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Districts constituted under the Marriage Act, 1908.

(L.S.) ISLINGTON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Waitara, Patea, Waverley, Wanganui, Pleasant Point, and Mount Cook Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into seven marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

WAITARA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded towards the north and north-west by the ocean from the mouth of the Waiongona River to a point due west of the trig. station on the summit of Mount Tiger; thence again towards the north by a right line to the said trig. station on Mount Tiger; thence towards the north-east generally by the southern watershed of the Mohakatino River and the summit of the range over Mount Dampier to Section No. 17, Block II, Pouatu Survey District; thence towards the south-east generally by Sections Nos. 17 and 18, Block II aforesaid, to Mount Dampier Road; thence by that road to its junction with the Mangapapa Road; thence by the last-mentioned road to the Waitara River; thence by that river to the confluence of the Makino Stream with the said Waitara River; thence by the Makino Stream to Block VII, Huiroa Survey District; thence towards the south-west generally by Blocks VII and VI, Huiroa Survey District, to the Manganui River; thence by that river to the Kurapete Stream; thence by the said Kurapete Stream to Section No. 238, Huirangi District, Huiroa Survey District; thence by that section and Sections Nos. 233, 230, 221, 215, 214, 205, and 212, Huirangi District aforesaid, to the Waiongona River; and thence by that river to the sea, the place of commencement.

WHANGAMOMONA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded towards the north generally by the Mangapapa Road from the Waitara River to Mount Dampier Road; thence by the last-mentioned road to the south-western corner of

Section No. 6, Block XIV, Waro Survey District; thence by Sections Nos. 6 and 7, Block XIV aforesaid, to the south-eastern corner of the latter section; thence by the summit of the range to Mangapapa Trig. Station; thence by the north-eastern boundary-line of Section No. 1, Block III, Pouatu Survey District, and the production of that boundary-line to the northern boundary-line of Whangamomona County as described in the First Schedule to the Whangamomona County Act, 1907; thence by the northern boundary-line of that county to the Wanganui River; thence towards the south-east by the Wanganui River to the northern boundary of Omara Survey District; thence towards the south generally by the northern boundaries of Omara and Taurakawa Survey Districts to the summit of Mount Humphries; thence by a right line to Taurakawa Trig. Station; thence by a line along the summit of the Matemateonga Range to a point in line with the southern boundary-line of Section No. 11, Block VIII, Ngairi Survey District; thence by a right line running due west to the Patea River; thence towards the west generally by that river to the confiscation boundary-line at the south-western corner of Toko A Block; thence by the said confiscation boundary-line to the northernmost corner of the said Toko A Block; thence by a line running due north to the watershed between the Waitara and Patea Rivers; thence by that watershed to the eastern boundary of Block XV, Huiroa Survey District; thence by the said Block XV and Blocks XI and VII, Huiroa Survey District, to Makino Stream; thence by that stream to its confluence with the Waitara River; and thence by the Waitara River to the Mangapapa Road, the place of commencement.

PATEA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Taranaki and Wellington Land Districts bounded towards the north-west by the Manawapou River from the sea to its confluence with the Ingahape Stream; thence by that stream to its source; thence towards the west generally by a right line to the Patea River at its intersection by the confiscation boundary-line in the Pukekino Block; thence by the Patea River to the southern boundary-line of the Omona Survey District; thence by that boundary-line to the main watershed between the Patea and Whenuakura Rivers; thence by that watershed and the summit of the Matemateonga Range to Taurakawa Trig. Station; thence towards the east generally by a right line to Matemateonga Trig. Station; thence by the Moeawatea Road to its junction with the Koane Road; thence by the

Koane Road and the watershed between the Whenuakura and Waitotara Rivers to Kapara Trig. Station; thence by a right line to the source of the Tawhiti Stream; thence by that stream to the Whenuakura River; thence by the said Whenuakura River to the sea; and thence by the sea to the mouth of the Manawapou River, the place of commencement.

WAVERLEY DISTRICT.

All that area in the Taranaki and Wellington Land Districts bounded towards the north generally by a right line from Taurakawa Trig. Station to the summit of Mount Humphries; thence by the northern boundaries of Taurakawa and Omara Survey Districts to the Wanganui River; thence towards the east generally by the Wanganui River and the boundary between the Taranaki and Wellington Land Districts to the watershed between the Waitotara and Wanganui Rivers; thence by that watershed and the summit of the range over Pukeariki Trig. Station to the north-western corner of Pakaraka Native Reserve; thence by the said Native reserve and Sections Nos. 42, 61, and 62, Block XIII, Nukumarū Survey District, and the north-western boundary-line of the last-mentioned section produced to the sea; thence towards the south and south-west by the sea to the mouth of the Whenuakura River; thence towards the west by the Whenuakura River to the Tawhiti Stream; thence by that stream to its source; thence by a right line to Kapara Trig. Station; thence by the watershed between the Whenuakura and Waitotara Rivers to Koane Road; thence by that road and Moeawatea Road to Mate-mateonga Trig. Station; thence by a right line to Taurakawa Trig. Station, the place of commencement.

WANGANUI DISTRICT.

All that area in the Wellington Land District bounded towards the north-west by a right line from a point on the sea-shore in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 63, Block XIII, Nukumarū Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of that section; thence by Sections Nos. 63, 64, 44, and 43, Block XIII aforesaid, and by the north-western boundary-line of Pakaraka Native Reserve to the north-western corner of that reserve; thence by the summit of the range over Pukeariki Trig. Station and by the watershed between the Waitotara and Wanganui Rivers to the boundary between the Taranaki and Wellington Land Districts; thence by that boundary to the Wanganui River; thence towards the north generally by a line across the Wanganui River and by its left bank to the northern boundary of the Tauakira Block; thence by the northern boundary of the Tauakira Block to the Mangawhero River; thence by the Mangawhero River to its confluence with the Rangitatau Stream; thence by the Rangitatau Stream to Field's Track; thence by Field's Track to the Waokaramu Stream; thence by that stream to the Wangaehu River; thence by the Wangaehu River to its confluence with the Rangiwai Stream; thence by that stream to its source; thence by a right line to the summit of Tuhirangi Mountain; thence towards the east generally by the western watershed of the Hautapu and Rangitikei Rivers to the road forming the southern boundary of Section No. 24, Block VIII, Tiriraukawa Survey District; thence by that road and Sections Nos. 25 and 27, said Block VIII, to the western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by the summit of the range over Trig. Stations P. and C., and by the western watershed of Porewa Stream, and by the summit of the range over Okota Trig. Station to Tiriraukawa Trig. Station; thence by the northern boundary of the block formerly known as Paraekaretu Block, and by Section No. 107, Block I, Ongō Survey District, by a road-line bounding Sections Nos. 105, 106, 51, 52, and 62, Block I, Ongō Survey District, by Section No. 56 of said Block I, Sections Nos. 57, 23, and 22, Block V, Sections Nos. 27 and 28, Block IX, Ongō Survey District, and by the Tarakiki Block to its westernmost corner; thence towards the south-west by the north-eastern boundary-line of the block formerly known as the Rangitikei Block and its production to the right bank of the Wangaehu River; thence again towards the east generally by the Wangaehu River to the sea; and thence again towards the south-west by the sea to the place of commencement.

PLEASANT POINT DISTRICT.

All that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded towards the north-east by the Opihi River from Three-mile Bush Road at the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 20125, Block XIII, Opihi Survey District, to the north-western boundary-line of Section No. 21122, Block IV, Pareora Survey District; thence towards the

south-east generally by that section and Section No. 10454, Block IV, and Sections Nos. 12448, 16677, and 17800, Block VIII, Pareora Survey District, to the Albury Railway line; thence by that railway-line to the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 15425, Block VIII, Pareora Survey District; thence by that road and its continuation, passing Sections Nos. 12242, 13744, 12875, 13516, 15830, 15877, 17304, and 19165, Block VIII, Pareora Survey District, to the road at the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 17311; thence by the road which forms the south-eastern boundaries of Rural Sections Nos. 17311, 19165, 19454, 19427, 19222, 18561, and 23283, by the road which intersects Rural Section No. 18558, and by that road continued in a south-westerly direction through Rural Sections Nos. 18559, 19552, and 19553, and passing Rural Sections Nos. 25600, 21782, and 29557, intersecting Rural Sections Nos. 23303 and 18688, and passing Rural Sections Nos. 15493, 15495, 18766, and 18768, to the southern boundary-line of the last-mentioned section; thence by Rural Section No. 18864 to the road forming the south-western boundary of that section; thence by that road, passing Rural Sections Nos. 18873, 21787, 25588, and 20970, by Rural Sections Nos. 20970, 36045, 33346, 21909, 21908, and 21906, to the road forming the north-western boundary of the last-mentioned section; thence by that road and the road intersecting Rural Sections Nos. 21906, 33141, and 36211, passing Rural Sections Nos. 30253 and 28531, intersecting Rural Section No. 33289, passing Rural Section No. 33287, intersecting Rural Section No. 21575, and passing Rural Sections Nos. 33285 and 33826, to the Pareora River; thence by that river to its source; thence by a right line to Mount Nimrod; thence towards the south-west generally by the eastern watershed of the Hakateramea River to a point due west of the source of Rocky Creek; and thence towards the north-west generally by a right line to the source of Rocky Creek, and by that creek to the Tengawai River; thence by the said Tengawai River to the Three-mile Bush Road at Section No. 31984, Block IV, Opawa Survey District; thence by that road through Block IV aforesaid to the Opihi River at the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 20125, Block XIII, Opihi Survey District, the place of commencement.

MOUNT COOK DISTRICT.

All that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded towards the north-west by the summit of the Southern Alps; towards the north-east generally by a straight line bearing south 45° east to the source of the Forbes River; thence by the summit of the watershed over Mount Chevalier, Mount Sinclair, the Two-thumb Range, and Fox Peak to the source of the north branch of the Opuha River; thence by that branch and by the left bank of the Opuha River to the confluence of the latter river with the Opihi River; thence by the said Opihi River to the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 20125, Block XIII, Opihi Survey District, known as the Three-mile Bush Road; thence towards the south generally by that road to and through Block IV, Opawa Survey District, to the Tengawai River at Section No. 31984 of the said Block IV; thence by the said Tengawai River to the confluence of Rocky Creek with that river; thence by Rocky Creek to its source; thence by a right line running due west to the eastern watershed of the Hakateramea River; thence by the said eastern watershed and the summit of Dalgety Range to Hakateramea Pass; thence by the Hakateramea Pass Road to Burke's Pass Road; thence by the last-mentioned road to Stony Creek; thence by that creek to its confluence with the Waitaki River; thence by the Waitaki River to its confluence with the Ohau River; thence by the last-mentioned river to Lake Ohau; thence by a right line running in the direction of Mount Aspiring to the western watershed of the Ahuriri River; thence towards the west generally by that watershed and the summit of the range northwards to the summit of the Southern Alps aforesaid.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the lands specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto are State forests under the control of the Commissioner of State Forests appointed under the State Forests Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and the said lands are now no longer required for State-forest purposes: And whereas plans showing the extent and position of the said lands, and a statement of the reasons why they are no longer required for State-forest purposes, have been laid before both Houses of Parliament for a period of thirty days, and no resolution has been passed by either of such Houses objecting to the issue of this Proclamation:

Governor's Order No. 198.]

Powers delegated to the Northcote Borough Council under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908.

ISLINGTON, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule below (being land reserved under the said Act), for the period of three years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), in the under-mentioned body, namely,—

The Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Northcote, acting as the Northcote Scenic Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), in trust for the preservation of scenery, and subject to the conditions and regulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

MEETINGS.

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business at the Borough Council office after the conclusion of

business at the ordinary meetings of the Council, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held during the month of February, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Mayor, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any five members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

5. If at any meeting the Mayor is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

6. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

7. The Board shall not lease any portion of the reserve, or permit any grazing thereon, without the permission of the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation having been previously obtained.

OFFENCES.

8. Every person is liable to a penalty of one hundred pounds who, without the written consent of the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation first obtained,—

- Lights a fire within the limits of the reserve; or
- Discharges any firearm thereon, or kills or takes any birds or any native or imported game thereon; or
- Cuts or removes any timber or bush thereon; or
- In any way interferes with or damages the scenic or historic features thereof.

9. No person shall, within the limits of the reserve, without the written consent of the Board first obtained,—

- Take, carry, or use any fireworks, or any explosive, or any axe, tomahawk, weapon, or instrument of a dangerous nature;
- Take or destroy the nests or eggs of any birds;
- Injure any animal, or remove any animal therefrom;
- Damage any fence, gate, or barrier, or other property belonging to or in the custody of the Board;
- Destroy, deface, or injure any inscription, or any label attached to or connected with any article, or tree, or shrub, or other plant, or copy of these conditions hung up or affixed at any entrance to or in any part of the reserve;
- Interfere with or damage any water-pipes or water-supply connected with the reserve.

10. No donkeys, sheep, or goats shall be allowed within the limits of the reserve without the written consent of the Board thereto being first obtained by the owners of such animals.

11. Any Inspector or person authorized for that purpose by the Board may drive any animal or animals trespassing in the reserve to the nearest public pound and there impound the same, and any such animal or animals shall not be released therefrom except upon payment of the usual driving fees and poundage charges. Nothing in this regulation contained shall be deemed to limit or prevent the taking of any proceedings for the recovery of any penalty or otherwise in respect of the trespass of such animal.

12. Wild cattle or horses trespassing within the limits of the reserve shall only be destroyed by persons authorized by the Board to do so, and such persons may be authorized to use firearms for that purpose.

13. No person shall, within the limits of the reserve, use any obscene or profane language, or commit any breach of the peace, act of indecency, or other impropriety, or insult or annoy any person.

14. No persons of bad repute, disorderly persons, or vagrants shall be allowed within the limits of the reserve.

15. Every person who commits any breach of regulations Nos. 9 to 14 is liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

Subsidies to Public Libraries.

Education Department,
Wellington, 26th October, 1910.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 3rd February, 1911, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 27th January, 1911.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1910; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

DECLARATION.

I, [Name], of [Place of abode], [Occupation], do solemnly and sincerely declare that I am Chairman [or Secretary, or Treasurer] of the [Name of institution]; that during the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1910, the receipts of the aforesaid institution for the maintenance of the library only were as follows: From rates levied by a local governing body under Part I of the Libraries and Mechanics' Institutes Act, 1908, or the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, pounds shillings and pence; from the subscriptions of members, pounds shillings and pence;

and from voluntary contributions other than members' subscriptions, pounds shillings and pence; that the library is public in the sense of belonging to the public, and is not under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only; that the information hereinafter furnished by me in the appendix hereto is correct in every particular; that the abstract of accounts is a true statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year herein specified; that the whole of the subsidy received during the year was expended in the purchase of books for the library; and that by the rules of the library it is open to the public free of charge.

And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and by virtue of the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908. (Signature.)

MANGAWHERO ROAD BOARD.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in the Mangawhero Road Board by the Road Boards Act, 1908, and of all and each and every other power and authority thereunto or in that behalf enabling it, the Mangawhero Road Board doth hereby by way of special order make the following by-laws, which by-laws shall come into force on the 21st day of December, 1910.

PART I.

Interpretation.

In the construction of these by-laws—

“Bridge” includes any culvert, and means any bridge connected with any road as hereinafter defined:

“Board” means the Mangawhero Road Board:

“District” means the Mangawhero Road Board District:

“Heavy traffic” means—

(a.) The transportation of any vehicle, engine, or machine which shall itself or together with any thing or things being transported thereon weigh more than 1½ tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels;

(b.) The traction of any vehicle or thing by means of bullocks, notwithstanding that such vehicle or thing may separately or together with any load thereon weigh less than 1½ tons avoirdupois;

(c.) Any other heavy traffic coming for the time being within the term as used in section 139, subsection (1), of the Public Works Act, 1908:

“Owner” of any vehicle shall include a bailee entitled to the possession and use or profit thereof.

Words importing the singular number include the plural number, and vice versa; and words importing the masculine gender include the feminine gender:

“Person” includes corporations:

“Road” includes all bridges, culverts, drains, ferries, fords, gates, buildings, and other things thereto belonging upon the line and within the limits of the road; and means roads under the care, control, and management of the Board, and any other roads as to which these by-laws are capable of operating.

PART II.

Penalties.

1. Every person who shall do or suffer, or permit, or omit, or procure or cause to be done or omitted, any act, matter, or thing contrary to or otherwise than as provided by these by-laws or any clause or provision thereof shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

2. Any person committing a breach of these by-laws, or any clause or provision thereof, shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

PART III.

Regulating Width of Tires.

1. The width of the tires of the wheels of any vehicle (whether plying for hire or not) carrying goods or produce, or merchandise of any description (other than passengers, luggage, or goods carried by vehicles used chiefly for the carriage of passengers) upon any road shall bear the following proportion to the number of animals employed to draw the same, that is to say:—

2. Nothing in this section shall apply to ratepayers carting wool, grain, or other agricultural produce (except firewood), the bona fide produce of their own farms, away from their property over unmetalled roads, nor shall this section apply to ratepayers carting stores, agricultural machinery (except traction-engines), or firewood to their own properties, or to lands occupied by them, for their own use over unmetalled roads.

3. No person shall use, or cause or permit to be used, upon any road any vehicle having tires of less width or carrying any load of greater weight than are respectively hereinbefore prescribed.

4. It shall be lawful for any official employed by the Board and for any constable to measure the width of any tire of any vehicle when proceeding or being upon any road, and to weigh and measure any load thereon. It shall be the duty of the driver of any vehicle to forthwith stop the same at the request of any such official or constable, and to keep the vehicle standing for such time as such official or constable shall reasonably require for the purposes aforesaid or any of them.

PART IV.

Regulating Heavy Traffic.

1. No person shall conduct, or permit, or be engaged in, or allow or permit to be conducted or engaged in, heavy traffic during the months of May, June, July, August, and September in any year on any road within the district of the Board.

GENERAL.

ORDER IN COUNCIL OF 13TH OCTOBER, 1910, RELATING TO THE RECOGNITION OF SWEDISH LOAD-LINE CERTIFICATES.

At the Court at Saint James's, the 13th day of October, 1910.

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section four hundred and forty-five of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that where the Board of Trade certify that the laws and regulations for the time being in force in any foreign country and relating to overloading and improper loading are equally effective with the provisions of that Act relating thereto, His Majesty in Council may direct that on proof of a ship of that country having complied with those laws and regulations she shall not, when in a port of the United Kingdom, be liable to detention for non-compliance with the said provisions of that Act, nor shall there arise any liability to any fine or penalty which would otherwise arise for non-compliance with those provisions:

And whereas by section one of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, provision, as is more particularly therein mentioned, is made for applying to foreign ships while they are within any port in the United Kingdom certain sections of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, which relate to load-line, without prejudice to any direction of His Majesty in Council given under the said section four hundred and forty-five of the last-mentioned Act:

And whereas the Board of Trade have certified that certain statutory regulations which have been approved by the Swedish Government relating to overloading, so far as regards the assignment of load-lines to Swedish ships, are equally effective with the corresponding regulations

in force in this country respecting the assignment of load-lines to British Merchant ships :

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council doth direct that on proof that Swedish ships have complied with the aforesaid Swedish regulations such ships shall not, when in ports of the United Kingdom, be liable to detention for non-compliance with the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts relating to overloading, nor shall there arise any liability to any fine or penalty which would otherwise arise for non-compliance with those provisions.

Arrivals and Departures in 1910.

Government Statistician's Office, Wellington, 20th January, 1911.

TABLES showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1910, with totals for the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The total number of persons who arrived in the Dominion during 1910 was 35,769, and the departures during the year numbered 32,361, the excess of arrivals over departures for the year being 3,408 persons.

According to returns furnished by the Immigration officers, 9,367 persons arrived from the United Kingdom, and 2,509 persons departed therefor during the year. From the Commonwealth of Australia the arrivals are returned as numbering 24,502 persons, and the departures thereto as 27,100 persons. Arrivals and departures from and to other countries were 1,900 and 2,752 persons respectively.

Of the 35,769 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 3,776, or 10.56 per cent. of the total, were children—i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 32,361 departures the children numbered 2,700, or 8.34 per cent.

COUNTY OF OTAMATEA.

SPECIAL ORDER MAKING BY-LAW.

BY-LAW of the Otamatea County Council, forbidding certain traffic unless cost of reinstating road and all bridges and culverts thereon is previously paid. This by-law shall, where not inconsistent, form part of section 3 of By-law No. 1 of the Otamatea County.

In the construction of this by-law “heavy traffic” means “heavy traffic” as defined by section 139 of the Public Works Act, 1908.

Whereas the Otamatea County Council (hereinafter called “the said Council”), being the local authority for the Otamatea County, is of opinion that the conduct of the particular kinds of traffic hereinafter mentioned will cause serious injury to the roads (together with the bridges and culverts thereon) hereinafter referred to, being roads (including all bridges and culverts thereon) under the control of the said Council: Now, therefore, the said Council, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 151 of the Public Works Act, 1908, and of all and every other power enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby ordain as follows :—

1. No person or persons shall conduct or cause to be conducted all or any of the following kinds of traffic, that is to say: the carriage of cement, bricks, sand, concrete, gravel, broken stone, road pipes, firewood, coal, timber, or use, conduct, propel, or drive any traction or locomotive engine upon or along any road, bridge, or culvert under the control of the said Council, and particularly the following roads, together with the bridges and culverts thereon, viz. :—

Mangawai-Kaiwaka Road,
Kaiwaka-Maungaturoto Road to Waipu Gorge Bridge,
Maungaturoto-Brynderwin,
Main road from Maungaturoto to Tokatoka Wharf,
Maungaturoto-Whakapirau,
Maungaturoto-Wharf and Bickerstaffe to Batley Road,
Maungaturoto-Waikiekie Road,
Maungaturoto-Wairere,
Whakapirau-Birtles Crossing,
Whakapirau-Batley,
Paparua-Pahi,
Paparua-Mareretu,
Paparua-Waikiekie,
Paparua-Wairere,
Matakohe-Hukatere,
Matakohe-Ruawai,
Ruawai-Raupo,
Tokatoka-Mangapai,

unless the cost, as estimated by the said Council, of reinstating the road, together with the bridges and culverts thereon, consequent upon the injury to be occasioned by such traffic, upon or along which such traffic is to be conducted is previously paid to it.

2. No person or persons shall drive, lead, or conduct any vehicle, contrivance, or machine containing or having thereon any cement, bricks, sand, concrete, gravel, broken stone, road pipes, firewood, coal, timber, conduct, propel, or drive any traction or locomotive engine upon or along all or any of the said roads, together with any bridges or culverts thereon, unless the cost as estimated by the said Council of reinstating the road or roads, together with the bridges and culverts thereon, consequent upon the injury to be occasioned by such traffic upon or along which such traffic is to be conducted is previously paid to it.

3. For the purpose of ascertaining the cost of reinstating the road or roads upon or along which such traffic is to be conducted, any person or persons desirous of conducting such traffic upon or along such road or roads may make application, in the form in the Schedule hereto, to the said Council.

4. It is hereby further ordained, in order to assist in guarding, protecting, and indemnifying any of the said county roads against damage which may be occasioned by heavy traffic, that the said Council, in accordance with clauses (e) and (f) of subsection (2) of section 139 of the Public Works Act, 1908, be empowered and enabled hereby to give and take security by or from any person or persons, where deemed necessary, that no special damage will be occasioned to any particular road, bridge, or culvert under the control of the said Council by reason of any heavy traffic thereon. Also for the annual or other payment of any reasonable sum by any person or persons concerned in any heavy traffic, by way of compensation for any damage which the said Council considers is likely to occur to any road, bridge, or culvert thereon under its care and control.

5. Before and traction-engine is propelled or drawn upon or across any bridge or culvert within the Otamatea County the driver or person in charge of such traction-engine shall first lay down on such bridge or culvert planks of way of sufficient length and not less than 16 in. in width and 3 in. in thickness under such wheel, for the purpose of distributing as equally as possible the weight of such traction-engine over the whole length of such bridge or culvert; and no traction-engine shall be propelled or driven upon, over, or across any bridge or culvert whatsoever within the county save on planks of way as above provided. Such planks of way shall be removed by the driver or person or persons in charge of such engine immediately after the passage of such traction-engine over or across any bridge or culvert. Every person who commits a breach of this by-law (section 5) is liable to a fine, not exceeding £5, as the convicting Justices think fit.

6. No person or persons shall make any application to the said Council pursuant to this by-law containing any untrue statement.

7. Every person who commits a breach of sections 1 and 2 of this by-law is liable to a fine not exceeding £20, as the convicting Justices think fit.

8. *Repeal.*—Clause (g) of subsection (2) of section 2 of By-law No. 1, providing for the use of 8 in. tires where the load exceeds 70 cwt., is hereby repealed and deleted from the said county by-laws.

9. This by-law shall come into force on the 1st day of February, 1911.
