#### ISLINGTON, Governor. (L.S.) A PROCLAMATION.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Town Boards Act, 1908, that the Governor may declare that any locality outside a borough wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act, 1908:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said area shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district, under the Town Boards Act, 1908, by the name of the Manunui Town District. And in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of seven members.

# MANUNUI TOWN DISTRICT.

Manunui Town District.

All that area in the Wellington Land District bounded towards the north and north-east generally by the Wanganui River from a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section No. 5, Block II, Hunua Survey District, to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 139, Suburbs of Manunui (cemetery reserve); thence towards the south-east by a right line to and by the said south-eastern boundary of Section No. 139 and its production to the Main Trunk Railway line; thence towards the south-west by that railway-line to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 83, Suburbs of Manunui (quarry reserve); thence again to-

wards the south-east by a right line to the easternmost corner of that section, and by the south-eastern boundary to Section No. 29, Block II, Hunua Survey District; thence towards the east by the eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 29, 22, 24, and 26, Block II aforesaid, to the southernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence again towards the south-west by the south-western boundary of that section to the public road forming its western boundary; thence across that road to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 17, Block II aforesaid; thence by the southern boundary of that section to its south-western corner; thence towards the west generally by the western boundaries of Sections Nos. 17, 16, 15, and 14 to the westernmost corner of Section No. 79, Suburbs of Manunui, in Block II aforesaid; thence again towards the south generally by a right line through Sections Nos. 1, 2, and 3, Block II aforesaid, to the corner of the road opposite the easternmost corner of Section No. 4; thence across the said road and by the southern boundary of the said Section No. 4 to its westernmost corner; thence towards the northwest by the north-western boundary of the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 5, Block II aforesaid, to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of that section; thence again towards the south-west by a right line across the said road to the north-eastern corner of the said Section No. 5; and thence by that section and the production the said road to the north-eastern corner of the said Section No. 5; and thence by that section and the production of its north-eastern boundary to the Wanganui River, the place of commencement.

HEREAS by Order in Council dated the fifth day of December, nineteen hundred and ten, regulations were made under the authority of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, as amended by the Post and Telegraph Amendment Act, 1910 (hereinafter termed the said Acts), for the insurance of registered postal packets of any description (whether for delivery within or beyond New Zealand), the payment of premiums in respect thereof, and the payment of the amount of the insurance, not exceeding four hundred pounds in respect of any such postal packet: And whereas it is expedient to revoke those regulations and to make other regulations in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Acta, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, ooth hereby revoke the regulations made in the above-recited Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto for the same purpose; and doth further order that such revocation shall take effect as from, and the regulations hereby made shall come into force on, the first day of July, nineteen hundred and eleven.

#### SCHEDULE.

#### INSURANCE OF LETTERS.

- 1. LETTERS addressed to any place in the United Kingdom, or in any foreign country (via London) which has the insurance of letters system in force, or in New Zealand, may be in ured on the conditions mentioned below, and, subject to the following regulations, compensation (not exceeding in any case the sum of £400) shall be paid for the loss in the post of any letter or its contents so insured.
- 2. Every letter so insured must contain bank-notes, bonds, coupons, securities, or other documents of the kind. Post-cards, packets of "printed papers" or "commercial papers," sample packets, or letters which contain articles other than documents as aforesaid shall not be insured.
- 3. A letter intended for insurance must be presented at the counter of a post-office. Letters dropped into a letter-box or handed to a postman or a mail-cart driver shall not be insured.
- 4. Every letter tendered for insurance must be enclosed in a strong envelope, which must be securely fastened and sealed with fine wax in such a way that it cannot be opened without either breaking the seals or leaving obvious traces of having been interfered with. An envelope with a black or coloured border shall not be accepted for insurance. No labers may be affixed except those of the postal service. Seals must be placed over each flap or seam of the cover of the letter, and at the points where flaps or seams meet; and if the packet is tied round with string or tape, a seal must be placed on the ends of the string or tape where they are tied.
- 5. Insured letters addressed to the United Kingdom, or to any country via the United Kingdom, shall, while this regulation remains in force, be sent via Suez only.

6. A letter containing any such documents as aforesaid addressed to the United Kingdom, or to any country via the United Kingdom, and bearing on the outside a declaration of the value of the contents must be insured.

7. An insured letter must be fully addressed in ink.

7. An insured letter must be fully addressed in ink. A letter addressed to initials or in pincil shall not be accepted.

8. A receipt on the usual registered-letter receipt form must always be obtained by the sender, and on payment of a fee of 2½d, he shall be furnished with an advice of delivery obtained in the manner provided.

9. All the seals on an insured letter must be of the same kind of wax, and must bear distinct impressions of the same private device. Coins must not be used for sealing; and the device must not consist merely of straight, crossed, or curved lines which could readily be imitated.

10. If a letter tendered for insurance does not, in the opinion of the officer of the

10. If a letter tendered for insurance does not, in the opinion of the officer of the post-office to whom it is tendered, comply with the foregoing conditions as to packing and sealing, he shall refuse to insure it. The onus of properly enclosing, packing, and sealing any postal packet lies upon the sender; and, notwithstanding the fact that it has been insured, no liability shall be assumed by the Postmaster-General for

that it has been insured, no hability shall be assumed by the Postmaster-General for loss in respect of that packet if such loss is due to failure on the part of the sender to comply with any of the conditions aforesaid.

11. The amount for which an article is insured must be written by the sender both in words and in figures at the top of the address side of the cover, thus: "Insured for fifteen pounds (£15)." No alteration or erasure of the inscription shall be allowed. If a mistake is made, the entry must be completely obliterated and an entirely new one made by the sender.

12. A letter cannot be insured for more than its actual value. A letter of which the contents have no saleable value may, however, be insured for a nominal sum in order to obtain the safeguards of the insurance system; the fee payable in such a case shall be the minimum one of 4d. for inland letters, 6d. for those addressed to the United Kingdom, and 8d. for those addressed to other countries via the United Kinglom. Insurance in excess of the value of the contents shall bar the payment of compensation in respect of any insured letter.

They shall also be redirected to any of the countries for which insured letters are accepted, but a fresh insurance fee becomes payable for such transmission. If the fee is not prepaid, it shall be collected from the

16. Compensation for the loss in the post of an insured letter or its contents shall not exceed the amount of the actual loss or damage, and shall not be paid for a letter containing any prohibited article, or for any letter which has been delivered without external trace of injury, and has been accepted without remark; or when loss arises from tempest, shipwreck, earthquake, war, or other cause beyond control. No claim for compensation shall be admitted if made more than a year after the packet in respect of which the claim is preferred was posted.

for compensation shall be admitted if made more than a year after the packet in respect of which the claim is preferred was posted.

17. In case of a claim respecting the loss or damage of an insured letter containing bank-notes, bonds, coupons, securities, or other similar documents, particulars sufficient for the identification of those documents must be furnished.

18. Inland letters containing coin may also be insured, but in such case the coin shall be packed so that it cannot move about. The compensation, however, for the loss of coin shall in no case exceed £5.

19. No legal liability to give compensation in respect of any letter for which an insurance fee has been paid shall utach to the Postmaster-General, either personally or in his official capacity. The final decision upon all questions of compensation shall rest with the Postmaster-General or the Minister discharging the office of the Postmaster-General of the country in which the loss has taken place, or shall be referred to the postal authorities of such country. to the postal authorities of such country.

#### RESIDENCE AND IMPROVEMENTS.

12. All fruit-trees and grape-vines shall be pruned, dressed, sprayed, and fertilized to the satisfaction of the Minister or of some person appointed by him for the pur-

Minister or of some person appointed by him for the purpose.

13. All land subject to the said Act which is planted in orchards or vineyards shall be ploughed at least once during the months of March, April, or May, and also during the months of September, October, or November in each year. Each such ploughing shall be followed by not less than six harrowings or hoeings, or by as many more such cultivations as may be required to maintain the soil in good open condition, and free from weeds, grass, or vegetation other than such vegetation as is authorized by the Minister or by some person on his behalf.

14. On the whole of the land planted in orchard on each allotment, a cover crop suitable for green manure shall be grown and ploughed under in the spring of every third year, unless otherwise authorized by the Minister or by some person on his behalf.

15. No animals, except fowls, shall be allowed to be at large or to graze on land planted as an orchard, or as a vineyard, or as a shelter-belt; nor shall any animal or animals be allowed to graze or be at large on any other land unless that land is securely fenced off from any orchard, vineyard, shelter-belt, or road.

16. The occupier of an allotment under the said Act shall not keep bees, except by permission of the Minister or of some person authorized by the Minister in that behalf, and then only in accordance with the terms of that permission.

17. (1.) If, in the opinion of the Minister, a lessee fails

permission.

17. (1.) If, in the opinion of the Minister, a lessee fails at any time to properly comply with the conditions of his lease as contained in the foregoing regulations numbered 8 to 16, the Minister may call upon such lessee to comply with the said conditions within a period to be specified by the Minister.

(2.) Should the said lessee fail to comply with the said conditions within the specified period, the Minister may cause such work to be undertaken as shall enable the said

cause such work to be undertaken as shall enable the said conditions to be complied with, and the cost of such work shall be borne by the said lessee, and until payment thereof by him shall constitute a debt recoverable by any person authorized by the Minister for that purpose in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

(3.) Should a lessee at any time permit the orchard or cultivations upon his allotment to deteriorate in value to any appreciable extent, the question as to whether or not there is such deterioration shall be determined by the Minister; or should a lessee wilfully cause damage, or negligently permit damage to be done, to the said orchard or cultivations, then and in such case the Minister or person authorized by him for that purpose may bring a suit in any Court of competent jurisdiction for the recovery from the said lessee of the amount of the said depreciation in value or of the damage caused as aforesaid, and the lessee shall be liable for the whole amount of such damage or depreciation.

(4.) The Minister may forfeit the lease of any lessee forthwith upon non-compliance with the conditions of his

lease, or the deterioration in value of the orchard or culti-

lease, or the deterioration in value of the orchard or cultivations of any allotment leased by him, and more particularly set forth in paragraphs (1) and (3) of this regulation. (5.) Every lessee, prior to the execution of his lease, shall execute a bond to the Commissioner to enure for the benefit of the said Commissioner for the time being, with one surety to be approved by the said Commissioner, conditioned for maintaining the said orchard and cultivations on his allotment free from damage or depreciation as aforesaid, and for the due payment of any moneys recoverable under paragraphs (2) and (3) hereof.

(6.) Every such bond shall be for an amount equal to 20 per centum of the total capital value of the allotment granted to the said lessee.

#### ADVANCES OF MONEY FOR BUILDINGS.

18. Advances of money for the erection of a dwelling-house may be made under the New Zealand State-guaranteed Advances Act, 1909, and its amendments, or under the following regulations, as the Minister shall decide in each

case.

19. When Parliament has appropriated money for advances under the said Act and these regulations, the holder of any allotment selected thereunder may apply to the Minister, through the Commissioner, for an advance, and shall enclose with his application a plan of the proposed house, together with specifications thereof, and such other information as may be required by the Minister.

20. When the Minister has approved the erection of the dwellinghouse, the plans of the same, and the amount to be advanced for its erection, the Commissioner shall notify the holder of the allotment accordingly, and the holder may then proceed to erect the dwellinghouse.

21. The dwellinghouse must be completed to the satisfaction of the Commissioner according to the plans approved by the Minister.

22. Upon the completion of the dwellinghouse to the

22. Upon the completion of the dwellinghouse to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, the money authorized as aforesaid shall be forthwith paid over by the Commissioner to the holder of the allotment, or the builder of the house, as he thinks fit, and the said holder shall at the same time execute a mortgage to His Majesty for the amount so advanced.

23. The mortgage shall contain a table of repayments comprising annual interest at the rate of 7 per cent., reducible to 5 per cent. upon payment of the lesser amount within thirty days of the date when it becomes due, together with instalments of the principal amount advanced under the said mortgage. under the said mortgage.

24. Payments of principal and interest, as set forth in the schedule to the mortgage, shall be made half-yearly, the first half-yearly instalment being payable six months after the date of the loan.

after the date of the loan.

25. The repayments of principal shall extend over such period, being not less than five years nor more than fifteen years, as the Minister shall determine; provided that the mortgagor may at any time repay the whole of the money then due under the mortgage by giving one month's written notice to the Commissioner of his intention to do so, together with the amount of interest then due thereon.

26. In the event of any dwellinghouse on an allotment being destroyed or damaged by fire, all moneys (if any) payable to His Majesty under the policy of insurance shall be recoverable by the Commissioner, who, after deducting the expense (if any) incurred in recovering the same, shall, in his discretion, apply the residue thereof, or a sufficient part thereof, either in or towards restoring the dwellinghouse or in or towards paying the unpaid instalments of interest and principal, or in repayment of the principal due in respect of an advance under these regulations.

27. The lessee or owner shall at all times during which moneys may be due to His Majesty on account of any 26. In the event of any dwellinghouse on an allotment

27. The lessee or owner shall at all times during which moneys may be due to His Majesty on account of any dwellinghouse erected on his allotment keep in good repair and condition to the satisfaction of the Commissioner the dwellinghouse so erected, and shall not destroy, pull down, remove, or materially alter the same without the previous written permission of the Commissioner.

28. Every instalment of interest and principal as aforesaid, as it becomes due, and every sum paid by the Commissioner in respect of the insurance of any building towards the erection of which moneys have been advanced as aforesaid, shall be payable by and may be recovered

as aforesaid, shall be payable by and may be recovered from the lessee or owner of the said land in the same manner as rent.

29. All payments of money under these regulations or the said Act shall be made to the Receiver of Land Revenue for the land district in which the land is situate.

#### TRANSFER OF ALLOTMENTS.

30. It shall not be lawful for a lessee under the said Act to transfer his lease within a period of five years from

its date: Provided that, on the death of the lessee, or on the happening of any extraordinary event within the said period which in the opinion of the Commissioner renders a transfer necessary or expedient, a transfer of the lease may, with the sanction of the Minister, be made.

#### RATES, TAXES, AND ASSESSMENTS.

31. The lessee shall pay all rates, taxes, and assessments levied on or payable in respect of the land during the term of his lease.

#### VALUATION OF IMPROVEMENTS ON FORFEITURE OR SURRENDER.

32. In the event of the forfeiture or surrender of a lease, the provisions of the Land Act, 1908, respecting valuation of improvements and the payment or other disposal thereof shall, so far as the same are applicable, apply to the improvements made by the lessee.

# Existing Improvements to be specified in Lease.

EXISTING IMPROVEMENTS TO BE SPECIFIED IN LEASE.

33. For the purpose of distinguishing the improvements existing on the land at the date of the lease from those subsequently made by the tenant, the first-mentioned improvements and their value shall be fixed by the Commissioner, and be specified in the lease. Any building in respect of the election of which an advance has been made under these regulations shall be deemed to be an improvement effected by the lessee to the extent to which that advance, and the interest thereon, has been paid by the lessee.

## RIGHT TO TAKE WATER-RACES AND LAY PIPES.

34. The right is hereby reserved to the Crown or to its 34. The right is hereby reserved to the Crown or to its delegated authority to take water-races and to lay waterpipes over any lands disposed of, without compensation; but the rentals of the allotments shall be reduced in proportion to the area so taken or utilized when any such right has been exercised: Provided that if the said land has been disposed of for cash, or has been acquired in feesimple, the compensation to be paid for the area taken shall be assessed as provided for by Part III of the Public Works Act, 1908.

#### USE OF WATER.

35. In any case where the channel of any creek, or natural or artificial water-race or watercourse, runs on more allotments than one, then each lessee on whose land any part of such channel runs shall have the right to the any part of such channel runs shall have the right to the reasonable use and enjoyment of a reasonable proportion of the water that would flow in such channel if it were not stopped or diverted by any other lessee; and, for the purpose of securing such right as between the respective lessees, no lessee on whose land any portion of such channel runs shall at any time alter such portion, or stop or divert the water flowing therein, save to such extent as the Commissioner deems reasonable, and the decision of the Commissioner shall be final and conclusive.

## FORFEITURE OF LEASES.

FORFEITURE OF LEASES.

36. If a lessee under the said Act or these regulations is, during the term of the lease, twice convicted of an offence under the provisions of the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1908, the Noxious Weeds Act, 1908, or the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1908, with respect to the land comprised in his lease, his lease shall thereupon be deemed to be determined. For the purposes of this regulation it shall not be material that the second conviction was not obtained under the same Act as that under which the first conviction was obtained.

#### The Census and Statistics Act, 1910.—Agricultural and Pasteral Statistics.

Office of the Registrar-General, Wellington, 27th June, 1911.

THE last collection of the Agricultural and Pastoral Statistics was made by the Department of Agriculture in October, 1908, for the 1908-9 season.

No collection was made either in 1909 or in 1910, but in April last a return, in connection with the General Census, was taken under the provisions of the Census and Statistics Act, 1910.

On the 3rd April, the date of the Census, the crops were all harvested, but farmers and others were requested to show the crops on their land for the 1910–11 season, and although, owing to change of ownership of land, and other causes, some of the schedules were not as accurate as they might have been, the totals will not be materially affected.

The following return of corn and green crops must be treated as an "interim return," as there are still some schedules outstanding. The figures, however, may be taken as substantially correct. Comparing the grain and green crops with the returns of two years ago, both show a large decrease this year. This can be accounted for by the drought experienced in several parts of the Dominion last summer; and by the increase of dairying and of sheep-farming. The principal decreases are in Canterbury and Otago, where the drought was very severe, and where the turnip and other crops were, in many instances, total failures. In grain crops it will be noticed that whilst there is an increase in the area under wheat amounting to 81,859 acres, oats, on the other hand, show the very large decrease of 155,557 acres.

The following talles show the summarized increases and decreases for the Dominion, and the respective totals by districts and counties.
