Amended Regulations .- Leave of Absence .- Holidays.

ISLINGTON, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifth day of December, 1910.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities thereunto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations set out in clauses numbered fifty-nine to sixty-seven, both inclusive, under the heading "Leave of Absence: Holidays," in the Schedule to an Order in Council dated the second day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eight, for the classification and regulation of the Post and Telegraph Department, and also, in so far as they affect the Post and Telegraph Department, the regulations as to leave of absence in the public service made by Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations respecting leave of absence and holidays of officers of the Post and Telegraph Department of New Zealand, and doth direct that such revocation shall take effect and the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

REGULATIONS.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE.—HOLIDAYS.

THE following days in each year shall be observed as holidays :-

New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, His Majesty's Birthday, Dominion Day, Christmas Day, and the day following.
 Whenever any of such days falls upon a Sunday the next following Monday shall be a holiday in

lieu of such day

Provided that any post or telegraph office on the days aforesaid shall, in the discretion of the Minister, be open to the public for a half-hour or any longer time in the morning from the usual time of opening, and for a half-hour or any longer time in the evening to be duly announced; and that, in respect of the Saturday preceding a holiday falling on a Monday, any delivery of letters by any letter-carrier which on another Saturday would be made once shall be made twice on that day.

by any letter-carrier which on another Saturday would be made once shall be made twice on that day.

2. Nothing herein shall prevent the Minister from requiring the services of any officer during any such holiday in case of emergency; but in that case such officer shall be entitled, in lieu thereof, to a holiday upon such other occasion as shall not interfere with public business, and in such case no overtime shall be payable.

3. Every officer in the Post and Telegraph Department may be granted by the Minister leave of absence for recreation on the following scale:—

(1.) When an officer has served for fifteen years or upwards, not exceeding twenty-one working-days in each year.
(2.) When he has served less than fifteen years, not

exceeding fourteen working-days in each year.

(3.) Telegraph message-boys, seven working-days in each year, after one year's complete service.

4. The granting of any such leave of absence shall be subject to the express conditions,—

(1.) That the behaviour of the officer has been in every

way satisfactory;
(2.) That the total intermittent leave during the pre-

(2.) That the total intermittent leave during the previous twelve months has not exceeded five days;
(3.) That absence from illness or accident has not exceeded one week; and
(4.) More generally, that his official duties have been properly performed.

Any or all of the days of absence in excess of the number of days allowed for intermittent leave or sick leave may be deducted from the annual leave of absence granted for recreation.

recreation.

5. In the case of officers holding positions superior to that of telegraph message-boy, any time served as telegraph message-boy will be reckoned in computing the length of service for annual-leave purposes.

6. No officer shall be entitled to claim leave of absence as a right, and if for any cause the Secretary thinks such leave ought not to be granted, he may refuse the same in any case, subject to the approval of his action by the Minister.

7. An officer failing to apply the same of the same in any case of the same in any case, subject to the approval of his action by the Minister.

7. An officer failing to avail himself of the annual leave

7. An officer failing to avail himself of the annual leave provided will not on that account be entitled to a more lengthened leave in any subsequent year, unless under special circumstances approved by the Minister.

8. In cases of absence from illness or accident for any period extending beyond two days, a medical certificate shall be supplied, but the Secretary or other responsible officer may require that a certificate be supplied forthwith. The certificate should state the nature of the illness or accident. accident.

9. In cases of illness or other pressing necessity the Minister may grant to any officer such extended leave, not exceeding twelve months, and on such terms, as he thinks

fit.

10. The Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, grant to any officer in the Department of at least ten years' continuous service twelve months' leave of absence, and to any officer of lesser period of service any time not exceeding six months' leave of absence no officer shall be entitled to receive any annual increment.

11. Where it has been decided to dispense with the services of any officer, he shall not be entitled to any leave of absence, either at the time or in contemplation of his services being so dispensed with; nor shall any officer who retires from the service upon a superannuation allowance be granted more than three months' leave of absence immediately prior to or in contemplation of such retirement, except in case of physical or mental infirmity, when the Governor may grant such further leave as the circumstances justify.

HEREAS by Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and published in the New Zadand Gazette of the eighteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ten, regulations were made under the authority of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), inter alia, prescribing conditions and fixing fees and rates for the construction, supply, and maintenance of private lines: And whereas it is expedient to alter and amend such regulations in the manner hereinafter set forth: inafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulation numbered eleven under the heading "Private Lines" in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulation set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth order that such regulation shall be read as part of the regulations first herein mentioned, and shall have effect on and after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

WHEREAS by section eleven of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, as amended by section four of the Post and Telegraph Amendment Act, 1910, it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations for the insurance of registered postal packets of any description (whether for delivery within or beyond New Zealand), the payment of premiums in respect thereof, and the payment of the amount of insurance, provided that the maximum amount payable in respect of the insurance of any such postal packet shall not exceed four hundred pounds:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities for that purpose vested in him by the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations contained in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall come into force on and after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

SCHEDULE.

INSURANCE OF LETTERS.

1. Letters addressed to any place in the United Kingdom or in New Zealand may be insured up to an insured value of £400 on the conditions mentioned below, and, subject to

the following regulations, compensation will be paid for the loss in the post of any letter or its contents so insured.

- 2. The letter must contain bank-notes, bonds, coupons, securities, or other documents of the kind. Post-cards, packets of "printed papers" or "commercial papers," sample packets, or letters which contain articles other than documents as aforesaid cannot be insured.
- 3. A letter intended for insurance must be presented at the counter of a post-office. Letters dropped into a letter-box or handed to a postman or a mail-cart driver cannot
- 4. Every letter tendered for insurance must be enclosed in a strong envelope, which must be securely fastened and sealed with fine wax in such a way that it cannot be opened without either breaking the seals or leaving obvious traces of having been interfered with. An envelope with a black or coloured border will not be accepted. No labels may be affixed except those of the postal service. Seals must be placed over each flap or seam of the cover of the letter, and at the points where flaps or seams meet; and if the packet is tied round with string or tape, a seal must be placed on the ends of the string or tape where they are tied.
- 5. Insured letters addressed to the United Kingdom will for the present be sent via Suez only.
 6. A letter addressed to the United Kingdom and bearing on the outside a declaration of the value of the contents must be insured.
- 7. An insured letter must be fully addressed in ink. A letter addressed to initials or in pencil will not be accepted.
- 8. A receipt on the usual registered-letter receipt form must always be obtained by the sender, and on payment of a fee of 2½d. he shall be furnished with an advice of delivery obtained in the manner provided.

 9. All the seals on an insured letter must be of the same kind of wax, and must bear distinct impressions of the same private device. Coins must not be used for sealing; and the device must not consist merely of straight, crossed, or curved lines which could readily be imitated.
- or curved lines which could readily be imitated.

 10. If a letter tendered for insurance does not, in the opinion of the officer of the post-office to whom it is tendered, fulfil the foregoing conditions as to packing and sealing, he shall refuse to insure it. Nevertheless, the onus of properly enclosing, packing, and sealing the packet lies upon the sender; and no liability is assumed for loss arising from defects which may not be observed at the time of posting.
- 11. The amount for which an article is insured must be written by the sender both in words and in figures at the top of the address side of the cover, thus: "Insured for fifteen pounds (£15)." No alteration or erasure of the inscription is allowed. If a mistake is made, the entry must be completely obliterated and an entirely new one made by the sender.
- 12. A letter cannot be insured for more than its actual value. A letter of which the contents have no saleable value may, however, be insured for a nominal sum in order to obtain the safeguards of the insurance system; the fee payable will be the minimum one of 4d. for inland letters and 6d. for those addressed to the United Kingdom. Insurance in excess of the value of the contents will bar the payment of compensation in respect of any insured letter.

14. As few stamps as possible should be used to prepay the postage and insurance fee. The stamps must not be folded over the edge of the cover, and when more stamps than one are used, they must be affixed with spaces between them

15. Insured letters may be redirected to any place within New Zealand on the same conditions as registered letters. They may also be redirected to the United Kingdom, but a fresh insurance fee becomes payable for such transmission. If the fee is not prepaid, it is collected from the addressee on delivery. Insured letters cannot be redirected to any place beyond New Zealand except the United Kingdom.

except the United Kingdom.

16. Compensation for the loss in the post of an insured letter or its contents shall not exceed the amount of the actual loss or damage, and shall not be paid for a letter containing any prohibited article, or for any letter which has been delivered without external trace of injury, and has been accepted without remark; or when loss arises from tempest, shipwreck, earthquake, war, or other cause beyond control. No claim for compensation will be admitted if made more than a year after the packet in respect of which the claim is preferred was posted.

17. In case of a claim respecting the loss or damage of an insured letter containing bank-notes, bonds, and similar documents, particulars sufficient for their identification must be furnished.

18. Inland letters containing coin may also be insured.

18. Inland letters containing coin may also be insured, but the coin shall be packed so that it cannot move about. The compensation, however, for the loss of coin will in no

The compensation, however, for the loss of coin will in no case exceed £5.

19. No legal liability to give compensation in respect of any letter for which an insurance fee has been paid shall attach to the Postmaster-General, either personally or in his official capacity. The final decision upon all questions of compensation shall rest with the Postmaster-General or the Minister discharging the office of the Postmaster-General of the country in which the loss has taken place taken place.

20. Any insurance effected contrary to the foregoing regulations shall be invalid.

The soundings of 13 and 10 fathoms, which were taken practically together while the ship was proceeding at slow speed, were obtained in (approximately) latitude 25° 30' 15" N., longitude 120° 25' 30" E. Two soundings eastward of the first position gave depths of 30 fathoms; four-teen soundings between the two positions gave depths of 29 to 35 fathoms, and three soundings westward of the last position gave depths of 26 and 30 fathoms.

The ship's position had been determined by astronomical observations taken a few hours previously, and was checked

Special Warning to Mariners.

East Coast.—A copy of a translation has been received through the Foreign Office, from His Majesty's Minister at Buenos Ayres, of certain articles of a new law promulgated

Buenos Ayres, of certain articles of a new law promulgated by the Argentine authorities on the 22nd August, 1910, limiting the coasting traffic of the Argentine Republic to vessels registered under the Argentine flag.

The new law will come into operation sixty days after the date of promulgation, and masters of British ships are warned of the great risk which vessels and cargo are likely to incur if, after the law comes into operation, they are found carrying parcels from one port of the Argentine to another.

Article 1.—Coastwise shipping and trade between ports of the Republic is hereby limited to vessels under the national flag, except in cases of reciprocity with the riverain nations.

Article 2.—Foreign vessels may enter one or more national ports in order to discharge cargo which they bring from

ports in order to discharge cargo which they bring from abroad and to load merchandise for exportation in accordance with the laws which Congress may sanction and the decrees which regulate such laws.

decrees which regulate such laws.

Article 5.—Every foreign vessel which shall be caught in carrying on the coasting trade in contravention of the provisions of this law shall, together with her cargo, be liable to confiscation.

Article 6.—The executive shall draw up the regulations based on this law, within a term of sixty days from which it shall come into force, both as regards the benefits conferred by it as well as the conditions necessary for the crews and vessels, and for the personnel of the marine building-yard. It is all level, and is partly drained, and with the exception of Sections 12 to 15 and 17 to 20 inclusive, Block II, Waihou Survey District, are all in worked-out kahikatea bush, the remaining timber being of a generally light nature.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of six, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted :-

- Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
- Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
- 3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
