U.S. NAVAL WIRELESS-TELEGRAPH STATIONS.

INFORMATION FURNISHED TO SHIPPING.—The following extracts from Special Order No. 98, of 24th April, 1911, issued by the Navy Department to its wireless-telegraph stations, concerning information sent out daily to ship-ping, is published for the information of mariners :—

Information furnished to Shipping.

86. Storm warnings and hydrographic information shall be sent broadcast at 8 a.m., noon (immediately after time signal), 4 p.m., and 8 p.m., local standard time, when received, and to passing vessels on request whenever practicable. Should it not be possible to send out the information mentioned above on any of the hours men-tioned, they shall be held until the next scheduled time, except in cases of important storm warnings and reports of light-ships off station, which will be treated as urgent. 87. Weather reports shall be sent broadcast immediately after noon only. They shall be furnished to other sta-tions by special request at other times. 88. At stations where the noon time-signals are sent out, care shall be taken to have the relay connected before 11.55 a.m. Any interruption of the service shall be re-ported to the commandant at once, and the cause stated, if known. 86. Storm warnings and hydrographic information shall

Collection and Transmission of Hydrographic Information.

89. Information shall be transmitted concerning derelects, dangerous obstructions to navigation, &c., to vessels at sea.

90. Messages are sent direct from the Hydrographic Office to the particular wireless station or stations most convenient for disseminating the information. 91. When received, the messages shall be sent broad-cast four times, at the hours of 8 a.m., noon, 4 p.m., and

8 p.m., local standard time. 92. These messages, together with such other hydro-graphic information as may be furnished for the purpose, shall be kept on file, and when request is made by vessels at sea for such information the same shall be furnished them.

93. Such messages take precedence over ordinary busi-

93. Such messages take precedence over ordinary business, but not over important official, or even private, messages, the same to be determined by the operator.
94. If for any reason it is not practicable to send broadcast such a message at any of the hours stated, it shall not be sent until the succeeding designated hour, unless a request is received from seaward.

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96. Instances have occurred that render it advisable to give authority to certain branch hydrographic offices to circulate wreck or derelict reports, when urgently required, through the medium of broadcast messages.
97. The Bureau of Navigation has authorized the branch hydrographic office at San Francisco for the Pacific coast and that at New Orleans for the Gulf coast to communicate to such wireless-telegraph station or stations as may be necessary the information regarding any serious menace to navigation which it is essential to spread broadcast at the hours fixed for that purpose.
98. The branch hydrographic offices named shall report such action by wire to the Hydrographic Office, and the wireless stations affected shall send a confirmation to the same office by mail.

same office by mail. 99. Other branch hydrographic offices on the two coasts can secure prompt action on important information re-ceived from seaward by referring it to San Francisco or New Orleans.

New Orleans. 100. The branch hydrographic offices on the Atlantic coast shall report to the Hydrographic Office at Washing-ton, and the latter office shall communicate directly with the wireless stations on all coasts, as needed. 101. The electrician in charge at each of the wireless-telegraph stations is directed to forward direct to the Hydrographic Office, Navy Department, Washington, D.C., by telegraph or by wireless, if necessary, any in-formation concerning serious obstructions to navigation, such as derelects, wrecks, ice, &c., of which he may gain knowledge.

such as derelects, wrons, ice, ice, ice, knowledge. 102. All information received by wireless stations from communicating vessels regarding serious obstructions shall be sent by wire or by wireless, if necessary, to the nearest branch hydrographic office, as well as to the Hydrographic Office, Washington. 103. The wireless stations are supplied with pilot charts, which show the location of offices and stations.

103. The wireless stations are supplied with pilot charts, which show the location of offices and stations. 104. Wireless stations are instructed to make inquiries of any vessel with which they may be communicating for any information in her possession that may be useful to the "Pilot Chart" or "Hydrographic Bulletin." 105. The inquiries should concern, first, any menaces to navigation, reports of which should be sent by wire to the nearest branch hydrographic office and the Hydrographic Office; second, general information of hydrographic in-terest, which should be sent by mail direct to the Hydro-graphic Office.

106. Northern stations should embrace every opportunity to collect information on heavy ice and icebergs.

107. As the masters of nearly all vessels equipped with wireless are regular correspondents of the Hydrographic Office, they are ready to co-operate in the work and furnish information, provided it can be made clear to them for whom it is intended. 108. The electrician in charge shall mail to the Hydro-graphic Office, Navy Department, Washington, D.C., copies of every message sent broadcast by direction of that office

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of six, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

- Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
