EAST COAST .- CHANGE IN FOG-GUN SIGNALS .- The Chinese Government has given notice that on and after the under-mentioned dates the responding fog-gun signals from light-stations on the east coast stations of China will be altered as described in the following instructions to light-keepers:

"The keeper on hearing a bell, fog horn, steam whistle, or siren, or any other sound, during thick or foggy weather, which shall indicate the proximity of a vessel, will immediately fire one gun, and after a lapse of 5 minutes will fire two guns, with the station's distinguishing interval between them; and this distinguishing signal of two guns will be repeated every 5 minutes if the vessel's fog-signal, showing that she is under way, continues to be heard."
