IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, as amended by the Animals Protection Amendment Act, 1910, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby suspend the operation of section ten of the said Animals Protection Amendment Act, 1910, for the period commencing on the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and ending on the thirty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, with respect to the species of birds indigenous to New Zealand mentioned in the Schedule hereto:

Provided, however, that the said birds shall not be taken or killed except in such districts and on such conditions as may be notified by the Governor under the said Acts.

1. FALLOW-DEER bucks may be taken or killed within the Grey District Acclimatization District from the 4th day of April, 1911, to the 3rd day of June, 1911, both days inclusive.

2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Greymouth on payment of a license fee of £2, in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations. The number of such licenses shall not exceed fifteen: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.

3. No licensee shall take or kill more than four bucks, and no buck shall be killed carrying antlers with less than four points.

4. No doe or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

6. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

3. No licensee shall take or kill more than two stags, and no stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than ten points.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.
6. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

WHEREAS the block of land, containing two thousand six hundred and forty acres, situated in the Provincial District of Canterbury, and known as the Kaiapoi Reserve, was in and after the year eighteen hundred and sixty-two, pursuant to the Acts in that behalf enabling, apportioned and granted to the aboriginal Natives entitled thereto: And whereas the Crown grants issued to such aboriginal Natives provided, *inter alia*, that no disposition of the land included in the grant by way of sale, mortgage, lease, or otherwise should be made without the consent in writing indorsed thereon of the Governor or of some person duly appointed by him or otherwise duly authorized by law in that behalf: And whereas the Native owners under such grants and their successors in title have at various times since the issue of such Crown grants as aforesaid made dispositions by will of the land so granted as aforesaid without such consent being indorsed thereon: And whereas the Supreme Court has decided that such dispositions by will are prohibited by the terms of the grants aforesaid, and are invalid in law; and by reason of such decision the validity of the titles of persons now in possession of such lands has been questioned, and actions have been commenced in the Supreme Court in respect thereof: And whereas it is expedient to appoint a Commission under the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, to inquire into and report upon the circumstances connected with the dispositions by will of any such land and the expediency of validating all or any of such dispositions, and in the meantime to stay all actions and proceedings now commenced or threatened in respect thereof:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby appoint you, the said

WALTER EDWARD RAWSON,

to be a Commission to inquire into and report upon the circumstances connected with the dispositions by will of any of the lands hereinbefore described and subsequent dealings therewith, and the expediency of validating all or any of such wills and all or any of the dispositions made thereby; and you are hereby enjoined to make such suggestions and recommendations as you may consider desirable or necessary with respect to the foregoing matters, and generally with respect to the necessity of legislation in the premises.

And for the better enabling you, the said Commission, to carry these presents into effect, you are hereby authorized and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry under these presents at such times and places in New Zealand as you deem expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and from place to place as you think fit, and to call before you and examine on oath or otherwise, as may be allowed by law, such person or persons as you think capable of affording you information in the premises; and you are also hereby empowered to call for and examine all such books, documents, papers, plans, maps, or records as you deem likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject-matter of this inquiry, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all lawful ways and means whatsoever. And, using all diligence, you are required to transmit to me, under your hand and seal, your report and recommendations not later than the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eleven. And you are directed to so frame your report as to facilitate prompt action being taken thereon. And it is hereby declared that these presents shall continue in full force and virtue although the inquiry may not be regularly continued from time to time or from place to place by adjournments. And, lastly, it is hereby further declared that these presents are issued under and subject to the provisions of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908.

Regulations for the Administration of the Gold-miners' Relief Fund.

ISLINGTON, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section three hundred and ninety-two of the Mining Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby make the following regulations dealing with the administration of the Gold-miners' Relief Fund, and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall come into force from the date of the gazetting thereof.

REGULATIONS.

GOLD-MINERS' RELIEF FUND.

1. THE Public Trustee shall, on receipt of a certificate from a duly qualified medical officer, and also on the certificate from an Inspector of Mines, apply the moneys deposited to the credit of the Gold-miners' Relief Fund, as follows:—

- (a.) When any gold-miner has been injured while working, and is off work for one week or more, he shall receive the sum of 12s. 6d. per week, or at the rate of 2s. 1d. for every working-day, from the date of the injury, which payment shall, subject as hereinafter provided, continue so long as such medical officer and Inspector of Mines certify that such gold-miner is unable to work; but when an injury occurs in any mine situate in a locality remote from settlement, where the services of a medical officer are not procurable, payment at the prescribed rate may be made for any period not exceeding thirty days from the date of the injury on the certificate of the Inspector of Mines alone.

In cases where any gold-miner is permanently disabled, he may be granted a fixed sum (not exceeding £50) in satisfaction of all claims, but in any such case the certificate of a duly qualified medical officer and an Inspector of Mines will be required. No gold-miner shall be entitled to any payment in any case unless he has been so injured as to prevent him working for a period of not less than one week, and the total amount payable to any gold-miner shall in no case exceed £50.

- (b.) If any gold-miner meets with an injury which proves fatal, the nearest relative of such gold-miner may be granted a sum (not exceeding £10) towards defraying the funeral expenses of the deceased miner, and an additional sum (not exceeding £15) may be granted to the widow or other near relative of such deceased miner in full satisfaction of all claims.

2. Any gold-miner who meets with an injury which disables him from work shall send, or cause to be sent, within seven days of such injury occurring, a notice in writing to the Inspector of Mines; and all applications for relief must be made within fourteen days of the date of the injury, or the claim cannot be entertained.

3. No miner shall be entitled to relief from the Gold-miners' Relief Fund for any injury caused by drinking intoxicating liquors, fighting, or any kind of athletic sports or game of amusement, or for any injury caused by the misconduct of such miner.

4. Any gold-miner who becomes incapacitated by miners' phthisis (pneumoconiosis) from following his calling as a gold-miner shall be entitled to payment in accordance with these regulations: Provided that a gold-miner shall not be so entitled unless he has been resident in New Zealand for at least three years before the incapacity arises.

5. In these regulations—

“Gold-miner” and “miner” mean gold-miners who are actually and regularly employed or engaged in gold-mining, and who derive their livelihood from such calling; but do not include persons who merely work as gold-miners occasionally;

“Injury” means personal injury by accident arising out of and in the course of the employment or occupation of a gold-miner, and includes miners' phthisis (pneumoconiosis).

Warrant authorizing the Hawke's Bay County Council to construct a Bridge over the Esk River on the Napier-Wairoa Road, together with the Approaches thereto and Protective Works, and apportioning the Cost.

ISLINGTON, Governor.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and nineteen of the Public Works Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed “the said Act”), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that in any case where the local authority of any district desires to construct a bridge, or to establish a ferry or ford, in any position that will, in its opinion, be of advantage or benefit to the whole or any considerable portion of the inhabitants of an adjacent district, as well as to the inhabitants of its own district, and where it is, in the opinion of such local authority, reasonable that the local authority of such adjacent district should contribute to the cost of constructing or establishing the said bridge, ferry, or ford, the provisions of the said section shall have effect:

And whereas the Hawke's Bay County Council has given notice and taken the steps required by the said Act, and has made application to the Governor to authorize the construction of the bridge, approaches, and protective works mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter referred to as “the said work,” and to apportion the cost of constructing and establishing the said work between the said Council and the Wairoa County Council:

And whereas I am of opinion that the work should be done, and it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purpose and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby

authorize the Council of the County of Hawke's Bay to execute the work; and I do hereby declare that the cost thereof, less such contribution as may be made thereto (if any) by the Government of New Zealand, shall be borne by the Council of the County of Hawke's Bay and the Council of the County of Wairoa in the following proportions, in terms of an agreement entered into between the Hawke's Bay County Council and the Wairoa County Council, and dated the twenty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, viz. :—

1. Within twelve months after the issue of this Warrant the Wairoa County Council shall pay to the Hawke's Bay County Council a sum of money equivalent to one-fourth part of the total estimated cost of building and making safe and convenient the said work, and of constructing all such works as the engineer in charge may deem necessary for the protection thereof: Provided always that the Wairoa County Council shall not be liable under this clause for the payment of any greater sum than eight hundred pounds: Provided, further, that in case the Hawke's Bay County Council shall raise a loan under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, for the purpose of defraying the estimated cost aforesaid, then the Wairoa County Council shall be at liberty to fulfil their obligations under this clause by paying to the Hawke's Bay County Council in each year during the currency of the said loan the sum of forty pounds (£40), or such lesser sum as may be required of them in this behalf, in satisfaction *pro tanto* of the yearly charges imposed on the Hawke's Bay County Council in respect of the said loan; and in such case and subject to the sanction aforesaid the said yearly payments shall be accepted by the Hawke's Bay County Council as a sufficient performance on the part of the Wairoa County Council of their obligation under this clause—that is to say, their obligation to contribute one-fourth part of the total estimated cost above referred to.

2. The Hawke's Bay County Council on their part shall contribute the residue of the total actual cost of constructing the said work—that is, the said bridge, approaches, and protective works; but for the purposes of the agreement any grant or grants in aid they may receive from the General Government shall be reckoned as part of their contribution to the said total cost.

3. The construction of the said work shall be carried out under the sole and exclusive control of the Hawke's Bay County Council, and according to their directions and subject to their supervision and to their satisfaction in all things; and for the purposes of the said work the Hawke's Bay County Council may employ such engineers, contractors, servants, and workmen as they shall choose, and for such respective periods of time and at such respective rates of remuneration or wages as they shall think fit, and they shall be solely responsible for the payment of all costs and expenses of and incidental to the execution of the said work.

4. In case the Wairoa County Council shall elect to perform the obligation under the agreement by paying the annual sum mentioned in clause 1 hereof, then that annual payment shall not be varied so long as the boundary between the Counties of Wairoa and Hawke's Bay shall remain unchanged; but if at any future time any change shall be made in the said boundary so as to include in the County of Hawke's Bay some portion of the present County of Wairoa, or so as to include in the County of Wairoa some portion of the present County of Hawke's Bay, then and in any such case the parties hereto shall make as between themselves a fair and equitable readjustment and reapportionment of the cost of the said work: Provided that if the said parties shall fail to agree with regard to the terms of the said readjustment and reapportionment, then the same shall be made on their behalf by the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Land District of Hawke's Bay, whose decision shall be final and without appeal.

And I do hereby further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Council of the County of Wairoa shall be paid from time to time respectively in the proportion hereinbefore prescribed out of the funds of the said county, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Hawke's Bay County Council, and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the Clerk of the Hawke's Bay County Council for and on behalf of the Wairoa County Council.

THAT bridge over the Esk or Petane River at a point on the main road from Napier to Wairoa, distant about nine miles from the Napier Post-office, and being within the boundaries of the County of Hawke's Bay; as the site of the said bridge is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 28562, deposited in the office of the Minis-

ter of Public Works, at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and thereon shown in red colour.

“Dwellinghouse” includes any house or building in which human beings dwell or are intended to dwell, but does not include offices appurtenant to a dwellinghouse:

“Board” means the Mount Roskill Road Board:

“District” means the water-supply area of the Mount Roskill Road District as defined in *Gazette*, 1902, No. 2, page 19:

“Site” means a piece, lot, allotment, or subdivision of land intended to be appropriated to the purposes of one dwellinghouse:

“An offence” shall mean an offence against these by-laws, and shall include the omission or neglect to comply with any part thereof.

Building-site Area.

1. No person shall erect a dwellinghouse in the district upon a site of a less area than one-fifth of an acre, and unless such site shall have a frontage of at least 50 ft. to a road.

2. If after the passing of these by-laws a dwellinghouse be erected upon any site in the district of greater area than one-fifth of an acre, no person shall erect another dwellinghouse thereon unless each dwellinghouse shall have a site of at least one-fifth of an acre and each site shall have a frontage to a road of at least 50 ft.

3. Nothing contained in these by-laws shall apply to any allotment of land shown on a plan of subdivision deposited at any lands or deeds registration office, or approved by the Board, before the passing of the Public Health Amendment Act, 1910.

Every person who after the coming into operation of these by-laws shall do or cause to be done, or be concerned in doing, anything contrary to the same or any of them, or any provision therein contained, or who shall omit to do anything required by the same or any of them to be done by him, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of the same.

Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every offence, and in the case of a continuous offence to a penalty of not more than £5 for each day during which such offence continues after the first day.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of six, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
