Prison at Gisborne proclaimed.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled the Prisons Act, 1908, it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, declare any house, building, enclosure, or place to be a prison, and from and after the gazetting of any such Proclamation, or from any later time specified in the Proclamation, such house, building, enclosure, or place shall be deemed a prison:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the above-recited power and authority, do hereby declare that the buildings erected upon the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and all enclosures used or occupied therewith, shall, from and after the publication of this Proclamation in the *Gazette*, be a prison, known as the Gisborne Prison, within the meaning and for the purposes of the Prisons Act, 1908.

Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, on which the wharf and slip are to be erected, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said wharf and slip thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the construction of the wharf and slip, as shown on plan marked M.D. 3696.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensees shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of two pounds ten shillings, and thereafter an annual sum of one pound ten shillings, payable in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf and slip, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf and slip without payment.

6. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf and slip in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at their own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and slip and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or slip, requiring them, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

12. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf or slip may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part.

13. In case the licensees or either of them shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Fail to erect and complete the wharf and slip within eighteen months from the date of this Order in Council; or

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- (3.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf and slip for a period of thirty days; or
- (4.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (5.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause three of these conditions,

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council, without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; the publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. The erection of the wharf and slip shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensees of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

WHEREAS by the three-hundred-and-twenty-first section of the Land Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

And whereas by the three-hundred-and-twenty-second section of the said Act it is provided that land temporarily reserved under the said three-hundred-and-twenty-first section may, at the expiration of one month but not later than six months after the publication in the Gazette of notice of such temporary reservation, be permanently reserved, and that notice of such permanent reservation shall be published in the Gazette:

And whereas by the sixty-ninth section of the Land for Settlements Act, 1908, it is further provided that the Governor may from time to time, as he thinks fit, set aside reserves for any specified public purpose out of land acquired under the last-mentioned Act, provided that no land so acquired shall be set aside for endowments:

And whereas the lands specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto were, by the Warrants the dates of which are specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and the notifications of which were published in the Gazettes

specified in the fourth column, temporarily reserved under the authority of the said Acts for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby permanently reserve the lands so temporarily reserved as aforesaid, and enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto, for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule, being the same purposes for which the said lands were so temporarily reserved as aforesaid.

WAIMEA COUNTY COUNCIL.

Special Order.

THAT, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 23 of the Counties Act, 1908, the Waimea County Council resolves by way of special order as follows, viz:—

That the present division of the Waimea County into seven ridings be revoked, and that in lieu thereof the said county be divided into six ridings, to be called respectively Maitai Riding, Wai-iti Riding, Motupiko Riding, Wangapeka Riding, Motueka Riding, and Moutere Riding, the altered boundaries of which ridings are set forth in the Schedule hereto.

The said Waimea County Council shall consist of seven members, who shall be elected as follows: The electors of the Wai-iti, Motupiko, Wangapeka, Motueka, and Moutere Ridings shall each elect one Councillor. The electors of the Maitai Riding shall elect two Councillors.

This special order shall take effect on and after the 6th day of October, 1911.

SCHEDULE.

The Maitai Riding shall be bounded as follows:—

Starting at a point on the centre-line of the Waimea River where the said river enters the sea, between Section X, Waimea West, and Section 207, Waimea East; thence generally on the north-west, north, and south-east by the county boundary to a point on the said boundary about a mile east of Bush Cone on the main dividing-range; thence generally on the south-west by the summit of a leading ridge to the River Lee; thence by the centre-lines of the said River Lee and of the Rivers Roding, Wairoa, and Waimea to the starting-point: and including Section 223, known as Reay's Island, and all islands and mud-flats adjacent to the aforesaid portions of the county boundary; and excluding thereout Section 179A, Waimea East, and the Boroughs of Nelson and Richmond.

The Wai-iti Riding shall be bounded as follows:—

Starting at a point on the centre-line of the Waimea River at the confluence of the Wairoa and Wai-iti Rivers; thence on the north-east by the aforesaid south-western boundary of the Maitai Riding, and on the east by the county boundary to the south-eastern corner of Block XI, Rentoul Survey District; thence generally on the south-west and south by the summit of a leading ridge to a point on the said ridge about two miles due east of the south-eastern corner of Section 29, Square 4, in Block X, Gordon Survey District; thence on the south by a right line from the point aforesaid to the south-eastern corner of the said Section 29, and by the southern boundary of the said section to its south-western corner; thence generally on the west by the summit of the dividing-range between the Wai-iti and Motueka Rivers in Block VI, Gordon Survey District, and Blocks XIV, X, XI, and VII, Wai-iti Survey District, to the north-western corner of Section 28 of the aforesaid Block VII; thence by the northern boundary of the aforesaid Section 28 and of Section 27 and the eastern boundary of the same to the south-eastern corner of the said Section 27; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Section I, Block VIII, Wai-iti Survey District, and by the northern boundary of the said Section I to the eastern extremity thereof; thence by the southern boundary of the said Section I to the eastern side of a public road; thence across the said road and by the western and southern side of the same to the eastern corner of Section 13, Square 2, in Block VIII, Wai-iti Survey District; thence by the south-eastern boundary of the said Section 13 to the northern corner of Section 17, Square 2, in Block V, Waimea Survey District, and by the northern and eastern boundaries of the said Section 17 to the northern corner of Section 11 of 112, Waimea South, in Block IX, Waimea Survey District; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of the said Section 11 of 112 and of Section 12 of 112, of Waimea South, in Block IX aforesaid, and the eastern boundaries of the said Section 12 of 112 and of Section 10 of 112 to a public road; thence across the said road and by the southern side of the said road to an arm of the Wai-iti River; thence by the centre-line of the said arm and of the Wai-iti River to the starting-point.

The Motupiko Riding shall be bounded as follows:—

Starting at a northern corner of Section 28, Block VII, Wai-iti Survey District, generally on the east by the western and southern boundaries of the Wai-iti Riding, as hereinbefore described, to the south-eastern corner of Block XI, Rentoul Survey District; thence on the south-east and south by the county boundary to the junction of the Hope and Buller Rivers; thence on the west by a right line to the Tadmor Saddle, in Block XIV, Tadmor Survey District; thence in easterly and northerly directions by the summit of the dividing-range between the Tadmor and Motupiko Valleys to the eastern corner of Section 43, Block XVI, Wangapeka Survey District; thence by a right line to the south-western corner of Section 36, Square 6, in Block XIII, Wai-iti Survey District; thence by the southern boundary of the said

Section 36 and the production thereof to the centre-line of the Motueka River; thence by the centre-line of the said river to its intersection with the production of the north-eastern boundary of Section 104, Square 6, in Block IV, Wangapeka Survey District, and generally on the north-west by the north-eastern boundary of the aforesaid Section 104 to the southern corner of Section 23, Block I, Wai-iti Survey District; thence by a right line to the eastern corner of Section I, and by the western boundary of Section 88 of Square 6 in the aforesaid Block I and the production thereof to the northern side of a public road; thence along the northern side of the said road to the eastern corner of Section 83, Square 6; thence by the north-eastern boundary of the said Section 83 to the western corner of Section I, Thorpe Sub-section; thence by the north-western boundaries of Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 to the northern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by the north-eastern boundary of the said Section 9 to the western corner of Section 2, Block XIV, Motueka Survey District; thence by a right line to the northern corner of Section 139, Square 2, and by the north-eastern boundaries of the said Section 139 and of Sections 108 and 147 of Square 2, in Block II, Wai-iti Survey District, to the western corner of Section 148, and by the north-western boundaries of the said Section 148 and of Section 14 to the eastern corner of Section 113, Square 2 aforesaid; thence by a right line to the south-eastern corner of Section 157 of Square 2, and from the last-mentioned point also by a right line to the northern corner of Section 19, Block III, Wai-iti Survey District; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 19 and 29 to the starting-point at the northern corner of Section 28, Block VII, Wai-iti Survey District.

The Wangapeka Riding shall be bounded as follows:—
