Proclaiming Native Land to be Crown Land under Section 368 of the Native Land Act, 1909.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and sixty-eight of the Native Land Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Crown may purchase any Native land in pursuance of a resolution of the assembled owners passed and confirmed in accordance with Part XVIII of the said Act, and on the resolution being adopted by the Native Land Purchase Board it shall become a contract of purchase as between the Crown and all persons who are the owners of the land; and the Governor may, by Proclamation at any time after the contract of purchase has been so made, declare that the land so purchased is vested in His Majesty the King, and it shall vest accordingly, and shall become Crown land:

And whereas a resolution was passed by a meeting of assembled owners, and duly confirmed by the Ikaroa District Maori Land Board, that the land set out in the Schedule hereto be sold to the Crown:

And whereas the Native Land Purchase Board duly considered and adopted the resolution:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three hundred and sixty-eight of the said Act, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the land set out in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and twenty-six of the Mining Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that on application in that behalf the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, constitute and set apart the whole or any part of any watercourse to be a watercourse into which may be discharged any tailings, debris, and waste matter produced by or resulting from mining operations carried on under the said Act, and in which, or on the banks of which, mining operations may be lawfully carried on:

net of any description (except a landing-net) in the Taieri River :

Provided that this regulation shall not prohibit the use of nets for the taking of indigenous fish at the mouth or entrance of such river, or from the mouth or entrance up to the ferry or bridge.

Any person committing a breach of this regulation is liable to a fine of not less than £1 and not more than £50.

And whereas a Commissioner was appointed, and an inquiry was duly held in the manner provided by the said Act in respect to the said work, and in respect also to the apportionment of the cost of constructing the said work:

And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor, after due inquiry, his opinion as to the matters respecting which he was appointed to report:

And whereas I am of opinion that the work, together with the additional works described in the said Schedule, which the Commissioner has recommended should be carried out, should be done, and it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby

authorize the Pelorus Road Board to execute the said work and additional works described in the Schedule hereto; and I do hereby declare that the cost thereof, less such contribution as may be made thereto (if any) by the Government of New Zealand, shall be borne by the Pelorus Road Board, the Havelock Town Board, the Picton Road Board, the Blenheim Borough Council, the Omaka Road Board, the Wairau Road Board, and the Spring Creek Road Board in the following proportions, viz.: The Pelorus Road Board to bear forty per centum of such cost, the Havelock Town Board to bear five per centum of such cost, the Blenheim Borough Council to bear twenty-five per centum of such cost, the Omaka Road Board to bear sixteen per centum of such cost, the Wairau Road Board to bear nine per centum of such cost, and the Spring Creek Road Board to bear three per centum of such cost respectively.

And whereas the portions of streets known as Boston Road and Mount Eden Road, described in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter termed "the said portions of streets," form the boundary between the Auckland City and the Borough of Mount Eden:

And whereas a dispute has arisen as to which local authority should have control of the said portions of streets, and what proportion of the cost of constructing and maintaining the said portions of streets should be borne by the local authorities affected:

And whereas an inquiry was duly held, and a report was made, in respect to the matter:

And whereas it is expedient that effect should be given to the recommendations contained in the said report, and that provision should be made for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that, from and after the date of this Warrant, the control and maintenance of the said portions of streets shall be as provided for in an agreement made between the Auckland City Council and the Borough of Mount Eden—viz., the Auckland City Council and the Mount Eden Borough Council shall each construct, control, and maintain the portion of Mount Eden Road adjoining both districts situated on its own side of the tram-rails.

And I do hereby further direct that the Mount Eden Borough Council shall construct, control, and maintain the whole of that portion of Boston Road lying between Mount Eden Road and the production of a line being the eastern boundary of Normanby Road, and that the Auckland City Council shall construct, control, and maintain that portion of Boston Road from the aforesaid tram-rails, being the production of the eastern boundary of Normanby Road to the Epsom Road District boundary. SCHOOL FOR DEAF-MUTES, SUMNER, NEAR CHRISTCHURCH.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of six, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
