioned

license, and it is expedient to grant the same for the term and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of using the aforesaid timber-booms in connection therewith, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark necessary for such wharf as shown on the plans marked M.D. 2062, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

2. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of two pounds ten shillings, and thereafter an annual sum of one pound in advance, payable on the 1st day of March, dating from the 1st day of March, 1910, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

3. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said booms without payment.

4. The company shall maintain the said booms in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at its own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

5. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said booms, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such booms, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

6. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1908," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for the term of two years, computed from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

8. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company.

9. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said booms may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

10. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said booms for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause two of these conditions,

then and in any such case this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, right, and privi-

leges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

11. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

BY-LAWS.

WHAKAREWAREWA THERMAL SPRINGS RESERVE.

1. In these by-laws "General Manager" means the General Manager of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, and includes any person who may be acting for the General Manager; "Caretaker" means the person having the general charge and control (under the direction of the General Manager) of the Whakarewarewa Thermal Springs Reserve; "the reserve" means the reserve described in the First Schedule hereto.

2. The hours at which the reserve shall be open to the public under these by-laws may be fixed from time to time by the General Manager.

3. No person shall enter the reserve except by the authorised entrance, nor (if not a season-ticket holder) without first obtaining at the ticket-office a ticket and paying the charge prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto; and every person shall produce such ticket for inspection whenever required by the Caretaker, and shall deliver up such ticket when leaving the reserve.

4. Every person holding a season ticket shall produce it for inspection when required to do so by the Caretaker or his assistants, and shall deliver up such ticket upon expiry of its currency.

5. No guide holding a license under "The Rotorua Town By-laws, 1909," shall guide more than six persons at one time within the reserve.

6. No person shall pick any flower, or break or destroy any plant, shrub, or tree, growing in the reserve.

7. No person shall place, deposit, or leave any bottle or glassware, paper, straw, dirt, rubbish, or any offensive or noxious matter of any kind within the reserve or any part thereof except in a receptacle provided for the purpose.

8. No person (except the Caretaker) shall place in any thermal spring, or in any spring or pool, or in any water-race, channel, or reservoir, in the reserve any clothes, or soap, or any substance or article.

9. No horse, dog, or other animal shall be allowed within the reserve; and for each time any horse, dog, or other animal trespasses or is allowed to trespass in the reserve, the owner of such horse, dog, or other animal shall be liable for breach of these by-laws. This by-law shall not, however, apply in the case of dogs which are led by a cord or chain.

10. No person shall trespass upon any portion of the reserve which may be set apart for planting, or where the soil is loose, or upon grass kept cut for lawns or ornamental purposes.

11. No person shall break, remove, deface by writing or marking, or otherwise injure or damage any rock or stone or silica within the reserve.

- 12. No person shall bathe in any pool within the reserve.
- 13. Any person behaving to the annoyance of any person shall, if requested by the Caretaker, immediately leave the reserve, and may be prohibited from again entering.
- 14. Every person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach.

When the above light is established the white light-buoy, moored northward of the ledge, will be withdrawn.

JAVA.

NORTH COAST.—SURABAYA STRAIT.—WEST CHANNEL.—LIGHT-VESSEL TEMPORARILY CHANGED.—Information has been received that the light-vessel at the western entrance to Surabaya Strait, north coast of Java, has been temporarily replaced by a light-vessel exhibiting a fixed white light.

The temporary light-vessel has two masts and a black funnel.

AFRICA.

The light is exhibited 56 ft. above the sea, from a masonry tower 42 ft. high, and is visible 13 miles.

On the same date, 1st January, 1910, a fixed red light was established on the head of the eastern breakwater and a fixed green light on the head of the western breakwater. ROCK OFF INDIAN ISLAND, DUSKY SOUND, SOUTH-WEST COAST OF SOUTH ISLAND.

CAPTAIN George Hooper, R.N.R., of the Government s.s. "Amokura," reports the existence of a rocky patch bearing N. 25° E. magnetic from N.W. point of

Indian Island, Dusky Sound, and distant upwards of one cable and a half from the point and one cable from the foreshore. The least water found over the rock was 12 ft. at L.W.O.S. The rocky patch is in extent a quarter of a cable E.N.E., and slightly less in width, and is steep to on north and west sides, having channel between it and the foreshore carrying from 6 to 17 fathoms of water. Excepting this patch the channel on N.W. side of Indian Island appears clear, the ship failing to find anything else with 20-fathom sounders constantly trailed. This is no doubt the rocky patch on which the s.s. "Waikare" struck.

Regulations under which Commissions in the British Army may be obtained by University Candidates.

THE following revised regulations (issued with "Army Orders" of 1st October, 1909), under which commissions in the British Army may be obtained by university candidates, are in substitution for those contained in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 13th February, 1908, and are published for general information.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH COMMISSIONS IN THE REGULAR ARMY MAY BE OBTAINED BY UNIVERSITY CANDIDATES, 1909.

1. COMMISSIONS in the Cavalry, the Royal Artillery, the Infantry, Indian Army, and the Army Service Corps will be granted each half-year on the nomination of such recognised universities, or of groups of recognised universities, as have established courses of military instruction approved by the Army Council, to candidates who have fulfilled certain conditions of academic and military qualifications.*

2. Subject to such additions or alterations as the Army Council may from time to time determine, the following is the list of recognised universities, arranged as units for purposes of nomination:—

- (a.) The University of Oxford.
- (b.) " Cambridge.
- (c.) " Trinity College, Dublin.
- (d.) " London.
- (e.) The Universities of Scotland.
- (1.) The Victoria University of Manchester.
- The University of Liverpool.
- (f.) (2.) " Leeds.
- " Durham.
- " Birmingham.
- " Wales.
- The Royal University of Ireland.†

(g.) Such chartered universities in the colonies as have established courses of military instruction approved by the Army Council.

For the number and distribution of commissions between the nominating units or groups, see paragraph 12.

3. Each approved university, or group of approved universities, in the United Kingdom will appoint a Nomination Board, to which the War Office will add one or more military members, who will have a veto on any selection.

* Candidates selected for the Indian Army will, in the first place, be gazetted as 2nd Lieutenants in the Unattached List of the British Army under the conditions set forth in the pamphlet "Information regarding Appointment, Promotion, Pay, &c., in His Majesty's Indian Army."

† References to the new universities in Ireland will be issued separately in due course.

The approved universities in the colonies will, until groups have been formed, each appoint a Board.

The names of fully qualified candidates who have been nominated by the Nomination Board will be rendered to the War Office by the 15th January and 15th July each year.

4. A candidate for nomination—
 - (a.) Must be between the ages of twenty and twenty-five* on the 1st of April or on the 1st of October immediately preceding the half-yearly nomination for which he presents himself.
 - (b.) Must be unmarried.
 - (c.) Must be, in the opinion of the Army Council, in all respects suitable to hold a commission in the regular forces.
5. A candidate, in addition to the military qualifications specified in paragraph 10, must—
 - (a.) Reside for three academic years at an approved university or college of the same.
 - (b.) Qualify for a degree in an approved subject or group of subjects.
 - (c.) Produce a certificate of good conduct from the head or other competent authority of the university, or college of the same, in which he has resided.

At the Scottish universities a candidate must have graduated after a course of study extended over three academic years.

At the London University, and certain others where there are both internal and external students, a candidate must be an internal student, which is defined as "one who has completed a three-years course under recognised teachers."

6. Candidates may graduate in any of the subjects, or groups of subjects, current at the several universities, with the exception of theology, medicine, music, and commerce.

7. A candidate who has graduated with first-class honours in an approved subject or group of subjects, or with other distinctions recognised by the Army Council as equivalent thereto, will, if nominated, be entitled to count one year of seniority on obtaining his commission.

8. First-class honours are defined as follows:—

- (a.) For the University of Oxford, a first class in any final school.
- (b.) For the University of Cambridge, a first class in any tripos.
- (c.) For the University of Durham, a first class in classics or mathematics in the final examination for the degree of B.A.; or special distinction in the final examination for the degree of B.Sc.
- (d.) For the University of London, a first class in any subject in which degrees in honours are awarded.
- (e.) For the Victoria University of Manchester, a first class in any honours school for the B.A. or B.Sc. degrees.
- (f.) For the University of Birmingham, a master's or doctor's degree in arts or science.
- (g.) For the University of Liverpool, a first class in the final examination of any honours school in the faculties of arts or science, or in the honours school of engineering.
- (h.) For the University of Leeds, a first class in the final examination of any honours school in the faculties of arts or science.
- (i.) For the University of Wales, the degree of B.A. or B.Sc. with first-class honours in any department.
- (j.) For the Scottish universities, a first class in any honours group, or the B.Sc. degree in pure science or in engineering, provided that the diploma of the graduate certifies that he has obtained special distinction in at least one of the subjects of his final science examination.
- (k.) For Trinity College, Dublin, the standard of silver medal at the degree examination in honours.
- (l.) For the Royal University of Ireland, a first class in any honours group for the M.A. degree.
- (m.) For approved universities in the colonies, as may be decided in each case by the Army Council.
- (n.) Any other distinction recognised by the Army Council as equivalent to first-class honours in any approved branch of study.

9. A candidate for a commission in the Royal Artillery must produce evidence satisfactory to the Nomination Board that he has duly qualified in the mathematical subjects set forth in Appendix II.

10. In addition to the academic qualifications specified in paragraph 5, a candidate for nomination must present

* A candidate for nomination to the Indian Army must be within the ages of twenty and twenty-four on the dates named.

certificates of military qualifications, practical and theoretical.

In this connection—

(1.) He will be required during his residence at the university, in addition to undergoing the military instruction, which will form a part of the curriculum of his studies, to be an "efficient" member of the Senior Division, Officers' Training Corps (should there be a unit of that corps at the university to which he belongs).

He will further be required during his residence at the university to be attached to a Regular unit for a minimum period of six consecutive weeks, and to obtain a satisfactory certificate as to his proficiency (Appendix III).

- (a.) Under special circumstances, or in a case where there is no unit of the Officers' Training Corps at the university, a candidate will be required to be attached to a Regular unit for six consecutive weeks in each of two consecutive years, or twelve consecutive weeks in one year, and obtain satisfactory certificates as to his proficiency (Appendix III). Before such attachment a candidate will be required to have been instructed in squad drill, as laid down in "Infantry Training," under arrangements made by the university to which he belongs.
- (b.) For a candidate who is an officer of the Special Reserve of Officers, the probationary period of training with a Regular unit will count as the equivalent of the attachment in (a), and such candidate will not be required to be a member of the Officers' Training Corps.
- (c.) Application for attachment to a Regular unit should be made, through the authorities of the university to which a candidate belongs, to the Secretary, War Office. Arrangements will then be made, firstly, for his appointment to a commission on the unattached list for the Territorial Force, and, secondly, for his attachment to a Regular unit. In the case of such an unattached officer, the compulsory provision of uniform will be limited to the provision of the service dress, with sword, &c.
- (d.) In the case of a student at a colonial university, an attachment for six consecutive weeks in each of two consecutive years, or twelve consecutive weeks in one year, will be required, which attachment may be to a Regular unit or to a unit of the Permanent Forces of the colony. Before such attachment, a candidate will be required to have been instructed in squad drill, in accordance with "Infantry Training," under arrangements made by the university to which he belongs.
- (e.) The attachment of a student at a colonial university will be arranged between the university authorities and the general officer commanding-in-chief, or colonial authorities, as the case may be. Certificates similar to those required from candidates from universities in the United Kingdom must be obtained (Appendix III).
- (f.) During these periods of attachment, no candidate will be eligible for an outfit allowance, nor will he receive either pay or allowances from Imperial army funds.

(2.) He will be required to qualify in military subjects at an examination which will be held, commencing on the last Tuesday in March and on the second Tuesday in October of each year, at one of the following centres, under instructions from the War Office: London, Aldershot, Dublin, Edinburgh, Portsmouth. Arrangements may be made for the conduct of the examination at any of the approved universities, provided that all local arrangements are made by the university concerned, and that no expense to the public is thereby incurred.

11. Each university in the United Kingdom will furnish to the War Office, not later than 15th February and 15th August, lists of candidates for examination in the following March and October respectively, stating the groups of subjects they wish to take up.

Lists from universities in the colonies should reach the War Office by 1st January for a March examination and by 1st July for an October examination.

The subjects* of examination, and the marks allotted thereto, will be as follows:—

Group A—

1. Military history and strategy (2 papers)	1,000
2. Tactics (2 papers)	1,500

* See syllabus in Appendix IV.

Group B—

3. Military engineering (2 papers)	1,000
4. Map-reading, field-sketching, and reconnaissance (2 papers)	1,000

Group C—

5. Military law (1 paper)	250
6. Military administration (1 paper)	250

A candidate who so desires may take up the examination in three parts. For this purpose the subjects are divided into groups as shown.

To qualify, a candidate must obtain '4 in each paper, and '5 in the aggregate of marks allotted to each group. Where, however, the three groups are taken together at one examination, a candidate may be considered to have qualified if he obtain '4 in each paper and '5 of the aggregate marks allotted to the whole examination.

A candidate who fails in one paper only of a group, but who obtains '5 in the aggregate of the remaining papers of the group, will be re-examined in that paper only. When that paper is taken on re-examination, a candidate will, to complete his qualification in the group, be required to obtain '5 in that paper. Such a paper must be taken up with any remaining group, paper, or papers in which the candidate has yet to qualify.

A candidate who fails in more than one paper of a group, or in the aggregate of a group, will be re-examined in the whole of that group.

12. Notice will be given from time to time of the number of commissions which will be allotted to candidates from recognised and approved universities, and of the proportion assigned to each nominating unit or group.

In the case of group (f) the number of commissions allotted will be divided evenly between the two subgroups. Any commissions not taken by one subgroup will be available for the other subgroup.

If any approved university, or group of approved universities, in the United Kingdom shall not be able in any half-year to fill up the number of commissions allocated to it, such unallocated surplus will be at the disposal of the Army Council, to be allocated to any other university, or group of universities, which may have qualified candidates over and above the number originally assigned to it.

To provide for such contingencies, any said university, or group of universities, may prepare a supplementary list of qualified candidates both for ordinary commissions and for antedated commissions.

13. The candidates nominated by universities in the United Kingdom each half-year will be arranged in one list, as follows:—

One name will be taken successively from the list of nominations of each university, the order of the universities shown in paragraph 2 being changed in cycle each successive half-year.

Candidates nominated by colonial universities will also be arranged in one list. Names will be taken successively, and the order of the universities changed in cycle in the same manner as for universities in the United Kingdom.

Honours men who are entitled to antedated commissions, under paragraph 7, will take precedence before all other candidates.

Medical Examination.

14. The selected candidates will be examined by a Medical Board, and no candidate will be accepted unless he be pronounced physically fit for His Majesty's Service. Boards will assemble in London, Dublin, and Edinburgh for candidates in the United Kingdom.

In the colonies, Boards will be convened by the Governor or other proper authority.

The general conditions as to height, weight, chest-measurement, eyesight, &c., are given in Appendix I.

The Board has power—

- (a.) To pass the candidate as physically fit.
- (b.) To report the candidate as unfit; but
 - (1.) In a case in which the defect can be cured by operation, to recommend that he be re-examined by a Medical Board after such operation.*
 - (2.) In a case in which the candidate is slightly below one or other of the conditions as to height, chest-girth, &c., enumerated in Appendix I, and in which the Board considers that he will fulfil them within six months, to recommend that he be re-examined at

* Such a candidate will be re-examined at the end of six months. If not then pronounced fit, his name will be removed from the list of nominated candidates.

the end of that period. A candidate so recommended will be re-examined at the end of six months, and will not be granted a commission unless he has then attained the standard which his increased age and height demand.

(c.) To reject a candidate as physically unfit.

No relaxation of the eyesight-test can ever be allowed.

Candidates who are pronounced unfit by a Medical Board in the United Kingdom under (c) will be allowed to present themselves for re-examination by an Appeal Board which will assemble in London a few days later.

Notification that a candidate will appeal must be made to the Director-General, Army Medical Service, War Office, London, S.W., within four days of the first medical examination, accompanied by a fee of four guineas, which will be returned if the candidate is passed fit. (Cheques, &c., should be made payable to the Assistant Financial Secretary, War Office.)

The decision of the Appeal Board will, in all cases, be absolutely final.

A candidate who is rejected by that Board can under no circumstances be medically re-examined, unless he be again nominated under paragraph 3.

Preliminary Medical Examination.

15. It is suggested that a candidate before commencing his course of study should undergo a thorough medical examination. By such an examination any serious physical disqualification would be revealed and the candidate probably spared expense and the mortification of rejection.

16. Candidates may undergo a preliminary examination by a military Medical Board, not more than three years before they compete, under the following conditions:—

(a.) In the United Kingdom applications must be addressed to the Secretary, War Office, London, S.W., accompanied by a fee of two guineas. (Cheques, &c., should be made payable to the Assistant Financial Secretary, War Office.)

In the colonies applications must be addressed to the colonial authorities, accompanied by a fee to be assessed by them.

(b.) Instructions will be issued for the examination to take place at the military station nearest the candidate's residence where a Medical Board can be held.

In the colonies the Board will be constituted by the colonial authorities, and will be composed of military medical officers, or, when this is not practicable, of civil medical practitioners of recognised professional standing.

The result will be notified to candidates by the Board.

(c.) Candidates must pay their travelling-expenses.

(d.) Candidates found unfit by the preliminary Medical Board are not bound to accept its finding, but may, at their own risk, continue their studies, and if nominated may then submit themselves for medical examination by the final Medical Board.

(e.) It must be distinctly understood that passing such preliminary Medical Board is solely for the candidate's information, and would give him no sort of claim to be accepted as physically fit when he is nominated by the University Board. His acceptance will depend entirely upon the report of the final Medical Board, which examines nominated candidates. Candidates may be fit for the service at the preliminary examination, but may become disqualified by some subsequent physical deterioration.

APPENDICES.

APPENDIX I.

Physical and Medical Examination of Candidates for Commissions in the Army.

I. A candidate for a commission in His Majesty's army must be in good mental and bodily health, and free from any physical defect likely to interfere with the efficient performance of military duty.

II. The attention of the Board will be directed to the following points:—

(a.) That the correlation of age, height, and chest-girth is not less than that which is given in the following table:—

(b.) Measurement of height.

The candidate will be placed against the standard with his feet together, and the weight thrown on the heels, and not on the toes or outside of the feet. He will stand erect without rigidity, and with the heels, calves, buttocks, and the shoulders touching the standard; the chin will be depressed to bring the vertex of the head level under the horizontal bar, and the height will be noted in parts of an inch to eighths.

(c.) Measurement of chest.

The candidate will be made to stand erect, with his feet together, and to raise his arms above his head. The tape will be carefully adjusted round the chest, with its posterior upper edge touching the inferior angles of the shoulder-blades, and its anterior lower edge the upper part of the nipples. The arms will then be lowered to hang loosely by the side, and care will be taken that the shoulders are not thrown upwards or backwards so as to displace the tape. The candidate will then be directed to take a deep inspiration several times, and the maximum expansion of the chest will be carefully noted. It is often attempted to conceal the true minimum measurement, but it can be obtained by a little manipulation and by drawing off attention from the examination by a few questions.

The maximum expansion rarely exceeds the average minimum by more than 2 in. to 2½ in.

The minimum and maximum will then be recorded thus,—

33 34
35 36½, &c.

In recording the measurements, fractions of less than ½ in. should not be noted.

(d.) The candidate will also be weighed, and his weight recorded on the proceedings of the Board.

(e.) Eyesight.

The regulations regarding the examination of eyesight are as follows:—

The army test types and Snellen's optotypi (1892 edition) will be used for the determination of the visual acuteness.

If a candidate can read D = 6 at 6 metres (20 English feet), and D = 0.6 at any distance selected by himself, with each eye without glasses, he will be considered fit.

If a candidate can only read D = 24 at 6 metres (20 English feet) with each eye without glasses, his visual deficiency being due to faulty refraction which can be corrected by glasses which enable him to read D = 6 at

6 metres (20 English feet) with one eye, and $D = 12$ at the same distance with the other eye, and can also read $D = 0.8$ with each eye without glasses at any distance selected by himself, he will be considered **FIT**.

If a candidate can read $D = 6$ at 6 metres (20 English feet) with one eye, a higher defect than $D = 24$ will be accepted in the other; and if he can read $D = 36$ with the defective eye at the required distance, the defect being due to error in refraction which can be remedied by glasses so that he can read at least $D = 12$, and can also read $D = 0.8$ without glasses at any distance selected by himself, he will be considered **FIT**.

If a candidate cannot read $D = 24$ at 6 metres (20 English feet) with each eye without glasses, notwithstanding he can read $D = 0.6$, he will be considered **UNFIT**.

The candidate must be able to read the tests without hesitation in ordinary daylight, and the eyes must be wide open.

Squint, or any other morbid condition subject to the risk of aggravation or recurrence, in either eye, will cause the rejection of the candidate.

Inability to distinguish the principal colours will not be regarded as a cause for rejection, but the fact will be noted in the report, and the candidate will be informed.

The degree of acuteness of vision of all candidates for commissions (including preliminary examinations) will be entered in their reports in the following manner:—

No relaxation of the standard of vision will ever be allowed.

The following additional points will then be observed:—

- (f.) That his hearing is good.
- (g.) That his speech is without impediment.
- (h.) That his teeth are in good order. Loss or decay of ten teeth will be considered a disqualification. Decayed teeth, if well filled, will be considered as sound.
- (j.) That his chest is well formed, and that his lungs and heart are sound.
- (k.) That he is not ruptured.
- (l.) That he does not suffer from a severe degree* of varicocele, or varicose veins. A candidate who has been successfully operated on will be accepted.
- (m.) That his limbs are well formed and developed.
- (n.) That there is free and perfect motion of all the joints.
- (o.) That his feet and toes are well formed.
- (p.) That he does not suffer from any inveterate skin-disease.
- (q.) That he has no congenital malformation or defect.
- (r.) That he does not bear traces of previous acute or chronic disease pointing to an impaired constitution.
- (s.) If the candidate is not of pure European descent the fact should be recorded by the Board.

APPENDIX II.

(See paragraph 9.)

A university candidate for a commission in the Royal Artillery must produce satisfactory evidence that he has duly qualified in the following subjects:—

(A.) ELEMENTARY MATHEMATICS.

Arithmetic.—The ordinary rules, with applications more especially to the mensuration of plane figures and solids. The metric system and the use of decimals in approximate calculation, with contracted methods, will be specially insisted upon.

Neither the extraction of the cube root nor the use and theory of recurring decimals is required.

Neatness and accuracy of working are expected; and the methods of solution employed must be clearly indicated. There will be no objection to the intelligent use of algebraic formulæ and symbols.

Geometry.—The elements of geometrical drawing and practical geometry.

The substance of Euclid, Books I, II, III, and a working knowledge of as much of the properties of similar figures as is necessary for plan-making, map-drawing, and simple problems in mensuration.

Algebra.—To simple quadratic equations; the elementary use of graphs, particularly in connection with linear and quadratic functions.

The papers will be set to test knowledge of fundamental principles and readiness in application to simple practical problems. The solutions of equations must be worked out to a few significant figures; and candidates must be accustomed to test the accuracy of solutions by substitution. Skill in elaborate analysis, such as the simplification of complicated fractions, will not be looked for.

Practical Measurements.

Measurement of length—verniers, calipers, micrometer screw gauge, spherometer.

Measurement of angles—use of protractor, &c.

Measurement of areas—by dimensions (rectilinear figures, circles), by squared paper, by weighing; area of cross-sections of a tube, calibration of a tube.

Measurement of volume—by dimensions (solids bounded by not more than six plane faces, spheres, right circular cones), by graduated jar or burette.

Measurement of weight—use of balance.

Principle of Archimedes—volume by weighing.

Specific gravity.

The examination will deal with the first three paragraphs in the above Schedule, with a possibility of questions for written answers on the other four.

(B.) MATHEMATICS I.

Arithmetic.—As in elementary mathematics with more difficult questions, and exercises involving the use of four-figure logarithms. Use of the slide rule.

Geometry.—Geometrical drawing and practical geometry of plane figures, including the use of Marquois and other scales.

The substance of Euclid, Books I to VI.* The special treatment of incommensurables will not be required.

Proportion may be treated algebraically, and the complications of Euclid's definitions and nomenclature avoided.

Algebra.—As in elementary mathematics, together with indices and the simpler properties of surds; graphs of the simpler algebraic functions; quadratic equations; use of graphs in solving equations, and in illustrating and solving practical questions; rate of variation of a function and gradient of a graph; graphic interpolation.

Grasp of elementary principles and readiness in practical application will be looked for, but great skill in analytical transformations will not be demanded.

Trigonometry.—Up to and including solution of plane triangles; graphs of trigonometrical functions; use of four-figure tables.

Readiness in straightforward practical applications, but no great analytical skill will be demanded.

Dynamics.—Graphical proofs of formulæ for uniformly accelerated motion—impact, work, energy, circular motion.

Statics.—Composition and resolution of forces; parallel forces; centre of gravity; three-force problems; friction; mechanical powers—e.g., lever, wedge, pulleys, &c.

Practical Work.

Experimental verification of the above theoretical work, such as the measurement of velocity, impact, work, energy, &c. Construction of the mechanical powers.

APPENDIX V.

FIRST APPOINTMENTS TO LINE REGIMENTS.

The appointment of qualified candidates to particular regiments of the line will be made on the following principles:—

- 1. A candidate having a special family or territorial connection with a regiment may, when fully qualified for a commission, apply to the Secretary, War Office, London, S.W., to be appointed to that regiment, and such consideration as can be afforded will be given to his application.

2. If desirous of waiting for a particular regiment, he must state this when making application, but he must clearly understand that he will only be allowed to wait if his claim be a very strong one, and if the conditions at the time are such as to allow of this without detriment to the service. The period for which he will be allowed to wait will in no case exceed six months, but may be determined at any moment if the needs of the army so require. After a candidate has once been gazetted on first appointment, no application for a transfer will be entertained.

3. A candidate without a special claim is at liberty to apply for particular regiments (not exceeding three in all), but will in no case be allowed to wait.

4. Where the claims of different candidates for the same regiment are evenly balanced, the first consideration will be given to those highest on the general list referred to in paragraph 13.

5. A first appointment is made strictly from the information contained in the form filled in and signed by the candidate, and according to his place on the general list referred to in paragraph 13. He is advised not to invoke the aid of outside influence, which answers no useful purpose.

6. It is neither possible to forecast vacancies nor to predict the chances of appointment, and the candidate may rest satisfied that having filled in his form in accordance with instructions he has done all that is requisite. It is a mistake to imagine that the personal or written applications of his relatives or friends will in any way further his chance.

7. All candidates must clearly understand that while their wishes will be met as far as possible, they will be posted to vacancies as demanded by the interests of the service.

THE COUNTY OF WHANGAMOMONA.

By-law regulating Heavy Traffic and the Licensing of Vehicles.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in it by "The Counties Act, 1908," "The Public Works Act, 1908," and the amendments thereof respectively, and of every other power and authority it in this behalf enabling, the Council of the County of Whangamomona doth hereby ordain and make the following by-laws:—

1. No person shall use any road under the care, control, or management of the County of Whangamomona (hereinafter termed "the Council") by the traction thereon of any vehicle for the purpose of "heavy traffic" within the meaning assigned to those words by "The Public Works Act, 1908," during any parts of the months of May, June, July, August, and September in any year.

2. Each of the vehicles enumerated in the first column of the First Schedule hereto, having the number of wheels respectively enumerated in the second column of the said Schedule, and constructed to carry, or carrying, respectively the weight mentioned in the third column of the said Schedule, shall have tires on each wheel of a width not less than mentioned in the fourth column of the said Schedule. Any person driving, or permitting to be driven, any vehicle upon any county road in the County of Whangamomona failing to comply with these requirements of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence.

3. For the purposes of these by-laws, and for the purpose of estimating the weight carried by any vehicle as in the last preceding by-law mentioned, the measurement, number, or quantity mentioned in the second column of the Second

Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be 1 ton weight of the material, produce, merchandise, or goods of description mentioned in the first column of such Second Schedule.

4. Any person authorised by the Council may, for the purpose of ascertaining if the provisions of these by-laws are being complied with, at any time examine and measure the tires of the wheels of any vehicle within, or which has been used within, the county, and may for the like purpose, and at any time, examine any vehicle, and inspect, measure, and weigh such vehicle or the load thereon. Any person refusing to permit, or in any way hindering, obstructing, or interfering with such examination or inspection, or refusing forthwith to stop when requested by any person authorised by the Council, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this by-law.

5. For the purpose of these by-laws the word "owner" shall include any person having custody or control of, whether temporarily or otherwise, or having any interest in, any vehicle, but shall not include mortgagee, unless such mortgagee have the custody or control thereof.

6. Any person committing a breach of any of these by-laws shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable upon conviction for any such breach to a penalty not exceeding £5.

7. The above by-laws shall come into operation on the twenty-first day after publication of the notification in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

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SCHOOL FOR DEAF-MUTES, SUMNER, NEAR CHRISTCHURCH.

Under the Control and Supervision of the Education Department.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of 8, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
