WHEREAS by section one hundred and forty-four of the Land Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, resume possession of any land leased under Part VI of the said Act which in his opinion is required for any public purpose:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto forms part of land which is held under pastoral license: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, the land described in the said Schedule is required for a public purpose—that is to say, for the purpose of tree-planting:

These sections are situated on the Mangahao River, access being from Pahiatua Railway-station, which is about two miles and a half distant—two miles by the Pahiatua-Palmerston North Road, which is metalled, and the remainder by surveyed road only. They comprise all flat country, with soil of good quality on a shingle formation. There are areas of 26, 44, and 37 acres respectively on Sections 136, 137, 138 which have been cleared and grassed. The remaining areas are covered with light bush, comprising mahoe, tawa, konini, titoki, &c. About 12 acres of Section 136 is swampy.

All the provisions of the said Act, so far as applicable, shall extend and apply to the lands affected by these regulations, and to the applications and leases to be made and issued thereunder, and generally to the interests created, and the persons whose rights, liabilities, or interests are thereby affected; and the mention of any particular provision of the said Act shall not be deemed to exclude any other provision of the said Act applicable to the particular case.

Before any license is issued to any vessel, such vessel shall be approved by the Harbourmaster, and certified by him as in all respects properly equipped and reasonably fit for the purpose for which the license is sought. The Board may at any time during the currency of a license cancel same upon proof that the conditions upon which the license was granted have not been continuously fulfilled, and after an opportunity shall have been afforded to the licensee of showing cause to the Board why such license should not be cancelled.

“142. Such license shall state the number of passengers and the quantity of cargo, ballast, water, or otherwise any boat or vessel may with safety be permitted to carry.

“143. In the case of steam-vessels, the number of passengers allowed shall in no case exceed the number stated in the certificate of survey granted by the Marine Department, and the number of passengers allowed to be carried shall be painted in a conspicuous manner on a board on the upper deck of such steam-vessels in the following form: ‘Licensed to carry Passengers.’”

**EAST COAST.**—CHANGE IN FOG-GUN SIGNALS.—The Chinese Government has given notice that on and after the under-mentioned dates the responding fog-gun signals from light-stations on the east coast stations of China will be altered as described in the following instructions to light-keepers:—

“The keeper on hearing a bell, fog-horn, steam whistle, or siren, or any other sound, during thick or foggy weather, which shall indicate the proximity of a vessel, will immediately fire one gun, and after a lapse of 5 minutes will fire two guns, with the station's distinguishing interval between them; and this distinguishing signal of two guns will be repeated every 5 minutes if the vessel's fog-signal, showing that she is under way, continues to be heard.”

8. No lessee shall divide, sublet, or transfer the land held by him under these regulations, except under and subject to the provisions of Part I of the said Act.
9. No lessee shall apply for or hold more than one allotment, and such allotment shall be held for his or her sole use and benefit, and not for the use or benefit of any other person whomsoever. Any person who already holds land shall not be eligible as a selector.
10. The lease shall be issued subject to the condition that the Crown reserves the right to construct and lay down tramways, or to authorise any person to do so, through the land comprised therein.
11. All the provisions of the said Act, so far as applicable, shall extend and apply to the lands affected by these regulations, and to the applications and leases to be made and issued thereunder, and generally to the interests created, and the persons whose rights, liabilities, or interests are thereby affected; and the mention of any particular provision of the said Act shall not be deemed to exclude any other provision of the said Act applicable to the particular case.
