Constituting the Town District of Napier South, in the County of Hawke's Bay.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Town Boards Act, 1908, that the Governor may declare that any locality outside a borough wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act, 1908:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said area shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district, under the Town Boards Act, 1908, by the name of the Napier South Town District. And in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of five members.

Altering Boundaries of Kurahaupo and Tongariro Maori Council Districts under the Provisions of the Maori Councils Act, 1900.

(L.S.) PLUNKET, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section three of the Maori Councils Act, 1900 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor may proclaim any district a Maori district for the purposes of the said Act, and at any time may alter or revoke such Proclamation: And whereas by Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of December, one thousand nine hundred, the Governor proclaimed certain districts to be Maori districts for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of certain of the districts so proclaimed:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee, Baron Plunket, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, do hereby amend the said recited Proclamation by altering the boundary between the Kurahaupo and Tongariro Maori Council Districts so as to include the area described in the Schedule hereto in the Kurahaupo Maori Council District, and to exclude the said area from the Tongariro Maori Council District.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land bounded as follows: Commencing at Paretaitonga Peak, and running by a right line in a southerly direction to Trig. B. on the north-west boundary of Rangipo-Waiu No. 1B Block; thence along the north-west boundary of that block to the Tongariro River, and north-easterly along that river to its junction with the Waipahihi Stream; thence south-easterly along that stream to its source; thence along the southern boundary of Kaimanawa No. 3B Block to the source of the Moawhangoiti Stream, and south-easterly along that stream to its junction with the Moawhango River; thence north-westerly along the said Moawhango River to the north-west boundary of Orouamatua-Kaimanawa Block; thence by the north-west boundaries of Orouamatua-Kaimanawa Nos. 1 and 4 to the Oteamateanui River, and south-easterly by that river to its junction with the Rangitikei River; thence south-easterly by that river to its junction with the Mangamaire River; thence north-easterly along the

Mangamaire River to the north-west corner of Owhaoko B Block; thence easterly along the boundary between the Tapuioruahine Block and the Owhaoko B, D1, and D8 Blocks to the Ngaruroro River; thence by the Ngaruroro River to where it crosses the boundary of the Tamatea Maori Council District; thence towards the south generally along the boundary of the Tamatea Maori Council District to a point due east of the source of the Kawhatau River; thence along the original south-western boundary of the Tongariro Maori Council District (as recited in the Proclamation of the twenty-sixth day of December, one thousand nine hundred) to the point of commencement.

Special Order made by the Remuera Road Board, County of Eden, making By-laws.

THE following special order, made by the Remuera Road Board, is published in accordance with the provisions of the Road Boards Act, 1908.

THE Remuera Road Board, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the Road Boards Act, 1908, the Public Health Act, 1908, and the Public Works Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following by-laws:—

INTERPRETATION.

1. In the construction of these by-laws the words and expressions used herein the meaning of which is defined in clause 1 of certain by-laws of the Board made by special order on the 7th day of March, 1910, and confirmed on the 28th day of April, 1910 (hereinafter referred to as the said by-law), shall, unless inconsistent with the context, bear the meaning attached to them by the said clause of the said by-laws.

IN RESPECT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY.

2. Every person who shall make an application to the Clerk pursuant to paragraph (c) of clause 2 of the said by-laws shall pay to the Clerk for use of the Board the sums respectively set out as follows, and at the time he lodges his said application:—

For buildings to cost a sum not exceeding ..	£	s.	d.
For buildings to cost a sum not exceeding ..	£350	0	10 0
For buildings to cost a sum not exceeding ..	£700	1	0 0
For buildings to cost a sum not exceeding ..	£1,000	1	5 0

For buildings to cost a sum not exceeding ..	£3,000	3	0 0

3. No building shall be erected, added to, or altered in such manner that the outer side of any external wall thereof shall be situate within 4 ft. of any boundary of

the site upon which such building shall be erected, added to, or altered, or within 8 ft. of the outer side of the external wall of any other building on another site. The term site in this by-law shall bear the meaning assigned to it in paragraph (a) of clause 2 of the said by-laws. Provided, however, that if the said external wall shall be erected in brick, concrete, or non-combustible material other than metal this section shall not apply.

4. Every owner and occupier of a house which is at the time these by-laws come into operation within 100 ft. of a sewer or public drain shall, within three calendar months from such time, provide and instal in such house or upon the site thereof a water-closet or a sufficient number of water-closets.

5. Every owner and occupier of a house which shall at any time after these by-laws come into operation be or become situated within 100 ft. of a sewer or public drain shall, unless the same is already provided and installed therewith, provide and instal in such house or upon the site thereof a water-closet, or a sufficient number of water-closets, within the period of three calendar months after such house shall be or become situated within 100 ft. of such sewer or drain.

6. No person who is obliged by these by-laws to provide and instal a water-closet or a sufficient number of water-closets shall, after the time the same ought in accordance with these by-laws to be provided or installed, use or permit, suffer, or allow to be used any closet or privy save such water-closet as is provided for by these by-laws.

7. No person shall, after the time when he is obliged by these by-laws to provide and instal a water-closet, construct or use, or permit, suffer, or allow to be constructed or used, any water-closet save in accordance with the following provisions:—

(a.) Every detached building used for the purpose of a water-closet shall be either a new building or shall be in a perfectly clean and sound condition, and must be, if wood-floored, raised so as to allow 6 in. of air-space between the ground and such floor, and the studs from the floor to eaves-level must be at least 9 ft. high.

(b.) Every water-closet erected in a building shall be constructed in such a position that at least one of its sides shall be an external wall; and such external wall shall be provided with a window having an area (exclusive of frame) of not less than 2 sq. ft., and also with an air-brick or an outlet covered with perforated zinc or galvanized-wire netting having an area of not less than 40 sq. in., and such window shall be made to open directly on or communicate directly with the open air throughout at least one-third of its area. In the case of a fully detached water-closet, or one attached to an outhouse, light and ventilation shall be provided as above.

(c.) No water-closet shall be connected with any water-supply directly, but shall be provided with a separate cistern, of approved materials and construction, containing and delivering at each flush 3 gallons, fitted with an efficient ball cock; and such closet shall be connected with a drain leading to a sewer or public drain in accordance with this by-law. There shall be provided a high-pressure stop-cock to regulate the flow of water into every cistern. The service pipe from the cistern to the closet-basin shall be not less than 1½ in. in internal diameter, and shall be made of drawn lead or galvanized screwed iron or brass piping. The bottom of the supply-cistern shall be placed at least 5 ft. above the closet-seat, unless where it is shown that the closet-basin is specially designed to be operated with the flush cistern at lesser height.

(d.) Every water-closet shall be furnished with a pan, basin, or other receptacle of non-absorbant material, and of such shape and capacity and of such mode of construction as to receive and contain a sufficient quantity of water, and to allow all filth which may from time to time be deposited in such pan, basin, or receptacle to fall free of the sides thereof and directly into the water received and contained in such pan, basin, or receptacle. In no case shall the form of basin known as a "washout basin" or "hopper and trap" be used, nor shall any closet be used having an outlet underneath or in such a position as to prevent the joint with the soil-pipe being readily inspected.

(e.) Every closet basin-trap shall be ventilated by an airtight pipe of not less than 2 in. in diameter, made of 6 lb. lead or galvanized screwed iron piping for such length as is within the building, and external thereto of similar material or of 22-gauge galvanized iron. This ventilation-pipe shall be carried either up to a point 2 ft. above the eaves, or connected to the extension of the soil-pipe at a point not less than 3 ft. above the highest closet connection. Where two or more closets connect with the same soil-pipe, the ventilation-pipes from their traps may be connected to a single ventilation-pipe of 3 in. in diameter.

(f.) No closet-basin shall be enclosed, but shall be left open so that every joint in connection therewith can be readily inspected.

(g.) The soil-pipe of every water-closet, and every portion of the drain thereof not imbedded in the solid ground, shall be not less than 4 in. internal diameter, made of 6 lb. lead or cast iron. It shall be fixed on the outside of the building, be properly supported, and have airtight joints. The soil-pipe shall in all cases be without traps, and the drain shall be perfectly free from obstructions between the disconnection-trap and the ventilation outlets. The soil-pipe when used as a ventilation shall be extended from the highest branch closet connection to a point at least 3 ft. above the eaves, with an internal diameter of not less than 4 in., and this extension shall be formed of 6 lb. lead, screwed wrought iron, galvanized 24 B.W.G. galvanized iron, or cast iron. It shall be properly supported, and carried on the outside of the building in a suitable manner, free from avoidable angles and bends, being finished with a cap or cowl, and terminating not less than 6 ft. from any chimney, window, or other opening, and not less than 30 ft. from a window or other opening which may be on a level with or above such outlet.

8. No person shall erect or fit up any closet, or lay on any water service to a closet, or connect any closet with any drain, or alter, reconstruct, extend, or remove any closet, unless he shall have previously given the Clerk three days' notice in writing of his intention to do so. Such notice to be given in the following form:—

9. No person shall put, place, or deposit upon any road within the road district any filth, dirt, rubbish, refuse, or decaying animal or vegetable matter.

10. Any notice required to be sent pursuant to clause 24 of the said by-laws may be in the following form:—

THE Remuera Road Board, pursuant to its by-laws, hereby require you, within . . . from the service of this notice upon you, to remove *[or repair]* a certain drainpipe *[trap, urinal, water-closet]*. The work is required to be done in the following manner:

You are warned that if you fail to comply with this requisition the Board may do the work and you will be liable to pay the cost incurred. In addition, you will also be liable to a penalty for a breach of the Board's by-laws.

11. The owners and occupiers of any building used or constructed, or adapted to be used, either ordinarily or occasionally, as a church, chapel, or other place of public worship, or as a hospital, college, school, theatre, public hall, public concert-room, public ball-room, public lecture-room, or public exhibition-room, or as a place of assembly for persons admitted thereto by tickets or otherwise, or used or constructed, or adapted to be used, either ordinarily or occasionally, for any other public purpose, shall, within a period of three calendar months after these by-laws shall come into operation, cause the doors of every such building to be so constructed as to open outwards freely, and thereafter to be so maintained.

12. Every licensed plumber and drain-connector who shall execute any work as such in the district shall leave or cause to be left at the office of the Board, on the first day of every month, a statement in writing setting forth in detail the nature of the work (if any) he has done in the district during the month prior to the forwarding or leaving of the notice, and the several persons for whom he has done the work, together with a statement of the situation of the property upon which the work has been done.

IN RESPECT OF HEAVY TRAFFIC.

13. Where the Board is of opinion that the conduct of the particular kinds of traffic hereinafter referred to will cause serious injury to roads under their control, no person shall conduct or cause to be conducted all or any of the following kinds of traffic, that is to say: The carriage of timber, bricks, sand, lime, cement, shell, metal, scoria, posts, sleepers, gas-pipes, stone, earth, gravel, coal, fire-wood, water-pipes and fittings, steel and iron rails, upon or along all or any road under the control of the Board,

unless the cost, as estimated by the Board, of reinstating the road or roads consequent upon the injury so occasioned by such traffic to the road or roads upon or along which it is to be conducted is previously paid to the Board.

14. For the purpose of ascertaining the cost of reinstating the road or roads upon or along which such traffic is to be conducted, any person desirous of conducting such traffic may make an application in the form in the Schedule hereto to the Board.

15. No person shall make any application to the Board, pursuant to clause 13 of these by-laws, containing any statement false or untrue to the knowledge of such person.

GENERAL AND PENALTIES.

16. These by-laws shall apply to the whole of the district, and they shall come into force on their being gazetted.

17. If any person shall commit a breach of clauses 1 to 12, both inclusive, of these by-laws he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the case of a continuous breach to an additional fine not exceeding £5 for every day on which the breach is continued after the first day. The continued existence in a state contrary to any by-laws of any work or thing shall be deemed to be a continuous breach within the meaning of this clause.

18. If any person shall commit a breach of clauses 13 and 14 of these by-laws he shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20.

In the event of more than one person producing the required quantities of quicksilver before the dates named, inquiry will be made by the officer above referred to, when, if it is found that each applicant is equally entitled to a bonus, the amount will be divided in proportion to the quantities produced by each applicant, but in no case shall any bonus be paid until at least one hundred thousand pounds (100,000 lb.) of quicksilver has been produced in the aggregate.

2. Notice of intention to claim the aforesaid bonus must be given in writing to the Minister of Mines not later than 31st March, 1912.

3. The claim must be made and the conditions duly fulfilled on or before the 31st March, 1915.

4. The first claimant who proves to the satisfaction of the Government that he has fulfilled all the conditions under any of the headings (a), (b), (c), or (d) shall be the recipient of the bonus payable under that heading. The oil must in each case be produced from the well or wells of one proprietary only.

5. All conditions as to quantity, quality, priority, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.
