WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), Robert Bryce Smith and William Stewart Rae (hereinafter called "the licensees") have applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore at Purakanui, in order to construct a boat-shed and staging thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, have deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington, marked M.D. 3628, in duplicate, showing the area of foreshore intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it is proposed to construct the said boat-shed and staging: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensees under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore on which the boat-shed and staging are to be constructed, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing and maintaining the said boat-shed and staging thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the construction of the boat-shed and staging at Purakanui, as shown on plan marked M.D. 3628.

Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said boat-shed and staging, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair of such boat-shed or staging, requiring them within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.
7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions

of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees, or either of them, in New Zealand.

10. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said boat-shed or staging may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part.

11. In case the licensees shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinafter set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said boat-shed and staging for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy;
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause three of these conditions,

erected in accordance with the said plan, such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

THE HONOURABLE J. A. MILLAR PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section eleven of the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may vest the management of any wharf the property of His Majesty in any local governing body or person, upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit:

And whereas it is provided by section thirteen of the said Act that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, prescribe what dues and rates shall be taken by the body or person in whom any such wharf shall be vested as aforesaid:

And whereas it is thought desirable to vest in the Hokianga County Council (hereinafter called "the Council") the management of a wharf at Rawene, in Hokianga Harbour, in the County of Hokianga, in the positions shown on plans marked M.D. 181, 182, 582, and 583, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington, on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, and to prescribe the dues and rates which shall be taken by the Council for the use of such wharf:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said eleventh and thirteenth sections of the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby vest the management of the wharf at Rawene, in Hokianga Harbour aforesaid, in the Council, subject to the conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be taken by the Council for the use of the said wharf.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS OF MANAGEMENT.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. All His Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf and rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

3. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the wharf without payment.

4. The Board shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf, and all erections on or in connection with the wharf, in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at its own cost any lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

5. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharf by the Board shall be applied to keeping the said wharf, and all erections on or in connection with such wharf, in good order and repair.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf, and any buildings erected on the wharf or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon his leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Council shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. The Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf any building or structure whatever except with the consent of the Minister.

8. The Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the thirty-first day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

9. The Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the wharf.

10. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

11. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

12. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

13. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council. No compensation or allowance shall be payable in such case.

14. The Council shall be liable for any injury which may be caused at the said wharf to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.

15. In case the Council shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein before set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days,

then and in either of the said cases every right, power, or privilege hereby conferred may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without notice to the Council or other preceding whatsoever, and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

EVERY person who shall use the said wharf with any vessel shall pay to the County Council of the County of Hokianga, or to its officer or other person appointed or authorized by it to receive the dues and rates hereby prescribed, for the use thereof, as follows, that is to say,—

For every vessel lying alongside the wharf—

- (a.) One halfpenny per ton per day or part of a day for every ton register up to 100 tons.
- (b.) Exceeding 100 tons, $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per ton per day or part of a day for the first 100 tons, and $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per ton per day or part of a day for every ton over 100 tons.

Every person who shall use the wharf for landing goods, or whose goods are stored in any shed on the wharf, shall pay wharf-dues in respect of the landing, storage, and receiving such goods, as follows, that is to say,—

THE HONOURABLE J. A. MILLAR PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section eleven of the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may vest the management of any wharf the property of His Majesty in any local governing body or person, upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit :

And whereas it is provided by section thirteen of the said Act that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, prescribe what dues and rates shall be taken by the body or person in whom any such wharf shall be vested as aforesaid :

And whereas it is thought desirable to vest in the Hokianga County Council (hereinafter called "the Council") the management of a wharf at Kohukohu, in Hokianga Harbour, in the County of Hokianga, in the positions shown on plans marked M.D. 1222 and 1223, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington, on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, and to prescribe the dues and rates which shall be taken by the Council for the use of such wharf :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said eleventh and thirteenth sections of the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby vest the management of the wharf at Kohukohu, in Hokianga Harbour aforesaid, in the Council, subject to the conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be taken by the Council for the use of the said wharf.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS AND MANAGEMENT.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. All His Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

3. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the wharf without payment.

4. The Council shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf, and all erections on or in connection with the wharf, in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at its own cost any lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

5. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharf by the Council shall be applied to keeping the said wharf and all erections on or in connection with such wharf in good order and repair.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf, and any buildings erected on the wharf or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon his leaving at or posting at the last known address of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Council shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. The Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf any building or structure whatever except with the consent of the Minister.

8. The Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the thirty-first day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

9. The Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the wharf.

10. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

11. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

12. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

13. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor on giving to the Council three calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council. No compensation or allowance shall be payable in such case.

14. The Council shall be liable for any injury which may be caused at the said wharf to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.

15. In case the Council shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days,

then and in either of the said cases every right, power, or privilege hereby conferred may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without notice to the Council or other proceeding whatsoever, and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

EVERY person who shall use the said wharf with any vessel shall pay to the Council, or to its officer or other person appointed or authorized by it to receive the dues and rates hereby prescribed, for the use thereof, as follows, that is to say,—

For every vessel lying alongside the wharf—

- (a.) One halfpenny per ton per day or part of a day for every ton register up to 100 tons.
- (b.) Exceeding 100 tons, $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per ton per day or part of a day for the first 100 tons, and $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per ton per day or part of a day for every ton over 100 tons.

Every person who shall use the wharf for landing goods, or whose goods are stored in any shed on the wharf, shall pay to the Council wharf-dues in respect of the landing, storage, and receiving such goods, as follows, that is to say,—

- (a.) For all goods landed, stored, or received, at weight or measurement, according to shipping usage.

REGULATIONS.

Special Roll.

1. The special roll for the part of a district for which a loan is to be raised, and which is not a legal subdivision, shall be prepared from the existing valuation roll by the local authority applying for the loan, and shall be in the following form, and shall contain the particulars therein specified:—

FORM OF SPECIAL ROLL TO BE PREPARED WHERE THE PART OF THE DISTRICT IS NOT A LEGAL SUBDIVISION.

2. The special roll shall be deposited for public inspection at the office of the local authority for not less than seven days prior to the first public notice of intention to raise the loan, or not less than seven days before any steps are taken to obtain the ratepayers' consent to the loan, as the case may be, and notice of that deposit shall be published on the first day of such deposit in some newspaper circulating in the district within which the rating-area is situated.

3. Any ratepayer who objects to any matter or thing contained in the said roll, and who desires that such objections shall be heard or considered, shall forward notice thereof in writing to the local authority within seven days after the last day on which the roll was deposited as aforesaid. Such notice shall be in duplicate, and shall state fully the grounds of objection and also the full name and address of any objector.

4. The local authority shall cause to be prepared a list of all objections (if any) to the said roll, and such list shall state the name and address of the objector, his number on the special roll, and his reasons for objecting to the valuation.

5. Such list, or a certified copy thereof, together with the said roll, shall be submitted to the Stipendiary Magistrate for the said district, and if there is more than one Stipendiary Magistrate for such district, then to the senior Stipendiary Magistrate for the same. The said Stipendiary Magistrate shall give at least seven days' notice of the time and place appointed by him to hear such objections, and he shall have jurisdiction to hear and finally determine the same and all matters directly connected with such objections, and also to make all such alterations in the said roll as he thinks proper, and shall initial all alterations, additions, or erasures so made by him, and shall sign the said roll.

6. The roll when so signed and initialled shall be the special roll for the portion of the district specified therein, and shall be delivered by the said Stipendiary Magistrate to the local authority as the complete special roll for the particular rating district or area to which the same relates.

7. Where no objections have been made to the said special roll, the Chairman of the local authority shall sign the said roll, and affix the seal of the local authority to the same, and such roll shall thereupon be deemed to be duly authenticated.

RATEPAYERS' CONSENT.

8. The signatures to every consent of the ratepayers to be testified for the purposes of paragraph (d) of section 15 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, shall be witnessed by some adult person or persons, and verified by statutory declaration of the attesting witness or witnesses, and such consent shall, when completed, be forwarded by the Chairman of the local authority of the district to the Superintendent of the State-guaranteed Advances Office at Wellington, together with a statutory declaration made by such Chairman in the form hereinafter prescribed.

9. Every such consent shall be in the following form:—

Merger of Rating-area.

12. (a) Where the whole of any area over which a special rate has been made as security for a loan is merged or included within the district of a local authority other than the local authority that made the rate, such last-mentioned authority shall give notice to the local authority in whose district such area has been merged or included, and also to the Minister of Finance, of all existing special loans in respect of which special rates have been made over such area.

(b.) Such notice shall be in the Form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto.

13. (a) Where part only of any special-rating district is merged or included as aforesaid the local authority that made the rate shall give notice to the local authority in whose district such part-area has been merged or included, and also to the Minister of Finance, of all existing special loans in respect of which special rates have been made over such part-area, together with a plan showing sections of land and parts of sections (if any) contained in such part-area, and of any proposed adjustment or apportionment of the liability in respect thereof among the respective local authorities affected by such merger or inclusion.

(b.) Such notice shall be in the Form No. 2 in the Schedule hereto.

14. (a) Any local authority that objects to such proposed adjustment or apportionment shall forward written notice of its objection to the Minister of Finance within twenty-one days from the receipt of the notice referred to in the last preceding regulation.

(b.) Such local authority shall, prior to the expiry of the said twenty-one days, also serve a copy of such notice on the local authority that made the rate.

(c) If within the said period of twenty-one days no notice of objection is served either on the Minister of Finance or the local authority that made the rate, then such last-mentioned authority may proceed *ex parte* to have an apportionment or adjustment of liability effected in respect of the said loans, and for that purpose shall forward to the Minister of Finance a statutory declaration of the facts in the form or to the effect set forth in Form No. 3 in the Schedule hereto.

(d) In cases where objections have been received the statutory declaration shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in Form No. 4 in the Schedule hereto.

(e.) On receipt of the statutory declaration in either of the cases aforesaid it shall be the duty of the Minister of Finance to forward the same, with all other particulars and information, to the Governor in Council.

(f.) Where an objection has been duly lodged by the local authority or authorities affected, then the Governor in Council shall hear or consider such objections, and the parties shall receive such notices, and such steps shall be taken, as the Governor in Council may consider necessary for determining the matter.

15. As soon as any transfer, adjustment, or apportionment of liability in respect of any special loan has been made the Secretary to the Treasury shall forward to every local authority directly affected thereby a notice in the Form No. 5 in the Schedule hereto, and such entries shall be made in the Register of Debts of Local Authorities as may be necessary to complete such transfer, adjustment, or apportionment respectively.

16. Where any notice is directed by these regulations to be served upon or given to a local authority, it shall be sufficient if such notice be sent to or delivered at the office of such local authority addressed to the Clerk or other principal officer thereof.

Regulations for Deer-shooting, Nelson.

ISLINGTON, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby

make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the Nelson Acclimatization District, comprising the Counties of Waimea, Takaka, and Collingwood, and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

REGULATIONS.

1. RED-DEER stags and fallow deer bucks may be taken or killed within the Nelson Acclimatization District from the 25th day of February, 1911, to the 1st day of May, 1911, both days inclusive.
2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Nelson, and the Postmaster at Motueka, on payment of a license fee of £1 1s., in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.
3. No licensee shall take or kill more than six deer in all, whether red-deer stags or fallow-deer bucks; and no red-deer stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than four points, and no fallow-deer buck carrying antlers with less than four points.
4. No doe, hind, or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.
5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.
6. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.

* *Lead, red, dry.*—This shall consist entirely of red-lead, and be free from compounds of iron, barium, or other metals. It shall be of approved (standard) bright-red colour.

† *Lead, white, dry.*—This shall be a basic carbonate of lead, containing not less than 25 per cent. nor more than 30 per cent. of hydrated oxide. It shall be in the form of an amorphous, impalpable white powder. It must not contain any sulphates or other compounds of zinc, barium, or other metals.
