Regulations for the Appointment of Arbitrators under the Rangitaiki Land Drainage Act, 1910.

WHEREAS by section six of the Rangitaiki Land
Drainage Act, 1910 (hereinafter referred to as
"the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor, by
Order in Council gazetted, may from time to time make
regulations for giving effect to the said section:
Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the
Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of
the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and
acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive
Council of the said Dominion doth hereby make the following

Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the fol-lowing regulations for the purposes of the said section, and declare that those regulations shall come into force on the day of the publication thereof in the New Zealand

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations-

In these regulations—

"Minister" means the Minister of Lands:

"Occupier" means the person by whom or on whose behalf any property which is liable to be rated under the said Act is actually occupied, if that person is in occupation by virtue of a tenancy which was for not less than six months certain; and as to property so rateable and occupied by virtue of a tenancy not coming within the above description, and also in the case of unoccupied property so rateable, means the owner of the same; and as to Crown lands whatever may be the term and as to Crown lands, whatever may be the term of the tenancy thereof, means the lessee or licensee thereof, or where there is no such lessee or licensee means the Minister of Lands.

means the Minister of Lands.

2. A roll of all occupiers shall be prepared by and kept in the office of the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Auckland Land District, and the said Commissioner shall from time to time amend the same so as to insure that all changes of occupation are duly recorded therein.

3. No occupier who acquires his interest in any land subject to the said Act after the compilation of the roll in accordance with the last preceding regulation shall be entitled to vote at any election of an arbitrator as hereinafter provided unless he notifies the Commissioner of Crown Lands at Auckland of the acquisition of his interest at least one month prior to the date of that election: Provided that if the said Commissioner has entered the name of the new occupier upon the aforesaid roll, that occupier shall be entitled to vote notwithstanding that he has not given the prescribed notice.

4. When the Minister proposes to obtain an advance from the Superintendent under the New Zealand Stateguaranteed Advances Act, 1909, for the purpose of constructing or carrying on such works as are authorized by the said Act, he shall deposit a full description of the proposed works, together with such specifications and plans as he deems necessary, at the Te Teko Post-office, and at such other place as he thinks fit, and shall notify by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the district that such description and other particulars are available for inspection by all occupiers of land within the area subject to the said Act.

5. In the aforesaid advertisement the Minister shall call upon the occupiers to hold a public meeting at such time and place as he therein appoints, being not less than thirty days after the date on which the said advertisement first appears in the said newspaper, to elect an arbitrator.

6. At such meeting the occupiers present shall elect from among themselves a chairman and two scrutineers.

7. The occupiers present at such meeting shall then elect an arbitrator to act under section 6 of the said Act, the mode of election to be by nomination and subsequent ballot, the voting to be conducted by the chairman and scrutineers aforesaid.

8. The chairman of a meeting held as aforesaid shall forthwith notify the Minister of the name of the arbitrator elected at such meeting.

9. Should the arbitrator so elected refuse to act, or die.

9. Should the arbitrator so elected refuse to act, or die, or resign his position at any time, or for any reason become incapable of acting as required by the said Act, a fresh arbitrator shall be elected in his place in the manner aforesaid, save that the public meeting of occupiers at which

he is to be elected may be held at any time after fourteen days from the publication of the advertisement calling for

such meeting.

10. The Minister shall have full power to decide whether or not an arbitrator so elected has become incapable of acting as required by the said Act, and his decision shall be final: Provided that he shall not have power to decide until he has been previously requested so to do by at least six occupiers

six occupiers.

11. Any arbitrator elected as aforesaid shall hold office for one year, after which time a fresh election shall be held if an arbitrator is required.

12. The remuneration of the arbitrators and umpire elected or appointed under these regulations and the said Act shall be at a rate not exceeding two guineas a day, exclusive of travelling-expenses.

13. The remuneration and expenses of the said arbitrators and umpire shall be paid out of the Rangitaiki Land Drainage Account.

WHEREAS by section thirty-six of the Licensing Amendment Act 1910 the Constitution ment Act, 1910, the Governor is empowered to make regulations as to the mode of registration of barmaids, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of that sec-

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Do-minion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by that section, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. Every person desiring to be registered as a barmaid in accordance with the provisions of section 36 of the Licensing Amendment Act, 1910, shall, on or before the 1st day of June, 1911, forward to the Secretary of Labour, at Wellington, an application in duplicate in the Form L. 1 in the Sche-

ton, an application in duplicate in the Form L. 1 in the Schedule hereto.

2. Every such application shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration made by the applicant in the Form L. 2 in the Schedule hereto.

3. On receipt of any such application the Secretary of Labour shall, if satisfied that the applicant is entitled to be registered in accordance with the said section 36, cause the name of the applicant and the other prescribed particulars in respect thereof to be entered in the Register of Barmaids hereinafter referred to.

4. The Secretary of Labour shall cause to be kept a Register of Barmaids in the Form L. 3 in the Schedule hereto.

5. On the entry of the name of any person in the Register of Barmaids the Secretary of Labour shall issue and cause to be forwarded to that person a certificate of registration in the Form L. 4 in the Schedule hereto.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. In these regulations, unless a contrary intention appears, the expressions following have the meanings attached

 thereto:

 "The Act" means the Native Land Act:

 "Board" means the Maori Land Board of the district to which the particular matter in the context refers:

 "President" means the President of a Maori Land
 Roard:
- "Committee" means the Committee of Management. All other terms used in these regulations have the same signification as when used in the Act, unless a contrary intention appears.

ELECTION OF COMMITTEE.

2. A meeting of the beneficial owners of any land being farmed by a Board under section 292 of the Act, for the purposes of electing a Committee, shall be summoned by the President at the instance of the Board in such manner and at such time and place as the President considers expedient.

expedient.

If two or more parcels of land owned by different sets of owners are contiguous or so situated that in the

sets of owners are contiguous or so situated that in the opinion of the Board such two or more parcels can be conveniently and advantageously worked as one farm, the President may convene a meeting of all the owners of all the parcels of land so grouped, for the purpose of electing a Committee for all such parcels.

3. An owner may appoint a proxy by writing under his hand in the Form No. 14 in the Second Schedule to the Regulations relating to the Maori Land Boards dated the 13th day of June, 1910, attested by some person authorized by the Act to attest a will of a Native. Such proxy shall not be available except by leave of the representative shall not be available except by leave of the representative of the Board at the meeting, and shall be handed in to the Board or its representative previous to the commencement of the meeting.

4. If at any time and place appointed for the meeting or within one hour thereafter, a quorum is not present. or for any reason the meeting cannot be held at that time

or nominations of persons, who shall be owners, whom it is desired to elect. Each person so nominated shall be proposed by one of the owners, and seconded by another owner.

8. If the number of persons nominated is not more than the number required to be elected, the Chairman shall declare them to be elected.

9. If the number of persons nominated exceeds the number required to be elected, the Chairman shall call upon the meeting to elect from the persons nominated the number required, and may appoint one or more scrutineers for the purpose of counting the votes recorded. The votes may be given by a show of hands, or in such other manner as the meeting determines.

10. In the case of equality of votes the Chairman shall

have a casting-vote.

11. The Chairman shall declare those persons (not being more than the number of persons required to be elected) who have received the highest number of votes to be duly elected as the Committee.

12. A list of the names of the persons so elected shall forthwith be prepared by the Chairman, and signed by him and countersigned by an owner, and shall be for-

warded to the Board.

13. The Committee so elected shall remain in office for three years from the date of the election, when another

election shall take place.

14. In the event of a vacancy occurring on the Committee, the same may be filled by the Board on the recommendation of the members remaining on the Committee at the time the vacancy occurs.

MEETINGS.

15. The members of the Committee shall meet together for the despatch of business at the times and places as the Chairman of the Committee considers expedient.

16. Minutes of the proceedings of the Committee shall be recorded in a minute-book, and the minutes of any meeting shall be read and confirmed at the next succeeding meeting. The minute-book shall be in the custody of the Chairman, who shall forward same to the President or Board whenever required so to do.

17. Every member of the Committee other than the Chairman thereof shall be paid, out of revenue from the farm, a sum to be determined by the Board, but not, in any one case, to exceed the sum of 7s. 6d. for each day on which he is actually engaged on the business of the Committee.
