THE HONOURABLE SIR JAMES CARROLL, K.C.M.G., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

HEREAS, in exercise of the powers conferred by section sixteen of the Counties Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), the Clifton County Council and the Ohura County Council respectively did, by an instrument bearing date the fourteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, formally agree that the boundaries of the said counties should be altered to the extent set forth in the said instrument, and also in the Schedule hereto: And whereas it is expedient that such alteration of boundaries be approved by the Governor in Council, and that such altered boundaries be defined in terms of the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that, on and after the publication of these presents in the New Zealand Gazette, the boundaries of the Counties of Clifton and Ohura respectively shall be those set forth under their respective headings in the Schedule hereto.

# CLIFTON COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded towards the north generally by a line along the middle of the Mokau River from the sea to a point in line with the western boundary of Mokau-Mohakatino No. 1H Block; thence towards the east generally by a right line to and by the said western boundary of Mokau-Mohakatino No. 1H Block to Trig. Station Tawhitiraupeka; thence by Section No. 3, Block III, Waro Survey District, to the Mohakatino Stream; thence by that stream to its confluence with a stream which intersects the Mohakatino-

Parininihi No. 1D East Block, the said confluence being near the westernmost corner of Section No. 1, Block III, Waro Survey District; thence by the said stream intersecting the Mohakatino-Parininihi No. 1D East Block to the Mohakatino Road; thence by that road to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 6, Block VI, Waro Survey District; thence by Sections Nos. 6 and 5, Block VI aforesaid, to the Tongaporutu-Mangaroa Road; thence by that road to where it intersects Section No. 3, Block VI aforesaid; thence by the said Section No. 3 to the Mangatawa Stream; thence by that stream to its confluence with the Kotare Stream; thence by the said Kotare Stream to the Tongaporutu-Mangaroa Road; thence by that road to Section No. 3, Block VI, Waro Survey District; thence by that section and Section No. 1, Block VII, Waro Survey District, to the Kotare Road; thence by that road to the Waitaanga Stream; thence by that stream to the confiscation boundary-line; thence by the confiscation boundary-line; thence by Block XVI aforesaid and Block IV, Pouatu Survey District, to Whangamomona County, as described in the New Zealand Gazette No. 26, of the 30th March, 1911; thence towards the south and south-east generally by the said Whangamomona County to Te Wera Road; thence towards the south by Stratford County, as described in the New Zealand Gazette No. 34, of the 27th April, 1911, to the Waitara River; thence towards the south west by a line along the middle of the Waitara River to the Borough of Waitara; thence by that borough and the Waitara River to the sea; and thence towards the north and north-west by the sea to the place of commencement.

#### OHURA COUNTY.

All that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded All that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded towards the north generally by Waitomo County from the Mokau River to the Ongarue River; thence towards the east by the said Ongarue River to its confluence with the Wanganui River; thence towards the south-east generally by the Wanganui River to the north-eastern corner of Whangamomona County, as described in the New Zealand Gazette No. 26, of the 30th March, 1911; thence towards the south by the said Whangamomona County to the western boundary of Clifton County; and thence towards the west generally by Clifton County hereinbefore described to the Mokau River, and by that river to the place of commencement. place of commencement.

Notice of Intention to change the Purpose of Portion of a Reserve in the Nelson Land District.

# ISLINGTON, Governor.

WHEREAS by the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908, it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may declare his intention to change, exchange, or alter the dedication of any public reserve now or hereafter vested in His Majesty or the Governor for any of the purposes named in Class II of the Second Schedule to the said Act, whether the same be granted or not; and in the case of same named in Class II of the Second Schedule to the said Act, whether the same be granted or not; and in the case of any reserve made under the authority of section three hundred and twenty-one of the Land Act, 1908, if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to change the purpose of such reserve or any part thereof from the purpose or presumed purpose for which it was set apart to any other purpose, or if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to exchange any of the land comprised in such reserve for other land of equal value, to be dedicated to one

or more of the purposes named in the said Class II, the Governor may, by notice gazetted, make such change, exchange, or dedication, as the case may be, and in such notice declare the manner and terms in which the same is intended to be so made:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908, aforesaid, declare my intention to change the specific purpose of the portion of the reserve described in the second column of the Schedule hereto from that named in the first column of the said Schedule to that named in the third column of the said Schedule.

Whereas at a special meeting of the Collingwood County Council duly convened and held at the Council Chambers, at Collingwood, on Monday, the 3rd day of July, 1911, the following resolution was passed by the said Council, that is to say: That the County of Collingwood be divided into seven separate ridings, and that each riding shall have power to return one member for representation on the said Council: And whereas the names and boundaries of the said seven ridings are set forth in the Schedule hereto: And whereas it was, on the said 3rd day of July, 1911, resolved that the said resolution should be confirmed at a special meeting of the Council to be held at 10 o'clock a.m. on the 28th day of August, 1911: And whereas public notice of the place and date fixed for the subsequent meeting of the said Council to be held on the said 28th day of August, 1911, for the purpose of confirming the above resolution, and of such resolution, was given by publishing the same in the Golden Bay Argus newspaper, being a newspaper circulating in the County of Collingwood, on the 3rd, 10th, 17th, and 24th days of August, 1911, in the words and figures following,—

# Puponga.

Starting at the sea-shore at Seaford Golden Bay, the southern boundary of this riding shall extend along the north bank of Pakawau Mud-flat and stream to West-haven Inlet, thence along the northern shore of that inlet to the sea-coast at Westhaven Heads, thence northward along the sea-coast to Cape Farewell and Farewell Sandspit, thence southward along the shore of Golden Bay to the starting-point at Pakawau River mouth.

# We sthaven.

This riding consists of the whole of the Taitapu Gold Estates, as shown on the public map of the County of Collingwood, and being section numbered 1 of Square 17 on the Survey Districts of Pakawau, Paturau, and Wakamarama.

#### Pakawau.

Follows the southern boundary of Puponga Riding from the Pakawau River mouth to Westhaven Inlet; thence along

the southern shore of that inlet to the boundary of the Westhaven Riding at its intersection with Scenic Reserve No. 8, westward of Wairoa River; thence along the eastern boundary of the said Westhaven Riding to the boundary of Rockville Riding; thence via Oti Mataura Creek to Aorere River; thence along the Aorere River to Golden Bay; thence along the shore of Golden Bay to the starting-point at Pakawau River mouth.

#### Collingwood.

This riding includes the whole of the Port and Village of Gibbstown, and extends therefrom southward along the foreshore of Golden Bay to the Milnthorpe Road near Parapara River mouth; thence along the said Milnthorpe Road to its intersection with the Collingwood-Takaka Inland Road; thence north-westward along the latter road to its intersection with Appo's Flat Road; thence along the boundary-line between Sections 218, 217, 205, and 206 in Block XIV, Pakawau Survey District, and a public road to the main Aorere Road; thence north-eastward along the latter road to the boundary-line between Sections 4 and 6 of Block XIV, Pakawau Survey District; thence along the said boundary-line and the boundary-line between Sections 5 and 7 in the same survey district to Aorere River; thence along the southern bank of the said river to the starting-point. #### Parapara.

Joins and follows the suthern boundary of Collingwood Riding along the Milnthorpe and Inland Roads to Appo's Flat Road, thence along the said Appo's Flat Road to Aorere River at its junction with Stanton's Creek, thence along Aorere River to the confluence of Slate River, thence follows Slate River to the county boundary at Slate River Peak, thence along the county boundary to the sea at Purawhakaho, thence along the foreshore to starting-point at Milnthrope Road north of Parapara River mouth.

#### Rockville.

Commences on Appo's Flat Road coterminous there with Collingwood and Parapara Ridings, follows the northwestern boundary of Collingwood Riding to Aorere River, thence follows the southern boundary of Pakawau Riding via Oti Mataura Creek to boundary of Westhaven Riding, thence along portion of the eastern boundary of that riding to Kaituna River, thence down that river to Kaituna Bridge at intersection of Section 129 ("King's Corner"), thence following public road-lines eastward to Aorere River at intersection of Section 156, thence following portion of the western boundary of Parapara Riding to the starting-point.

#### Bainham.

Commences at the Aorer River at the southern boundary of Rockville Riding on public road fronting Section 156 (Jos. Skilton), follows the said boundary throughout to its junction with Westhaven Riding at the head of Kaituna River, thence southward and westward along the boundary of Westhaven Riding to the sea, thence along the sea-coast to the boundary of the county at Koihaihai Bluff, thence along the southern county boundary to Slate River Peak, thence along the western boundary of Parapara Riding to the starting-point.
