Districts constituted under the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908.

ISLINGTON, Governor. (L.S.) A PROCLAMATION.

I N pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration district known as the Grey District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two registration districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows :-

RUNANGA DISTRICT.

All that area bounded towards the north generally by the watershed between the Porarari River and Omonehu Creek All that area bounded towards the north generally by the watershed between the Porarari River and Omonehu Creek from the sea to the summit of the Paparoa Range; thence towards the east generally by the summit of the Paparoa Range to Sewell's Peak; thence by a right line to the source of Langdon's Creek, and by that creek to the Borough of Brunner; thence towards the south by the Borough of Brunner to its north-western corner; thence by a right line to Trig. Station AB, Cobden Survey District; thence by the road running westerly to and along the northern boundary of Section No. 123, Block V, Cobden Survey District, to the Greymouth - Point Elizabeth Railway line; thence across the railway and road to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 186, Block IV, Cobden Survey District; thence by that section, across a road, and by Section No. 185, Block IV aforesaid, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by a right line to the easternmost corner of Section No. 232, Block II, Cobden Survey District; thence by that section and its northern boundary produced to the sea; and thence towards the west generally by the sea to the place of commencement.

GREY DISTRICT.

All that area bounded towards the north generally by a right line from a point on the sea-shore in line with the northern boundary of Section No. 232, Block II, Cobden

Survey District, to the north-western corner of that section; thence by the northern boundary of that section to its easternmost corner; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Section No. 185, Block IV, Cobden Survey District; thence by the northern boundary of that section, across a road, and by the northern boundary of Section No. 186, said Block IV, to the north-eastern corner of that section; thence across a road and railway to the road at the north-western corner of Section No. 123, Block V, Cobden Survey District; thence by the road forming the northern boundary of that section and its production easterly to Trig. Station AB; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of the Borough of Brunner; thence towards the east and again towards the north by the Borough of Brunner to the Arnold River; thence towards the north-east by the Arnold River; thence towards the north-east by the Arnold River to Lake Brunner; thence again towards the south generally by that lake to Dobson's Road; thence by the southern watershed of New River and its tributaries, and by the summit of the range leading to Blackwater Creek about half a mile north of the confluence of Armstrong's Creek with the said Blackwater Creek; thence by a line due west to Marsden Road; thence by that road to Greenstone Road; thence by the latter road to the Teremakau River, and by the southern bank of that river to the sea; and thence towards the west by the sea to the place of commencement.

New County of Kaitieke divided into Ridings, &c.

ISLINGTON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Counties Act, 1908, and the Kaitieke County Act, 1910, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby divide the new County of Kaitieke, as constituted by the said Acts, into seven ridings, to be called the Hunua Riding, the Owhango Riding, the Kirikau Riding, the Retaruke Riding, the Oio Riding, the Raurimu Riding, and the Manganui Riding, and declare that the boundaries thereof shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto. Schedule hereto.

And I do hereby declare that one member shall be elected for each of the aforesaid ridings. And I do further declare that Saturday, the twenty-first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, shall be the day upon which the election of the first Council of the said fourty of Kaitieke shall take place; and that Saturday, the fourth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, shall be the time, and the Public Hall, Raurimu, shall be the place, at which the first meeting of the said Council shall be held.

All that area in Kaitieke County bounded towards the north-east generally by the Kirikau Riding, hereinbefore described, from the Wanganui River to Retaruke River; thence towards the east by that river to a point opposite the north-western corner of Native Reserve No. 1, in Block XII, Retaruke Survey District; thence across the said river by the north-western and earth-net by the north-western and the nor in Block XII, Retaruke Survey District; thence across the said river, by the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of the said Native Reserve No. 1, and by Blocks IX and XIII, Kaitieke Survey District, to the southern boundary of Kaitieke County; thence towards the south by the southern boundary of the said Kaitieke County to the Wanganui River; and thence towards the north-west generally by the Wanganui River to the place of commencement. mencement.

Station; thence towards the north generally by Owhango Riding, hereinbefore described, to the Oio Road; thence across and by that road to the north-western corner of Section No. 5, Block VII, Kaitieke Survey District; thence towards the east by that section to its south-western corner: thence towards the Kaitieke Survey District; thence towards the east by that section to its south-western corner; thence towards the south generally by the southern boundaries of Sections Nos. 4, 3, and 2, Block VII aforesaid, to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 1, Block X; thence by the south-eastern boundary of that section to the Kaitieke Road; thence across and by that road to Section No. 4, Block XI, Kaitieke Survey District; thence by that section and Sections Nos. 40 and 39, Block X, to the Retaruke River; thence across that river, and by Section No. 2, Block IX, Kaitieke Survey District, to its north-western corner; thence by the south-western boundaries of Sections Nos. 3 and 5, Block IX aforesaid, and the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 1, Block IX aforesaid, to the place of commencement.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Thermal Springs
Districts Act, 1910 (hereinafter referred to as
"the said Act"), that the Governor may proclaim as
a public road any road in any district which at any time
before the passing of this Act is or has been subject to
the Thermal Springs Districts Act, 1908, or to the Thermal
Springs Districts Act, 1881, if that road is in use as a
public highway at the passing of this Act, and if public
money or the money of any local authority has before the
passing of this Act been expended in the formation, construction, improvement, or maintenance thereof; and that
every such road may, irrespective of the extent of its forevery such road may, irrespective of the extent of its formation or use at the passing of this Act, be proclaimed as of the width of thirty-three feet on each side of the centreline of the formation thereof as existing at the passing

of that Act:

And whereas the roads described in the Schedule hereto are in a district which, before the passing of the said Act, has been subject to the Thermal Springs Districts Act, 1908, or the Thermal Springs Districts Act, 1881, and were in use as public highways at the passing of the said Act, and public money has, before the passing of the said Act, been expended in the formation, construction, improvement, and maintenance of such roads:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities in me vested by the Thermal Springs Districts Act, 1910, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim as public roads the roads described in the Schedule hereto, and I do also proclaim such roads as of the width of thirty-three feet on each side of the centre-line of the formation thereof as existing at the passing of the said Act.

And whereas it is desirable to make regulations for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the hereinbefore-recited power and authority, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulation.

REGULATION.

1. EVERY person who shall construct or who has constructed a dam or weir in any river, stream, or waters in the Taranaki Acclimatization District in which salmon the Taranaki Acclimatization District in which salmon or trout exist, or have been liberated, or may hereafter be liberated, shall erect or construct proper fish-ladders or other means of ingress and egress for fish so as to allow fish to pass and return at all times.

THE following particulars, taken from the Commontewealth of Australia Gazette of 29th July, 1911, of the restrictions on the importation of potatoes into the Commonwealth are published for general information:—

The regulations published in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette of 25th March, 1911, are repealed, and it is now proclaimed that the importation of potatoes into the Commonwealth from any country is prohibited un-

less—

1. They are accompanied by an official certificate, dated and signed by a responsible officer of a Government Department of the country of origin, identifying the potatoes, specifying the quantity, and certifying—

(a.) That at the date of the issue of the certificate they were, on inspection, found free from the disease caused by Phytophthora infestans (known as Irish blight), and from the disease Synchytrium endobioticum (known as potato canker, black scab, warty disease, and cauliflower disease in potatoes):

(b.) That they were grown in the country named;
(c.) That they were grown on premises known, after due investigation, not to be or to have been during the preceding twelve months infected with either of the said diseases;

of the said diseases;
(d.) That they were packed in the country of origin in clean new packages.

2. The bags, crates, or other packages containing the potatoes are marked on the outside with the name of the country of origin and with other distinguishing mark or marks.

Provided that the Minister may permit potatoes which are certified by a Quarantine Officer to be free from disease to be imported under and subject to such conditions as the Minister may think fit to impose.

The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 18 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of six, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted :-

Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
 Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
 Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
