*Redividing County of Levels into Ridings, &c., under the Counties Act, 1908.*

(L.S.) ISLINGTON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and ten, made under the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the second day of June, one thousand nine hundred and ten, the boundaries of the Borough of Timaru were altered and a certain area was thereby excluded from the County of Levels, and it is therefore expedient to redivide the said County of Levels into fresh ridings, and also to determine the number of Councillors to be elected for each riding, and the date for the election of such Councillors:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Counties Act, 1908, do hereby redivide the said County of Levels into six ridings, to be called the Seadown Riding, the Waimataitai Riding, the Point Riding, the Claremont Riding, the Otupua Riding, and the Tengawai Riding; and do hereby declare that the boundaries of the said ridings shall be those set forth under the names of the said ridings respectively in the Schedule hereto, and that the number of Councillors to be elected for such ridings shall be one for each riding; and I do further declare that Wednesday, the eighth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, shall be the day upon which the election of Councillors for the said ridings shall be held.

SCHEDULE.

SEADOWN RIDING.

ALL that area in Levels County bounded towards the north by a line along the middle of the Ophi River from a point opposite the westernmost corner of Rural Section No. 22302 to the sea; thence towards the south-east by the sea to the outlet of the Waitarakao Lagoon; thence towards the south-west by the south-western shore of the

said Waitarakao Lagoon to Washdyke Creek; thence by that creek to the main North Road; thence by the main North Road and the Timaru-Pleasant Point main road to the Pleasant Point Town District; thence by the said town district to the westernmost corner of Rural Section No. 22302; and thence by a right line to the middle of the Ophi River, the place of commencement.

WAIMATAITAI RIDING.

All that area in Levels County bounded towards the north-east by Seadown Riding hereinbefore described from the junction of roads at the northernmost corner of Rural Section No. 14284 to the outlet of the Waitarakao Lagoon; thence towards the south generally by the Borough of Timaru to the Waimataitai Creek; thence by that creek to Morgan's Road; thence by Morgan's Road to the Upper Washdyke Road, by the Upper Washdyke Road to Hadlow Road, by Hadlow Road to Brockley Road, by Brockley Road to German Valley Road, and by the last-mentioned road to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 115, Rosewill Settlement; thence towards the west generally by the said Section No. 115 to Rolling Ridges Road; thence by Rolling Ridges Road to Hart's Road; thence by Hart's Road to Down's Road; thence by Down's Road to Levels Valley Road at the northernmost corner of Section No. 3, Block VIII, Pareora Survey District (Papakā Settlement); thence by Miller's Road to Hall's Road; thence by Hall's Road to Cartwright's Road; and thence by Cartwright's Road to the place of commencement.

POINT RIDING.

All that area in Levels County bounded towards the north-east by a line along the middle of the Ophi River from a point opposite the westernmost corner of Rural Section No. 22786 to the north-western corner of Seadown Riding hereinbefore described; thence towards the east generally by the said Seadown Riding and Waimataitai Riding hereinbefore described to German Valley Road at the south-eastern corner of Section No. 115, Rosewill Settlement; thence towards the south by the said German Valley Road to Cliffs Road at View Point; thence by the road forming the north-eastern and northern boundaries of Section No. 104, Rosewill Settlement, to Tycho Flat Road; thence by Tycho Flat Road to Hay's Road;

thence by Hay's Road through Rural Section No. 18864, and by the road forming the northern boundaries of Sections Nos. 18873 and 21787 (and forming the north-eastern boundary of Section No. 85, Rosewill Settlement) to the northernmost corner of the said Section No. 85; thence by that section to Summit Road; thence by that road and by Rural Section No. 36212 and Section No. 79, Rosewill Settlement, to the road forming the north-western boundary of the last-mentioned section, and thence by that road to the county boundary; thence towards the south-west by Mackenzie County to the Tengawai River; thence across that river, and towards the north-west by the left bank of the said Tengawai River to the Totara Valley Road; thence again towards the south-west by the Totara Valley Road to its junction with School Road at the westernmost corner of Rural Section No. 16115; thence again towards the north-west by School Road and the road forming part of the south-western boundary of Rural Section No. 22786 to the north-western corner of that section; and thence by a right line to the middle of the Opihi River, the place of commencement: excluding the Pleasant Point Town District.

CLAREMONT RIDING.

All that area in Levels County bounded towards the north generally by Point and Waimataitai Ridings hereinbefore described from Mackenzie County to the Borough of Timaru; thence towards the north-east by the said Borough of Timaru to the Great South Road; thence towards the south generally by the Great South Road to the Otupua Creek; thence by that creek to the Coonor Road; thence by the Coonor Road to Brigg's Road at the westernmost corner of Rural Section No. 13754; thence by Brigg's Road and the road forming the north-western boundaries of Rural Sections Nos. 16364, 10570, 16758, 14438, 15613, intersecting Education Reserve No. 1203 and its continuation westerly to the Upper Pareora Bridge; and thence towards the south-west by Waimate and Mackenzie Counties to the south-western corner of Point Riding aforesaid, the place of commencement.

OTUPUA RIDING.

All that area in Levels County bounded towards the north-west by the Claremont Riding hereinbefore described from the Upper Pareora Bridge to the Borough of Timaru; thence towards the north-east by the Borough of Timaru to the sea; thence towards the east and the south-east by the sea to the mouth of the Pareora River; and thence towards the south-west by Waimate County to the Upper Pareora Bridge, the place of commencement.

TENGAWAI RIDING.

All that area in Levels County bounded towards the north-east by a line along the middle of the Opihi River from the north-eastern boundary of Mackenzie County to the northernmost corner of Point Riding hereinbefore described; thence towards the south-east generally by the said Point Riding to the north-eastern boundary of Mackenzie County; and thence towards the south-west by the said Mackenzie County to the middle of the Opihi River, the place of commencement.

*Taihape Old-age Pensions District.*

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of six, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
