RULES FOR SHIPS OF DIVISION E, CLASS 4.

Class 4 consists of oil-launches up to forty feet in length carrying passengers and plying within river and extended river limits.

- (a.) They shall carry two approved lifebuoys.
- (b.) They shall carry approved buoyant apparatus or approved lifebelts at least equal in number, together with the lifebuoys, to one-third of the total number of passengers and crew when plying in river limits, and to one-half of the total number of passengers and crew when plying in extended river limits.

RULES FOR SHIPS OF DIVISION E, CLASS 5.

Class 5 consists of oil-launches up to forty feet in length plying within river and extended river limits and not carrying passengers.

- (a.) They shall carry one approved lifebuoy.
- (b.) They shall carry approved buoyant apparatus or approved lifebelts at least equal in number, together with the lifebuoy, to one-third the number of the crew when plying in river limits, and to one-half of the number of the crew when plying in extended river limits.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of November, nineteen hundred and ten, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-fourth day of November, nineteen hundred and ten, regulations were made, under the authority of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), prescribing examinations to be passed by officers of the Post and Telegraph Department : And whereas it is expedient to amend those regulations in the manner hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke regulation numbered 51B in the Schedule to the aforesaid Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto. The regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

51B. BEFORE receiving promotion to a class higher than the Seventh Class officers will be required to pass an examination (to be called the Second Examination) as under :—

- (a.) For postal officers : (1.) A test similar to that for the First Examination, but of a more extensive character. Officers employed principally in mail work must show themselves competent in all the sorting and making-up of mails done at the office at which they are engaged, and, in addition, must show practical knowledge of handling registered letters and parcels. They must also pass an examination in postal geography. (2.) Money-order and savings-bank and counter officers and those performing clerical work must pass in the

practical working of their branches. (3.) The tenor and sometimes the text of rules will form part of the examination, but literal mistakes in the text will not be taken into account.

- (b.) For telegraph officers as follows :—

Operators, and others engaged in the work of operating telegraph instruments : An examination in magnetism and electricity as applied to telegraphy, theoretical and practical.

Counter Clerks (Telegraph) : Either (1) the Senior Technical (Check Clerk's) Examination (pass marks, 50 per cent.), or (2) the examination for postal officers hereinafter mentioned.

Despatch Clerks (Telegraph) : Either the Senior Technical (Check Clerk's) Examination, or (2) the examination for postal officers hereinafter mentioned.

Telephone Exchange Clerks, to qualify as Senior or Second Exchange Clerk at Auckland, Christchurch, Dunedin, or Wellington, or as Senior Exchange Clerk at other centres : Senior Technical (Check Clerk's) Examination (pass marks, 50 per cent.).

- (c.) For all officers : An examination in the provisions of the Post and Telegraph Act.

51c. No officer shall be allowed to sit for the Senior Technical Examination mentioned in Regulation 37 made by Order in Council of the 10th day of May, 1909, until he has passed the examinations prescribed for officers below the Sixth Class ; but any officer who has not passed such examinations may, if he so desires, sit for such Senior Technical Examination on payment of a fee of £1. If the candidate fails to pass the said examination the said fee shall be retained by the Department, but shall otherwise be returned to the candidate. Nothing in this regulation shall exempt any officer from the requirement to pass the examinations so prescribed for officers below the Sixth Class.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and

acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing thereon timber-booms in accordance with the said plan, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine, as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the construction of the timber-booms, as shown on plan M.D. 3717.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of two pounds ten shillings, and thereafter an annual sum of one pound in advance, such annual payments to date from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

5. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said timber-booms without payment.

6. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, and the company may be required to remove the timber-booms at its own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company in New Zealand.

7. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned timber-booms in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at its own cost, any lights that may be required by the Minister: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

8. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said timber-booms and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such timber-booms, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

9. The company shall be liable for any injury which may be sustained by any vessel or boat in passing the timber-booms, or by contact therewith, and which may be occasioned by any default or neglect on the company's part.

10. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said timber-booms for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause three of these conditions; or
- (4.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined; and upon such revocation the Minister may cause the said timber-booms to be removed, and may recover the costs incurred by any such removal from the company.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, on which the wharf is to be erected, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said wharf thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the construction of the wharf, as shown on plan marked M.D. 3733.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of two pounds ten shillings, and thereafter an annual sum of one pound, payable in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at his own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such

wharf, requiring him, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, by the Harbourmaster at Kaipara, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege, without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Fail to erect and complete the wharf within eighteen months from the date of this Order in Council; or
- (3.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days; or
- (4.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (5.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause three of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

Prescribing Close Season for Oysters at Nelson.

WHEREAS it is provided by the fifth section of the Fisheries Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, make regulations, which shall have force and effect either throughout New Zealand or only in such waters or places as are specified in the regulations, for, *inter alia*, prescribing a close season for oysters over any term not exceeding three years, and, before the expiration of such term, further extending the same:

And whereas it is desirable to prescribe a close season for oysters, over a term of two years, in the waters and places hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and

consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. A CLOSE season for oysters, for a term of two years from the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*, is hereby prescribed within the area described in the Schedule hereto. During such close season it shall not be lawful to take oysters within the said area.

2. Any person committing a breach of the foregoing regulation shall be liable to a fine of not less than £1 nor more than £20.

SCHEDULE.

All that area bounded by a line commencing at a point at high-water mark on the eastern shore of Tasman Bay, at the south-western boundary of the Wakapuaka Native Reserve; thence by the northern and western boundaries of Section 36, Block VI, Wakapuaka Survey District (Suburban North), the northern boundary of Sections 1 and 4, Block V, and the western boundary of the latter section to the Wakapuaka Road; thence by the said road to the western boundary of Section 7; thence by the western boundary of Sections 7, 17, and 16, Block V, again to the Wakapuaka Road; thence by the said road to Section 11A, Block IX; thence by the western boundary of the said Section 11A to the Wakapuaka Road; thence by the said road to a road forming the western boundary of Section 1, Block IX, Wakapuaka Survey District (Suburban North); thence by the said road to the northern boundary of Section H 9, City of Nelson; thence by the said boundary for a distance of 626.2 links; thence by a line bearing 293° 40' 20" a distance of about 4600 links; thence by a line bearing 220° 18' a distance of about 4400 links to a point 50 links outside the railway breastwork, opposite the road lying between Sections 57 and 58, City of Nelson; thence by a line parallel to and 50 links outside the railway breastwork to the south-eastern boundary of Foreshore Lease No. 9; thence by the south-eastern boundary of No. 9 to the south-western corner of No. 9; thence by the south-western boundaries of Foreshore Leases Nos. 9, 8, 7, 6, and 5; thence 50 links along the north-western boundary of Lease No. 5; thence by lines parallel to and 50 links outside the railway breastwork and the north-eastern and north-western sides of the Railway Wharf; thence by a line in prolongation of the line parallel to and 50 links outside the north-western boundary of the Railway Wharf to a point at which it intersects the prolongation of boundary-line between Sections 18 and 17, City of Nelson; thence to Wakefield Quay opposite the boundary-line between Sections 18 and 17, City of Nelson; thence by a line to form the north-western side of Wakefield Quay distant 1 chain from the north-western boundaries of Sections 17, 16, 15, 14, and 13, City of Nelson, to the Rocks Road breastwork; thence by the said breastwork to a point 7 chains distant in a northerly direction from the western boundary of the main road to Stoke; thence by high-water mark of Tasman Bay and the Waimea Mud-flat to a public road forming the south-western boundary of Section 62, Block III, Waimea Survey District (Suburban South); thence by a public road forming the boundary of Sections 77, 78, and 79, Block VII (Waimea East), to the north-eastern boundary of Section 222 of the said Block VII; thence by the said boundary and by the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of Section 221 again to a public road forming the south-western boundary of the last-mentioned section; thence by the said public road forming the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 220, 219, 218, 217, Block VII, Sections 216, 215, 214, 213, 212, 169, Block VI, Sections 198, 212, 211, 209, 208, and 207, Block II, to the mouth of the River Waimea; thence by a line across the said river to the northern boundary of Section 10, Block II aforesaid (Waimea West); thence by high-water mark of the Waimea Mud-flat to the west side of the road forming the western boundary of Section 3, Block II aforesaid (Waimea West); thence by the said road to the northern boundary of Section 13, Block I, Waimea Survey District; thence by high-water mark of the Waimea Mud-flat, Tasman Bay, and the Moutere Mud-flat to a public road forming the north-western boundary of Section 203, Block VIII, Motueka Survey District (Moutere); thence by the said road and a continuation thereof forming the boundary of Section 202, Block VII, to the mouth of the River Moutere; thence by a line across the said river to the road forming the eastern boundary of Section 172, Block VII aforesaid (Moutere); thence by the said road to the southern boundary of Section 3 of 173; thence by the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of the said section to a public road; thence by the said public road to the southern boundary of Section 3 of 170, Block VII

aforesaid (Motueka); thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of the said section to a public road; thence by a public road to Section 144, Block IV; thence by the southern boundary of the said Section 144 to a public road forming the eastern boundary of the said section; thence by the said road forming the eastern boundary of Sections 144, 145, 146, 147, 143, 142, 141, 140, 139, 138, 137, 136, 135, and 132, Block IV, Motueka Survey District (Motueka) to a point on high-water mark of Tasman Bay formed by the production (in an easterly direction) of the northern boundary-line of the last-mentioned section; thence by a further production of the said section-line for a distance of three miles; thence by a line parallel to the general trend of the coast-line of Tasman Bay, and distant three miles therefrom, to a point made by the production of the south-western boundary-line of the Wakapuaka Native Reserve; and thence by the said produced line to the point of commencement:

tive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby order and declare that the reserves for recreation in the Wellington Land District described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of Part II of the said Act; and such reserves shall hereafter form part of Makuri Domain, and be managed, administered, and dealt with as a public domain by the Makuri Domain Board.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Civil Service Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities thereunto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations as to leave of absence in the public service made by Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations respecting leave of absence of officers of the public service of New Zealand, and doth direct that such regulations shall come into force on the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

REGULATIONS.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

1. EVERY officer in the public service, whether permanently or temporarily employed, may be granted by the Minister in charge of the Department leave of absence for recreation, on the following scale:—

(1.) When an officer has served for fifteen years or upwards, not exceeding three weeks in each year.

(2.) When he has served less than fifteen years, not exceeding two weeks in each year.

2. The granting of any such leave of absence shall be subject to the express conditions—

(1.) That the behaviour of the officer has been in every way satisfactory;

(2.) That the total intermittent leave during the previous twelve months has not exceeded five days;

(3.) That absence from illness or accident has not exceeded one week; and

(4.) More generally, that his official duties have been properly performed.

Any or all of the days of absence in excess of the number of days allowed for intermittent leave or sick-leave may be deducted from the annual leave of absence granted for recreation.

3. No officer shall be entitled to claim leave of absence as a right, and if for any cause the head of the Department thinks such leave ought not to be granted, he may refuse the same in any case, subject to the approval of his action by the Minister.

4. An officer failing to avail himself of the annual leave provided for will not on that account be entitled to a more lengthened leave in any subsequent year, unless under special circumstances approved by the Minister.

5. Where application for sick-leave for any term extending beyond one week but for less than one month is applied for, it shall be granted only on the certificate of a qualified medical practitioner, to be chosen by the Chief Health Officer or the Minister in charge of the Department in which the applicant is employed.

6. Where the sick-leave applied for exceeds one month there shall be two such certificates.

7. Such certificate shall be in the following form:—

I [We] hereby certify that I [we] have this day examined A. B., of _____, employed on the staff of the [Name of Department].

The said A. B. is suffering from [State nature of complaint], and is at present medically unfit to continue his [or her] duties. I [We] anticipate the period of illness which will necessitate absence from duty will be [State time].

8. If any person employed in the public service is absent from duty more than four times in one year, or if in the opinion of the official head of the Department any member of the staff is inefficient through repeated illness, such absences or inefficiency shall be reported to the Minister in charge of the Department, who may order such person to be examined under the provisions of the Public Service Superannuation Act, with a view to retirement from the public service as being medically unfit for further duty.

9. All existing regulations as to leave of absence of officers of the public service not hereinbefore revoked are hereby modified in so far as they are inconsistent with these regulations.

10. These regulations shall apply to all Departments of the public service, except the Government Railways Department.

Amended and Additional Regulations under the Mining Act, 1908.

ISLINGTON, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Mining Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby make the following amendments and additions to the regulations made under the said Act on the twenty-fifth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-eighth day of October then instant; and doth hereby order that the regulations hereby made shall be read as part of the said principal regulations, and shall come into force on the day of the gazetting hereof.

REGULATIONS.

1. REGULATION 94 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting the following clauses:—

(5A.) In raising or lowering persons the rate of speed shall not exceed 200 ft. per minute when the cage or other conveyance is within 100 ft. of the surface, bottom, or stopping-place, nor 500 ft. per minute when it is in any other part of the shaft.

- (5b.) No stope shall be worked at a greater height than 8 ft. 6 in., or as may be approved by the Inspector of Mines.
- (5c.) The owner, agent, or manager shall cause a sufficient number of suitable sanitary conveniences to be provided above and below ground, in suitable and convenient places, for the use of the persons employed, and to be constantly kept in a cleanly and sanitary condition; and no person shall relieve his bowels below ground elsewhere than in those conveniences. No person shall soil or render unfit for use in any way any convenience or sanitary utensil or appliance provided for the use of the persons employed. Pump-cisterns, sumps, and water accumulations in the mine shall not be directly or indirectly used for the purpose of this rule as a sanitary convenience.
- (5d.) (i.) A place or places for meals shall be set aside in each level. Such places shall be kept clean.
(ii.) At every such place an impervious metal receptacle shall be provided, in which all waste food, paper, and other rubbish shall be placed. Any person wilfully neglecting to use the receptacle or throwing waste food about the mine shall be guilty of an offence.
(iii.) The contents of the receptacle shall be sent to the surface, and the receptacle shall be thoroughly cleansed, at regular intervals.
- (5e.) A uniform code of signals shall be adopted at all mines, such code being as follows:—

- 1 bell—Stop or hold cage.
- 2 bells—Lower cage.
- 3 bells—Haul up cage.
- 4 bells—Men on cage.
- 5 bells—Change level.
- 12 bells—Accident.

In addition to the ordinary signals for winding, the "ward" system must be used when ringing the cage from a level to another level.

When ringing the cage from a level to another level, the number of the ward must be rung first, and then the number of the level in that ward. It must always be understood that there are men on the cage in the inter-level signals.

- (5f.) In any mine where the number of holes to be fired in one blast exceeds six, electric firing-apparatus shall be used. If, however, the number of holes to be fired does not exceed six, they may be spitted.
- (5g.) Every workman, howsoever employed in or about the mine, whether on the surface or underground, shall be subject to the rules and regulations under the said Act, and shall obey the commands or instructions of the manager or any person in charge of the mine or part of the mine in which he is working.
- (5h.) No person shall use threatening or abusive language towards the manager or other official of a mine, nor shall the manager or other official of a mine use threatening or abusive language towards any person employed in or about a mine.
- (5i.) The ends of every cage shall be provided with a suitable gate, which shall always be used when persons are riding, and there shall also be a rigid bar or handrail at the top of the inside of every cage for persons to hold on to during the ascent or descent of the cage; and no cage shall be used until it has been examined by an Inspector, and his certificate in writing given that the aforesaid appliances have been fitted to his approval, and that the cage is in fit working-order.
- (5j.) No person shall interfere with the engine, except the certificated winding-engine driver, when men are being raised in or lowered down a shaft. The engine-driver shall at all times gently lift the cage from the pit-bottom, and carefully drive the engine, and not leave the handle while persons are in the shaft, and no other persons shall be

allowed to remain in the engine-house. Particular attention shall be paid to all indicators and signals, and the engine shall be stopped if any defect is perceived.

2. Subclause (b) of clause 6 of Regulation 127 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

(b.) For sinking in wet ground where slabbing is necessary, the shaft being not less than 4 ft. by 3 ft., or as to be determined by the Inspector of Mines,—

Double the foregoing rate.

3. Form 93 in the Eighth Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:—

(3.) My age at the present time is years.

Powers delegated to the Kennedy's Bush Scenic Board under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908.

ISLINGTON, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule below (being land reserved under the said Act), for the period of three years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), in the undermentioned persons, who shall be known as the Kennedy's Bush Scenic Board, namely,—

The Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Canterbury Land District (*ex officio*),
Henry George Ell, Esq., M.P., Christchurch,
Leonard Cockayne, Esq., Ph.D., Linwood,
William Reece, Esq., Christchurch,
George Thomas Booth, Esq., New Brighton, and
George Harper, Esq., Riccarton

(herein referred to as "the Board"), in trust for the preservation of scenery, and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

MEETINGS.

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Tuesday in each month, at half-past three o'clock p.m., at the District Lands Office, Christchurch, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the eighteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.
2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.
3. Any four members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.
4. The Commissioner of Crown Lands shall be the Chairman of the Board, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote.
5. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.
6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.
7. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.
8. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.
