A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by the River Boards Act, 1908, as amended by the River Boards Amendment Act, 1910, it is among other things enacted that the Governor may, on petition signed by not less than one-fourth in number of the ratepayers of a river district, enlarge, alter, or diminish any such district:

And whereas a petition, signed as aforesaid, has been duly presented, praying that the Hutt River District, established under the said Act, may be enlarged, and that the boundaries thereof may be those set forth in the Schedule hearets.

And whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition: $\dot{\ }$

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the above-recited power and authority, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said district shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto, and that this Proclamation shall come into force on the fifteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Picton Borough Council (hereinafter called "the Council") has applied to the Governor in Council

for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore, and the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore, in order to erect and maintain thereon baths in Picton Harbour; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, marked M.D. 3605, showing the place ment at Wellington, marked M.D. 3605, showing the place in the said harbour where it is intended to erect such baths, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the same, and the area of foreshore or land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council without modification or addition: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the Council on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

after expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby license and permit the Council to use and occupy those parts of the foreshore, and the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto, which are particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon baths in accordance with the said plan, such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say: say:

1. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark required for the construction of the baths as shown and delineated on the plan as aforesaid.

2. The foreshore and tidal land included in this license shall be used solely for bathing purposes.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council the Council shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister an annual rental of one shilling payable on demand.

- 4. The Council shall, during the subsistence of this 4. The Council shall, during the subsistence of this Order in Council, provide and maintain proper and sufficient baths, with all necessary appliances and conveniences thereto, as will enable the public to use and enjoy the same, and all other advantages hereby conferred in respect of the use and occupation of the foreshore and land helow low-water mark and with or with the content of the cont shore and land below low-water mark, and with or with-out any charge for the same, and under such regulations for the decent and orderly use thereof as the Council may make; provided that no such charge as aforesaid shall be made until after the same has been approved by the Minister.
- 5. A printed copy of the regulations affecting the use of the said baths, and advantages as aforesaid, shall be put up by the said Council in such baths.
- 6. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.
- 7. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council
 - 8. In case the Council shall-

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
(2.) Cease to provide or maintain the said baths for the use of the public for bathing purposes,

the use of the public for bathing purposes, then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the New Zealand Gazette of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

- 9. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and four, and published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 78, of the twenty-second day of the same month, regulations were made for trout, perch, and tench fishing in the Southern Acclimatization District:

And whereas it is desirable to make additional regulations to provide for the netting of trout at the mouths or entrances of any rivers or streams within the boundaries of the Canterbury Acclimatization District for the purpose of numbering trout so taken in order to ascertain their migratory habits; and to provide for the allocation of numbers for such purpose to Acclimatization Societies in the Southern Acclimatization District, which are herein or may hereafter be authorized to net trout for such purpose in their respective districts:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following additional regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation 13 of the said regulations of the 21st day of September, 1904, it shall be lawful for the Canterbury Acclimatization Society to net trout at the mouths or entrances of the rivers or streams within that society's district which extends from the mouth or entrance of the Conway River to the northern mouth or entrance of the Rakaia Revier, both inclusive, for the purpose of numbering sych travet. both inclusive, for the purpose of numbering such trout in order to ascertain their migratory habits.

2. The Minister of Marine may, on the application of any acclimatization society in the Southern Acclimatization District, allocate to such society numbers which shall be affixed to trout taken for the purpose of ascertaining

their migratory habits.

3. Any person taking, by accident or otherwise, any trout so numbered shall immediately return the same alive into the water, and shall notify the fact of its having been so taken and returned, together with the number of the trout, to the secretary of the acclimatization society in whose district the trout is taken.

4. Any licensed angler catching during the fishing-season any trout so numbered shall forward same, together with the number affixed to same, to the secretary of the acclimatization society in whose district the trout is caught, or in the event of difficulty being experienced in forwarding such trout, then the anglers must forward full particulars as to the date of catch, exact weight, where trout is caught, together with the number referred to, and such particulars shall be verified and certified to by another licensed angler or responsible person.

5. Any person committing a breach of or failing to comply with clause 4 of these regulations, or any person other than a person acting under the direction of a society to which numbers have been allotted, who affixes such numbers to trout, is liable to a fine not exceeding £5.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

Generally speaking, sections for selection lie midway between the Waihou River and Piako River, and extend from the Kerepeehi-Turua-Netherton Road northwards.

The land is all excellent alluvial clay-deposit on sand, and none of the land offered for selection has any peat on it. Artesian bores have been sunk by the Department at several points on the Hauraki Plains, and very good flows have been obtained. The water is, however, mineralized, but is excellent for stock purposes. The Department is prepared to sink bores for selectors at practically cost price.

Guides will, where necessary, be stationed at different points to show selectors the various sections, but generally speaking, selectors will not have the slightest difficulty in locating each section.

All road-lines forming boundaries of sections must be securely fenced so that cattle shall not damage the drains or ston-banks.

Stop-banks, roads, drains, and protective works considered necessary will be completed by the Department. All main drains will be maintained for two years from date of ballot.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The Town of Pipiroa is situate in Hauraki Plains, on the west bank of the Piako River. The nearest access is by launch or steamer, &c., from Thames, which is distant about seven miles. 1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. New Zealand Schools of Mines.—Further amended Scholar-ship Regulations.

SIX Scholarships are offered annually for competition by Students attending Schools of Mines within the Dominion—one for Otago, two for the West Coast of the Middle Island, and three for the North Island. Of these, four will be for Students in gold-mining subjects, and two for coal-mining subjects.

2. The Scholarships will be granted to those candidates who comply with the conditions and obtain the highest percentage of marks, which must not be less than specified in Reg. 9.

3. Should the holder of a Scholarship attend the University of the conditions of th

3. Should the holder of a Scholarship attend the University of Otago no class fees will be charged, but should he elect to attend any other institution which is affiliated to the University of New Zealand he must pay his own class fees.

4. The Scholarships will be of the annual value of £50 each to successful candidates who may reside three miles or more beyond the boundaries of the Borough of Dunedin or of the borough in which the affiliated institution is situated, and of £30 to successful candidates who reside within the boundaries of any such borough, or within three miles thereof. miles thereof.

5. The Scholarships will be tenable for three years, or for such other period less than three years as may at the discretion of the Minister appear to be necessary.

6. The Scholarships will be open to all Students as aforesaid who are not less than eighteen years of age on the day appointed for receiving applications, and who shall have attended regularly at any School of Mines within the Dominion for not less than two years at least 80 per cent. of the lectures in each subject of the examination course.

7. The examinations will be held in the month of December in each year, on days which will be duly announced.

Applications from candidates, accompanied by a fee of 10s., must reach the Mines Department at Wellington not later than the 1st November in each year, accompanied by the certificate of the Director that the Student has attended the necessary number of lectures in each subject at the school for two years.
