Union of Boroughs of City of Dunedin and North-east Valley.

ISLINGTON, Governor. (L.S.) A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the respective Councils of the City of Dunedin and of the Borough of North-east Valley,

V Dunedin and of the Borough of North-east Valley, by petitions under the respective common seals of the Corporations of such city and borough, as provided by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, have prayed the Governor that such city and borough (forming one continuous area) be constituted one united borough:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, do hereby proclaim that the said City of Dunedin and the said Borough of Northeast Valley are hereby constituted one united borough, and also that the said borough so constituted is a city by the name of the City of Dunedin, and also that the said city so constituted and named is hereby divided into seven wards, with the names and boundaries set forth in the Schedule hereto:

And I do proclaim and direct that the number of coun-

And I do proclaim and direct that the number of councillors to be elected for each such ward shall be three:

And I do hereby appoint Richard Watkins Richards (the Town Clerk to the existing City of Dunedin) to be the Town Clerk and Returning Officer temporarily of the said united borough:

And I do also proclaim and declare that this Proclama-tion shall take effect on and from the fifteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

# SCHEDULE. VALLEY WARD.

All that area bounded towards the north-west by a line along the middle of the road forming the north-western boundary of Block XI, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District, from a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section No. 68, Block XI aforesaid, to Section No. 61, Block VIII, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; thence to the north-western side of the said road and by Sections Nos. 47 and 51, Block VIII aforesaid, to the westernmost corner of Section No. 62; and 48, Block VIII aforesaid, and Section No. 42, Block thence towards the north-east generally by Sections Nos. 62 and 48, Block VIII aforesaid, and Section No. 42, Block VIII, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District, to a public road; thence by that road to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section No. 85, North-east A ALL that area bounded towards the north-west by a line

Station E in Block IX, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; thence by a right line to the southernmost corner of Section No. 51, Block IX aforesaid; thence towards the south-west generally by Section No. 52 to Pelichet Bay; thence by the said Town Belt and Sections Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4, Block VIII, Upper Kaikorai Survey District, to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 5, Block X, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; thence again towards the north-west by a right line to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section, and by that section to its south-eastern corner; and thence towards the west generally by the said Section No. 5, Sections Nos. 69 and 67, Block XI, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District, across a road, by Section No. 68, Block XI aforesaid, and the north-eastern boundary of that section produced to the place of commencement.

# LEITH WARD.

Leith Ward comprises all that portion of the City of Dunedin and Town Belt of Dunedin bounded towards the north-east by Blocks IX and X, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District and North-east Valley Survey District; towards the east generally by Block IX, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District and Otago Harbour; towards the south generally by right lines from Otago Harbour along centre of Frederick Street, part of Pitt Street, Elder Street, and Argyle Street, and produced across the Town Belt; and towards the west generally by Blocks I and VIII, Upper Kaikorai Survey District.

### HIGH WARD.

High Ward comprises all that portion of the City of Dunedin and Town Belt of Dunedin bounded towards the north-east generally by Bell Ward hereinbefore described; towards the south-east generally by Otago Harbour; towards the south generally by right lines along centre of Jetty Street, and produced across railway land and right lines along centre of Manse Street, and up High Street, and produced across the Town Belt; and towards the west and north-west generally by Block VI, Town Survey District, and Block IV, Upper Kaikorai Survey District.

## SOUTH WARD.

South Ward comprises all that portion of the City of Dunedin and Town Belt of Dunedin bounded towards the north generally by High Ward hereinbefore described; towards the south-east generally by Otago Harbour and by the south-east boundary of the Town Belt, and that boundary produced to Otago Harbour; and towards the southwest by Block VI, Town District.

Caversham Ward comprises all that portion of the City of Dunedin bounded towards the north by South Ward hereinbefore described, from Anderson's Bay Road to the middle of the Main South Road; thence by the middle of the Main South Road, through Sections 13, 14, and 15, Block VII, Town District, to where the eastern boundary of Section 5, Block VI, Town District, cuts that road; thence along the eastern side of said Section 5, Block VI; and thence by the northern boundary-line of Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 18, 19, 22, 23, 26, 27, 30, 31, 33, 34, 37, 38, 41, and 42, Block VI, Town District; thence towards the west by Section 45, Block VI, Town District, to the middle of the Main South Road; thence by the middle of the Main South Road to district road in Section 39, Block VI, Town District; thence along middle of said district road of the Main South Road; thence by the middle of the Main South Road to district road in Section 39, Block VI, Town District; thence along middle of said district road to junction of another district road known as Corstorphine Road; thence along the middle of that other district road to where it intersects Section 78, Ocean Beach District; thence by the eastern boundary of Section 78 and western boundaries of Section part 20, Sections 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, and 32, Ocean Beach District, and a right line produced to Southern Ocean; thence towards the south by the Southern Ocean; thence towards the east by the east boundary of Forbury Road from the ocean to its junction with Bay View Road: thence again towards the south by the southern boundary of Bay View Road to a point opposite boundary of Sections 36 and 37, Block VII, Town District; thence to and by east boundary of Sections 37: again towards the north by northern boundary of Sections 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, and part 46, to the Forbury Road: again towards the east by the east boundary of the Forbury Road, intersecting Sections 42, 43, 44, and 45: again towards the south by the northern side of district road forming the southern boundary of Sections 13, Block VI, and 21, 20, 19, 18, 17, 16, 15, 14, 13, and 12, and north part of Section 8, Block VII, Town District, and a line produced into Otago Harbour, 10 chains beyond west side of Anderson's Bay Road: thence again towards the east by a right line to a point in Otago Harbour on the production of the southern boundary-line of the Town Belt of the City of Dunedin, distant from the middle of Anderson's Bay Road 10 chains; and thence by a right line to the place of commencement: excepting out of the land herein described an area 1 chain wide being the Dunedin, Peninsula, and Ocean Beach Railroad.

# OAMARU FIRE BOARD BY-LAWS.

By virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it in that behalf by section 43 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, the Oamaru Fire Board hereby makes the following by-laws.

# Interpretation Clauses.

In these by-laws, except where inconsistent with the context or when otherwise expressly provided,—
"Board" means the Oamaru Fire Board elected and appointed under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act:

"Brigade" means the Oamaru Fire Brigade established and enrolled under the provisions of these by-laws: "Corps" means the Oamaru Fire Police and Salvage

Corps established and enrolled under the provisions

of these by-laws:
" District" means the Oamaru Fire District as defined in

New Zealand Gazette of the 25th day of April, 1907:

"Secretary" means the Secretary appointed by the Oamaru Fire Board:

"Superintendent" and "Deputy Superintendent" mean respectively the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent of the Oamaru Fire Brigade appointed by the Oamaru Fire Report. the Oamaru Fire Board:

"Street" means any public or private street, and includes public places:

"The Act" means the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, and any

amendment thereof.

# Establishment.

1. The brigade shall consist of Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent, and not less than twelve firemen, and such number of auxiliaries as the Board may from time to time determine.

# Enrolment of Members.

2. Candidates for enrolment as members of the brigade must be physically strong men free from any defect in limb, hearing, or sight. They must be not less than twenty-one years of age nor more than thirty-two years, unless they have been previously and recently engaged as active and efficient firemen or are otherwise thoroughly competent. In such cases the limit may be extended to forty years. They must be able to read and write, and may be required to produce testimonials as to character and ability. They may also be required to produce certificate of birth or other satisfactory proof of age. They will be required to undergo a medical examination by such legally qualified medical practitioner as the Board may appoint. Members of the brigade acting in that capacity on the coming into force of this by-law to be exempt from these requirements.

# Application for Enrolment.

3. Applications for enrolment must be made in form set out in Schedule A to these by-laws, and applicants shall only

be enrolled as members of the brigade on their application being approved by the Board.

### Members to serve Term of Probation.

Candidates when approved will be accepted as members of the brigade on probation only, the term of which shall be three months. If at the end of such term the probationer shall have given satisfaction to the Superintendent, and have proved himself suitable, his acceptance as an enrolled member may be confirmed by the Board.

# Period of Service.

5. Members of the brigade are subject to the provisions of clause 4 hereof, enrolled for service from year to year subject to three months' notice in writing on either side, except as hereinafter provided.

## Appointment and Promotion of Officers.

6. The appointment of the Superintendent shall be made by the Board. The appointment of the Deputy Superintendent shall be made by the Board, due consideration being given to the recommendation of the Superintendent, either by the engagement of men not heretofore in the service of the Board or by promotion of officers or men in the Board's service. service.

### Retiring-age.

7. The age at which members must retire from the brigade shall be as follows: Superintendent or Deputy Superintendent, sixty-five years; firemen, fifty years; but the Board may, if it thinks fit, in any special cases extend these limits for a further five years, but no more.

## Care of Uniform and Equipment.

8. Uniforms and equipment of pattern and design approved by the Board will be issued to members of the brigade on enrolment, but shall remain the property of the Board; and each member of the brigade on resigning from or otherwise leaving the brigade shall return all articles on issue to him clean and in good order and condition, fair wear-and-tear only excepted, and in the event of his failing so to do the value of the articles not returned or returned in a damaged condition shall be deemed a debt due to the Board by the member of the Brigade and may be recovered by process of law. the Brigade and may be recovered by process of law.

# The Superintendent.

- 9. The duties and powers of the Superintendent, in addition to those conferred by the Act, shall be as follows:—
  - (1.) He shall be responsible to the Board for the efficiency of the members of the brigade, and all gear used in its service.
  - (2.) He shall have the power to suspend any member for breach of discipline or misconduct of any description at any time, but must at once report such suspension to the Board. The member suspended may appeal to the Board, who will hold an inquiry into the alleged breach of discipline or misconduct. At such inquiry the suspended member may be present and have the right to speak in his defence, and, if he desires, bring witnesses in support of same
  - (3.) He shall keep an order-book, in which from time to time all orders affecting the working of the brigade shall be entered. Such order-book, or a copy of the orders therein, shall be available for inspection
  - the orders therein, shall be available for inspection by members of the brigade at all times.

    (4.) He shall allot such duties to the members of the brigade as he shall deem necessary for insuring the efficiency thereof, and may withdraw any member from any special duty and allot him fresh duties at his (the Superintendent's) discretion.

    (5.) He shall keep a store-book, in which shall be entered all property of the Fire Board, the date of purchase, and the date it was used or condemned.

    (6.) He shall keep the service-record book, containing the names, occupations, places of birth, dates of birth, dates of joining and discharge from the brigade.

  - brigade.

    (7.) He shall perform any further duty in connection with his position which the Fire Board may from time to time assign to him.

# Discipline.

- 10. A member of the brigade guilty of any of the following offences whilst on the premises of the Board, or going to, present at, or returning from any drill practice, false alarm, or fire shall be liable to suspension from duty by the Superintendent:

  - (a.) Being in an intoxicated condition:
    (b.) Disobeying any lawful order of his superior officer:

- (c.) Using abusive or insubordinate language to his
- superior officer:
  (d.) Striking his superior officer:
  (e.) Using obscene language.

A member of the brigade committing either of the following offences shall be reported to the Board by the Superintend-

(a.) Wilfully damaging any portion of the brigade premises or other the property of the Board:
(b.) Absenting himself without sufficient excuse from any drill or practice ordered by the Superintendent, or from any false alarm or fire.

## Leave of Absence.

11. Leave of absence for any period not exceeding fourteen days may, on the application of any member of the brigade, be granted by the Superintendent, who shall record same in his occurrence book. Any member of the brigade desiring leave of absence for a longer period than fourteen days shall apply in writing addressed to the Superintendent, who shall forward such application to the Secretary of the Board with such recommendation as he may think fit, and leave of absence for such longer period shall only be granted by the Board.

# Brigade may make Rules.

12. Subject to the approval of the Board, and provided they in no way conflict with any provision of these by-laws, the brigade may make rules and regulations for its own government.

## Brigade Premises not to be abused.

13. Betting or gambling shall not be permitted on any part of the brigade premises, nor shall any noisy recreation be indulged in therein or thereabout on Sundays.

# Members to salute Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent.

14. Firemen shall at all times salute the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent when addressing or being addressed by them whilst on duty.

# Purchase of Stores or Effecting of Repairs to be sanctioned by Board.

15. Stores required for use of the brigade, and repairs required to any of the premises or gear, shall only be obtained or carried out by direction of the Board on requisition signed by the Superintendent. Neither the Superintendent nor other officer for the time being in control of the brigade shall have any authority to purchase on behalf of the Board nor to in any way pledge the Board's credit for repairs or material.

# Members of Brigade not to write to the Press on Fire-brigade Matters.

16. No member of the brigade shall under any circumstances write any letters or furnish information to the Press on matters connected with the Board or brigade, save that in the event of no superior officer being present the senior on duty may give particulars regarding any fire which has been attended.

# Fire Police and Salvage Corps.

17. The members of the force established by the Board under the authority of section 44 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, for the purpose of attending at fires and saving properties shall be enrolled by the Secretary as a fire police and salvage corps. The control of such corps shall vest in and be exercised by the officer elected to be captain by the members and approved by the Board. The duty of such fire police shall be to attend at any fire to aid and assist the regular Police Force, to watch over any properties saved, to preserve order, and carry out any instructions which may be given by the Superintendent or Deputy Superintendent or such other officer of the fire brigade in command on the spot. Such officer of the fire brigade in command on the spot. Such instructions to be conveyed as far as possible through the captain or officer in charge of the fire police.

# Gratuities for Volunteer or other Services.

18. For the performance of any volunteer or special services rendered by any person, whether a member of any brigade or not, in respect of any fire there may be paid out of the funds of the Board such sum as the Board or any committee authorized by the Board may direct.

# Electric Fire-alarm Circuits.

19. The Board may establish or contract with any person or corporation for the establishment of an electric fire-alarm circuit, or may take over any such circuit now or hereafter

established by the Oamaru Borough Council, and may from time to time extend such circuit and provide for the connection therewith of street alarms and public and private buildings and premises. All connections of alarms installed in public or private buildings or premises, and alterations to the same, shall be carried out to the approval of the Board at the cost of the owner of the property to be connected, and the cost of maintenance and of the periodical examination and testing of such connections shall be borne by the owner of the property connected, and all such connections shall be efficiently maintenance to the satisfaction of the Board or the officer appointed by the Board for that purpose. With the consent of the owner such cost may be commuted to the payment of such annual sum as may be agreed on between the Board and the owner.

# In respect of Fires on Board any Ship or Vessel.

20. If any brigade or any portion of any brigade established and maintained by the Board attends and performs any services at a fire taking place on board any ship or vessel, then the owner of such ship or vessel shall pay to the Board for such attendance and service the undermentioned rates as fixed by the Board not exceeding:—

Superintendent or officer in charge of brigade: First hour,

£1 ls.; each succeeding hour, 10s. 6d. Each fireman: First hour, 5s.; each succeeding hour

Each fire appliance, £2 10s.

The said charges to be reckoned as from the time the brigade leaves the station until it returns to the station.

In respect of the Maintenance of Discipline and the Insuring of Good Conduct on the Part of the Officers and Members of the Brigade.

21. No person shall interfere with or obstruct any officer

or member of a brigade in the execution of his duty.

22. No person shall aid, abet, or encourage any member of a brigade in any act of disobedience of orders, or insubordination, or in the use of a busive or obscene language while such member is on duty.

23. No person shall supply any intoxicating liquors to any officer or member of a brigade while such officer or member shall be on duty, unless he shall first have received from the officer in charge of the brigade at the time permission to do so.

24. No person other than the members of the Fire Board and its Secretary, or members of a brigade, shall enter any station unless they shall first have received permission to do so from the officer in charge.

so from the officer in charge.

25. No person other than an officer or member, or the wife or child of any officer or member, of a brigade shall sleep in or on any station or in or on any of the Board's premises without the written permission of the Superintendent.

For the purposes of the preceding paragraphs of this part numbered 21, 22, and 23 the words "officer or member of a brigade" shall be deemed to include officer or member of a volunteer five police. volunteer fire brigade or volunteer fire police.

# Penalty Clause.

Every person guilty of an offence against or committing any breach of or failing to perform any duty imposed upon him by any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be liable for such offence, breach, or failure to such a fine not exceeding £20 as the Court inflicting the same shall in its discretion think fit.

In the above table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognized as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at each of the four centres.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 593, against 651 in August—a decrease of 58. The deaths in September were 221—a decrease of 85 on the number in August. Of the total deaths, males contributed 118, females 103. Forty-eight of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 21.72 per cent. of the whole number; 42 of these were under one year of age.

There were seventy-two deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Eight men, 65, 75, 76 (three), 77, 82, 84, and five women, 65, 73, 79, 83, 84, died at Auckland; eight men, 66 (three), 68, 69, 72, 80, 82, and five women, 65, 67, 73, 79, 85, at Wellington; twelve men, 66 (two), 68, 69, 70, 74, 76, 78, 81, 82, 83, 84, and fourteen women, 65, 66, 68 (two), 71, 77, 78 (two), 80, 82, 84 (two), 87, 88 at Christchurch; and thirteen men, 66, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77 (two), 80 (two), 83, and seven women, 65, 74, 75, 79, 80, 85, 88, at Dunedin.

Te Makarini Scholarships, held at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition. One of these scholarships, to be called the senior scholarship, is open to all Maori boys not over sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination: the other two scholarships are junior scholarships, one of which is open to all Maori boys under fourteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination who have attended a Native school or schools under the control of the Education Department, and whose attendance at school during the previous year is considered by the Inspector of Native Schools to have been satisfactory; the other is open on similar conditions to Maori boys whose attendance at any school other than Te Aute and St. Stephen's during the previous year has been satisfactory. The scholarships are open to Maori boys on the conditions laid down in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Appendix to the Native Schools Code, 1908, and in amended regulations thereto, as contained in the Department's circular memorandum of 25th April, 1910. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 5th and 6th of December, 1910. Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, and while the Interest of the Interest o

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted so as to reach the Department not later than the 26th of October, 1910.
