Land reserved under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a scenic reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this tenth day of July, 1911.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-sixth day of December, nineteen hundred and seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and seven, regulations were made under the authority of the Post Office Act, 1900, for the conveyance of parcels by means of the Post Office: And whereas it is desirable to amend those regulations as hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, and of all other powers in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the additional regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth further order that these regulations shall form part of and be read together with the regulations first herein mentioned, and shall come into force on the date of publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

PROHIBITIONS.

- SOFT fruit shall not be accepted for transmission unless enclosed in liquid-tight tins, and securely packed. Regulation 12 (relating to prohibitions) of the original regulations is hereby amended accordingly.

CUSTOMS AND OTHER CHARGES PAYABLE BY SENDER.

- Customs and other charges ordinarily payable by the addressee of parcels may, in the case of parcels addressed to Australia or Papua, be prepaid by the sender, subject to the following conditions:—

(1.) The sender shall pay a fee of 6d., sign an undertaking to pay on demand the amount due, and make a deposit on account of the charges. The deposit shall be at the rate of 1s. for each 4s. or fraction of 4s. of the declared value of the parcel.

(2.) A final settlement will take place when a notification of the amount due has been received from Australia or Papua.

(3.) An undertaking to pay charges under this arrangement shall not be accepted if the sender is residing only temporarily in New Zealand, or is unable to give a settled address in this Dominion.

UNDELIVERED AND UNCLAIMED PARCELS.

- Unclaimed parcels originating in Australia shall, in the absence of instructions from the sender, be retained for four months from the date of the posting of the advice of non-delivery, and shall then be returned through the Dead Letter Office to the State in which they so originated.

Opening Lands in Wellington Land District for Sale or Selection.

ISLINGTON, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Land Act, 1908, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare and provide as follows, that is to say:—

1. The rural lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto are hereby set apart for disposal by way of sale or selection on Tuesday, the fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, at the respective prices specified in the said Schedule, and shall be deemed to be "heavy-bush land."

2. The said lands may be purchased for cash, or be selected for occupation with right of purchase, or on renewable lease; provided that in the case of lands containing or supposed to contain any metal, mineral, or valuable stone, they shall be selected on renewable lease only and shall not be purchased for cash.

3. No general rate shall be levied or collected by any local authority from the said lands for a period of two years from the date from which in each case respectively such lands are disposed of, and no local authority shall have power to levy or collect any such rate from such lands during such period.

4. After the first half-year's rent has been paid by the selector the further instalments of rent payable by him for a period of two years shall not be demanded; provided that if at any time during the first five years of his occupancy the selector disposes of his interest in the land, the rent so conceded shall be paid by him in full, and thereupon the Land Board may remit such instalments of rent payable by the incoming tenant, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of rent previously conceded to the selector, as the Board shall think fit.

LOCALITY AND DESCRIPTION.

This block is situated on the southern side of the Retaruke River, about twenty miles west of Raurimu, on the North Island Main Trunk Railway, and immediately north of the Mangatiti and Riariaki Blocks, which were disposed of in 1910.

The principal means of access to the block is by way of the Kaitieke-Retaruke Road from Raurimu. This road is formed for a distance of fifteen miles as a dray-road, and is continued as a bridle-track to its termination at the Wanganui River.

Mariner Patch buoy, 341°.

Hakau Mataleingale Reef beacon, 194°.

The master states that he touched at about 3 hours flood, and estimates the depth on the shoal to be about 3½ fathoms at low water. The pilot was not aware of the existence of the shoal on which the vessel touched.

Approximate position of observation spot (Pangai): Latitude 19° 48' 34" N., longitude 174° 20' 49" W.

FIJI ISLANDS.—DISCOLOURED WATER SOUTH-WESTWARD.—The master of the steamship "Providence" reports passing through discoloured water, which he believes indicated a bank, south-westward of the Fiji Islands, South Pacific Ocean, in (approximately) latitude 21° 31' S., longitude 176° 36' E.

The discolouration appeared to extend in an east-north-east—west-southwest direction.

Apparently no soundings were taken.

IN the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 6th July, 1911, there appeared a return showing the area in grain and pulse crops and root and green crops. The following tables show the yields for the principal crops. As anticipated, they are low, the drought experienced in many parts of the Dominion last summer being responsible.

SCHOOL FOR DEAF-MUTES, SUMNER, NEAR CHRISTCHURCH.

Under the Control and Supervision of the Education Department.

Director: MR. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of six, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
