Districts constituted under the Marriage Act, 1908.

(L.S.) ISLINGTON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage district known as the Cambridge District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

CAMBRIDGE DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-west generally by Te Rapa and Tamahere Parishes from the southernmost corner of Te Rapa Parish to Pukemoremore Trig. Station; thence towards the north-east by the Waikato confiscation-line to the southernmost corner of Maunganui Block; thence towards the north generally by the northern boundary of Hinuwera No. 2 Block; thence towards the east generally by the eastern boundary of the said Hinuwera No. 2 Block to the Waikato River; thence by the right bank of the Waikato River to the Little Waipa River; thence towards the south by a right line to Maungatautari Trig. Station; thence by a right line to the southernmost corner of Pukekura Parish; and thence towards the south-west generally by Puniu and Ngaroto Parishes to the place of commencement.

TIRAU DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-west by the north-western boundary-lines of Waipa and Mangawhara Blocks from the Waikato River to the Mangawhara Stream; thence by the Mangawhara and Mangawhero Rivers to the River Thames; thence by the River Thames to the Wairere Stream; thence by that stream to its source, and a right line thence running due east to the Tauranga confiscation-line; thence towards the east generally by the Tauranga confiscation-line to Puwhenua Trig. Station; thence by a right line to Te Whetu Native Settlement; thence by a right line running in the direction of Atiamuri to where it is intersected

by a right line joining Paeroa and Uraura Trig. Stations; thence by that right line to Uraura Trig. Station; and thence by a right line running in the direction of the mouth of the Waihora Stream, at Lake Taupo, to the Waikato River; and thence towards the south, south-west, and west generally by the Waikato River to the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

Districts constituted under the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration district known as the Cambridge District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Cambridge and Tirau Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names, as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of the Marriage Act, 1908.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

New County of Heathcote divided into Ridings, &c.

(L.S.) ISLINGTON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Counties Act, 1908, and the Selwyn County Subdivision Act, 1910, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby divide the new County of Heathcote, as constituted by the said Acts, into seven ridings, to be called the Avonside Riding, the Bromley Riding, the Opawa Riding, the Hillsborough Riding, the Heathcote Riding, the St. Martin's Riding, and the Cashmere Riding, and declare that the boundaries thereof shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.

And I do hereby declare that one member shall be elected for each of the aforesaid ridings. And I do further declare that Thursday, the sixth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, shall be the day upon which the election of the first Council of the said County of Heathcote shall take place; and that Saturday, the eighth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, at three o'clock in the afternoon, shall be the time, and the Heathcote Road Board Office, Woolston, shall be the place, at which the first meeting of the said Council shall be held.

SCHEDULE.

AVONSIDE RIDING.

ALL that area in Heathcote County bounded towards the north-west generally by Waimairi County, as described in the First Schedule to the Waimairi County Act, 1909, from the City of Christchurch to the Borough of New Brighton; thence by that borough to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Rural Section No. 7026, in Block XII, Christchurch Survey District; thence towards the south-east generally by a right line to the northernmost corner of that section; thence by Rural Sections Nos. 7026, 9152, and 9165, 6755, 5838, and 16007, to Breeze's Road; thence by that road to its junction with Page's Road; thence by Page's Road to Rudd's Road; thence by Rudd's Road to the road forming the western boundary of Rural Section No. 1148; thence by the last-mentioned road and Berry's Road to McGregor's Road; thence by McGregor's Road to the Borough of Woolston; and thence towards the south-west generally by the Borough of Woolston and the City of Christchurch to the place of commencement.

BROMLEY RIDING.

All that area in Heathcote County bounded towards the north-east generally by the Borough of New Brighton from a point in line with the north-western boundary of Rural Section No. 7026, in Block XII, Christchurch Survey District, to the estuary of the Heathcote and Avon Rivers; thence towards the south-east by the said estuary to the Borough of Woolston; thence towards the south-west by the Borough of Woolston to the junction of the Canal and Road Reserve with McGregor's Road; and thence towards the north-west generally by the Avonside Riding hereinbefore described to the place of commencement.

OPAWA RIDING.

All that area in Heathcote County bounded towards the north-east by the City of Christchurch and the Borough of Woolston from Wilson's Road to the River Heathcote; thence towards the east, south, and south-west generally by the River Heathcote to the south-eastern boundary of the City of Christchurch; and thence towards the north-west by the City of Christchurch to the place of commencement.

HILLSBOROUGH RIDING.

All that area in Heathcote County bounded towards the north-east and north generally by the Borough of Woolston from the left bank of the Heathcote River where the Christchurch-Lyttelton Railway line crosses that river to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Rural Section No. 329, in Block XVI, Christchurch Survey District; thence towards the south-east by a right line to and by the north-western boundary of that section to Scroton's Road; thence towards the east generally by Scroton's Road to the road forming the northern boundary of Rural Section No. 966; thence by that road to the north-western corner of the said Section No. 966; thence by that section and Sections Nos. 104, 23594, and 23560, to the Borough of Lyttelton; thence towards the south by the Borough of Lyttelton and the summit of the Port Hills to the junction of White's Road and Summit Road; thence towards the west generally by White's Road to the southern boundary of Rural Section No. 23645; thence by that section to the junction of roads at its northernmost corner; thence again by White's Road forming the western boundary of Rural Section No. 256 to and across the Heathcote River; and thence by the Opawa Riding hereinbefore described to the place of commencement.

HEATHCOTE VALLEY RIDING.

All that area in Heathcote County bounded towards the north generally by the Borough of Woolston from the north-eastern corner of the Hillsborough Riding hereinbefore described to the estuary of the Heathcote and Avon Rivers; thence by that estuary to the north-western corner of the Borough of Sumner; thence towards the east generally by the Borough of Sumner to the Borough of Lyttelton; thence towards the south by the Borough of Lyttelton to the south-eastern corner of the Hillsborough Riding aforesaid; and thence towards the west generally by the said Hillsborough Riding to the place of commencement.

ST. MARTIN'S RIDING.

All that area in Heathcote County bounded towards the north-east generally by Opawa Riding hereinbefore described from the City of Christchurch to Hillsborough Riding hereinbefore described; thence by the said Hillsborough Riding to the summit of the Port Hills; thence towards the south by the summit of the Port Hills to the road forming the eastern boundary of Rural Section No. 11549; thence towards the west generally by the road forming the eastern boundaries of Rural Sections Nos. 11549, 17908, 34655, and 2135 to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by that section and Rural Section No. 2115 and the north-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned section produced to the boundary of the City of Christchurch; and thence by the City of Christchurch to the place of commencement.

CASHMERE RIDING.

All that area in Heathcote County bounded towards the north-east generally by the City of Christchurch from Colombo Road to St. Martin's Riding hereinbefore described; thence by St. Martin's Riding to the summit of the Port Hills; thence towards the south-east by the summit of the Port Hills to the middle of Dyer's Pass Road; thence towards the west generally by a line along the middle of that road and Colombo Road to the City of Christchurch, the place of commencement.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Counties Act, 1908, and the Selwyn County Subdivision Act, 1910, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, Governor of the Do-

minion of New Zealand, do hereby divide the new County of Halswell as constituted by the said Acts into three ridings, to be called the No. 1 Riding, the No. 2 Riding, and the No. 3 Riding, and declare that the boundaries thereof shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.

And I do hereby declare that two members shall be elected for each of the aforesaid ridings. And I do further declare that Thursday, the twentieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, shall be the day upon which the election of the first Council of the said County of Halswell shall take place; and that Saturday, the twenty-second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, at three o'clock in the afternoon, shall be the time, and the Halswell Road Board Office, at Spreydon, shall be the place, at which the first meeting of the said Council shall be held.

SCHEDULE.

No. 1 RIDING.

ALL that area in Halswell County bounded towards the north-east by Waimairi County from Middle Lincoln Road to Lower Lincoln Road; thence towards the south-east by Lower Lincoln Road to Henderson's Road; thence again towards the north-east by Henderson's Road to Rural Section No. 5809, and the production of the south-western side of that road to the Plantation and Road Reserve; thence across and by that reserve to the north-eastern corner of Rural Section No. 3753; thence towards the south-east by the road forming the south-eastern boundary of that section, and by Hoon-Hay Road to Quarry Road; thence by Quarry Road to the north-eastern corner of Rural Section No. 1350, and by a closed road forming the north-western boundary of Rural Section No. 6359 and its production to the middle of the Halswell River; and thence towards the west and north-west generally by Paparua County as described in the Second Schedule to the Selwyn County Subdivision Act, 1910, and Middle Lincoln Road to the place of commencement.

All that area in Halswell County bounded towards the north-east generally by the Borough of Spreydon as described in the Seventh Schedule to the Selwyn County Subdivision Act, 1910, from Lower Lincoln Road to the north-western corner of Heathcote County as described in the Third Schedule to the aforesaid Act; thence towards the east by the said Heathcote County to its south-western corner; thence by Mount Herbert County as described in the Schedule to the Mount Herbert County Act, 1902, to Rural Section No. 565 in Block III, Halswell Survey District; thence towards the south by that section and Rural Section No. 33748 to Burke's Bush Road North; thence by that road to the Halswell River at the southern corner of Rural Section No. 8100; thence towards the west by Paparua County as described in the Second Schedule to the Selwyn County Subdivision Act, 1910, to the southern corner of No. 1 Riding hereinbefore described; and thence towards the north-west generally by the said No. 1 Riding to the place of commencement.

No. 3 RIDING.

All that area in Halswell County bounded towards the north generally by No. 2 Riding hereinbefore described, from the Halswell River to the north-eastern corner of Rural Section No. 565; thence towards the east by Mount Herbert County as described in the Schedule to the Mount Herbert County Act, 1902, and Wairewa County as described in the First Schedule to the Wairewa County Act, 1909, to the Halswell River at the southern corner of Rural Section No. 1069 in Block X, Halswell Survey District; thence towards the south-west by Springs County as described in the Fifth Schedule to the Selwyn County Subdivision Act, 1910, to Ellesmere Junction Road; and thence towards the north-west generally by the Paparua County as described in the Second Schedule to the last-mentioned Act to the place of commencement.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirteenth day of March, 1911.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on him by the Immigration Restriction Act, 1908, and the amendments thereof, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations prescribing the conditions on which any person may be permitted to land in New Zealand without complying with the provisions of the Immigration Restriction Act, 1908.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations shall apply to *bona fide* merchants, tourists, or students, including Chinese, who cannot comply with the provisions of the Immigration Restriction Act, or to Chinese merchants, tourists, or students who, although able to comply with such provisions, do not wish to pay poll-tax.

2. Certificates in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto, signed by the Collector of Customs at the port of issue, will be issued to *bona fide* merchants, tourists, or students who can produce passports issued by the Governments of their respective countries and vised by the British Consul in those countries or by any other duly authorized British authority:

Provided that no certificate shall be issued to any person debarred from landing by paragraphs (b), (c), and (d) of section 14 of the Immigration Restriction Act, 1908:

Provided also that in any case where in the opinion of the Minister of Customs there are special circumstances, he may authorize the issue of a certificate without the production of a passport upon a bond being given for £100, with security satisfactory to the Collector, that the person named therein shall leave New Zealand upon the expiry of a period not exceeding six months.

3. (1.) Merchants or tourists coming under these regulations may land and remain in New Zealand for a period not exceeding six months, and students may land and remain for a period to be ascertained within one month of arrival, but not exceeding six years.

(2.) Such persons shall not again be granted a certificate should they return to New Zealand before the expiry of five years from the date of their departure upon the preceding visit, except on such special conditions as may be prescribed by the Minister.

4. The Minister may in cases of extreme urgency extend the certificate of any merchant, student, or tourist for such time and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit.

5. (1.) Every person applying to the Collector of Customs for a certificate shall provide two photographs of himself taken within one year of such application. The photographs shall be securely attached to the certificates, one of which shall be handed to the applicant and the other filed by the Collector.

(2.) The applicant shall also deposit a sum of £10 with the Collector as security that he will report upon departure from New Zealand, and that sum shall be returned to him by the Collector at the port of departure upon identification and upon complying with these regulations.

(3.) The amount deposited on account of any person who departs without being identified or who remains in New Zealand beyond the time permitted by his certificate shall be forfeited and paid into the Public Account.

6. Immediately before departure from New Zealand the holder of a certificate shall personally deliver up the same to the Collector of Customs at the port of departure.

7. Certificates delivered up at a port of departure shall be forwarded to the Collector at the port of issue, to be filed with the duplicate.

8. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, any prohibited immigrant or Chinese arriving at a New Zealand port *en route* to some place beyond New Zealand may be permitted to land for a period not exceeding twenty-one days, provided that a bond, with security satisfactory to the Collector of Customs, is given that the person named therein shall report himself to the Collector upon departure from New Zealand within the time specified. Such bond shall be in the following amounts:—

(a.) In the case of Chinese, £200.

(b.) In the case of all other prohibited persons, £100.

Regulations for Deer-shooting, Otago.

ISLINGTON, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the Otago Acclimatization District, comprising the Counties of Bruce, Clutha, Maniototo, Peninsula, Taieri, Tuapeka, Vincent, Waihemo, and Waikouaiti, and part of the County of Southland (except within the area described in the First Schedule hereto), and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

REGULATIONS.

1. RED-DEER stags may be taken or killed within the Otago Acclimatization District from the 1st day of April, 1911, to the 20th day of May, 1911 (both days inclusive).

2. Fallow-deer bucks may be taken or killed within the said district from the 1st day of April, 1911, to the 31st day of May, 1911 (both days inclusive).

3. Licenses to take or kill red-deer stags may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Dunedin, on the recommendation of the secretary of the Otago Acclimatization Society, on payment of a license fee of £4, and licenses to take or kill fallow-deer bucks may be issued by the said Chief Postmaster, upon the like recommendation, on payment of a license fee of £2; such licenses to be in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations.

4. No licensee shall take or kill more than four red-deer stags or fallow-deer bucks, and no red-deer stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than eight points. Ball cartridge only to be used.

5. The licensee must give notice to the said Chief Postmaster of the date on which it is his intention to stalk deer; such notice to be posted, or delivered, or telegraphed three clear days before such date.

6. No doe, hind, or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

7. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

8. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the Hawke's Bay Acclimatization District, comprising the Counties of Hawke's Bay, Patangata, Woodville, Waipawa, Dannevirke, Waipukurau, and Weber, and part of the County of Wairoa, and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

REGULATIONS.

1. Red deer (stags only) may be taken or killed within the Hawke's Bay Acclimatization District from the 1st day of April, 1911, to the 13th day of May, 1911, both days inclusive.

2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Napier, on payment of a license fee of £4, in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.

3. No licensee shall take or kill more than three stags, and no stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than ten points.

4. No hind or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

6. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.

5. The application to the Inspector for the renewal of registration under sections 11 and 16 of the Act, and the particulars to be specified with such application, shall be in such of the forms F 3A, F 3B, or F 3C as the Inspector may require.

6. The notice to be given to the Inspector under section 15 of the Act shall be in the form F 4A.

7. The notice required to be exhibited in a factory under section 17 of the Act, as amended by the Schedule to the Amendment Act, 1910, shall be in the form F 5A.

8. The record to be kept by the occupier of a factory under section 2 of the Amendment Act, 1910, shall be in either of the forms F 5B or F 5C, at the option of the occupier.

9. The warrant for overtime under section 24 of the principal Act and section 3 of the Amendment Act, 1910, shall be in the form F 6A.

WEREKINO ROAD BOARD.

By-law regulating Heavy Traffic and the Licensing of Vehicles.

IN pursuance of the powers, provisions, and authorities contained in the Road Boards Act, 1908, the Public Works Act, 1908, and the Acts amending the same respectively, and of all other powers, provisions, and authorities it in this behalf enabling, the Corporation of the Inhabitants of the Werekino Road District, by the Werekino Road Board (hereinafter, save where inconsistent with the context, termed "the Road Board"), doth hereby make and ordain the following by-law:—

1. In this by-law, if not inconsistent with the context,—

"Heavy traffic" shall have the meaning given to it by subsection (1) of section 139 of the Public Works Act, 1908:

"Engine" shall include machine and any locomotive (not being used on a railway or tramway) propelled by electricity, oil, steam, petrol, or other mechanical power:

"Vehicle" means any dray, cart, trap, wagon, carriage, or other conveyance of any sort whatsoever (other than an "engine" as hereinbefore defined):

"Owner," as applied to any vehicle or engine, includes a bailee entitled to the possession and use or profit of any vehicle or engine:

"Road" includes any bridge, gate, culvert, drain, and all other things belonging to, upon the line, or within the limits of a road; and includes every road within the meaning of section 101 of the Public Works Act, 1908, which is or shall be under the care, control, or management of the Road Board.

2. No person shall, without the permission of the Road Board in writing for every occasion in that behalf first had and obtained, engage in heavy traffic on any road under the care, control, or management of the Road Board during the months of May, June, July, August, and September in each year.

3. No person shall use any such road by the traction thereon of any engine or vehicle for the purposes of heavy traffic during the months of October, November, December, January, February, March, and April in any year, unless such engine or vehicle shall be licensed in manner hereinafter set forth for the period during which such engine or vehicle shall be so used.

4. No person shall use bullocks as traction animals during the months mentioned in clause 3 hereof upon the gravelled or metalled portion of any such road, except where no unmetalled or ungravelled portion of such road is available for traffic.

5. The yearly license fee payable in respect of every engine or vehicle having four wheels or more shall be £10, and in respect of every two-wheeled engine or vehicle shall be £5; and upon application to him by the owner of any engine or vehicle or his agent for that purpose, and payment of the proper fee, the Clerk of the Road Board shall issue a license, and also a docket with a mark thereon designating the date of issue; and such license shall continue in force for one year from the date of issue.

6. The owner shall affix such docket to the near side of such engine or vehicle, and keep the same affixed during the currency of the license in respect of which such docket is issued.

7. The owner of every engine or vehicle which by this by-law is liable to a license fee shall cause the correct weight of such engine or vehicle when unloaded to be at all times marked in some conspicuous place thereon in figures 2 in. in length and of proportionate width.

8. If any duly licensed engine or vehicle becomes destroyed or unfit for use, the owner may, with the previous consent in writing of the Clerk to the Road Board, detach the docket mentioned in clauses 5 and 6 hereof, and affix it to another engine or vehicle of the like description, which shall thereafter be deemed the licensed vehicle for the remainder of the period of the said license.

9. No person shall deface or alter or tamper with any docket or, except as aforesaid, remove the same during the period for which it shall have been issued.

10. Each of the engines or vehicles enumerated in the first column of the first schedule hereto, having the number of the said schedule, and licensed to carry or carrying respectively the weight mentioned in the third column of the said schedule, shall have tires on each wheel of a width not less than that mentioned in the fourth column of the said schedule.

11. For the purposes of this by-law, and for the purposes of estimating the weight carried by any engine or vehicle as in the last preceding clause mentioned, the

measurement, number, or quantity mentioned in the second column of the second schedule hereto shall be deemed to be 1 ton weight of the material, produce, merchandise, or goods of the description mentioned and set opposite to such measurement, number, or quantity in the first column of such second schedule.

12. Any person authorized by the Board, or any constable or police officer may, for the purpose of ascertaining if the provisions of this by-law are being complied with, at any time stop and detain any engine or vehicle which in his opinion infringes this by-law, until the width of the tires or the weight of such engine or vehicle and the load thereon, or the weight or measurement of the contents thereof, can be ascertained.

13. The driver of any engine or vehicle which shall be driven or taken over or be on any such road as aforesaid shall give to any person authorized as aforesaid such information as to the load or contents of any such engine or vehicle, and the quantity, weight, or measurement of the same, and shall do all such acts for the purpose of enabling the same to be ascertained as such authorized person requests.

14. No horses, cattle, engine, or vehicle shall cross or be driven, led, or taken over any bridge in the Werekino Road District at a greater pace than three miles per hour.

15. The Road Board may by notice in writing call upon any person engaged in heavy traffic over any road to enter into a bond with the Board, to ensure for the benefit of the Road Board, with or without a surety or sureties to be approved by the Road Board, as the Road Board may by such notice determine, conditioned for duly repairing and making good to the satisfaction of the Road Board any special damage resulting from such heavy traffic; and the bond shall be in a penalty to be fixed by the Board, not exceeding the sum of £200; and no such person after being called upon by the Board to enter into such bond, with such sureties (if any) as may be required as aforesaid, shall engage in heavy traffic until he complies with the requirements of this clause.

16. Any person committing a breach of any of these clauses shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable upon conviction for any such breach to a penalty not exceeding £5.

17. The above by-law shall come into operation on the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.
