month, regulations were made for trout-fishing in the Buller Acclimatisation District:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 9, of the tenth day of the following month, an amendment was made to the said regulations of the twenty-seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said recited regulations in so far as they relate to the fees to be charged for licenses to take trout in the said district, and to make other regulations in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section eighty-three of "The Fisheries Act, 1908," and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke clauses numbers one and two of the said regulations of the twenty-seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and the whole of the said Order in Council of the twenty-eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and in lieu thereof doth make the following regulations for the said district:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Any holder of a license as hereinafter mentioned may fish for trout with one rod and line, and may use a landing-net to secure any trout caught with such rod and line, in the County of Buller, together with all town districts and boroughs therein, and the waters thereof, from the 1st day of October in any one year to the last day of April in the following year, both inclusive. Such licenses will be issued under the hand of the honorary secretary of the Buller Acclimatisation Society, and for every such license a fee of 10s. shall be charged: Provided that it shall not be obligatory upon the said honorary secretary to issue a license: Provided, further, that it shall be lawful for the said honorary secretary to issue licenses for the whole season to women for the sum of 5s. each, and to youths under the age of eighteen years for the sum of 5s. each.

2. The honorary secretary of the said society may issue day licenses within the district aforesaid on payment of a fee of 1s. for each day's fishing.

Regulations under "The Government Life Insurance Act, 1908."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this nineteenth day of April, 1910.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section seven of "The Government Life Insurance Act, 1908" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted,—

Direct the use of tables approved from time to time by him for determining the values of all annuities under the provisions of the said Act, and of tables so approved for payment of sums of money at death and otherwise under those provisions; and such tables respectively shall be valid and effectual so long as the same remain in force;

Regulate the mode and form of making contracts under the said Act, and the conditions precedent to such contracts in respect of medical certificates, and of extra rates of premium or fines in case of badness of lives or other contingencies declared by the regulations to be special risks;

Prescribe the mode of proving the age and identity and the existence or death of persons, and the mode of paying sums of money payable under the said Act, and the management of the accounts required to be kept;

Prescribe beforehand the terms upon which premiums paid under contracts for payments to be made at death or otherwise shall be returned to any person beneficially interested in the contract, and determine beforehand the cases or classes of cases in which no premium shall be returned;

And whereas it is expedient to direct the use of the tables hereinafter specified, and that certain of the rules and regulations now in force should be modified in manner hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in this behalf vested in him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make and prescribe the rules and regulations set forth in the First Schedule hereto. And, in further exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and acting by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, His said Excellency doth order and direct the use of the several tables set forth in the Second Schedule hereto. And, lastly, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and acting by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, His said Excellency doth hereby order that this present Order in Council shall take effect on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, and shall be read with the Order in Council made under the said Act on the nineteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS OF POLICIES TO BE INDORSED.

POLICIES under Tables nVI, nVI₅₀, and 2VI₅₀ in the Second Schedule hereto shall be subject to the following conditions, which shall be indorsed on all such policies issued by the Commissioner, and shall be in substitution for those contained in paragraph 18 of the regulations contained in the Order in Council dated the 19th December, 1908. In all other respects such regulations shall, where not inconsistent, apply to policies issued under such tables.

Conditions.

(a.) Policies shall become void if the statements of the proposer as set forth in the proposal are knowingly untrue; or if any other paper or statement furnished by the proposer, on the faith of which the policy may have been issued, is at any time found to contain any wilfully untrue statement; or if there is at any time on the part of the proposer any fraudulent concealment from the Commissioner of any important particular.

(b.) Policies shall become void if payment of the annual or other premium is not made within the days of grace—namely, thirty days from the date stipulated in the policy.

(c.) The provisions of this paragraph shall apply after the nominee named in any policy has attained the age of twenty-one years. No such policy shall be absolutely forfeited by reason of such non-payment of premium falling due after that event so long as the charges on the policy are not in excess of the surrender value for the time being. And (with respect to policies on which the premiums are payable yearly or half-yearly) no such policy as aforesaid shall be absolutely forfeited so long as the surrender value for the time being, after deduction of the charges on the policy, suffices to meet at least one-quarter of such yearly or one-half of such half-yearly premium. Any such policy may also be revived at any time not exceeding twelve calendar months after the date of forfeiture as above determined, on satisfactory proof being given of the unimpaired health of the nominee, and on payment of the premiums in arrear and interest thereon as at the due date of each premium, accumulated at a rate not exceeding seven pounds per centum per annum, provided that no charge for interest shall be less than 1s.

(d.) The amount of all premiums duly paid previous to the death of the nominee will be refunded in the case of the death of the nominee during the thirty days of grace mentioned in paragraph (b) of these conditions, if the death of the nominee occurs before attaining the age of twenty-one years.

(e.) Policies shall be exempt from forfeiture in all cases except fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation, or concealment of facts, or non-payment of premium.

(f.) Unless the age of the nominee has already been admitted by the Commissioner, the Commissioner shall be entitled to require at any time reasonable proof of the date of birth.

(g.) On the death of the nominee, notice in writing of such death shall be immediately given to the Commissioner.

(h.) Payment of any sum payable under the policy shall not be due until the expiration of one calendar month after the time when the proofs of identity and death of the nominee have been supplied to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, nor until the policy, duly discharged, has been delivered to the Commissioner or to a duly appointed officer; but it shall be competent for the Commissioner, if he thinks fit, to pay the said sum at any time after such proofs have been supplied to him.

(i.) The purchaser, his executors, administrators, or assigns, may surrender the policy prior to the attainment of the age of twenty-one years by the nominee, and a receipt given by the purchaser, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for such surrender value shall be a complete discharge to the Commissioner from all liability under the policy.

SINGAPORE MAIN STRAIT.—BULAN ARCHIP.—(a.) A reef, about 2 cables in extent, which dries, exists in 1° 2½' N., 103° 44½' E., N. wrd. of Steep Cape. (b.) A reef, about 2 cables in extent, which dries, exists in 1° 4½' N., 103° 47' E., srd. of Little Gaunymedes Isls. (c.) A reef, carrying 2½ fms., exists in 1° 8' N., 103° 48½' E., 8½ cables W. from summit of Pulo Nérup. Foul ground extends from the above position to Pulo Nérup. The drying reef nrd. of the isl. extends 2½ cables. March.

CHINA SEA, ETC.

SAM SA INLET APPROACH.—Spider Isl. Lt.-h. is in 26° 31' 2" N., 120° 4' 5" E., on Chart No. 1988, 4½ cables S. 9° W. from its charted position. The islet on which the lt.-h. is at present shown on the charts does not exist, and in place of the penin. charted on the N.-ern side of Spider Islet there are 3 islets, on the srm. of which the lt.-h. is situated. A new edition of Chart No. 1988, showing these amendments, is shortly to be published. March.

BULLOCK HARB. APPROACH.—A rk. carrying about 2 fms., with 7 fms. close around, exists in 27° 44½' N., 121° 5' E., 1½ miles N. 68° W. from Rocky Islet. This rk. was found during a search for the danger, marked by breakers, recently reported about ½ mile nrd. from this position. The latter danger has been expunged from the charts. March.

YANG TSE KIANG ENTR.—There is less water in the vicinity of Shawsheishan Isl. (31° 25½' N., 122° 13½' E.) than is at present charted. GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

Clandeboye Settlement has a frontage of nearly two miles, extending along the left bank of the Orari River to a point distant about a mile in a direct line from the sea. 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GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The Town of Pipiroa is situate in Hauraki Plains, on the west bank of the Piako River. The nearest access is by launch or steamer, &c., from Thames, which is distant about seven miles. Through-access roads from Pokeno and Waerenga Railway-stations pass directly through the town to Pipiroa Wharf, and then continue from the Kopuarahi Wharf to Turua and Kerepeehi, these roads being now under construction.

The town lands are partly drained alluvial clay-deposit, and covered with native grass, manuka, and some mangrove. Some of the sections have small, dried-up watercourses through them, which can, however, be readily filled in.

The suburban lands are also partly drained alluvial clay-deposit, and the vegetation consists of light and heavy manuka in places, rauo, cabbage-trees, native grasses, &c. There are a few dried-up watercourses passing through some of the sections, which can, however, be readily filled in.

The rural lands are similar in character to the suburban sections.

The roads will be duly formed and stopbank and other protective works maintained for a period of two years by the Department.
