A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Board of the Town District of Kaikora North, in the County of Patangata, has, by resolution adopted at an ordinary meeting thereof, requested that the name of that town district be altered from "Kaikora North" to "Otane":

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, and the Designation of Districts Amendment Act, 1909, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the town district now known as "Kaikora North" shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Otane," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such town district accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and ten, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-second day of August, 1910.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the third section of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, a majority of the ratepayers in the area of land described in the Schedule hereto, situated in the Counties of Piako and Waikato, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, praying that the said area be constituted a drainage district under the provisions of the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in the third section of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby constitute and declare the area of land described in the Schedule hereto to be a district for the purposes of Part I of the said Act, and to be called by the name of the "Tauhei Drainage District"; and also, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in the fourth section of the said Act, doth hereby declare that the Board of Trustees for the said district shall consist of five persons, to be elected as members of the said Board, under and in accordance with the said Act.

*Regulations under the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908,  
relative to Butter and Cheese.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of September, 1910.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section twenty-seven of the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908, that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations prescribing the standard of strength, weight, quality, or quantity of any food or drug, or of any ingredient or component part thereof: And whereas it is expedient to define the standards of quality of several articles of food and proportions thereof more particularly described in the Schedule hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereto prescribing the respective standards of quality of the various articles of food more particularly defined therein, and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall take effect on and after the sixth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

SCHEDULE.

(1.) BUTTER.

DEFINITION.—Butter is the clean, non-rancid, solid product obtained by the churning of milk or cream, with or without the addition of common salt and of harmless vegetable colouring-matter, and includes "milled butter" as hereinafter defined.

*Milled Butter.*

Definition.—Milled butter is butter made in two or more private or farm dairies, and mixed, worked, or packed together, or formed into pats or prints, for sale or shipment.

The standard for butter shall be as follows: It shall contain not less than 82 parts per cent. of milk-fats, and not more than 16 parts per cent. of water.

Allowed addition.—Boron compounds estimated as boric acid may be mixed with butter as a preservative substance,

provided that the proportion present does not exceed one-half of 1 part per cent. by weight. Harmless vegetable colouring-matter may be added to butter.

Prohibited addition.—The addition to butter of any foreign substance (including foreign fat and preservatives and colouring-substance) other than those substances allowed under this regulation is hereby prohibited.

Labelling.—Milled butter shall not be sold save with a statement or label attached on which shall be clearly written or printed on a white ground in red capital letters of a size not less than  $\frac{1}{4}$  in. in length the words "Milled Butter."

(2.) PROCESS BUTTER AND RENOVATED BUTTER.

Definition.—Process butter or renovated butter is the product obtained by melting and reworking, or rechurning and reworking, butter, with the addition of milk, cream, water, or any other substance.

Prohibited sale.—The sale of process butter or renovated butter is hereby prohibited.

(3.) CHEESE OR WHOLE-MILK CHEESE.

Definition.—Cheese is the solid product obtained by coagulating the caseinogen of milk by means of rennets or acids, with or without the addition of ripening-ferments or of seasoning-substances.

*Whole-milk Cheese.*

Definition.—Whole-milk cheese is cheese made from milk from which no portion of the milk-fats has been removed.

The standard for cheese or whole-milk cheese shall be as follows: It shall contain in the water-free substance not less than 50 per cent. of fats wholly derived from milk.

(4.) SKIM-MILK CHEESE.

Definition.—Skim-milk cheese is cheese made from milk from which a portion of the fat has been removed.

The standard for skim-milk cheese shall be as follows: It shall contain in the water-free substance not less than 10 per cent. of fats wholly derived from milk.

(5.) CREAM CHEESE.

Definition.—Cream cheese is cheese made from milk and cream, or from milk containing not less than 6 per cent. of milk-fat.

The standard for cream cheese shall be as follows: It shall contain in the water-free substance not less than 60 per cent. of fats wholly derived from milk.

Prohibited addition.—The addition to cheese, whole-milk cheese, skim-milk cheese, and cream cheese of foreign fat, or of any preservative substance other than common salt, or of colouring-substances other than harmless vegetable colouring-substances, is hereby prohibited.

*Adjustment of Loan between the Waipukurau and Waipawa County Councils and the Waipukurau Town Board.*

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section ninety-one of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is provided that where part of the area over which a special rate is made as security for a loan is merged or included within the district of a local authority other than the local authority that made the rate, then, upon the written application of the local authority that raised the loan, or of the Minister of Finance, the Governor-in-Council may adjust or apportion the liability in respect of such loan among the respective local authorities affected by such merger or inclusion: And whereas a loan of six thousand pounds for the erection of a bridge across the Tukituki River was raised by the Waipukurau Road Board, and the Waipukurau Road District has since been merged in the Waipukurau County: And whereas parts of the area over which the special rate was made as security for

the loan were included in the Waipawa County and the Waipukurau Town District respectively: And whereas the inscribed amount of the said loan is six thousand one hundred and seventy-one pounds thirteen shillings and fivepence: And whereas the notices of the proposed apportionment of the said liability of six thousand one hundred and seventy-one pounds thirteen shillings and fivepence in respect of the said loan between the Waipukurau County Council, the Waipawa County Council, and the Waipukurau Town Board were duly given as required by the said Act, and no objections thereto have been received: And whereas written application has been made by the Waipukurau County Council that the said liability of six thousand one hundred and seventy-one pounds thirteen shillings and fivepence in respect of the said loan of six thousand pounds may be apportioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby apportion the liability of six thousand one hundred and seventy-one pounds thirteen shillings and fivepence in respect of the above-recited loan as follows: The sum of four thousand two hundred and ninety-four pounds and elevenpence shall be a liability of the Waipukurau County Council, the sum of three hundred and ninety-five pounds ten shillings and sevenpence shall be a liability of the Waipawa County Council, and the sum of one thousand four hundred and eighty-two pounds one shilling and elevenpence shall be a liability of the Waipukurau Town Board.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

**T**HREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. LOCALITY AND DESCRIPTION.

Te Karae Block.

This block is bounded by the Mangamuka River, which is navigable by vessels drawing up to, say, 7 ft., giving an extensive frontage (apart from several tidal creeks which intersect the block) for easy delivery and receipt of settlers' products or exports.

The communication from Auckland is by steamer from Onehunga direct to Kohukohu, or by steamer from Auckland to Russell, thence overland from Opua to Horeke, where a steamer meets the coach. The settlers get their supplies via Onehunga.

There is a fairly good road from Kohukohu (the steamer terminus) to Broadwood, which road bounds the upper portion of the block and gives a main-road access.

The land is generally of good quality, having a north-eastern aspect and undulating from the Kohukohu-Broad-

wood Road to the Mangamuka River (practically the main river of Hokianga).

A butter-factory has been established at Wairupe (Motukaraka), distant about seven miles by the Broadwood-Kohukohu Road, a complete service with the Broadwood and outlying and over-river districts having been established by launches and by horse-carriage from Kohukohu to Broadwood.

There is a good service by ferry from Kohukohu to Rawene.

The butter-factory is opposite, direct from Rawene, where the police-station and chief post-office are situate.

The sections up the Karae Valley are extremely good, being river-flats with good soil, while the land at the northern end is particularly adapted for sheep-grazing, and the bulk of the land is favourable for carrying on the dairy industry.

For the growing of fruit, the Karae Block has one of the best positions on the Hokianga River. Grapes ("Isabella"), peaches, quinces, lemons, and figs grow in wild luxuriance. At Te Mataa (which is about the middle of the block), at Hauai (the south-eastern end), and at Mangataipa (the northern end), there are ideal places for the cultivation of any fruit (as a specialty grapes, peaches, and apples).

Some years ago a viticulturist, speaking at a meeting of the Settlers' Association at Hokianga, said that "the land was equal to if not better than the land in Italy for fruit-cultivation, and all that was required was to plant the seed—the soil and climate would do the rest."

The sum of £6,000 is now being expended in forming the internal roads of the block.
