Constituting the Town District of Kohukohu, in the County of Hokianga.

(L.S.) ISLINGTON, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Town Boards Act, 1908, that the Governor may declare that any locality outside a borough wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act, 1908:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said area shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district, under the Town Boards Act, 1908, by the name of the Kohukohu Town District: And in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of five members.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north by the Kohukohu-Rakautapu Road from the north-western boundary of Tautehihi No. 2b Block to a point opposite the southernmost corner of Pikiparia A Block; thence across the said road, and towards the north-west by Pikiparia A Block and the south-eastern boundary of that block produced to the tidal waters of the Hokianga River; thence again towards the north and towards the east and south-east by the said tidal waters of the Hokianga River to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Section No. 22, Block XIV, Mangamuka Survey District; thence towards the west generally by a right line across a road reserve, by Section No. 22 aforesaid, Sections Nos. 19A, 19, 59, 58, Block X, Mangamuka Survey District, the abutment of a road, Sections Nos. 31 and 30,

Block X aforesaid, and part of the western boundary and the north-western boundary of Tautehihi No. 2b Block to the place of commencement.

PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section thirty-three of the Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council declare that land set apart under the said Act as a kauri-gum reserve, and which is no longer required for the purpose of gum-digging, shall be no longer subject to the said Act, and thereupon the land shall cease to be a kauri-gum reserve, and shall be dealt with by the Land Board as ordinary Crown land; provided that such Order in Council shall only be issued in pursuance of a resolution of the Land Board, supported by such independent evidence as the Governor in Council deems necessary:

And whereas the Land Board of the Auckland Land District passed a resolution recommending that the portion of Hukerenui Extension Kauri-gum Reserve, described in the Schedule hereto, be declared to be no longer subject to the said Act, and such resolution was duly gazetted and publicly notified in accordance with section nine of the Kauri-gum Industry Amendment Act, 1910: And whereas no objection has been received to the said proposal:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section thirty-three of the Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1908, and section nine of the Kauri-gum Industry Amendment Act, 1910, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby order and declare that the portion of Hukerenui Extension Kauri-gum Reserve, described in the Schedule hereto, shall be no longer subject to the provisions of the Acts aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, situated in Block VIII, Motatau Survey District, containing by admeasurement 50 acres, more or less, being a part of the Hukerenui Extension Kauri-gum Reserve set apart by Order in Council dated 12th April, 1899, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, 13th April, 1899, page 756. Bounded towards the north by Section 16 of Block VIII, Motatau Survey District, 2074.5 links; towards the east by Section 23 of Block VIII aforesaid, 3228.6 links; towards the south and west by part of the Hukerenui Extension Kauri-gum Reserve, 2000 and 2600 links respectively: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less: as the same is delineated on the plan marked L. 56982/6, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands, at Wellington, and thereon edged red.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this thirteenth day of January, 1912.

Present :

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE SIR J. G. WARD, BART., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the Act"), His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made on the tenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations under and for the purposes of the Act.

REGULATIONS.

THE BOARD.

1. ALL meetings of the Board shall be held in Wellington.
2. Ordinary meetings shall be held quarterly, on the second Thursday in January, April, July, and October, at 2.30 p.m.
3. Special meetings shall be held at such times as the Board decides, and also upon written request duly lodged with the Secretary to the Board and signed by at least three members of the Board. Such request shall set forth clearly the special business to be considered at such meeting.
4. On receipt of any such request the Secretary shall fix the date of such special meeting, being not later than ten days after the receipt of such request, and he shall forthwith duly notify the members of the Board as to such special meeting.
5. At all meetings the Chairman shall have a deliberative as well as a casting vote.
6. The Board shall keep a correct record of the business transacted at its meetings.
7. Every member of the Board shall receive notice of the business to be transacted at the ordinary meetings at least one week prior to the date of any such meeting, and a notice concerning the business to be transacted at any special meeting at least three days prior to the holding of such meeting. Such notices shall be issued by the Secretary to the Board.
8. Members of the Board shall not be entitled to or be paid any remuneration for their services as members, but shall, whilst travelling on the business of the Board, be entitled to travelling-allowance for personal expenses at the rate of 15s. per diem, but no additional allowance shall be made for sleeping-accommodation on train; and, if travelling by sea, 5s. shall be allowed for the first day, and 2s. 6d. per day for the following days.
This allowance shall be paid only where a member is necessarily absent from his home at night; but for all journeys where a member is not obliged to be absent at night actual expenses will be paid to an amount in no case exceeding 15s., on production of a statement giving details of the nature of the charges, with dates, places, and to whom paid, but without being obliged to produce receipts. Cost of transport by land or sea will be paid on production of vouchers, but no vouchers for such expenses will be required for sums of less than 10s., and vouchers for railway fares will not be required if the railway travelled upon and extent of journey are stated.
9. Every member shall be allowed by the head of his Department such special leave (exclusive of any leave which he might otherwise be entitled to) as will be necessary to enable him to attend all meetings of the Board: Provided that any elective member of the Board being unable for any pressing reason to attend any meeting may be granted by the Chairman of the Board leave to absent himself, but such leave shall not be granted in respect of two consecutive meetings unless by reason of illness of such member.

CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE FUND.

10. Any person who is a contributor to the Fund under the provisions of subsection (2) of section 26 of the Act and entitled under the Civil Service Act, 1866, to receive compensation for loss of office, shall, when his compensation becomes payable, pay into the Fund an amount equal

to the difference between the compensation to which he would have been entitled on the 30th June, 1908, and the amount of compensation as at date when he became a contributor. In the case of claims arising under section 32 (f) of the Act, it shall be a condition that no greater payment out of the Fund shall be made than if the officer had become a contributor on the 30th day of June, 1908.

11. All persons who are first employed hereafter in permanent positions on probation under agreement that, if their appointment is made permanent, it is to date from the time of their entering the Service, shall become contributors as from the date of their appointment being made permanent.

12. The head of each Department shall supply the Secretary to the Board with a statement showing the rate of salary or wages, annual or otherwise, of each contributor in his Department at the date of joining the Fund, and shall also advise the Secretary to the Board immediately the salary of a contributor is altered, giving particulars of alteration, and date from which it takes effect, and in like manner shall report when the salary of a contributor is reduced by reason of age or infirmity, and shall supply such further information as the Secretary to the Board may require.

13. (1.) It shall be the duty of the head of every Department to notify the Secretary to the Board forthwith of every permanent appointment hereafter made in his Department, giving the following particulars (as to the correctness of which he shall first satisfy himself) in regard to each such person:—

Full name;
Date of birth;
Name of Department;
Position;
Date of appointment—temporary, ; permanent, ;
Salary per annum;
Whether bachelor, spinster, husband, wife, widower, or widow;
Date of birth of wife (if living);
Date of birth of each child then living and under the age of fourteen years.

(2.) In each such case it shall be the duty of the head of the Department to make the proper deduction provided for under section 29 of the Act, and the Controller and Auditor-General shall not pass the salary of any such officer unless the deduction is made. This regulation shall also apply to all payments of salaries in advance.

14. The head of every Department shall notify the Secretary to the Board of any transfer and of the date thereof, and supply any other particulars required.

15. Any contributor having a break in his service and claiming to count continuous service in the terms of section 49 of the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Amendment Act, 1908, shall make written application to the Board in the form hereinafter set forth, and it shall be the duty of the head of his Department to certify on such application that the particulars stated are correct.

17. Any contributor may at any time submit to the Board a certificate of marriage, or of the birth of any of his children, in order that such may be recorded by the Secretary, who shall thereupon issue a certificate that such dates are recorded and acknowledged as correct, and it shall not thereafter be necessary to produce any evidence upon those points when claims upon the Fund arise.

18. (1.) All payments made to the Postmaster-General to the credit of the Fund on account of contributors' contributions or fines shall be accompanied by a schedule, signed by the officer making the payment, and setting forth in detail in respect of each contributor concerned the following particulars :—

 Department ;
 Amount of contribution (or fine).

(2.) On receipt of any such payment the Postmaster-General shall forthwith place the amount to the credit of the Fund, and forward the schedule, with his receipt for the total amount indorsed at foot thereof, direct to the Secretary to the Board.

(3.) The Postmaster-General shall similarly endorse and forward to the Secretary to the Board advices received, with payments under the Act.

(4.) The Postmaster-General shall, at least once in each month, pay to the Public Trustee the whole of the moneys then standing to the credit of the Fund in the Post Office Account.

(5.) The Public Trustee shall advise the Secretary to the Board of every payment made by the Postmaster-General to the credit of the Fund, and whenever any interest is credited to the Fund, the details and amount of such interest.

19. Every contributor whose salary is temporarily stopped owing to ill health, or who is on leave of absence without salary, shall,—

(a.) For the first three months during which his salary is stopped contribute at the ordinary rate payable by him, and for the balance of any such period of stoppage, contribute one-third of the rate otherwise payable by him, and thereafter at the ordinary rate of contribution ; or

(b.) Cease to contribute to the Fund while his salary is so stopped, and thereafter shall contribute by way of deduction from his salary an additional amount, being not less than his ordinary contribution, until the additional contributions so paid are equal in amount to the payments which would have been made had he elected to contribute under the last preceding paragraph.

In any case where the salary of a contributor has been temporarily stopped owing to ill health, the Board may by resolution, on application being made to it, modify this regulation with regard to payment of contributions in such manner as it thinks fit :

Provided that in the event of the retirement or death of any contributor who has elected to come under clause (b) hereof the arrears (if any) of payments shall be deducted from any allowances payable out of the Fund on account of the retirement or death of such contributor.

20. (1.) The head of a Department shall report to the Secretary to the Board the date when the salary of a contributor employed in his Department is temporarily stopped on account of ill health, and again when payment thereof is resumed. He shall also similarly report as to a contributor on leave of absence without salary.

(2.) In each case he shall state under which paragraph of the preceding regulation the contributor has elected to contribute.

21. From every payment made to a contributor to the Fund whose salary or wage is computed at a daily or hourly rate, and who is not paid for time during which he is not actually employed, there shall be deducted, under section 29 of the Act, an amount equal to the amount which would have been contributed by him if he had been actually employed during the whole of the period for which payment is made :

Provided that no deduction shall be made under this regulation from payments made in respect of overtime.

22. In the event of a contributor who has retired from the Public Service on a retiring-allowance being re-employed as provided for under subsection (1) or (2) of section 37 of the Act, it shall be the duty of the

head of the Department in which he is re-employed to immediately report the same to the Secretary to the Board, giving full particulars as to such re-employment (date, remuneration, &c.).

23. Any contributor appealing to the Board under section 33 of the Act shall forward at least twenty-one days before the next ensuing quarterly meeting of the Board full particulars of his case in writing, addressed to the Secretary to the Board, and may, subject to the consent of the Board, appear in person before the Board in support of his case. The Board shall have full power to call for the production of all papers necessary in connection with a case.

24. Every notice of intention to retire from the Public Service under section 35 of the Act shall be forwarded in writing through the head of the Department in which the contributor is employed.

25. The head of every Department shall forthwith notify the Secretary to the Board of all applications received by him for voluntary retirement, and of all cases where a Minister is retiring a contributor, whether by reason of age or infirmity, and also of the death, resignation, or dismissal of a contributor; and such notice shall contain any terms and conditions as to payments into the Fund or otherwise imposed upon the retiring contributor by the Minister.

26. All such notices shall be sent in in the form set forth below :—

28. He shall similarly, so far as the circumstances apply, advise the Board with respect to contributors who retire "medically unfit," or before becoming entitled to a retiring-allowance, or whose services are dispensed with. And in respect of every person whom it is proposed to retire as "medically unfit" there shall be produced two medical certificates in the form hereinafter following, each signed by a medical practitioner approved of by the Board.

29. With respect to claims on the Fund arising upon the death of a contributor, the Secretary shall investigate the same and report thereon.

30. The members of the Board shall, at the first quarterly meeting in each year, elect a committee, to consist of three members, two to form a quorum, to consider in detail and to report to the Board upon all claims arising on the Fund. Such committee shall meet on the afternoon of the day before that fixed for each quarterly meeting of the Board.

31. In respect of every contributor who retires medically unfit, and in respect of every claim arising on the Fund in consequence of the death of a contributor, it shall be the duty of the head of the Department to furnish a certificate with particulars (if any) as to whether any compensation has been paid or is payable by the Crown under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1908, or any Act amending or substituted for that Act.

32. The Board shall at its first meeting after receipt of the necessary particulars consider such cases as have been reported upon, and if satisfied as to the correctness of such claim grant allowances or authorize payments, as the case may require, in accordance with the terms of the Act, and determine the date from which the first payment in each case shall be made.

33. In the event of the date of a contributor's retirement falling on a day other than the last day of a month, then the first instalment of his retiring-allowance shall be payable in respect of the balance of the month, and thereafter at the end of each month.

34. Allowances granted to widows and children under sections 42 and 43 of the Act shall be due and payable on the last day of each month, and, except as to the first and last payment, shall be in equal monthly instalments of £1 10s. for the widow and £1 1s. 8d. for each child.

35. The Secretary shall forthwith after the Board's decision advise the contributor or beneficiary of the same, and where necessary require him to elect whether he accepts a retiring-allowance or a refund of his contributions in lieu thereof.

36. The receipt of any person to whom the Board may direct any sum accruing in respect to benefits derivable under the Act to be paid shall be an absolute discharge to the Fund of all further liability in respect of the amount so paid.

37. Statistical information required by the Actuary for the purpose of valuing the Fund shall be kept by the Secretary to the Board in respect of each contributor, and for this purpose it shall be the duty of the head of every Department to furnish any information possessed by that Department, and also to obtain from each contributor employed in his Department such statistical information regarding his family or otherwise as may from time to time be required. The Secretary to the Board shall obtain like information from each contributor in receipt of a retiring-allowance.

ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.

38. The Secretary to the Board shall be the Returning Officer for the election of the elective members of the Board.

39. There shall be prepared by the Returning Officer separate alphabetical voting-lists, to wit,—

- (a.) Of all contributors who belong to the Post and Telegraph Department;
- (b.) Of all contributors who belong to the Police Force;
- (c.) Of all contributors who belong to the other Departments of the Public Service;
- (d.) Of all contributors who belong to any or each division hereafter created;

and such lists shall be open to inspection by contributors at all reasonable times.

A copy of such list shall be supplied to any centre making application for the same, in so far as such supply shall be practicable.

40. The Returning Officer shall from time to time as may be required issue supplementary lists correcting the principal voting-list:

Provided that the validity of any election shall not be questioned on the ground that a name wrongly appears in a list or has been omitted therefrom.

41. For every election the voting-lists shall be closed on the day on which nominations close, and shall remain closed until the election is completed.

42. Any contributor may, by notice addressed to the Returning Officer posted or delivered so as to reach the Returning Officer not less than seven days before the lists are closed, object to any voting-list on some specified ground, and the Returning Officer shall forthwith after the receipt of any such objection inquire into and dispose of the same. The contributor aforesaid may appeal to the Minister of Internal Affairs against the decision of the Returning Officer, and the Minister's decision shall be final, and the Returning Officer shall thereupon make the amendment or correction, if any, consequent upon such decision.

43. Every extraordinary election shall be held on a date to be fixed by the Returning Officer, being not later than the sixtieth day after the date upon which he receives notification of any vacancy having occurred.

44. Not less than fifty days before any election the Returning Officer shall by advertisement in the *New Zealand Gazette* publicly notify in respect of the election—

- (a.) The day and hour for the closing of nominations, being not more than thirty days before the day of election;
- (b.) The number of vacancies;
- (c.) The day on which the election, if necessary, will be held, and the hour at which the poll will be closed, which shall be 5 p.m. of that day;
- (d.) The division in the Public Service for which the vacancy or vacancies occur.

45. No contributor shall be eligible for election unless he is nominated in writing by at least two other contributors belonging to the same division of the Public Service as that of which the candidate is a member.

46. Every nomination-paper shall be in the form or to the effect following, and shall be delivered personally or by course of post to the Returning Officer.

47. If the nomination-paper does not bear the written consent of the candidate nominated, such consent may be given by him in writing to the Returning Officer before the nominations are closed; and any nomination-paper shall be void if the consent of the candidate nominated therein is not duly given as aforesaid.

48. If in any division of the Public Service the number of persons nominated is not more than the number of vacancies to be filled, the persons nominated shall be declared to be duly elected; but if the number of persons nominated exceeds the number of vacancies to be filled, a ballot of the voters concerned shall be taken.

49. In any case in which a ballot becomes necessary the Returning Officer shall, immediately after the nominations are closed, prepare and post to each contributor, through the head of his Department, a printed ballot-paper containing, in alphabetical order of surnames, a list of all the duly nominated candidates for whom such elector is entitled to vote; and such ballot-paper shall be in the form or to the effect following:—

50. The ballot-paper sent to each contributor shall bear his registered number, which shall also be written opposite his name on the voting-list. The number shall be written on the left-hand bottom corner of the ballot-paper by the Returning Officer, who shall fasten down with gum or otherwise such corner, and impress his official stamp thereon.

51. The ballot-paper, if delivered to the Returning Officer, must be so delivered in a sealed envelope before the day of the election, or not later than 5 o'clock in the afternoon of that day; and, if posted to him, must be posted in a sealed envelope so as to reach him either before that day or not later than 5 o'clock of the afternoon of the fifteenth day thereafter.

52. The poll shall close at 5 o'clock in the afternoon of the day of the election; but all valid ballot-papers shall be included and counted which are received by the Returning Officer in due course of post not later than 5 p.m. of the fifteenth day after the day of the election.

53. A ballot-paper shall be informal in any of the following cases, that is to say,—

- (a.) If the name of the voter appears thereon; or
- (b.) If the number of candidates whose names are left uncanceled exceeds the number of candidates to be elected; or
- (c.) If, being personally delivered to the Returning Officer, it is not delivered at his office before the close of the poll; or if, having been forwarded by post, it is not received at the office of the Returning Officer on or before 5 p.m. of the fifteenth day after the day of election;
- (d.) If, from the postmark on the envelope or otherwise, the Returning Officer is satisfied that it was not posted until after the day of the election;
- (e.) If any such ballot-paper be returned mutilated in any essential detail, or if the official stamp of the Returning Officer be defaced or obliterated; or
- (f.) If any such ballot-paper be delivered or sent by post unsealed.

54. On the sixteenth day after the day of the election the Returning Officer shall, in the presence of not more than three scrutineers appointed by the Board to be present, open and examine all the ballot-papers duly delivered to him or received by him through the post as aforesaid, and, after rejecting all informal ballot-papers, shall ascertain the candidates (not exceeding the total number to be elected by each division of contributors) who have received the greatest number of the votes of such contributors, and shall declare the result of such election.

55. If by reason of an equality of votes given for two or more candidates the election is not complete, the Returning Officer shall complete the election by casting lots in the presence of one of the non-elective members of the Board.

56. The voting-papers shall, after being counted, be enclosed in a sealed packet, and, unless a scrutiny or recount is demanded, shall be kept unopened in the custody of the Returning Officer for two months,

and shall then be destroyed. A scrutiny or recount may be demanded in writing by not less than seven voters within fourteen days after the declaration of the result of the election, as provided for in Regulation 54, and in like manner any objection to the validity of the poll or otherwise in pursuance of section 23, subsection (1), clause (b), of the Act must be lodged with the Returning Officer within such fourteen days.

57. Forthwith after the completion of the election and the expiry of such fourteen days, or upon the completion of any such recount or scrutiny, or the settlement of any such dispute as to the validity of the poll or otherwise, the Returning Officer shall notify in the *New Zealand Gazette* the result of the election, specifying the names of the persons elected in the case of each division of the Public Service, the names of the candidates, and the number of votes received by each candidate, and declaring the candidates who have received the greatest number of votes to be elected.

GENERAL.

58. (1.) All moneys belonging to the Fund and in the hands of the Public Trustee shall form part of the common fund of the Public Trust Office, and shall be invested by the Public Trustee accordingly.

(2.) This regulation shall extend and apply to all moneys belonging to the Fund and in the hands of the Public Trustee at the date on which this regulation comes into operation (whether such moneys are already invested by the Public Trustee on mortgage or otherwise on behalf of the Public Service Superannuation Board or not).

59. The accounts and statements required under section 47 of the Act shall be in the forms shown in the Schedules hereto, or to the like effect.

60. The Secretary to the Board shall submit at each quarterly meeting of the Board a statement showing the amount at credit of the Fund.

61. In computing contributions payable, fractions of a penny shall be taken at the nearest penny, and in computing allowances granted under the Act, fractions of a shilling shall be taken at the nearest shilling.

62. The Board shall pay out of the Fund all expenses incidental to the management and administration of the Fund.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and fifty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that, on the confirmation of any such resolution as is referred to in paragraph (c) of section three hundred and forty-six of that Act, the Governor may, if he thinks fit, by Order in Council declare that the land affected by the resolution shall be subject to Part XVI of that Act as from the date of the Order in Council; and the land shall thereupon, and at all times thereafter while the Order in Council remains in force, remain subject to that Part of that Act accordingly, and all the provisions thereof shall apply in the same manner as if the land was subject to that Part of that Act by virtue of an Order in Council made under the authority thereof:

WHEREAS by section two of the Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1910, it is enacted that, notwithstanding the repeal by the Native Land Act, 1909, of section twenty-six of the Maori Land Claims Adjustment and Laws Amendment Act, 1907, and of sections twenty-six and twenty-eight of the Maori Land Laws Amendment Act, 1908, any recommendation duly made by a Maori Land Board under those sections before the repeal thereof may be proceeded with and acted upon, and for this purpose all powers conferred by those sections upon the Native Minister, the Maori Land Board, and the Governor in Council, or any other person, may be exercised in the same manner, and the exercise thereof shall have the same effect, as if those sections were still in force; and for the purposes of that section every reference in those sections to a Board shall be construed as a reference to the Maori Land Board having for the time being jurisdiction in the district in which the land is situated to which the recommendation relates:

And whereas application has been made, under section twenty-six of the Maori Land Claims Adjustment and Laws Amendment Act, 1907, to the Maori Land Board for the district for its approval to instruments dated the third day of January, one thousand nine hundred and six, the twenty-ninth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and five, the third day of January, one thousand nine hundred and six, respectively, purporting to alienate the

timber on Taurewa No. 4 West (part), Taurewa No. 4 West (part), Taurewa No. 4 East A, and Taurewa No. 4 East B Blocks:

And whereas the said company has erected a tramway on and over the adjoining land, and proposes to erect a tramway over the land particularized and set out in the Schedule hereto for the carriage of timber standing and being thereon: And whereas the proximity of the said tramway has created a marketable value for the said timber which would not otherwise obtain: And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand deems it expedient in the public interest that the acquisition of the said grant of timber rights in respect of the said land by the said company from the said Patumoana and others should be authorized in manner provided by section two hundred and three of the Native Land Act, 1909:

MY LORD,—With reference to my despatch No. 287, of the 17th of August, I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Ministers, copies of an Order of His Majesty in Council passed on the 10th instant, applying the Extradition Acts, 1870–1906, to Siam. The Order in Council was published in the London *Gazette* on the 14th instant, and the Extradition Treaty with Siam will come into operation on the 24th instant.

ORDER IN COUNCIL APPLYING THE EXTRADITION ACTS TO SIAM. NOVEMBER 10TH, 1911.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 10th day of November, 1911.

Present:

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.
PRIME MINISTER.
LORD PRESIDENT.
LORD PRIVY SEAL.
LORD CHAMBERLAIN.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded at Bangkok on the 4th day of March, 1911, between His Majesty and His Majesty the King of Siam, for the Extradition of Criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and His Majesty the King of Siam, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within their respective territories, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should under certain circumstances be reciprocally delivered up; the said High Contracting Parties have named as their plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty for this purpose, that is to say:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India; Arthur Peel, Esquire, His Envoy Extraordinary and Minister plenipotentiary at the Court of Bangkok, &c.

And His Majesty the King of Siam; H.R.H. Prince Devawongse Varoprakar, His Minister for Foreign Affairs, &c.,

Who, having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following articles:—

ARTICLE 1.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other persons over whom they respectively exercise jurisdiction who, being accused or convicted of a crime or offence committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty.

ARTICLE 2.

The crimes or offences for which the extradition is to be granted are the following:—

1. Murder, or attempt, or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm; malicious wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
4. Counterfeiting or altering money, or uttering counterfeit or altered money.
5. Knowingly making any instrument, tool, or engine adapted or intended for counterfeiting coin.
6. Forgery, counterfeiting, or altering or uttering what is forged or counterfeited or altered.
7. Embezzlement or larceny.
8. Malicious injury to property by explosives or otherwise, if the offence be indictable.
9. Obtaining money, goods, or valuable securities by false pretences.
10. Receiving money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen, embezzled, or unlawfully obtained.
11. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
12. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, or director, or member or public officer of any company made criminal by any law for the time being in force.
13. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
14. Rape.
15. Carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge of a girl under the age of puberty, according to the laws of respective countries.
16. Indecent assault.
17. Procuring miscarriage, administering drugs, or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of a woman.
18. Abduction.
19. Child-stealing.
20. Abandoning children; exposing or unlawfully detaining them.
21. Kidnapping and false imprisonment.
22. Burglary or housebreaking.
23. Arson.
24. Robbery with violence.
25. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any person in a railway train.
26. Threats by letter or otherwise with intent to extort.
27. Piracy by law of nations.
28. Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.
29. Assaults on board ship on the high seas, with intent to destroy life or do grievous bodily harm.
30. Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.
31. Dealing in slaves in such a manner as to constitute a criminal offence against the laws of both States.

Extradition is to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both contracting parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime for which, according to the law of both the contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

ARTICLE 3.

Either Government may, at its absolute discretion, refuse to deliver up its own subjects to the other Government.

ARTICLE 4.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of Siam, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the territory of Siam or in the United Kingdom respectively for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or if the person claimed on the part of the Government of Siam, should be under examination for any crime in the territory of Siam or in the United Kingdom respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial, and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

ARTICLE 5.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is deemed by the Party on whom the demand is made to be one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has in fact been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

ARTICLE 6.

A person surrendered can in no case be detained or tried in the State to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored or had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE 7.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the diplomatic agents of the High Contracting parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of the accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition for extradition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by a copy of the judgment passed on the convicted person by the competent court of the State that makes the requisition.

A sentence passed *in contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE 8.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive. The prisoner is then to be brought before a competent Magistrate, who is to examine him and to conduct the preliminary investigation of the case, just as if the apprehension had taken place for a crime committed in the same country.

ARTICLE 9.

When either of the contracting Parties considers the case urgent it may apply for the provisional arrest of the criminal, and the safe keeping of any objects relating to the offence.

Such request will be granted, provided the existence of a sentence or warrant of arrest is proved, and the nature of the offence of which the fugitive is accused is clearly stated.

The warrant of arrest to which this Article refers should be issued by the competent authorities of the country applying for extradition. The accused shall on arrest be sent as speedily as possible before a competent Magistrate.

ARTICLE 10.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in the

other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of or judicial documents stating the fact of a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State.
2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified under the hand of a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be the true copies thereof, as the case may require.
3. A certificate of or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State.
4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice or some other Minister of the other State; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law of the country where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

ARTICLE 11.

The extradition shall not take place unless the evidence be found sufficient according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the said State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to. The fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered until the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his being committed to prison to await his surrender.

ARTICLE 12.

If the individual claimed by one of the two High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date.

ARTICLE 13.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to or the proper tribunal thereof shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE 14.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered, at the time of his apprehension, shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery thereof, be given up when the extradition takes place, and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

ARTICLE 15.

The High Contracting Parties renounce any claim for the reimbursement of the expenses incurred by them in the arrest and maintenance of the person to be surrendered and his conveyance till placed on board the ship; they reciprocally agree to bear such expenses themselves.

ARTICLE 16.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of His Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws for the time being in force in such Colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any such Colony or foreign possession may be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by any person authorized to act in such Colony or possession as a consular officer of Siam.

Such requisitions may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the laws of such Colonies or foreign possessions will allow, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governors or chief authorities, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to His Britannic Majesty's Government.

His Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of criminals from Siam who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, as nearly as may be, and

so far as the laws of such Colonies or foreign possessions will allow, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any Colony or foreign possession of His Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding articles of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE 17.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties at any time on giving to the other six months' notice of its intention to do so.

The Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratification shall be exchanged at London, as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done in Duplicate at Bangkok, the fourth day of March, 1911, in the 129th Year of "Ratanakosindr."

And whereas the ratifications of the above Treaty were exchanged at London on the 1st day of August, 1911;

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 24th day of November, 1911, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Siam under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 4th March, 1911.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada, being Part I of chapter 155 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1911; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The sections for selection lie between the Piako and Waitoa Rivers, and consist of partly drained swamp lands and

H

high, dry, flat ridges. The access is from Waitoa Railway-station by No. 1 Road, distant six miles and three-quarters by formed cart-road, the last mile of which is about to be re-formed. Access is also obtained from Waitoa Station by No. 7 Road, distant seven miles and three-quarters, of which one mile has yet to be formed. The distance from Morrinsville Railway-station by formed cart-road is some eleven miles and a half to the permanent bridge-site over the Piako River. A temporary bridge is now in position, but a permanent bridge will ere long be erected in its place.

There is also a temporary foot-bridge across the Piako River near the western end of Whakahoro Road, but this is merely a service bridge for convenience of workmen, and will later on be removed.

The land consists of good, dry, loamy soil ridges, hard swamp, and peaty swamp of varying depth, resting upon a pumice formation. The land adjacent to Piako River is generally high, and is, with a few exceptions, well above high-flood conditions, and is covered with heavy manuka, cabbage-trees, flax, light bush, fern, and light manuka.

The sections fronting West Road run from hard swamp country covered with flax, cabbage-trees, &c., to deep and shallow peat covered with wiwi, &c., with some loamy, dry, flat ridges in places. Sections fronting Whakahoro Road embrace land running from dry, loamy, flat ridges, hard swamp in flax, to shallow and deeper peat swamp in wiwi and flax, with a good amount of rough feed and grass on same. The sections between the North and Paeroa-Tahuna Roads and east of the West Road are generally of a peaty nature.

The land is of generally good quality throughout, especially where the loamy ridges and hard swamp bottoms obtain. The general elevation of sections is about from 35 ft. to 60 ft. above sea-level. All necessary main drains and roads to sections have either been formed or are in course of construction, and the same applies to the necessary culverts and bridges. All main drains are upon roads, and the only subdivisional drain is that between Sections 6, 7, 8, and 9, Block X, Waitoa Survey District. The sections are not permanently watered, with the exception of those adjacent to the Piako and Waitoa Rivers, but selectors of these sections should note that there is a reservation along the banks of both of these rivers. The Department is prepared to sink artesian bores at cost price where required by settlers, upon satisfactory arrangements being made for pavement thereof.

The land for selection consists in some localities of old buried forest country, and timber for fencing is available on some sections.
