the land so purchased is vested in His Majesty the King, and it shall vest accordingly and shall become Crown land:

And whereas a resolution was passed by a meeting of assembled owners, and duly confirmed by the Waiariki District Maori Land Board, that the land set out in the Schedule hereto be sold to the Crown:

This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the said company without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferree is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

10. If the said company fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the company, within thirty days, to

remedy the default specified in that notice, and if the said company fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period, it shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The sections for selection lie between the Piako and Wai-The sections for selection lie between the Piako and Waitoa Rivers, and consist of partly drained swamp lands and high, dry, flat ridges. The access is from Waitoa Railwaystation by No. 1 Road, distant six miles and three-quarters by formed cart-road, the last mile of which is about to be re-formed. Access is also obtained from Waitoa Station by No. 7 Road, distant seven miles and three-quarters, of which one mile has yet to be formed. The distance from Morrinsville Railway-station by formed cart-road is some eleven miles and a half to the permanent bridge-site over the Piako River. In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section three of the Land Act, 1908, and by section thirty-eight of the Mining Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, hereby revoke the regulations for the occupation of certain pastoral lands in the Westland Mining District, known as the Glenroy Block, dated the twenty-eight day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the Gazette of the fourth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and do hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof.

#### REGULATIONS.

INTERPRETATION: In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context, the term "licensee" includes the successors and assigns of a licensee, and the term "Warden" means a Warden under the Mining Act, 1908, exercising jurisdiction within the district in which the Glenroy Block is situated. is situated.

1. Application may be made for any of the Crown lands within the area described in the First Schedule hereto.

2. Every application shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and every applicant shall make the declaration appended thereto or a declaration to that effect. declaration to that effect.

3. Every applicant shall at the time of his application pay to the Receiver of Land Revenue, Nelson, the first half-year's rent, together with the license and registration fee, or make such payment immediately the application has been approved or the applicant has been declared successful at the ballot. Deposits made by unsuccessful applicants shall be returned by the Receiver of Land Revenue after the ballot.

4. All rents shall be paid half-yearly in advance to the Receiver of Land Revenue, Nelson, on the 1st day of January and July in each and every year.

5. The area which may be applied for under these regulations shall be not less than 25 acres nor more than 650

acres.
6. The Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Land District of Nelson may, with the approval of the Land Board of that district (hereinafter referred to as "the Land Board"), grant not more than one pastoral license under these regulations to any person of the age of seventeen years and upwards who may apply for the same; but the Land Board may refuse any application, and its decision shall he final

7. The annual rent payable under the license shall be a sum to be fixed by the Land Board, but shall be not less

than 3d. per acre.

8. (1.) The term of the license shall be twenty-one years, and if the land for which the license has been issued is not required for mining purposes, on the licensee applying for the same at least twelve months before the expiration

of his license, a new license for a further term of twenty-one years, to date from the expiration of his license, shall be offered to the licensee at a rental to be ascertained as

one years, to date from the expiration of his license, shall be offered to the licensee at a rental to be ascertained as hereinafter specified, namely,—

(a.) A valuation shall be made by an appraiser to be appointed by the Land Board of the then value of the fee-simple of the land included in the license, and also a valuation of all substantial improvements of a permanent character made and then in existence on the said land.

(b.) After the service of notice of the valuations made as aforesaid (which shall be effected by serving a copy of the same on the licensee and another copy on the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Nelson Land District), but not later than twelve months before the expiry of the term for which the licensee then holds the land, the licensee shall elect, by notice in writing delivered to the said Commissioner, whether he will accept a fresh license of the said land for a further term of twenty-one years from the expiration of the then term at a rental equal to 4 per centum of the value of the fee-simple as fixed, less the value of the improvements, by the said valuation; such fresh license to be subject to conditions similar to the previous license, excepting as to the amount of rent payable thereunder.

(2.) In the event of an existing licensee not agreeing to the valuations made as aforesaid, then the rent to be naid

(2.) In the event of an existing licensee not agreeing to the valuations made as aforesaid, then the rent to be paid shall be determined by arbitration, in manner provided by section 80 of the Land Act, 1908.

(3.) If the licensee elects not to accept a renewal as above mentioned, or refuses or neglects to execute a license within thirty days after the same is tendered to him for the purpose, then a license of the said land shall, not later than one month before the end of the term for which the existing license was granted, be offered for sale by public auction for a further term of twenty-one years, subject to the provisions of section 219 of the Land Act, 1908.

(4.) If such license is not disposed of as above mentioned to some person other than the licensee, or if such person fails to execute the license in duplicate within thirty days after being notified that such license is ready for execution, or to pay the half-year's rent and the value of the improvements as aforesaid, then the licensee may again elect in manner aforesaid to accept a fresh license as aforesaid; and if he does not elect to accept the same, or refuses or neglects to execute such license for thirty days after re-tender of the license for execution, then he may continue as tenant of the said land from year to year, and shall pay the rent reserved by his expired license, and observe and perform the covenants and conditions contained in the same, or until the Board succeeds in finding an applicant for the new license, unless prior to the finding of such applicant by the Board he elects to accept a new license for the said further period of twenty-one years as aforesaid.

(5.) No outgoing tenant shall have any right or claim against the Crown or the Board in respect of the value of any improvements made by him on the land in his occupation in case any incoming tenant fails to pay such value to the Receiver of Land Revenue, nor shall the outgoing tenant have any claim against the Crown or the Board, or any body or person whatever, by reason of a reduction of the valuation for improvements made by the Board and approved by the Minister of Lands.

9. Residence on the land selected under these regulations shall be compulsory, and shall commence within

(a.) Within one year from the date of his license, to an amount equal to 5 per centum of the value of

the land;
(b.) Within two years from the date of his license, an amount equal to another 7½ per centum of the value of the land;

(c.) Within five years from the date of his license, to an

amount equal to another 10 per centum of the value of the land; and

(d.) Within ten years from the date of his license, to an amount equal to another 25 per centum of the value of the land.

11. (1.) Applications to transfer a license under these regulations shall be made to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, and every such transfer shall be subject to the approval of the Land Board.

(2.) No transfer will be allowed within one year from date of the license, nor until permanent improvements have been effected to the value of 12½ per centum of the value of the land held under the license.

12. Substantial improvements of a permanent character

of the land held under the license.

12. Substantial improvements of a permanent character shall include reclamation from swamps; clearing of bush not being milling-timber (as determined in pursuance of Regulation No. 15), scrub, gorse, broom, and sweetbriar; grassing; cultivation; planting with trees and live hedges; the laying-out and cultivating of gardens; fencing; draining; making roads; sinking wells; constructing watertanks or sheep-dips; making embankments or protective works of any kind; in any way improving the character or fertility of the soil; or the erection of any building at the licensee's option upon the protected area referred to in Regulation No. 19.

13. The licensee shall have the right to the use of the surface soil only of the demised land for the purpose set forth in his license.

14. The licensee shall have no right, either himself or

forth in his license.

14. The licensee shall have no right, either himself or through any other person, to fell, cut, sell, remove, or otherwise dispose of any milling-timber on the land included in his license, except for his domestic use, or for fencing or clearing for cultivation.

15. The Commissioner of Crown Lands, or any person appointed by him, shall decide what is milling-timber, and his decision shall be final.

16. The licensee shall not acquire, by virtue of a license under these regulations, any right to mine for gold, silver, or any other metals or minerals whatever.

17. The holders of miners' rights shall have the right to prospect over the whole area held under pastoral license, and for that purpose may, so long as they are legitimately engaged in prospecting, enter and camp thereon and to

use mining-timber and firewood growing thereon; but any prospecting carried on upon the protected area referred to in Regulation No. 19 hereof shall be subject to the provisions of sections 73 and 74 of the Mining Act, 1908.

18. The Warden shall have the right to grant any mining privilege or easement in respect of the land comprised in a pastoral license under these regulations subject to compensation for improvements as provided for in the Mining Act, 1908

prised in a pastoral license under these regulations subject to compensation for improvements as provided for in the Mining Act, 1908.

19. Except as hereinafter provided, no previous consent shall be required from the licensee to enable the Warden to grant an application for any mining privilege which may be lawfully made to him under the Mining Act or regulations for the time being in force in respect of the lands comprised in a pastoral license. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this regulation, the Warden shall not, without the consent of the licensee, grant any such application in respect of the area containing the dwellinghouse or immediately surrounding the same, if the dwelling is of a substantial nature, and the lands in cultivation, and surrounded by a substantial fence. For the purposes of this regulation and of Regulation No. 17 hereof, the area to be protected to the licensee around his dwelling shall be 50 acres: Provided, however, in all cases where the area which otherwise would be protected is not cultivated or substantially fenced, then so much only of the area as is substantially fenced or cultivated shall be protected.

20. The Crown and the local authorities concerned shall have the right to survey and take all lands necessary for the centred the construction of roads on the demiced metatoral lands.

20. The Crown and the local authorities concerned shall have the right to survey and take all lands necessary for the construction of roads on the demised pastoral lands, and compensation only for the value of substantial improvements made by the licensee will be paid in case of land resumed for public purposes.

21. For all land resumed for public or mining purposes a reduction, proportionate to the acreage resumed, shall be made on future annual rentals.

22. Any license may be forfeited if payment of rental is not made within three months after the due date or if the licensee fails to effect substantial improvements as required by Regulation 10 hereof.

23. All existing pack-tracks, whether surveyed or not, shall remain available for public use, and where the licensee's fences run across the same a swing-gate must be provided to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Crown Lands.

24. Every holder of a miner's right shall have the right

24. Every holder of a miner's right shall have the right of ingress and egress over the whole area comprised in a pastoral license, excepting so much thereof as may be under cultivation and substantially fenced, as provided in Regulation No. 19 hereof.

25. All water-rights are reserved to the Crown, but not so as to deprive the licensee's stock of access to the water

so as to deprive the licensee's stock of access to the water on his holding.

26. The Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Land District of Nelson may, with the approval of the Warden and the Land Board, grant a license under these regulations over land held under a sawmill license granted by the Warden, or over land subject to a certificate of reservation as a timber area under the Mining Act, 1908, and the regulations made thereunder: Provided that the licensee shall not in any way interfere with or prejudice the holder of such sawmill license, or the holder of any timber-rights within a timber area, in the exercise of his rights and privileges in respect thereof, and that the said licensee shall have no right of action, claim, or demand in respect of any injury done or committed in the lawful exercise of those rights and privileges.

George the Fifth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to Our Right Trusty and Right Entirely Beloved Cousin and Councillor Henry Duke of Norfolk, Earl Marshal, and Our Hereditary Marshal of England, Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight Grand Cross of our Royal Victorian Order: Greeting.

Order of the Garter, Knight Grand Cross of our Royal Victorian Order: Greeting.

Whereas His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, was pleased to issue His Royal Proclamation, bearing date the 9th day of September, 1907, ordaining, declaring, and commanding that the colony of New Zealand and the territory belonging thereto should be called and known by the title of the Dominion of New Zealand: And for as much as it is our Royal Will and Pleasure that for the greater honour and distinction of the said Dominion of New Zealand certain Armorial Ensigns and Supporters should be assigned thereto: Know Ye, therefore, that We of Our Princely Grace and Special Favour have granted and assigned and by these presents do grant and assign for the Dominion of New Zealand the Armorial Ensigns and Supporters following, that is to say:—

"Quarterly: Azure and Gules on a Pale Argent three Lymphads Sable, in the first Quarter four mullets in Cross of the last each surrounded by a Mullet of the second (representing the Constellation of the Southern Cross), in the second Quarter a Fleece, in the third a Garb, and in the Fourth two Mining Hammers in Saltire all Or; And for the Crest on a Wreath of the Colours a demi-Lion Rampant guardant Or supporting a flagstaff erect proper thereon flying to the sinister the Union Flag; And for the Supporters on the dexter side a female Figure proper vested Argent supporting in the dexter hand a flagstaff proper hoisted thereon the Ensign of the Dominion of New Zealand, And on the sinister side a Maori Rangatira (chieftain) vested proper holding in his dexter hand a Taiahia (halbert), all proper," together with the motto "Onward," as the same are in the painting hereunto annexed more plainly depicted, to be borne for the said Dominion of New Zealand on Seals, Shields, Banners, or otherwise according to the Laws of Arms.

Our Will and Pleasure therefore is that you Henry Duke of Norfolk, to whom the cognizance of matters of

this nature doth properly belong, do require and command that this Our Concession and Declaration be recorded in Our College of Arms in order that Our Officers of Arms and all other Public Functionaries whom it may concern may take full notice and have knowledge thereof in their several and respective departments. And for so doing this shall be your Warrant.

Sir,—I am commanded by my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to inform you that they have had under consideration the question of giving facilities for the entry as engine-room artificers in the Royal Navy of a limited number of New-Zealand-born subjects, not exceeding twelve each year, and with this object the following proposals have been made:

## (1.) Qualifications.

All candidates to be British subjects, and to possess the qualifications laid down in the King's Regulations and Recruiting Instructions. They must be prepared to serve in any part of the world, and must sign the usual Continuous Service Engagement for twelve years' service. Men of colour not to be accepted.

### (2.) Applications for Entry.

To be addressed to some central officer in New Zealand, who would answer inquiries and take the necessary pre-liminary action to ascertain the eligibility of a candidate, &c. Applications would be forwarded to the Captain in Charge, Sydney, in whose office a roster of applicants would be kept, and by whom the necessary arrangements would be made for entry.

# (3.) Examination and Trade Test.

To be carried out preferably by the Engineer Officer of one To be carried out preferably by the Engineer Officer of one of His Majesty's ships on the periodical visits to New Zealand waters, or, failing such opportunity, at Sydney by two Engineer Officers, or one if two are not available. Similar arrangements to be made for the medical examination, a preliminary examination being made by a local medical officer in the case of candidates proceeding to Sydney for the case of the case of candidates proceeding to Sydney for the case of the case examination for entry.

Travelling-expenses to Sydney to be allowed to candidates directed to proceed there for final entry.

## (4.) Disposal on Entry.

It is suggested that when possible new entries should be absorbed in vacancies on the station, or to relieve time-expired men, any in excess of such requirements being borne supernumerary pending vacancies in complement. They would be attached to the port division of the ship which they join, and on relief of the ship's company they should accompany the rest of the crew to England, unless retained for special reasons at the discretion of the Commander-in-Chief.

I am accordingly to request that you will arrange for a definite procedure to be drawn up on the lines of these proposals, with any modification or extensions which you may desire to suggest.

The distribution will take place on the 3rd February, 1912, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 27th January, 1912.

A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town. same town.
- 2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1911; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—
