Additional Regulations under the Christchurch Tramway District Act, 1906, and the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, and Amendments.

ISLINGTON, Governor.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of June, 1911.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in this behalf conferred upon him by the Christchurch Tramway District Act, 1906, and the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, and amendments, and of all other powers and authorities him hereto enabling, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made under the said Acts on the ninth day of March, one thousand

nine hundred and nine, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the eighteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and in lieu thereof and substitution therefor doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Acts in addition to those made by Order in Council on the fifteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and six, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the twenty-second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and six.

REGULATIONS.

EXCEPT where such interpretation is repugnant to or in conflict with the context of these regulations or the provisions of the said Acts, the word "Secretary" as hereinafter mentioned shall refer to and include the Secretary for the time being of the Christchurch Tramway Board; and the words "a roll," "such roll," or "the said roll" as hereinafter mentioned shall mean a roll or rolls, whether special or otherwise, for the purpose of taking a vote on any proposal to raise any sum by way of loan for tramway purposes; and the words "the local authority" or "the Board" shall mean the Christchurch Tramway Board.

Whenever it becomes necessary for the purpose of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, and its amendments, to prepare a roll for the purpose of taking a vote in any subdistrict or subdistricts, or any portion of any subdistrict or subdistricts, to raise any sum by way of loan for tramway purposes the following regulations shall apply:—

- (1.) The Secretary shall make out for such subdistrict, subdistricts, or part or parts thereof, a roll of the electors as defined in section 5 of the Christchurch Tramway District Act, 1906, and who are qualified to vote.
- (2.) Every roll shall be prepared from the existing valuation roll, and shall be in the form and shall contain the particulars specified in the First Schedule hereto, as the case may require.
- (3.) In the event of its being necessary to compile a roll of the whole of the Christchurch Tramway District, or any part thereof, the rolls of all subdistricts may together be a combined roll.
- (4.) It shall be the duty of the Secretary to make every such roll as complete as possible, and for that purpose he shall place thereon, in addition to the names obtained from the existing valuation roll as aforesaid, the name of—
(a.) Every person of whose qualification or qualifications as an elector he is satisfied;
(b.) Every person who makes and delivers or transmits to him at his office a claim for enrolment as next hereinafter prescribed, and who, in the opinion of the Secretary, possesses the prescribed qualifications.
- (5.) Every claim for enrolment shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and the claimant's signature shall be attested by a Justice of the Peace, or a Postmaster, or a minister of religion, or an elector of the Christchurch Tramway District, or the Secretary, or the Clerk of any local authority.
- (6.) It shall be the duty of the Board and of the Secretary to keep at the office of the Board a supply of blank printed claim-forms for the proper use of claimants for the purpose aforesaid.
- (7.) The Secretary shall, prior to the making-up of the said roll, insert in two or more newspapers circulating in the Christchurch district notice that it is his intention to compile such roll, and inviting persons who possess freehold or rating qualification to transmit their names within the time specified in such notice, and in the manner and form prescribed, for the purpose of inserting the same on such roll.
- (8.) The said roll shall be deposited for public inspection at the office of the local authority for not less than seven days prior to the first public notice of intention to raise the loan, and notice of that deposit shall be published on the first day of such deposit in some newspaper or newspapers circulating in the district within which the rating-area is situated. Subject to any amendments to be made under regulation numbered 11 hereof, the said roll shall be deemed to be closed at 9 a.m. on the first day that the said roll is deposited for public inspection as aforesaid.
- (9.) Any ratepayer who objects to any matter or thing contained in the said roll, and who desires that such objection shall be heard or considered, shall forward notice thereof in writing, in the form or to the effect set forth in the Third Schedule

hereto, to the local authority within seven days after the last day on which the roll was deposited as aforesaid. Such notice shall be in duplicate, and shall state fully the grounds of objection, and also the full name and address of any objector.

- (10.) The local authority shall cause to be prepared a list of all objections, if any, to the said roll, and such list shall state the name and address of the objector, his number on the roll, and his reasons for objecting to the valuation or to any other matter or thing contained in the said roll.
- (11.) Such list, or a certified copy thereof, together with the said roll, shall be submitted to the Stipendiary Magistrate for the said district, and if there shall be more than one Stipendiary Magistrate for such district, then to the senior Stipendiary Magistrate for the same. The said Stipendiary Magistrate shall give at least seven days' notice of the time and place appointed by him to hear such objections, and he shall have jurisdiction to hear and finally determine the same and all matters directly connected with such objections, and also to make all such alterations in the said roll as he may think proper, and shall initial all alterations, additions, or erasures so made by him, and shall sign the said roll.
- (12.) The roll, when so signed and initialled, shall be the roll for the portion of the district specified therein, and shall be delivered by the said Stipendiary Magistrate to the local authority as the complete roll for the particular rating district or area to which the same relates.
- (13.) Where no objections have been made to the said roll, the Chairman of the local authority shall sign the said roll and affix the seal of the local authority to the same, and such roll shall thereupon be deemed to be duly authenticated.
- (14.) As soon as practicable, the roll so compiled shall be printed.
- (15.) The Secretary shall supply any person with a copy of any roll, together with a copy of any supplementary roll, upon payment of one shilling (1s.).
- (16.) The Secretary shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5) in every case where he refuses, or wilfully neglects, or unreasonably delays—
 - (a.) To place on the said roll the name of any person who makes written claim for enrolment as provided by paragraph (b) of clause 4 of these regulations; or
 - (b.) To faithfully and promptly perform any other duty imposed on him by the said Acts or these regulations.
- (17.) If the Board shall fail or unreasonably delay to keep at the office of the Board a supply of blank printed claim-forms for the free use of claimants as provided by clause 6 of these regulations, or to faithfully and promptly perform any other duty imposed on it by the said Acts or these regulations, every person (whether the Secretary or any member of the Board) who is party to or responsible for such failure shall be severally liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section seven (b) of the National Provident Fund Act, 1910, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke Regulation 25 of the regulations under that Act dated the ninth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the nineteenth day of the same month, and doth hereby make the following regulation in lieu thereof.

REGULATION.

25. (1.) ALL moneys belonging to the Fund and in the hands of the Public Trustee shall form part of the common fund of the Public Trust Office, and shall be invested by the Public Trustee accordingly.

(2.) This regulation shall extend and apply to all moneys belonging to the Fund and in the hands of the Public Trustee at the date on which this regulation comes into operation (whether such moneys are already invested by the Public Trustee on mortgage or otherwise on behalf of the National Provident Fund Board or not), and all moneys so invested shall be deemed to form part of the common fund accordingly.

Rules for the Examination of Masters of Sailing-ships plying in Harbours and Rivers.

WHEREAS by Warrant dated the 29th day of July, 1910, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 74, of the 2nd day of August following, rules were made for the examination of candidates for certificates of competency as masters and mates: And whereas it is desirable to make additional regulations:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section 23 of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I do hereby make the following regulations for the examination of candidates for certificates of competency as master of sailing-ships plying in harbours and rivers, and do hereby order that they shall be embodied in and read with the said regulations of the 29th day of July, 1910.

REGULATIONS.

1. CANDIDATES for examination as master of sailing-ships in harbours or rivers must make a proper application on a form which will be supplied on application at any Mercantile Marine Office. The application, accompanied with the necessary testimonials, must be lodged at the Mercantile Marine Office for delivery to the examiners. Certificates procured on false information will be cancelled.

2. Candidates for certificates must pass the three sight-tests mentioned in the regulations relating to the examination of masters and mates.

3. A master of a sailing-ship in harbours or rivers must be twenty-one years of age, and must have served at least one year at sea or on board of a vessel plying within harbours or river limits. He must produce satisfactory testimonials of good conduct and sobriety. He must be able to read and write and understand the first five rules of arithmetic. He must understand the rules of the road as regards both steamers and sailing-ships, their regulation lights and fog and sound signals, and the local harbour regulations. He must understand how to act for the safety of the ship if caught in a sudden squall, and what action to take if a man falls overboard; also any other questions of a like nature appertaining to the duties of the master of this class of ship.

In the matter of a Bill to be intituled "An Act to incorporate and confer certain Powers on the Trustees of the Three Kings Institution and to make other Provisions in regard thereto," the Short Title of which shall be the Methodist Charitable and Education Trusts Act, 1911.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the General Assembly of New Zealand at the ensuing session thereof for leave to bring in a Bill to be intituled "An Act to incorporate and confer certain Powers on the Trustees of the Three Kings Institution and to make other Provisions in regard thereto," and that the objects of such Bill will be—

1. To constitute the present Trustees of all those pieces of land particularly described in the First, Second, and Third Schedules hereto (hereinafter termed "the said lands") a body corporate, under the name of "The Board of the Wesley Training College," having a perpetual succession and a common seal; and to provide regulations governing the meetings of such Board, the keeping of minutes and accounts, the appointment of new members, the circumstances creating vacancies, the mode of filling such vacancies, and generally defining the powers of the Board.

2. To vest all the said lands in the Board, to be used and administered by the Board under the general control and superintendence of the Conference of the Methodist Church of Australasia in New Zealand (hereinafter termed "the Conference").

3. with discretionary power to the Board as to selection of applicants for admission and as to fees to be charged where parents or guardians are of ability to pay the same, the trusts and purposes expressed in the Crown grants of the said land being modified and assimilated accordingly.

5. To provide that the course of instruction in the said institution shall be that indicated in the Crown grants of the said lands, and to define the scope of the words "instruction in the English language," "industrial training," and "religious education" as used in the said Crown grants.

6.
