And whereas the company has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a further portion of the foreshore and land below low-water mark in Hokianga Harbour, in order to construct a breastwork and the necessary reclamation to obtain the full benefit of the license granted by the hereinbefore-recited Order in Council; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 3578, two sheets), showing the manner in which it is proposed to construct such breastwork and reclamation, and the necessary reclamation to be constructed in order to obtain the full benefit of the license granted by the hereinbefore-recited Order in Council, the place where it is intended to construct the same, and the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed works will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the company under the said Act,

for the purposes aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy those parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which are particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid and thereon coloured pink and edged in red, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon the breastwork and reclamation shown and delineated on sheet 2 of the said plans, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say :—

1. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to those parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the erection and construction of such breastwork and reclamation which are shown on sheet 2 of the plans marked M.D. 3578, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid, and thereon coloured pink and edged in red.

2. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of two pounds ten shillings, and thereafter an annual sum of six pounds ten shillings in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

3. The facing of the reclamation shall be constructed in a substantial manner, and shall be of heart of totara. The braces shall pass the piles at each end at least six inches, and shall be notched on to the piles. A brace shall be placed at every second pile.

4. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the breastwork and reclamation without payment.

5. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned breastwork and reclamation in good order and repair.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said breastwork and reclamation and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such breastwork or reclamation requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. All His Majesty's subjects shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the breastwork and reclamation, and all rights of ingress or egress thereon and therefrom.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company.

11. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said breastwork or reclamation may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the company's part.

12. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinafter set forth, or any of them;

- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said breastwork and reclamation for a period of three calendar months;
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved;
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause two of these conditions,

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

13. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

14. The construction or erection of either of the works herein authorized shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the company of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

Regulations respecting Issue of Auctioneers' Licenses in Special Districts.

ISLINGTON, Governor.

Every person desirous of obtaining an auctioneer's license within a special district shall apply in writing to the Licensing Officer in the form set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and every such application shall be signed by the applicant in the presence of some competent witness, and shall be accompanied by the amount of the license fee payable.

3. If the Licensing Officer is satisfied, upon inquiry, that the applicant is a fit and proper person to hold an auctioneer's license, that the required fee has been paid, and that the application generally is in order, he shall thereupon grant to the applicant a license in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto. Every license granted under this regulation shall, unless sooner forfeited or cancelled, remain in force until the 31st day of December next succeeding the issue thereof.

4. The Licensing Officer shall, immediately upon receipt of an application as aforesaid, indorse thereon in writing the actual date of receipt; and may, if he thinks fit, adjourn from time to time the consideration of that application, but so that the application shall be finally dealt with not later than two calendar months from the date of the receipt thereof.

5. The Licensing Officer, in addition to publicly notifying the issue of each license by him, in accordance with section 12 of the said Act, shall also forward to the Minister of Internal Affairs full particulars of each license granted or refused by him.

Regulations for Deer-shooting, Wanganui.

ISLINGTON, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the Wanganui Acclimatization District, comprising the Counties of Wanganui and Waitotara, and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

REGULATIONS.

1. FALLOW-DEER bucks may be taken or killed within the Wanganui Acclimatization District from the 1st day of April, 1911, to the 15th day of May, 1911, both days inclusive.
2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Wanganui on payment of a license fee of £1, in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations. The number of such licenses shall not exceed thirty: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.
3. No licensee shall take or kill more than two bucks, and no buck shall be killed carrying antlers with less than four points.
4. No doe or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.
5. The licensee must give notice to the said Chief Postmaster of the date on which it is his intention to stalk deer; such notice to be posted, or delivered, or telegraphed three clear days before such date.
6. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.
7. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

Teachers' Certificate Examinations, 1911.

Education Department,

THE following lists contain statements of the principal results of the examinations held in January for the purposes of teachers' certificates. In the preparation of the lists consideration has been given to candidates' successes at previous examinations held by the Department and at university examinations of which notice has been received.

The first list (I) contains the names of the successful candidates for Classes B, C, and D. Teachers' certificates will be issued to such of these as have produced satisfactory evidence of age and good character, and have passed the special medical examination prescribed, and have fulfilled the necessary conditions as to length of service and efficiency in teaching. The second list (II) gives the names of those who have passed the examination for a certificate except in one or two subjects. Those candidates for the Class C examination who, though not entitled to be placed in the second list, passed in a "section" under clause 26 of the Regulations are included in the third list (III). In the fourth list (IV) are given the names of the candidates whose work has been deemed worthy of special mention, in accordance with clause 40.

The next examination will take place in January, 1912, beginning about the 5th day of the month. Notice must be sent to the "Inspector-General of Schools, Wellington," so as to reach him not later than the 30th September. Candidates that have obtained "partial pass" must observe this rule equally with other candidates, and must not expect to receive any further intimation of the date at which the notices become due.

Certificated teachers that have gained promotion at this examination may send their certificates to the Department for indorsement.
