A boat which is carried inboard under this rule need not be always attached to the davit tackles.

PROCEEDINGS OF GENERAL COMMITTEE.

- 2. If not already elected, then at the first meeting after these regulations have been gazetted the members of the General Committee shall elect one of their number to be Chairman.
- Chairman.

 3. All meetings of the Committee shall be called by the Chairman, but any two members may at any time require the Chairman to summon a meeting. Not less than three days' notice of any meeting shall be given to every member of the Committee.

 4. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman,

and the person so chosen shall have and may exercise at that meeting all the powers of the Chairman.

5. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present at that meeting. In the case of an equality of votes, the Chairman shall, in addition to his deliberative vote, have a section with

man shall, in addition to his deliberative vote, have a casting-vote.

6. Minutes of the proceedings of the Committee shall be recorded in a minute-book, and the minutes of any meeting shall be read and confirmed at the next succeeding meeting.

7. The Committee may appoint a Secretary, who shall be paid such remuneration as the Committee thinks fit. The Chairman or any other member of the Committee shall be eligible for appointment as Secretary.

8. The books and records of the Committee shall be in the custody of the Secretary, or of the Chairman if no Secretary has been appointed.

9. The Committee may appoint any place it thinks fit as the office of the Committee, and may from time to time remove such office to some other place.

10. A copy of the minutes of every meeting of the Committee shall be forwarded by the Chairman to the Native Minister.

11. (1.) The Committee shall have a seal upon which the name of the Committee, either in Maori or English, shall be engraved or impressed in legible characters.

(2.) The seal shall be kept in the custody of the Secretary of the Committee, or of the Chairman if no Secretary has been appointed.

(4.) The seal shall not be affixed to any document except in the presence of the Chairman and at least two other members of the Committee, and they shall attest the sealing of the document.
