Additional Land in Nelson Haven taken for the Purposes of the Nelson-Greymouth Railway.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it has been found desirable for the use, convenience, and enjoyment of the Nelson-Greymouth Railway to take further land in Nelson Haven, in addition to land previously acquired for the said railway:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections twenty-nine and one hundred and eighty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes above mentioned.

WHEREAS a further portion of the Catlin's-Seaward Bush Railway—namely, from a point in Section 2, Block IV, Woodland Survey District, to near the confluence of the McLennan and Tabakopa Rivers (hereinafter termed "the said railway")—is a railway the construction of which is authorised by the Public Works Act, 1908, and the Railways Authorisation Act, 1909: And whereas the

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister of Lands, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs,

and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, should be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the lands described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said lands should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor has, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in him by subsection one of section seven of the Native Land Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), by Warrants under his hand dated the fifth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and ten, appointed Walter Harry Bowler, of Auckland, John Bain Jack, of Wanganui, Harold Carr, of Gisborne, and Helyar Wedderburn Bishop, of Christchurch, to be Commissioners of the Native Land Court: And whereas by subsection two of section seven of the said Act it is provided that a Commissioner so appointed shall possess and may exercise such of the powers and functions of a Judge (other than those vested exclusively in the Chief Judge or vested in a Judge as a member of the Native Appellate Court) as the Governor, by Order in Council, from time to time determines either generally or with respect to any particular Commissioner or Commissioners: And whereas it is desirable that the powers and functions of the aforementioned Commissioners should be determined:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities vested in him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby, for the purposes aforesaid, determine that the Commissioners heretofore appointed shall possess and may exercise the powers and functions of a Judge of the Native Land Court following, that is to say:—

- (1.) All the powers of a Judge under Part VI of the said Act (relating to partition);
- (2.) All the powers of a Judge under Part VII of the said Act (relating to exchange);
- (3.) All the powers of a Judge under Part VIII of the said Act (relating to succession), except the power to grant probate or letters of administration;

- (4.) All the powers of a Judge under Part X of the said Act (relating to persons under disability);
- (5.) All the powers of a Judge under section three hundred and ninety-six of the said Act (relating to survey);
- (6.) All the powers of a Judge under section twenty-seven to amend any order, warrant, or other document made or issued by such Commissioner, or any record of the proceedings of such Commissioner;
- (7.) All the powers of a Judge under sections twenty-two, twenty-eight, thirty, thirty-one, thirty-nine, forty-one, three hundred and ninety-eight, and four hundred and twenty-eight of the said Act;
- (8.) All the powers of a Judge which are incidental to the exercise of any of the powers hereby conferred upon a Commissioner:

and doth hereby further determine that, in addition to such powers and functions, Helyar Wedderburn Bishop, one of the aforesaid Commissioners, shall possess and may exercise, in respect of Native land in the South Island, the powers and functions of a Judge following, that is to say:—

- (9.) To confirm any alienation of such land by a Native;
- (10.) To make a recommendation under section two hundred and thirty-two of the said Act;
- (11.) To make a recommendation under section four hundred and twenty-five of the said Act.

- (c.) No four-wheeled vehicle of any description, with or without springs, shall have tires of less width than 4 in. :
- (d.) No four-wheeled vehicle of any description, with or without springs, and with tires of 4 in. or more in width, shall be drawn by more than four horses or six bullocks.

In regard to vehicles used wholly for the purpose of carrying passengers or persons,—

- (a.) No four-wheeled passenger-coach, with or without springs, shall have tires of less width than 2 in. :
- (b.) No four-wheeled passenger-coach, with or without springs, and with tires of 2 in. or more in width, shall be drawn by more than four horses or other animals.

Third Schedule.

No vehicle, engine, or machine, whatever the width of its tires, shall itself or together with any thing or things being transported thereon weigh more than one and a half tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels.

2. Every vehicle or machine used on any road in the County of Weber for any purpose other than wholly for the carriage of passengers, and whether plying for hire or not, shall have plainly marked thereon the correct weight of such vehicle or machine.

3. Every person who shall drive, use, or employ, or who shall permit or suffer to be driven, used, or employed, any vehicle or machine upon any road in the County of Weber, whether plying for hire or not, for any purpose other than wholly for the carriage of passengers, without having plainly and correctly marked thereon the true weight of such vehicle or machine, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20.

4. The driver of every vehicle or machine used upon any road in the County of Weber for any purpose other than wholly for the carriage of passengers shall, upon the request of any person authorised in that behalf by the Weber County Council, give such information as to the load or the contents of such vehicle or machine, and the quantity, weight, size, or measurement of the same, and shall do such acts for the purpose of enabling the same to be ascertained as such authorised person requests; and any driver refusing or failing to give such information, or in any way acting in breach of this provision, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5.

5. For the purpose of ascertaining the weight of the contents of any vehicle or machine from a computation of the cubical or superficial measurement thereof, the following quantities of material shall be deemed to be of the weights set opposite to them hereunder, that is to say:—

Sawn timber	400 sup. ft.	1 ton.
Firewood	128 cubic ft.	2 tons.
Gravel or stone	1 cubic yard	27 cwt.
Bricks	500 bricks	25 cwt.

Potatoes	12 sacks	1 ton.
Chaff	24 sacks	1 ton.
Wool	5 bales	1 ton.
