*Allocating Land reserved and taken for a Railway to the Purposes of a Street in the Borough of New Plymouth.*

**A PROCLAMATION.**

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto forms part of land reserved and taken for the purposes of the Foxton-New Plymouth Railway, and it is considered desirable to allocate such land to the purposes of a street:

And whereas it has been certified by the Minister of Railways that such land is not required for railway purposes: And whereas such land is situated in the Borough of New Plymouth, the local authority of which has assented to the issue of this Proclamation:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor is of opinion that the said local authority can conveniently construct and maintain the said street:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by section one hundred and ninety-seven of the Public Works Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall, upon the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, become a street; and that the said street shall be under the control of the Corporation of the Borough of New Plymouth, and shall be maintained by the said Corporation in like manner as other public highways are controlled and maintained by the said Corporation.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in him by the Public Works Act, 1908, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that the portions of the road described in the Schedule hereto shall, on and after the date of this Order in Council, be a Government road.

SCHEDULE.

ALL those three portions of road in the Taranaki Land District known as the Ohura Road, commencing at its junction with the Poro-o-tarao-Taumarunui Road at Kawakawa, and proceeding thence in a north-westerly and south-westerly direction generally through Blocks IX, XII, and XI, Tangitu Survey District, Block I, Rangi Survey District, Blocks IV, III, II, and VI, Ohura Survey District, to a point about 20 chains north-east of its junction with Waitewhena Road, being a distance of 25 miles 29 chains, more or less.

Also that portion commencing at a point about 15 chains north-east of the eastern boundary of Section 7, Block V, Ohura Survey District, at 28 miles 14 chains from the Poro-o-tarao-Taumarunui Road, and proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction generally through Blocks VI, V, IX, and XIII, Ohura Survey District, Block I, Heao Survey District, Blocks IV, III, VII, VI, X, and XIV,

Pouata Survey District, to a point near the north-western corner of Section 40, Block XIV, Pouata Survey District, at 44 miles 19 chains from the centre of Broadway, Stratford, being a distance of about 37 miles, more or less.

*Licensing the Northern Wairoa Co-operative Dairy Company (Limited) to use and occupy a Part of the Foreshore at Mangawhare, Northern Wairoa River, as a Site for a Coal-bin.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this first day of June, 1910.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Northern Wairoa Co-operative Dairy Company (Limited), of Mangawhare, Northern Wairoa (hereinafter called "the company"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark at Mangawhare, Northern Wairoa, in order to erect and maintain a coal-bin thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 3518) showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the coal-bin: And whereas the Governor in Council has approved of the purpose for which the said foreshore and land below low-water mark is to be occupied: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the company under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the coal-bin is to be erected, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said coal-bin, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark occupied by the coal-bin, as shown on plan marked M.D. 3518.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of two pounds ten shillings, and thereafter an annual sum of one pound in advance, such annual payments to

date from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said coal-bin without payment.

5. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned coal-bin in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at its own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

6. Any person authorised by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said coal-bin and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such coal-bin, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said coal-bin shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand.

11. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said coal-bin may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the company's part.

12. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said coal-bin for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

13. The erection of the coal-bin shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the company of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

*Amended Regulation under the Government Life Insurance Act, 1908.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this first day of June, 1910.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the nineteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eight, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers vested in him by the Government Life Insurance Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), did make and prescribe certain rules and regulation for the purposes of the said Act :

And whereas it is expedient that Rule 12 set forth in the First Schedule of the said recited Order in Council should be revoked, and other provision made in lieu thereof, as hereinafter appears :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in this behalf vested in him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the said Rule 12, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulation, namely :—

"DEDUCTION IN CASE OF MINISTERS OF RELIGION.

"12A. In the case of life-insurance policies effected under the said Act on the lives of ministers of religion whose names are duly registered under the Marriage Act, 1908, deductions shall be made from the rates of premium as follows :—

"(a.) Whole-life insurances : A deduction at the rate of five pounds per centum per annum, calculated upon the whole premium.

"(b.) Endowment insurances : A deduction at the rate of five pounds per centum per annum, calculated upon the temporary insurance pure premium only.

"(c.) Double-endowment insurances : No deduction :

"Provided the Commissioner may discontinue such deductions at his discretion if the person assured ceases to reside in New Zealand."

And in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and acting by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, His said Excellency doth hereby order that this present Order in Council shall take effect on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SUMMARY FOR APRIL, 1910.

THE rainfall was everywhere below the average, except on the west coast of the South Island and in Southland. In most parts the rainfall was generally about 42 per cent. below the mean.

The outstanding feature in the meteorological records is an Antarctic low pressure, which reached a minimum of 28.64 in. at the Bluff on the 15th. Low pressure prevailed with westerly gales in the South between the 9th and the 19th. A cyclonic storm also passed off East Cape between the 22nd and 25th, and brought rain on the east coast of the North Island and heavy weather in those parts.

The temperature was below the average for the month, but on the whole the weather was not unfavourable, though the dry autumn in most parts prevented ploughing.
