A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto forms part of land acquired for the purposes of the Waimea Plains Railway, and it is considered desirable to allocate such land to the purposes of streets:

And whereas it has been certified by the Minister of Railways that such land is not required for railway purposes: And whereas such land is situated in the Borough of Gore, the local authority of which has assented to the issue of this Proclamation:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor is of opinion that the said local authority can conveniently construct and maintain the said streets:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by section one hundred and ninety-seven of the Public Works Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall, upon the publication hereof in the New Zealand Gazette, become streets, and that the said streets shall be under the control of the Gore Borough Council, and shall be maintained by the said Council in like manner as other public highways are controlled and maintained by the said Council.

W HEREAS the reserves referred to in the Schedule hereto have been brought under the provisions of the Tourist and Health Resorts Control Act, 1908, and it is expedient to make by-laws in respect to the management and control of such reserves:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act and by the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908, doth hereby make the following by-laws with respect to the management, control, and general regulation of the said reserves. serves.

BY-LAWS.

WAIMANGU SCENIC RESERVES.

- 1. In these by-laws "General Manager" 1. In these by-laws "General Manager means the General Manager of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, and includes any person who may be acting for the General Manager. "Caretaker" means the person having the general charge and control (under the direction of the General Manager) of the Waimangu Scenic Reserve. "The reserves" mean the reserves described in the Schedule hereto.
- 2. No person shall pick any flower, or break or destroy any plant, shrub, or tree growing on the reserves.
- 3. No person shall place, deposit, or leave any bottle or glassware, paper, straw, dirt, rubbish, or any offensive or noxious matter of any kind within the reserves or any part thereof, except in any receptacle provided for the purpose.
- 4. No person (except the caretaker) shall place in any thermal spring, or in any spring or pool, or in any waterace, channel, or reservoir in the reserves, any clothes or soap or any substance or article.
- 5. No horse, dog, or other animal shall be allowed within any fenced portion of the reserves; and for each time any horse, dog, or other animal trespasses or is allowed to trespass in such fenced portion of the reserves, the owner of such horse, dog, or other animal shall be liable for breach of these by-laws. This by-law shall not, however, apply in the case of dogs which are led by a cord or chain, nor to horses drawing any carriage, nor to saddled horses.
- 6. No person shall trespass upon any portion of the reserves which may be set apart for planting, or where the soil is loose, or upon grass kept cut for lawns or ornamental purposes.
- 7. No person shall break, remove, deface by writing or marking, or otherwise injure or damage any rock or stone or silica within the reserves.
- 8. No person shall bathe in any pool within the reserves unless permission so to do be first obtained from the caretaker.

- 9. Any person behaving to the annoyance of any other person shall, if requested by the caretaker, immediately leave the reserves, and may be prohibited at any future time from again entering.
- 10. No person shall take photographs, or canvass for the sale of photographs, within the reserves without the written permission of the General Manager, which must be first had and obtained.
- 11. No person shall, without the written permission of the General Manager, carry or use any gun, rifle, or fire-arm, or use any net, engine, instrument, or device for the capture or destruction of any bird or animal within the reserves.
- 12. Every person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds for every such breach.

HEREAS, there being no Harbour Board emtoned, the Sumner Amateur Rowing Club (hereinafter called "the licensee") has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore in the Heathcote Estuary, in order to erect and maintain a boat-shed and skids thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, marked M.D. 3629 (two sheets) shows ment at Wellington, marked M.D. 3629 (two sheets), showing the place on the said estuary where it is intended to construct such boat-shed and skids, and the area of foreshore struct such boat-shed and skids, and the area of foreshore intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid should be granted and issued to the licensee on the terms and conditions have instead acrossed. ditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated on sheet 2 of the plans so deposited snown and defineated on sneet 2 of the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a boat-shed and skids, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore in the hereinbefore-mentioned estuary shown on the said plan marked M.D. 3629 (sheet 2).

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister

the sum of one pound ten shillings, and thereafter an annual sum of one shilling, payable on demand.

4. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council.

Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

5. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, and the licensee may be required to remove the boat-shed and skids at his own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned boat-shed and skids in good order and repair.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said boat-shed and skids and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such boat-shed or skids, requiring the licensee within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which may be sustained by any vessel or boat in passing the said boat-shed or skids, or by contact therewith, and which may be occasioned by any default or neglect on the part of the licensee.

9. In case the licensee shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions here-

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them:
 (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said boat-shed and skids for a period of thirty days; or
 (3.) Fail to pay the sum specified in clause three of these conditions,

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the New Zealand Gazette of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined; and upon such revocation the Minister may cause the said boat-shed and skids to be removed, and may recover the cost incurred by any such removal from the licensee. then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council,

In pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section five of the Tramways Amendment Act, 1910 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of paragraph (g) of the said section five.

REGULATIONS.

1. The several tramway districts and the boundaries thereof as are respectively described in the Schedule heroto are hereby defined to be tramway districts within the meaning of and for the purposes of the said Act.

2. In these regulations, if not inconsistent with the conjust—

iext,-

"Board," "Chairman," or "Clerk" means respectively the Board, Chairman, or Clerk of an Appeal Board as hereinafter defined:
"Employer" means any local authority, company, Board, or person which employs labour for the purpose of working any public tramway authorized under the Tramways Act, 1908, or any Act repealed thereby.
"Employee" means any person paid by an employer as herein defined, and working in connection with any tramway authorized under the Tramways Act, 1908, or any Act deemed to be repealed thereby:

pealed thereby :

"Industrial Union of Tramway Workers" means a union (whether called by that name or other-wise) which is registered under the provisions of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and of which union the tramway employees or the majority of them in any tramway district are members :

way district are members:
"Minister" means the Minister of Public Works.

3. An Appeal Board for each of the tramway districts described in the Schedule hereto is hereby constituted, each of which Boards shall consist of one representative to be appointed by the employers, and one representative to be appointed by the employees of the tramways within such tramway district as is hereinafter provided, and the senior Magistrate for the time being exercising jurisdiction in such district. The Magistrate shall be Chairman of the Board, and the Clerk of the principal Court at which such Magistrate presides shall be Clerk to the Board.

4. The Appeal Board for each tramway district shall 4. The Appeal Board for each tramway district shall hear and determine all appeals arising in its district by tramway employees therein against dismissals, disratings, fines, or other punishments, or reductions in pay or other emoluments, inflicted by their employers, and also appeals on the ground of promotion being unreasonably withheld; but nothing in these regulations shall be held to empower the Board to hear and determine appeals in respect to any other matter.

other matter.

5. The members of the Board shall be appointed in the

calling upon employers and employees in such district to nominate a person to represent each of them respectively on the Board, and to send of them respectively on the Board, and to send such nomination in writing to him within a period of fourteen days from such date. The tlerk shall post a copy of such notice to each employer, and to the secretary of the Industrial Union of Tramway Workers in such district on behalf of the tramway employees in such district, and he shall send a copy of such notice to the manager of every tramway in the district with a request that it shall forthwith be exhibited in a prominent position in the principal with a request that it shall forthwith be exhibited in a prominent position in the principal carshed of such tramway, and the neglect or failure of any manager to comply with such request shall be deemed to be a breach of these regulations punishable as hereafter provided.

(b.) If there is only one employer in the tramway district, the person nominated by him or it, or

district, the person nominated by him or it, or if there is more than one employer in such district, and all such employers nominate the same person, such person shall in either case be deemed to have been duly appointed by such employer or employers.

(c.) If there is more than one such employer in the district, and if the names of more than one person be nominated, the Clerk shall ascertain the capital value respectively as shown in the last balance-sheet of the tramway or tramways belonging to each employer, and the person nominated by the employer or employers the capital value of whose tramway or tramways separately or together is found to be represented by a greater capital value than the capital value by a greater capital value than the capital value of the tramway or tramways of any other employer or employers in the tramway district shall be deemed to be the person appointed by the employers in such district.

(d.) The Industrial Union of Tramway Workers in the district shall within the period mentioned in the period representation of the process of the process of the process of the period mentioned in the period representation of the process of t

the district shall within the period mentioned in the notice referred to in subclause (a) hereof take such steps as it thinks fit to ascertain from the employees in the transway district what person is appointed by them to represent them on the Board, and the secretary of such union shall in writing within such period notify the Clerk of the name of the person so appointed.

6. The members of the Board appointed by the employers and employees respectively shall hold office for a period of three years from the date of their appointment, and shall be eligible for reappointment.

7. If any member appointed either by the employers or

(a.) Dies, resigns, is an undischarged bankrupt, becomes bankrupt, or is convicted of any crime, or is of unsound mind, or is an alien; or
(b.) Is proved to be guilty of inciting any industrial union or employee to commit any breach of an industrial agreement or award; or
(c.) Is absent from three consecutive meetings of the Board

Board---

his office shall in any such case become vacant, and the vacancy thereby caused shall be deemed to be a casual vacancy.

8. Every casual vacancy shall be filled by the same appointing authority, and as far as practicable in the same manner and subject to the same provisions as in the case of the vacating member, and the person so appointed shall hold office for the residue of the term of the vacating member. Then any casual vacancy being reported to the Clork hold omce for the residue of the term of the vacating member. Upon any casual vacancy being reported to the Clerk, he shall take such action as may be necessary in terms of clause 5 hereof to procure the appointment of another member to fill such vacancy.

9. The presence of the Chairman and of at least one of the other members of the Board shall be necessary to constitute a quorum at every meeting of the Board.

10. In all matters coming before the Board, the decision of the Board shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members present, except in the case of an equality of votes, in which case the Chairman shall have

casting-vote. 11. The Board way, subject to clause 9 hereof, act not

11. The Board may, subject to clause 9 hereof, act not-withstanding any vacancy in its body, and in no case shall any act of the Board be questioned on the grounds of any informality in the appointment of a member, or on the ground that the seat of any member is vacant, or that any supposed member is incapable of being a member.

12. In the case of the illness or unavoidable absence of the Chairman of the Board, the Governor shall appoint some other Magistrate to act as Chairman during such illness or absence, and in the case of the illness or unavoidable absence of either of the other members of the Board, or in the event of the employers or employees neglecting or failing to appoint a member of the Board, the Governor may in any such case temporarily appoint some following manner:

(a.) The Clerk shall, not later than the 28th day of February, 1911, and thereafter from time to time whenever it may be necessary, as vacancies in the Board occur, publish a notice in some newspaper circulating in the tramway district suitable person to act as a member of the Board during

the illness or absence of such member as aforesaid, or until such time as the employers or employees appoint such member; and the person so appointed shall, while acting upon the Board, have all the powers of a member

acting upon the Board, have all the powers of a member duly appointed by the employers or employees.

13. In the event of any dispute or question arising as to the meaning of these regulations, or of any portion thereof, the same shall be referred to the Minister for determination, and his decision shall be final and conclusive; but all questions as to matters of form or admissibility of evidence, and all other questions arising out of or in connection with any appeal, shall be decided by the Board.

14. The Board shall, in respect of appeals hereunder, have all the powers of a Commission appointed under the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, and may in its discretion accept or reject any evidence (whether legal or otherwise), and may also permit any employer or appellant to be represented by solicitor, counsel, or agent; and all evidence shall be on oath, or in such other manner as is permitted by law.

permitted by law.

15. It shall be the duty of the Clerk—

(a.) To receive, register, and deal with all appeals within the tramway district of which he is Clerk:

Clerk:

(b.) To convene the Board for the purpose of dealing with such appeals:

(c.) To keep a register in which shall be entered the particulars of such appeals and the determination of the Board thereon. Such register shall at all times be open to the perusal of any member of the Board, and of the Minister, or of such person as he may appoint, or of the employer, or of the secretary of the Industrial Union of Tramway Workers of the district:

(d.) To obtain the signature of the Chairman to all entries in such register in proof of their correctness:

ness :

ness:

(c.) To give notice of any appeal to any employer concerned therein, and to forward a copy of any determination of the Board thereon to the appellant, to the employer, and to the Minister respectively; and in addition to forward to the Minister particulars of the matter appealed against.

against:

(/.) To issue all summonses to witnesses, and to issue all notices and perform all other acts in connection with the sittings of the Board as the

Chairman directs.

16. Appeals shall be heard at such convenient times and places as the Chairman may from time to time deter-

nine.

17. No appeal shall be heard or determined by the Board which purports to take exception to any of the matters mentioned in subsection (2) of section 6 of the Tramways Amendment Act, 1910, constituting a ground of appeal thereunder if the same occurred at a time earlier than the 1st day of January, 1911.

18. With respect of every appeal the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) Every appeal shall be commenced by notice of

(a.) Every appeal shall be commenced by notice of appeal addressed to the Chairman of the Appeal Board of the tramway district within which

- appeal addressed to the Chairman of the Appeal Board of the tramway district within which the matter concerning such appeal has arisen.

 (b.) Such notice may be in the form of an ordinary letter, and shall set forth clearly the grounds of appeal, the date or dates when the subject-matter of such appeal arose, and the name of the employer against whose decision such appeal is made; but such appeal must in every case be a matter personally affecting the appellant himself. Copies of the correspondence or other documents, if any, or statements of fact relating to the dispute, verified by statutory declaration, shall be attached to the notice of appeal.

 (c.) A copy of the notice of appeal, together with a copy of the correspondence or other documents as mentioned in the last subclause, shall be served on the employer by the appellant.

 (d.) The Board may decline to hear any appeal which does not comply with the foregoing conditions, or which it considers to be frivolous or irrelevant.

19. On the hearing of any appeal the Board may, if it thinks fit, adjourn the consideration thereof if of opinion that it is desirable so to do.

20. The Chairman may in his discretion, at the instance of either party, order that such books, papers, or other documents as are in the possession of the other party to the appeal shall be produced by him for the information of the Board.

21. Subject to the provisions of these regulations the Board may regulate its own procedure.

22. If any person, body, or company commits a breach of any of these regulations, such person, body, or company shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20 for any such breach.

Regulations under the New Zealand State-guaranteed Advances Act, 1909 (Advances to Local Authorities).

ISLINGTON, Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this second day of February, 1911.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE J. A. MILLAR PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the New Zealand Stateguaranteed Advances Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made under the said Act on the fourteenth day of March, 1910, and the fourth day of July, 1910, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations, and doth declare that those regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING LOANS TO LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

1. The term of any loan granted to a local authority under the said Act shall be thirty-six years and a half.

2. The principal and interest of every such loan shall be payable by half-yearly instalments in accordance with such one of the tables contained in the First Schedule hereto (or hereafter prescribed by any regulations made in that behalf) as is appropriate to the case.

3. Any local authority may, before making an application for a loan in manner hereinafter provided, and although it has not yet taken the necessary steps under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, and its amendments, or otherwise, for obtaining sufficient authority to raise that loan, make a preliminary application to the Board in the Form No. 1 in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, for the provisional approval of the proposed loan by the Board. Every such preliminary application shall be transmitted by post or otherwise to the Superintendent of the New Zealand State-guaranteed Advances Office at Wellington, and shall be accompanied by a copy of the last balance-sheet of the local authority.

4. The Board shall thereupon take this preliminary application into consideration, and may either refuse to entertain the proposal or may agree to entertain it on such terms and with such modifications (if any) as it thinks fit.

5. If the Board decides to entertain the said proposal, notice of the decision shall be given to the local authority in the Form No. 2 in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, in order that the local authority may take such steps under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, and its amendments, or otherwise, as may be necessary for the purpose of obtaining sufficient authority to raise the loan, and for the making of the special rate required as security for the loan.

6. No such provisional approval by the Board shall be deemed to constitute any agreement between the Board or Superintendent and the local authority, or shall affect in any manner the right of the Board to refuse to grant the loan, or its right to impose any conditions on the grant thereof.

7. Every such provisional approval shall lapse unless an application for the loan so approved is made by the local authority in manner hereinafter provided, and received by the Superintendent within twelve months after the date of the decision of the Board approving of the proposed loan.

8. When the Board has provisionally approved of any loan in manner aforesaid the local authority may make application to the Board for the grant of the loan in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in the notice of provisional approval. Every such application shall be in such one of the forms Nos. 3, 4, or 5 in the Second Schedule hereto as is applicable, or to the like effect, and shall be verified by a statutory declaration in the Form No. 6 in the said Schedule. Every such application shall be transmitted by post or otherwise to the Superintendent at Wellington.

9. No such application for a loan shall be made until the local authority has taken all necessary steps under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, and its amendments, or otherwise, for obtaining sufficient authority to raise the loan, and has duly made the special rate required as security for the loan.

10. The Board may, if it thinks fit, in special cases accept an application for a loan although no preliminary application or approval has been made or obtained in accordance with the foregoing regulations, or although the application does not conform to the terms and conditions provisionally approved by the Board.

11. Every application for a loan shall be taken into consideration by the Board, which shall by resolution either grant or refuse the application; and notice of the acceptance or refusal of the application shall thereupon be given to the local authority.

12. Every such notice of acceptance shall constitute a contract between the Superintendent and the Corporation of the local authority to grant and accept the loan in accordance with the terms of the application.

13. The term of the loan shall commence on the date on which the money leaves the Advances Office, and the loan shall be deemed to be paid to the local authority on that date, notwithstanding any default by the local authority in accepting the amount of the loan or in fulfilling the conditions of the receipt thereof; and the dates of the payment of principal and interest by the local authority shall be computed and determined accordingly.

14. Any loan may, if so agreed upon, be made payable to the local authority by instalments, and in any such case each instalment shall for the purpose of calculating the term of the loan and the payments of principal and interest in respect thereof be deemed to constitute a separate loan made on the day on which that instalment is paid to the local authority. No instalment shall be less than £100, and no loan shall be divided into more than five instalments without the consent of the Board.

15. No loan and no instalment of a loan shall be paid to a local authority at any date later than two years after the date of the application for the loan, except in special cases where the period may be extended by the Board to four years with the consent of the Minister.

16. The debentures issued by the local authority in respect of the loan shall be in the Form No. 7 in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

17. Every such debenture shall be executed in pursuance of a resolution of the local authority, and shall be signed by the Mayor or Chairman of the local authority, and countersigned by an officer appointed by the local authority for that purpose. The due execution of every such debenture shall be verified by statutory declaration in the Form No. 8 in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

18. A commission fee of one-half per centum on the amount of the loan shall be payable to the Superintendent by the local authority to whom the loan is granted. The said fee shall be paid at the time when the amount of the loan is paid to the local authority; but where the loan is paid to the local authority by instalments, the commission fee shall be apportioned between those instalments, and a proportionate part thereof shall be paid by the local authority at the time when each instalment is received by it.

RULES AND BY-LAWS OF THE THAMES STOCK EXCHANGE.

Constitution.

1. The Thames Stock Exchange (hereinafter called "the Exchange") shall consist of members engaged in the purchase or sale of shares, debentures, mines, and mining interests, the negotiation of mortgages, and monetary transactions. No member shall be a member of any other exchange in Thames engaged in the same business.

OBJECTS.

Objects and purposes.

2. The objects and purposes of the Exchange are to provide, regulate, and maintain a suitable building, room, or rooms in Thames for the promotion and facilitation of dealing in stocks, shares, and monetary transactions; to establish just and equitable principles in the transaction of business; to adjust controversies between its members; and to main to adjust controversies between its members; and to maintain uniformity in its rules and usages.

MEMBERS.

Number of members.

3. The number of members shall be limited to twenty.

MANAGEMENT.

Office-bearers.

4. The office-bearers shall be a Chairman, Secretary, and a Committee consisting of five. The Chairman and Secretary to be ex officio members of Committee.

5. In the event of any member of Committee being absent from three consecutive meetings of the Committee without leave of the Chairman or, in his absence, the Secretary, his seat thereon shall be declared vacant. Secretary to give notice of meetings not later than the day before.

Retiring office-bearers.

Retiring office-bearers.

6. At every annual general meeting the whole of the office-bearers shall retire, and their places shall be filled up at such annual meeting. Such election shall take place by ballot. All such retiring office-bearers shall be eligible for re-election without notice, but any other member wishing to become an office-bearer shall be proposed in writing by one member and seconded by another, and notice given to the Secretary seven days at least before the day fixed for the annual meeting.

Members restricted from acting in certain cases.

7. A member of the Committee shall not act at a meeting on any case in which he is personally interested, or be entitled to vote at any subsequent meeting of members dealing with the matter.

3. A member of the Committee shall not take part in any of its meetings pending the investigation of a charge affecting himself.

ing himself.

Surviving members may act.

9. The surviving or continuing members on the Committee, notwithstanding any vacancy in their number, may act until the vacancy be filled up.

Majority to rule.

10. At meetings of the Committee all questions shall be decided by a majority of the members present.

Quorum.

11. The quorum of the Committee shall be four (4).

SECRETARY.

Acting-secretary.

12. In the absence of the Secretary from any meeting the Chairman shall carry out his duties, or may appoint another member to do so.

TREASURER.

13. The Secretary shall keep the accounts and act as Treasurer, and shall have the custody of all books and papers. He shall present at each annual general meeting a statement of the finances of the Exchange to the end of the previous year, duly audited by a member appointed by the members for that purpose.

CHAIRMAN.

Absence of Chairman and Secretary.

14. The Chairman or, in his absence, the Secretary shall preside at all meetings of the Exchange and of the Committee; but in the event of both being absent the members present shall elect a chairman for that occasion.

Powers

15. The chairman of any meeting shall have entire control thereof, and shall regulate the order and manner in which the business shall be conducted. The decision of the chairman shall be final in all cases submitted to him.

Casting-vote.

16. In all cases at any meeting, when on a division the votes are equal, the chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

Members to be fined.

17. In the event of any member or members obstructing the business of the meeting, or being guilty of any breach of etiquette, of which the chairman shall be the sole judge, the chairman shall report the matter to the Committee, who shall have power to inflict such fine, not exceeding £5, as they may deem advisable.

OFFICIAL VACANCY.

Occasional official vacancies to be filled up.

18. Any occasional vacancy in the Committee, or in the position of Chairman or Secretary, shall be filled at a special general meeting of the members to be summoned by the Committee for that purpose without unnecessary delay.

Annual General Meeting and Special General MEETINGS.

Business and powers of annual general meeting.

- 19. The financial year of the Exchange shall close on the 30th day of November. A general meeting of members shall be held annually in the month of December, at which the business shall be to receive from the Treasurer a balance-sheet showing the financial position of the Exchange, to elect a Committee and officers for the ensuing year, and also generally to conduct any business provided for in these
- 20. At any annual general meeting, after all business herein provided for shall have been disposed of, it shall be competent for any member to bring under the notice of the meeting any business or matter within the object or purposes of the Exchange, and to give notice of any proposition to be considered at a future meeting.

Committee may call a special general meeting.

21. A special general meeting may be called by the Committee at any time.

Any four members may call a special general meeting.

22. A special general meeting shall be called by the Committee upon the receipt of a requisition addressed to the Secretary requesting them to do so, signed by at least four members, and stating the business for which such meeting is required; and if the same shall not be convened within seven days from the time of such requisition being so left with the Secretary the requisitionists or any four members. with the Secretary, the requisitionists, or any four members, may themselves convene a meeting by giving the required notice at an official meeting.

Notice required for a special general meeting.

23. A special general meeting can only be held after at least twenty-four hours' notice has been given by announcement at an official meeting, specifying the day and hour of the meeting and the general nature of the business to be considered.

Business at special general meetings limited.

24. No other business shall be transacted at a special general meeting, except that stated in the notice convening the meeting, and no resolution shall be passed, or other business transacted, which is not included within the ob-jects and purposes for which the meeting is convened. No amendment shall be allowed upon any resolution contained in the notice convening any meeting not directly pertinent

Adjournment of general meetings.

25. Any general meeting shall have power, inter se, to adjourn from time to time as may be found necessary. Whenever an adjournment to a future day has been decided upon notice thereof shall be given in such manner as may be de-termined by the chairman of the meeting. No business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting so adjourned.

Voting majority to rule.

26. Every member shall have one vote, and all questions shall be decided by a majority of the members present and voting, except in the case provided for in Rule 117. Voting by proxy shall not be permitted.

Quorum.

27. The quorum for general or special general meetings of members shall be six.

Funds.

Control of funds.

28. The Committee shall have full control over the funds of the Exchange, and shall pay therefrom all current ex-penses and outgoings, and any other payments for which

they have the authority of the members. All moneys received shall be paid into a bank account, and all accounts, salaries, &c., shall be paid by withdrawals therefrom.

Investment of funds.

29. The Committee shall invest the funds as they may in their absolute discretion think advisable, and shall have power to sell and vary investments.

Cheques.

30. Cheques drawn upon any funds of the Exchange shall bear the signatures of the Chairman and Scoretary, or of any two members of the Committee.

ENTRANCE FEE.

31. An entrance fee of such sum as the Exchange may from time to time determine shall be paid by candidates for membership at the time of application for admission. In the event of a candidate being rejected his entrance fee shall be returned to him: Provided that any candidate for admission by virtue of the purchase of a membership shall not be required to pay any entrance fee other than the sum mentioned in Rule 47.

SUBSCRIPTION.

Subscription. Defaulters.

- 32. An annual subscription not exceeding £5 shall be made payable at such time and in such manner as the Committee payable at such time and in such manner as the Committee may consider necessary. New members shall pay on election the subscription which shall have been levied for the current year. DECEASED OR EX MEMBERS HAVE NO CLAIM ON ASSETS.

52. Members who resign or cease to be members from any cause whatever, or the executors or the administrators of any deceased member, shall have no claim on the assets of the Exchange.

DEFAULTERS.

Defaulters, Committee to deal with the, and how.

53. The Committee shall have the power to fine, suspend, or recommend the expulsion of any member who shall fail to pay, when due, any debt incurred by him to another mem-ber. Should the Committee decide to recommend the mem-Should the Committee decide to recommend the member's expulsion, they shall report accordingly to the members at a special general meeting called for that purpose. It shall be competent for the said special general meeting to confirm the Committee's recommendation, and expel the member so brought before them, or deal with him by fine or

Such transactions shall be closed accordingly by the Chairman buying or selling in the market on account of the member in default, such stocks or shares as he may have contracted to sell or purchase.

Members shall without delay render full statements of account to the Committee.

account to the Committee.

Accounts of members with a member in default.

55. The Committee shall have power to investigate the accounts of members with a member in default, and to reject or require the correction of any items which they deem unsatisfactory.

Surpluses.

56. Members, creditors of a member in default, shall have a preferential claim on all surpluses in the hands of other members resulting on the closing of transactions open at the time of default, and also on all moneys which may become payable to a member in default out of the funds in the hands of the Committee from the estate of enother member in default. of the Committee from the estate of another member in default. All surpluses in the hands of members resulting on the closing of open transactions with a member in default shall be paid to the Committee.

How to deal with surpluses.

57. The Committee shall distribute as soon as possible amongst members, creditors of the member in default, the surpluses received from other members on his account, and all moneys due to him out of funds in the hands of the Committee from the estate of another member in default.

DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS OF EX-MEMBERS.

Recent claims to have preference in distribution of assets of an ex-member.

58. The Committee, in dividing amongst members, creditors of a late member, the proceeds received by them on sale of a membership, after deducting the transfer fee of the purchaser and all other liabilities due to the Exchange, or in dividing any surpluses received by them from members on account of a defaulting member's estate, or in dividing any moneys due to him out of the funds in the hands of the Committee from the estate of another member in default, shall not necessarily distribute the same greater but mercial not necessarily distribute the same pro rata, but may in their discretion give preference, either wholly or in part, to claims of recent date over claims of longer standing which were not divulged to the Committee at the time they arose.

Claims not arising from transactions under the rules

59. Claims on the estate of a resigning, retiring, or deceased member that do not arise from transactions under the rules shall not be recognized by the Committee until all claims that have arisen from transactions under the rules shall have been satisfied.

Outside brokers non-members.

60. Licensed sharebrokers not members of the Exchange (hereinafter called "outside brokers") may be admitted to the privilege of doing business with members and dividing commission at an annual fee not exceeding £20, provided such outside brokers subscribe to the rules of the Exchange, and agree to be bound thereby in every respect as if they were members of the Exchange.

A list of all such outside brokers shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose by the Secretary of the Exchange, which book shall at all reasonable times be open for inspection. Names may from time to time be added to or removed from such list by the Committee.

Members' clerks may be admitted to official meetings.

61. The Chairman may grant a member permission for clerk in his service to attend the official meetings for the purposes of making quotations, and the purchase and sale of shares on behalf of his employer, but for no other purpose. Such authorized clerk shall be subject to the rules and usages of the Exchange, but shall not have a vote at any meeting nor any voice in the management of the Exchange. The Chairman may withdraw the permission at any time.

Conditions of admission.

62. A clerk so admitted to official meetings shall be deemed to be the agent of his employer, and the member on whose application he is admitted shall be responsible for all the transactions of the said clerk.

Admission allowable only under certain circumstances.

63. The attendance of a clerk at an official meeting shall be permitted in the case of a member's illness, absence from town, service on a jury, or other special emergency. The contingency for such attendance is to be shown at the time to the satisfaction of the Chairman.

Qualification of clerk.

64. A clerk shall not be eligible for admission unless he be at least twenty-one years of age.

Restrictions to dealing by a clerk

65. A clerk shall not buy or sell time bargains, or deal except in cash transactions, unless he shall have written authority to do so from his employer, such authority to be lodged with the Chairman; and all his dealings shall be on account of his employer.

Members may withdraw authority given to a clerk.

66. A member may, by a letter addressed to the Secretary, withdraw the authority for his clerk to act, but his responsibility shall continue until such withdrawal shall have been notified to the members at an official meeting.

COMMISSION

Brokerage chargeable.

67. The brokerage chargeable to both buyer and seller of shares in all companies, and debentures and scler of shares in all companies, and debentures and stocks, shall be as follows: Shares of the value of Is. and under, \(\frac{1}{2}d\) per share; from Is. to 3s. 4d. in value, \(\frac{1}{2}d\) per share; from 3s. 4d. and upwards in value, \(\frac{1}{4}\) per cent. Minimum commission for mission, 5s.

Members not to divide commission except under special conditions.

68. No member of the Exchange, or his clerk, partner, or employee, shall, either directly or indirectly, divide commission with any person not a member of the Exchange, except such persons as are provided for in Rule 60. But a member of the Exchange may transact business and divide commission with any broker whose place of business is more than twenty miles from the Borough of Thames.

69. No member shall sell or nurchase shares at a net price.

69. No member shall sell or purchase shares at a net price to or from a person who is not a member of the Exchange in the Borough of Thames, nor to or from any person elsewhere

who is not a licensed sharebroker.

OFFICIAL MEETINGS.

Time, place, and purposes of official meetings.

70. The official meetings of the Exchange shall be the meetings of members held at such place and times as the members shall appoint, at which the business shall be to make prices, effect sales, and receive and record quotations of sales; also to do any general business in accordance with these rules.

Official and special holidays

71. The official holidays to be observed by all members of the Exchange shall be fixed at the annual general meeting heli in December of each year. Special holidays shall not be declared except by the vote of not less than two-thirds of the members present at any official meetings; provided that notice of intention to take such vote be given by the Chairman at a previous meeting. No meeting shall be held on public holidays unless otherwise ordered by the members in the same manner as that provided for special holidays.

Members leaving during a meeting must get permission.
72. A member shall not leave an official meeting without the permission of the Chairman, under penalty of a fine of £5, which shall be paid within seven days.

QUOTATIONS.

Procedure to be observed at official meetings.

73. At the official meetings the prices made shall be binding on members making them to the extent of the minimum quotation. No sale shall be made while the record of business done is being called over, or during any time of suspense ordered by the Chairman.

Minimum quotations.

74. In offering to buy or sell at the meetings of the Exchange the minimum number of shares in mining companies in each case shall be,—

Up to 1s. in value Over 1s. to 2s. 6d. 200 shares. 150 " 2s. 6d. to 5s. 58 50 or 50 pounds' worth.

The minimum number of shares in investment companies in each case shall be.

Up to 5s. in value ... 100 shares. Over 5s. in value or 50 pounds' worth.

To maintain a quotation under Rule 73 members must be prepared to buy or sell in numbers divisible by five.

Highest declared buyer to have priority.

75. The highest declared buyer shall have priority over all members in purchasing the stock in question at the price named; but, having made a purchase, he must, to retain his priority, immediately declare himself as still a buyer.

Lowest declared seller to have priority.

76. The lowest declared seller shall have priority over all other members in supplying the stock in question at the price named, but, having made a sale, he must, to maintain his priority, immediately declare himself as still a seller.

77. After any stock has been called and passed, business in that particular stock can only be reopened at the buying or selling quotation.

Sales made at and between calls.

78. All sales of stocks and shares made at official meetings shall be quoted, except sales not amounting to a quotation. Sales made between the ordinary calls between two sharebrokers, members of the Exchange, may be quoted at the call immediately following such sale. Due date must accompany quotation of debentures. Members shall not publish in the newspapers quotations of shares. Time bargains shall not be quoted on the official list.

Quotations challenged.

79. If any quotation of sale be challenged, the Chairman of the day shall immediately accompany the member whose quotation is doubted to his office, and there satisfy himself by examination of the books or papers of such member as to the bona fides of the quotation, and shall report the result either to the Committee in the first instance or direct to the members in official meeting assembled, as to him shall seem fit. Any member refusing to the Chairman an inspection of his books shall be treated by the Committee as guilty of making a false quotation. An offender shall be considered as guilty of conduct unworthy of a member, and shall be dealt with accordingly.

Quotations for a stock which is not on official list cannot be demanded.

80. A member cannot demand a quotation for a stock which is not on the official list.

OFFICIAL LIST.

81. The list of quotations of prices, and purchases and sales effected and reported, at the daily meetings of the Exchange shall be the official list of the Exchange. The Exchange may also issue a Monthly Share List. The Exchange shall not be responsible for the issue by any of its members of any "List of Sales," "Prices Current," or "Trade Circular."

Terms and conditions of admission of companies to quotation.

82. Admission of companies to quotation on the official list shall be upon such terms and conditions as the members shall from time to time decide. The Exchange shall have power to suspend for any period, or withdraw altogether, the name of any company or association from the official list.

REGISTER OF SALES.

Register of all sales at official meetings to be kept.

Register of all sales at official meetings to be kept.

83. All sales made at official meetings shall be recorded in a register kept for that purpose, which record shall, if desired by any member, be called over before the close of such meeting, and members shall be bound thereby. Contractnotes for all transactions in mining shares shall be passed between members, and in the event of a dispute, unless the contract-note shall have been returned within a reasonable time, it shall be prima facie evidence of a sale having been effected, and at the price stated thereon.

INVIOLABILITY OF CONTRACT.

Members' contracts.

84. In contracts between members for the sale and purchase of shares and stocks they shall be held to be principals to each other unless a written arrangement to the contrary be made between buying and selling broker at the time of the contract being made.

DELIVERY AND SETTLEMENT.

Time allowed for delivery of documents.

85. Three clear days shall be allowed for delivery of documents by the seller, and, failing the delivery thereof during that period, the buyer may, after 1 p.m. on the third day, give twenty four hours' written notice to seller to deliver either cancel the purchase or buy at the risk of the seller through the Chairman of the Stock Exchange. Any defi-ciency of surpluses shall be adjusted between the parties by the Chairman. The defaulter shall settle the amount of any ciency of surpluses shall be adjusted between the parties by the Chairman. The defaulter shall settle the amount of any resulting deficiency within twenty-four hours. If, however, at the time of the sale the seller shall inform the buyer that the transfer has to come from a distance requiring a longer period than three days to deliver, it shall be the option of the purchaser to refuse to complete the transaction.

Payment for documents.

86. Purchasers shall not be required to take delivery of and pay for documents until the day following the sale. All documents must be delivered before 11 o'clock on Saturdays and 1 o'clock on other days, otherwise it shall not be incumbent on purchasers to pay for same until the following day.

Failure of payment.

87. Sellers shall have the right to require the purchasemoney to be paid in cash or by marked cheque at the time and place of delivery of documents. In case of failure of payment by the buyer the vendor may, within one day of default of settlement or on any future day, either cancel the transaction or sell at the buyer's risk through the Chairman of the Exchange the securities involved, and the defaulting member shall forthwith pay to the vendor any difference between the original purchase-money, and the net proceeds of the securities resold.

Limit of time for tender of documents.

88. If delivery of documents, has not been made within the time specified in Rule 85, and the buyer has not cancelled the purchase or bought at the risk of the seller as therein provided, and the seller shall tend delivery of the documents after the expiration of six weeks from the date of the sale, the house shall not be bound or compellable to secent dethe buyer shall not be bound or compellable to accept delivery unless some special agreement in writing has been entered into between the buyer and the seller in respect of such delivery.

Claim for delivery of documents.

89. When a buyer shall claim delivery of documents after the expiration of six weeks from the date of purchase, and the seller shall not have cancelled the sale or sold at the buyer's risk as provided in Rule 87, it shall not be incumbent upon the seller to deliver unless some special agreement in writing has been previously made between the buyer and the seller in respect of such delay.

Refusal to register a transfer not to invalidate sale

90. The refusal of the board of directors of any company to register a transfer shall not invalidate a sale.

Separate transfers for scrip to be delivered for each sale. Scrip to accompany transfer.

91. Sellers shall deliver separate transfers or scrip representing a sufficient number of shares sold in each sale if required to do so. Buyers requiring scrip must have transfers delivered with scrip attached, or a memorandum equivalent to such scrip certified to by the company. A seller of shares in London companies having a colonial register shall deliver scrip on the colonial register, unless otherwise arranged at time of sale. The selling broker shall be responsible for a period of seven clear days from date of delivery for the validity of all documents delivered, and for the shares being free from all liability due or payable at the time of sale.

Sellers may demand buyer's name for insertion in transfer

92. Sellers shall have the right to demand from the buyer, prior to delivery, a name for insertion in the transfer of investment shares. Failing the buyer complying with such demand within three clear days the seller may insert the name of the buying broker.

Buyers may refuse transfers with alterations in them.

A member shall not be bound to accept delivery of a transfer signed by a transferee and his signature cancelled, or filled in with a transferee's name and the name cancelled.

Transfers signed under power of attorney

93. Buyers shall have the option of refusing all transfers or scrip signed under power of attorney or per procuration, unless the signature thereto be certified as correct by the Secretary of the company, or the documents be accompanied by a valid power of attorney.

DIVIDENDS.

94. Transactions in shares shall be with dividend until the dividend is payable. When transfers are delivered subsequent to the declaration of a dividend, but prior to the closing of the books of the company, and in sufficient time for registration of the shares, the seller shall not be responsible for the dividend, and the buyer's claim shall be only upon the registered holder; but when no reasonable time is afforded to the buyer to register the shares in his own name, then the seller shall be responsible for the dividend.

Dividends on time bargains and options.

95. Dividends payable between the date of sale and the maturity of time bargains shall accrue to the buyer, and shall be accounted for at the time of settlement of the bargain.

Interest on debentures and funded stock.

96. Interest on debentures shall be charged to the date of sale in addition to the price.

CALLS.

Calls due to be paid by the seller before delivery.

97. All calls made prior to time of sale shall be paid by the seller before delivery. Calls made between the date of sale and maturity of time bargains shall be paid by the buyer to the seller at the time of settlement of bargain.

TIME BARGAINS.

Date of completion of time bargains.

98. Unless otherwise agreed, neither party to a time bargain shall be entitled to call upon the other party to complete until the day fixed for completion. Prices in all time sales shall be set.

Time bargains fixed for completion on Sundays or holidays.

99. Time bargains the day for completion of which shall fall on a Sunday or public holiday shall not be completed until the business day next following.

NEW SHARES.

100. In the event of new shares being created and offered to the shareholders in any company during the currency of a time bargain, or pending delivery of shares in time for the buyer to complete transfer to enable him to secure such new shares himself, the buyer, if desirous of receiving his proportion of such new shares, shall request the seller, in writing, accompanied by the necessary funds, to secure them, and the seller, on receipt of such request, shall secure them; but the seller may elect to deliver such documents as will enable

the buyer to secure the new shares.

When a transaction is in shares on a London register, the When a transaction is in shares on a London register, the responsibility of the seller shall case if he shall have taken every practicable course to secure the new shares, and, further, the seller shall be relieved of all responsibility if the circumstances place him in no better position than the buyer to secure the new shares, in which case the seller may, on receipt of a written request from the buyer to protect his rights, notify the buyer in writing of such circumstances, and the buyer on receipt of such notification shall protect his own interests

his own interests.

NON-MEMBERS.—FAILURE TO MEET ENGAGEMENTS.

Defaulters. Non-members.

101. Non-members shall pay for all stocks or shares purchased on their account before 2 o'clock on the day following the purchase, unless an agreement be made in writing to the contrary.

writing to the contrary.

102. Should a purchaser, not a member, fail to pay the amount due on his purchase as per Rule 101, either the seller or his broker, or the purchaser's broker, shall be at liberty at any time thereafter, at his or their option, either to sue such purchaser for breach of contract, or to resell the securities in any manner and upon such terms and conditions as he or they may think proper, and to sue for the difference; and all loss and expenses consequent upon such resale, whether the same shall be made immediately on such failure to pay as aforesaid or at any time thereafter, and all damages which the seller or his broker or the purchaser's broker may sustain thereby, shall be recoverable by chaser's broker may sustain thereby, shall be recoverable by him or them from the purchasers as and for liquidated damages, and it shall not be necessary to give notice of any such resale.

Non-members may be posted as defaulters.

103. In the event of any person not a member failing to meet any engagement with a member of the Exchange, the member may apply to the Committee to have such person posted as a defaulter. The Committee shall inquire into the case, and, if satisfied that such default has been made, shall post the said person, and announce to the members that he is in default post the said is in default.

Members not to transact business with a non-member announced as a defaulter.

104. A member shall not transact business for a non-member who has been announced to the members as a defaulter, unless such person shall have made a satisfactory arrangement with his creditors.

Members barred from dealing with other Members' EMPLOYEES.

Business with other members' clerks prohibited.

105. A member shall not buy or sell shares for any one employed in another member's office.

Disputes.

106. In disputes between members with reference to stock and share transactions, brought under the consideration of the Committee, their decision shall be final and binding, and shall be carried out forthwith by the member or members concerned.

Committee to be sole and final tribunal for settlement of disputes between members.

obtained, members shall not appeal to any Court of law or equity in any dispute that may arise between them in transactions under these rules, and if such permission is not granted they shall accept the Committee as the sole and final tribunal and arbiter therein.

Complaint from non-members.

108. It shall not be incumbent upon the Committee to entertain any complaint submitted to them by any one not a member of the Exchange against a member of it, unless not a member of the Exchange against a member of it, unless such member shall have been employed by the complainant in the capacity of broker; and in that or any other case in which a non-member desires the intervention of the Committee, he shall, previously to the case being heard, pay not less than five guineas, or such other sum as the Committee may determine, to the Secretary, and shall undertake in writing to abide by and forthwith to carry out the decision of the Committee in the same manner as if he were a member of the Exchange; the Committee to have the power to repay the whole or part of the five guineas or such other sum to the complainant. other sum to the complainant.

Power of Committee to procure Information relative TO MATTERS UNDER INVESTIGATION.

Committee may require members and their clerks to give information.

109. Members and their clerks, when required so to do by the Committee, shall attend any meeting of the Committee, and then and there shall give such information as may be in their possession relative to any matter under investigation.

Committee may call upon members to produce their books, &c.

110. The Committee shall have full and absolute power, in 110. The Committee shall have full and absolute power, in the event of complaint being made which in their opinion justifies such procedure, to call upon any member to produce for their inspection all books, letters, telegrams, or copies thereof, and other documents in his possession relating thereto, and he shall, without delay, produce them for inspection accordingly.

VIOLATION OF RULES, AND PENALTIES.

Violation of rules, and penalties.

111. The Committee shall take cognizance of all violations of these rules, whether in letter or spirit. Any member found by them to be guilty of such violation, or who may fail to comply with any of the Committee's decisions, or who may be guilty of conduct unworthy of a member, shall be liable to fine or suspension from membership by resolution of the Committee; or, should the matter be of such moment as in their opinion to demand expulsion, the Committee shall report accordingly to the members at a special general meeting called for that purpose. It shall be competent for the said special general meeting to confirm the Committee's recommendation, and expel the offending member, or to deal with him by fine or suspension. The fines mentioned herein shall not be less than £10 or more than £100, and in case of a continuous offence shall be not less than £2 or more than £10 for each day during which such offence continues.

112. Any member of the Exchange who shall fail to observe or be bound by the terms of any decision or ruling of the Committee, or the spirit or intentions thereof, relative to the conduct by the members of the Exchange of their business as such members, or relative to other matters aris-111. The Committee shall take cognizance of all violations of

outsides as such members, or to their dealings with one another as such members, or relative to other matters arising out of the objects or purposes of the Exchange, shall be deemed guilty of conduct unworthy of a member, and be dealt with in manner provided by the preceding Rule No. 111.

Fines to be paid within one week.

113. If a fine imposed on any member at a special general meeting of members be unpaid at the end of one clear week, the member in default shall forfeit his membership, and the Committee shall announce to the members that he has retired from the Exchange, and his name shall be erased from the list of members.

Restrictions to members voting.

114. A member, or his partner or clerk being a member, shall not vote at any meeting at which a charge affecting himself is under consideration.

Publication of expulsion, &c.

115. The Committee for the time being may, in their absolute discretion, and in such manner as they may think fit, notify or cause to be notified to the public that any member has been expelled, or has become a defaulter, or has been suspended, or has ceased to be a member.

No action or other proceedings shall under any circum-stances be maintainable by the person referred to in such notification against any member or official publishing or circulating the same, and this rule shall operate as leave and authority to any member or official to publish or circulate such notification, and be pleaded accordingly.

ALTERATION OF RULES.

Votes required to alter rules.

116. These rules shall not be amended, repealed, or added to except by a vote of two-thirds of the members present at the meeting specially called for that purpose, at which meeting at least six of the members shall be present.

Procedure to be observed for alteration of rules

of each member. The circular shall contain a copy of the proposed alteration. But the accidental omission to give any such notice to any member shall not invalidate any proceedings taken or any resolution passed at such meeting. No amendment shall be entertained at the meeting which introduces fresh matter, and no proposed amendment or repeal of or addition to the rules, if rejected, shall be entertained again for six months.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of six, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted :-

- Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
- Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
- Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
