A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Norsewood, Danevirke, Rakaia, and Hororata Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into four marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

**NORSEWOOD DISTRICT.**

All that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District bounded towards the north by a right line from a point on the summit of the Ruahine Range due west of the source of the Manawatu River to the said source of that river; thence towards the north-east by the said Manawatu River to the Kahututaetua Stream; thence towards the south-west by that stream to the northernmost corner of Section No. 1, Block V, Takapau Survey District; thence towards the south-east by Sections Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, and 95, Block V aforesaid, across a road, and by Sections Nos. 155, 133, and 140, said Block V, and Section No. 166, Block IX, to the road at the north-western corner of that section; thence across and by that road to Section No. 124, Block IX aforesaid, and by that section to the Mangatawainui River; thence towards the east generally by that river to the north-eastern corner of Otanga Block; thence towards the south by Otanga Block to the Whakaruatapu Stream; thence by a line running due west to the Mangatera Stream; thence towards the west and south-west by that stream to the northernmost corner of Section No. 31, Block XIII, Norsewood Survey District; thence by Sections Nos. 19 and 18, Block VIII, Norsewood Survey District, the abutment of a road, Section No. 17, Block VIII aforesaid, and the north-eastern boundary-line of the last-mentioned section produced to the summit of the Ruahine Range; and thence again towards the west generally by the summit of the Ruahine Range to the place of commencement.

**DANNEVIRKE DISTRICT.**

All that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District bounded towards the north-east generally by a right line from a point on the summit of the Ruahine Range in line with the north-eastern boundary-line of Section No. 17, Block VIII, Norsewood Survey District, to the northernmost corner of that section; thence by the north-eastern boundary of the said Section No. 17, the abutment of a road, and the north-eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 18 and 19, Block VIII aforesaid, to the Mangatera Stream at the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by the Mangatera Stream to a point due west of the north-western corner of Otanga Block; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of that block, and thence by the northern boundary of the said Otanga Block to the Mangatawainui River; thence by that river to its confluence with the Manawatu River; thence by the Manawatu River to its confluence with the Mangapuaka Stream; thence by that stream to the boundary of Patangata County; thence by Patangata County to the southernmost corner of Mangangarara No. 3 Block; thence towards the south-east by a right line to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 4, Block XIV, Mangatoro Survey District; thence by a right line to Trig. Station No. 51, Oporae; thence towards the south-west generally by Puketoi No. 6B Block, and Woodville County as described in the Schedule to the Woodville County Act, 1901, to the Otopae Stream; thence by that stream to the south-eastern corner of Otawahao Block; thence by the south-eastern boundary of that block to the Otawahao Stream, by that stream, and again by the south-eastern boundary of the Otawahao Block to the Manawatu River; thence across and by that river to the southern boundary of Oringiwhairu No. 2 Block; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that block, and by Blocks XI, X, and XVI, Woodville Survey District, to the summit of the Ruahine Range; and thence towards the north-west generally by the summit of that range to the place of commencement.

**RAKAIA DISTRICT.**

All that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded towards the north-east generally by the left bank of the Rakaia River from a point in line with Lauriston and Barhill Road to the road intersecting Rural Sections Nos.

37065 and 27061, and forming the eastern boundary of 27058; thence by that road to the Rakaia Bridge Road; thence by the last-mentioned road to Mead Settlement; thence by the northern boundaries of Mead Settlement and the production of the north-eastern boundary-line of Section No. 2, Block X, Selwyn Survey District, to the Christchurch-Dunedin Railway line; thence by that railway-line to the Great South Road; thence by the Great South Road to the left bank of the Rakaia River; thence again by the left bank of that river to the sea; thence towards the south-east by the sea to the Chertsey Boundary Road; thence towards the south-west generally by the said Chertsey Boundary Road to the northern corner of Reserve No. 1771, Ashburton Survey District; thence by a right line being a continuation of the north-eastern boundary of that reserve across a railway reserve to the Great South Road; thence by that road and the road forming the south-western boundary of Reserve No. 2376, and that road continued to the westernmost corner of Section No. 24262, Ashburton Survey District; thence by a right line to the southernmost corner of Section No. 27032; thence by the road forming the north-eastern boundary of Section No. 27031, and that road continued to the northernmost corner of Section No. 27394; thence by the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 27392; thence by Sections Nos. 27392, 27969, 27970, 27985, 28020, 31252, 30505, 30504, 30506, and 30509, Ashburton Survey District, to Thompson Road; thence towards the north by Thompson Road to its junction with the Lauriston and Barhill Road; and thence towards the north-west by the said Lauriston and Barhill Road and a line in continuation thereof to the place of commencement.

#### HORORATA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded towards the north-west by the summit of the Southern Alps from a point near the source of the Rakaia River to Browning's Pass; thence towards the north-east by a right line to Porter's Pass; thence by a right line to the intersection of Home Bush Road by the Waianiwaniwa Branch of the River Selwyn; thence by that branch and the north bank of the River Selwyn to the Great South Road; thence towards the south-east by the Great South Road to the Christchurch-Dunedin Railway line; thence by that railway-line to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary-line of Section No. 2, Block X, Selwyn Survey District, Mead Settlement; thence towards the south-west generally by a right line to the north-eastern corner of the said Section No. 2 and by the northern boundary of Mead Settlement to the Rakaia Bridge Road; thence by that road to its junction with the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Rural Section No. 27058; thence by the last-mentioned road and its continuation through Rural Sections Nos. 27061 and 37065 to the Rakaia River; thence by the northern bank of the Rakaia River to its source; and thence by a right line to the nearest point on the summit of the Southern Alps, the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

#### A PROCLAMATION.

**HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.**

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the Oamaru Harbour Board Enabling Act, 1910, the Oamaru Harbour Board is authorized and empowered to raise a loan not exceeding two hundred and twenty-five thousand pounds (£225,000) at a rate of interest not exceeding five pounds per centum per annum, to be applied exclusively for the purposes mentioned in the said Act: And whereas by the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1910, after reciting the said

power of the said Harbour Board to raise the said sum of two hundred and twenty-five thousand pounds as aforesaid, it is enacted that all sums of money so raised, with interest thereon not exceeding four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, may be guaranteed by the Government of New Zealand, and that in order to give full effect to such guarantee all principal and interest becoming payable in respect of the sums so raised shall, if and as often as any default is made by the said Board in payment thereof, be payable by the Minister of Finance out of the Consolidated Fund without further appropriation than the said Act, and that such guarantee when given shall be enforceable against the Government of New Zealand by the holder of any debenture or other security in respect of such loan in the same manner and as fully and effectually as if the guarantee were constituted by contract between such holder and the Government of New Zealand, and that in the event of such guarantee being given all debentures issued in respect of such loan shall have printed thereon a certificate in the following form, namely: "Payment of the principal and interest secured by this debenture is guaranteed by the Government of New Zealand," and that every such certificate shall be signed by the Minister of Finance, or some officer of the Treasury on his behalf: And whereas the said Harbour Board has, pursuant to the terms of the Oamaru Harbour Board Empowering Act, 1910, taken all necessary proceedings for the raising of a loan of two hundred and fifteen thousand pounds upon debentures of the said Board, bearing interest at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum, and has applied to the Government to guarantee the said loan as provided by the said Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1910:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section ninety-six of the said Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1910, doth hereby declare that all debentures which may be issued by the Oamaru Harbour Board in pursuance of the powers conferred upon that Board by the Oamaru Harbour Board Enabling Act, 1910, in respect of any loan or loans not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of two hundred and fifteen thousand pounds, at a rate of interest not exceeding four pounds per centum per annum, and which may be duly certified under the hand of the Minister of Finance, or an officer of the Treasury on his behalf, as guaranteed by the Government of New Zealand in accordance with the provisions of section ninety-six of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1910, shall be and are hereby guaranteed by the said Government under the provisions of the said section ninety-six of the last-mentioned Act accordingly: And doth hereby further declare that all principal and interest moneys becoming payable in respect of any such debenture so certified as aforesaid shall, if and as often as any default is made by the Oamaru Harbour Board in payment thereof, be payable by the Minister of Finance out of the Consolidated Fund: And doth hereby authorize and empower the Minister of Finance under his hand, or under the hand of any officer of the Treasury appointed by him in that behalf, to certify any such debentures as aforesaid in pursuance of section ninety-six of the last-mentioned Act, at such times and on such terms and conditions as the said Minister of Finance in his discretion thinks fit: And doth hereby further declare that, save and except in respect of such debentures as may be so certified by or on behalf of the Minister of Finance in his discretion as aforesaid, the guarantee given and constituted hereby shall have no force or effect.

##### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 17 of the Workers' Dwellings Act, 1910 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council make such regulations not inconsistent with the said Act as may be necessary for the effectual carrying-out of that Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said

Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke all existing regulations respecting workers' dwellings, and doth hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof.

#### REGULATIONS.

##### APPLICATIONS FOR WORKERS' DWELLINGS.

1. EVERY application to purchase a worker's dwelling shall be in the Form W.D. 1A in the Schedule hereto, and shall specify the particulars indicated in that form.
2. Every application for a renewable lease of a worker's dwelling shall be in the Form W.D. 1B in the Schedule hereto, and shall specify the particulars indicated in that form.
3. Every application for a weekly or monthly tenancy (as the case may be) of a worker's dwelling shall be in the Form W.D. 1C in the Schedule hereto, and shall specify the particulars indicated in that form.
4. Every applicant for a lease or tenancy of a worker's dwelling shall, with his application, deposit with the Superintendent of Workers' Dwellings four weeks' rent in advance.
5. The declaration required by section 8 of the said Act to accompany an application in respect to a worker's dwelling shall be in the Form W.D. 1D in the Schedule hereto.
6. In disposing of applications as aforesaid in respect of workers' dwellings, applications to purchase shall in all cases be preferred to applications for lease or other tenancy; and (without limiting the preceding provisions of this regulation) the Board may give preference to those applicants who, in its opinion, are most in need of such dwellings.

##### AGREEMENTS AS TO WORKERS' DWELLINGS.

7. Where any application in respect to a worker's dwelling is approved by the Board, an agreement in respect of the same shall be executed in duplicate by the Superintendent and by the applicant.
8. Every agreement to purchase a worker's dwelling shall be in the Form W.D. 2A in the Schedule hereto.
9. Every agreement for a renewable lease of a worker's dwelling shall be in the Form W.D. 2B in the Schedule hereto.
10. Every agreement in respect of the weekly or monthly tenancy (as the case may be) of a worker's dwelling shall be in the Form W.D. 2C in the Schedule hereto.

##### TERMINATION OF AGREEMENTS.

11. If the tender that the Board proposes to accept for the erection of a worker's dwelling exceeds the estimated cost of that dwelling, the applicant, within fourteen days after being notified thereof, may elect to withdraw his application, and shall thereupon be entitled to a refund of his deposit in respect of the purchase-money or rent, as the case may be. Upon such election the agreement shall be deemed to be cancelled. If he does not so elect, the agreement shall be deemed to be modified accordingly.
12. If for any reason other than that specified in the last preceding regulation an applicant withdraws his application, he shall not be entitled to a refund of his deposit in respect of his purchase-money or rent; but the Board may, if it thinks fit, refund the balance of such deposit after deducting an amount not less than £1 in respect of expenses.
13. If any agreement in respect of a weekly or monthly tenancy is terminated by the Board solely for the purpose of enabling that dwelling to be disposed of by way of purchase, the tenant under the terminated agreement shall have the first option of entering into an agreement to purchase the dwelling.
14. If a worker's dwelling is destroyed by fire at any time during the currency of an agreement in respect thereof, the Board shall cancel the agreement; and, in the case of an agreement to purchase, shall, if satisfied that the fire was not due to the negligence or wilful default of the purchaser, either enter into a new agreement for the purchase of another dwelling, deducting from the capital value thereof the amount paid under the former agreement on account of principal, less depreciation, or refund to the purchaser an amount not exceeding the difference between the total amount that has been paid under the agreement to purchase (including cost of fire insurance and rates, but without interest) and the amount that would have been payable under a renewable lease.
15. If a worker's dwelling is at any time damaged by fire during the currency of an agreement in respect thereof, the Board shall restore the building to its former condition so far as possible, or may, on application, terminate the agreement.

16. If the purchaser, lessee, or tenant permits any nuisance to exist on or about his dwelling, and fails to remove the same on receiving notice from the Board so to do, the Board may thereupon terminate the agreement on such terms as it thinks fit.

17. (1.) If the purchaser, lessee, or tenant of a worker's dwelling fails at any time to comply with any of the provisions of the said Act or of these regulations, or makes default in the due payment of any purchase-money or rent in respect of that dwelling, the Board may, if it thinks fit, cancel the agreement in respect of that dwelling.

(2.) No such cancellation as aforesaid shall affect any right or remedy on the part of the Board as to the recovery of instalments or rent in arrears, or shall otherwise release the purchaser, tenant, or lessee from any penalty or liability in respect to anything done or omitted to be done by him.

18. (1.) If an agreement to purchase is for any reason terminated before the purchase-money has been paid, the Board may, if it thinks fit, pay to the purchaser by way of compensation for any permanent improvements effected by him, a sum not exceeding the increase in the capital value of the dwelling by reason of those improvements.

(2.) On the termination of a lease or other tenancy of a worker's dwelling the Board may pay to the outgoing lessee or tenant, by way of compensation for improvements as aforesaid, a sum not exceeding the increase in the capital value of the dwelling by reason of those improvements.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

19. (1.) The Board shall insure to the maximum insurable value thereof every worker's dwelling in respect of which an agreement to purchase has been executed, and of which the purchase-money has not been fully paid; and the purchaser shall pay to the Board all amounts due in respect of the insurance of his dwelling.

(2.) All policies of insurance in compliance with the said Act or these regulations shall be effected with the State Fire Insurance Department.

20. The purchaser of a worker's dwelling shall pay all rates and taxes levied on or payable in respect of his dwelling.

21. (1.) Whenever any sum of £7 or multiple of £7 is paid in advance by the purchaser of a worker's dwelling, in pursuance of section 11 of the said Act, the sum so paid shall be disposed of by the Board as hereinafter mentioned.

(2.) If the purchaser so desires, the amount so paid shall be received in advance in respect of so many of the half-yearly instalments of principal and interest as the said amount is sufficient to satisfy; and the purchaser shall not be required to make any further payments in respect of the purchase-money until the expiration of the time in respect of which such payment in advance is made.

(3.) In lieu of making any such break as aforesaid in the continuity of the payments in respect of purchase-money, the Board shall, if the purchaser so desires, accept the amount so paid in advance in satisfaction of so many of the next succeeding half-yearly instalments of principal as that amount is sufficient to satisfy; and the corresponding instalments of interest shall not be payable. The subsequent half-yearly instalments of principal and interest shall then be payable without any break in the periodical continuity of the payments until the total amount of purchase-money has been paid.

22. The certificate referred to in section 14 of the said Act, to be granted by the Board on the fulfilment of the terms of an agreement to purchase a worker's dwelling, shall be in the Form W.D. 3A in the Schedule hereto.

23. (1.) The Board shall from time to time cause all necessary repairs to be made to workers' dwellings in respect of which an agreement to lease or for a weekly or other tenancy is in force, if those repairs are necessitated by fair wear-and-tear, damage by fire, earthquake, tempest, or suchlike. Subject as aforesaid, the lessee or tenant of a worker's dwelling shall keep the same in good order and condition to the satisfaction of the Board.

(2.) The purchaser of a worker's dwelling shall, until the total purchase-money has been paid, keep his dwelling in good order and repair, to the satisfaction of the Board.

(3.) No alterations to a worker's dwelling, other than those required or authorized by this regulation, shall be made except with the written consent of the Board.

24. If the local authority of the district in which any worker's dwelling is situated requires any alterations to be made to that dwelling in pursuance of any authority conferred upon it by any Act or otherwise, the Board shall have the required alterations made, and the cost of those alterations shall be added to the capital value of the dwelling, and the agreement in respect thereof shall be deemed to be adjusted accordingly.

25. Any person appointed by the Board for that purpose shall at all reasonable times be entitled to inspect any worker's dwelling

3. No licensee shall take or kill more than four stags, and no stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than ten points.
4. No hind or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.
5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.
6. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

5. So far as applicable, the general by-laws and regulations for the time being respectively in force and affecting the traffic on the New Zealand Railways shall extend and apply to this bridge.

The birth-rate for the Dominion last year was 26.21 per thousand. Auckland, Christchurch, and Dunedin are thus over the average, and Wellington below it.

The birth-rates for the four central boroughs last year show a fall when compared with 1909. In Auckland the rate fell from 29.73 to 27.75; in Wellington from 26.62 to 24.13; in Christchurch from 28.55 to 27.10; in Dunedin from 28.34 to 27.72. The rates for five years, 1906 to 1910, are,—

In the above table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns. As regards Auckland and Christchurch, the whole of the area usually recognized as suburban has not yet been brought under municipal government, and the vital statistics do not deal with such portions as still remain in road districts. But the omission is not very important, for there are in either case quite enough suburbs included within borough boundaries to give a fair idea of the death-rate of Greater Auckland and Greater Christchurch. As further boroughs are formed the vital statistics will be made to include them.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Christchurch, but raises it at Dunedin.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 652, against 594 in December—an increase of 58. The deaths in January were 266—an increase of 66 on the number in December. Of the total deaths, males contributed 148, females 118. Seventy-three of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 27.44 per cent. of the whole number; 63 of these were under one year of age.

There were seventy-two deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: Eight men, 65, 67, 68, 73, 76 (two), 77, 86, and nine women, 69 (two), 74 (two), 75, 79 (two), 80, 83, died at Auckland; seven men, 68, 70, 71, 73 (two), 74 (two), and two women, 69, 74, at Wellington; thirteen men, 65, 66, 70, 71 (two), 73, 74 (two), 75, 78, 80, 84, 90, and ten women, 66 (two), 67, 68 (two), 72, 75, 78, 80, 82, at Christchurch; and twelve men, 67 (two), 70, 74 (three), 75, 76, 79, 85, 95 (two), and eleven women, 65, 68, 71, 73, 74, 77, 79, 82 (two), 83, 86, at Dunedin.
