A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Board of the Town District of Kaikora North, in the County of Patangata, has, by resolution adopted at an ordinary meeting thereof, requested that the name of that town district be altered from "Kaikora North" to "Otane":

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section one hundred and ninety-seven of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following additional rule :—

RULE.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the rules relating to life-saving appliances, dated the 6th day of July, 1903, and the 3rd day of November, 1909, it shall be permissible in the case of such passenger or emigrant steamships as

are required by the rules dated the 6th day of July, 1903, to carry eight or more boats placed under davits, for boats, not exceeding in all one-fourth of the number required by the rules to be placed under davits, to be carried inboard, provided that each boat carried inboard is stowed alongside a boat which is placed directly under davits, and is so arranged that it can be launched promptly. A boat which is carried inboard under this rule need not be always attached to the davit tackles.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section eleven of the Urewera District Native Reserve Amendment Act, 1909, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations with respect to the mode of procedure of the General Committee under the Urewera District Native Reserve Act, 1896, and its amendments:—

PROCEEDINGS OF GENERAL COMMITTEE.

1. The members of the General Committee may meet together for the despatch of business, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they think fit. The quorum shall be eleven.
2. If not already elected, then at the first meeting after these regulations have been gazetted the members of the General Committee shall elect one of their number to be Chairman.
3. All meetings of the Committee shall be called by the Chairman, but any two members may at any time require the Chairman to summon a meeting. Not less than three days' notice of any meeting shall be given to every member of the Committee.
4. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman,

and the person so chosen shall have and may exercise at that meeting all the powers of the Chairman.

5. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present at that meeting. In the case of an equality of votes, the Chairman shall, in addition to his deliberative vote, have a casting-vote.

6. Minutes of the proceedings of the Committee shall be recorded in a minute-book, and the minutes of any meeting shall be read and confirmed at the next succeeding meeting.

7. The Committee may appoint a Secretary, who shall be paid such remuneration as the Committee thinks fit. The Chairman or any other member of the Committee shall be eligible for appointment as Secretary.

8. The books and records of the Committee shall be in the custody of the Secretary, or of the Chairman if no Secretary has been appointed.

9. The Committee may appoint any place it thinks fit as the office of the Committee, and may from time to time remove such office to some other place.

10. A copy of the minutes of every meeting of the Committee shall be forwarded by the Chairman to the Native Minister.

11. (1.) The Committee shall have a seal upon which the name of the Committee, either in Maori or English, shall be engraved or impressed in legible characters.

(2.) The seal shall be kept in the custody of the Secretary of the Committee, or of the Chairman if no Secretary has been appointed.

(3.) The seal shall be used for sealing documents which require to be sealed.

(4.) The seal shall not be affixed to any document except in the presence of the Chairman and at least two other members of the Committee, and they shall attest the sealing of the document.

12. The consent of the General Committee for the purposes of the Urewera District Native Reserve Amendment Act, 1909, shall be by resolution passed at a meeting of the Committee, and shall be given in writing under the seal of the Committee.

17. The lessee must once a year properly cut and trim all live fences now on the land, or which may be planted upon the land during the term, and stub all gorse not growing as fences, and also stub all broom, sweetbriar, and other noxious plants.
