## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, regulations were made under the authority of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), *inter alia*, fixing charges for the transmission of radio-telegrams: And whereas it is desirable to amend the said regulations in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations under the heading "Charges" in the Schedule to the above-recited Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth declare that such regulations shall be read as part of the hereinbefore-mentioned regulations, and shall have effect as from the date of publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

## SCHEDULE.

## CHARGES.

## Ordinary and Government.

*Ordinary*.—(1.) Except as provided in paragraph (2) hereof, the charge for the transmission of radio-telegrams to or from ships approaching or leaving the Dominion of New Zealand from or to any telegraph office in the said Dominion shall be 10d. per word, allocated as follows:—

Ship-station charge .. .. 4d. per word.  
Coast-station and inland charges .. 6d. per word.

(2.) The charge for the transmission of radio-telegrams sent by any of the officers or men on board any of His Majesty's ships stationed in New Zealand waters to any telegraph-office in New Zealand shall be 1d. per word, with a minimum of 6d. per message.

*Government*.—(3.) Except as provided in paragraph (4) hereof, the charge for the transmission of radio-telegrams transmitted on behalf of His Majesty's Government or of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand shall be 5d. per word.

(4.) Radio-telegrams on behalf of His Majesty's Government forwarded from any of His Majesty's ships shall be passed free of coast-station and inland transmission charges.

## For Transmission beyond New Zealand.

For messages to places beyond New Zealand the charges shall be the charges prescribed above, and, in addition thereto in each case, the charges for onward transmission published in the table of rates in the Post and Telegraph Guide.

## Press.

*Press Messages*.—The charge for Press radio-telegrams shall be 5s. per 100 words or fraction thereof, allocated as follows:—

Ship-station charge: 2s. 6d. per 100 words or fraction thereof.

Coast-station and inland charges: 2s. 6d. per 100 words or fraction thereof.

For places beyond New Zealand, in addition to the above charges, the charges published in the table of rates in the Post and Telegraph Guide shall apply.

And whereas it appears that the ratepayers have not been misled by such irregularities, and it is expedient to validate such irregularities :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section one hundred and twenty-one of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, as amended by section seven of the Local Bodies' Loans Amendment Act, 1910, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby validate the public notification of intention to raise the said loan and the poll of the ratepayers on the said proposal to raise the said loan, and doth hereby order and declare that the proceedings relative to such loan shall not be called in question by reason of the irregularities aforesaid.

WHEREAS the Johnsonville Town Board lately proposed to raise a loan of £3,500 under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, for the purchase and installation of a petrol-gas-lighting system : And whereas the special roll, although deposited for public inspection for not less than seven days, was not deposited before the steps described in sections seven to thirteen of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, were taken :

And whereas also the provisions of section eleven of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, as amended by section three of the Local Bodies' Loans Amendment Act, 1910, require that the poll of the ratepayers upon the proposal to raise the said loan shall be taken at a date not more than three weeks from the last publication of the notice mentioned in section eight of the said Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908 : And whereas the said poll of the ratepayers upon the said proposal was taken twenty-five days after the last publication of the notice referred to :

And whereas it appears that the ratepayers have not been misled by such irregularities, and it is expedient to validate those irregularities :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section one hundred and twenty-one of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, as amended by section seven of the Local Bodies' Loans Amendment Act, 1910, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby validate the said special roll and also the poll of the ratepayers on the said proposal to raise the said loan, and doth hereby order and declare that the proceedings relative to such loan shall not be called into question by reason of the irregularities aforesaid.

*Notice declaring that the Guardian, Trust, and Executors Company Act, 1883, and the Guardian, Trust, and Executors Company Amendment Act, 1911, are not repealed.*

WHEREAS by section twelve of the Guardian, Trust, and Executors Company Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that, within three months after the passing of the said Act, the Guardian, Trust, and Executors Company of New Zealand (Limited) shall institute appropriate proceedings in the Supreme Court to determine the questions set forth in the said section : And whereas such proceedings were duly instituted, and the Supreme Court, on the eighteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, did determine, consider, declare, and affirm—

1. That neither by desuetude nor by any other cause has the plaintiff company lost its corporate existence or its rights under the Guardian, Trust, and Executors Company Act, 1883 ; and

2. That the shareholders in the plaintiff company are liable for the capital represented by their shares to the extent to which calls in respect of such shares have not been made and paid prior to the transfers to such shareholders respectively, and that such shareholders are also subject to the further liability created by the fourteenth section of the Guardian, Trust, and Executors Company Act, 1883 :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on him by the said section twelve, doth hereby declare that, as the result of the judgment of the Supreme Court hereinbefore recited, the Guardian, Trust, and Executors Company Amendment Act, 1911, and the Guardian, Trust, and Executors Company Act, 1883, are not repealed.

Notice of Intention to change the Purpose of Portion of a Reserve in the Marlborough Land District.

ISLINGTON, Governor.

WHEREAS by the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908, it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may declare his intention to change, exchange, or alter the dedication of any public reserve now or hereafter vested in His Majesty or the Governor for any of the purposes named in Class II of the Second Schedule to the said Act, whether the same be granted or not; and in the case of any reserve made under the authority of section three hundred and twenty-one of the Land Act, 1908, if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to change the purpose of such reserve or any part thereof from the purpose or presumed purpose for which it was set apart to any other purpose, or if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to exchange any of the land comprised in such reserve for other land of equal value, to be dedicated to one or more of the purposes named in the said Class II, the Governor may, by notice gazetted, make such change, exchange, or dedication, as the case may be, and in such notice declare the manner and terms in which the same is intended to be so made:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908, aforesaid, declare my intention to change the specific purpose of the portion of the reserve described in Part II of the Schedule hereto from that named in Part I of the said Schedule to that named in Part III of the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Description and Purpose of Original Reserve.

ALL that area in the Marlborough Land District, containing by admeasurement 40 acres, more or less, situated in Block XII, Linkwater Survey District, adjoining the Town of Picton, and being Section 55, Picton Suburban. Bounded towards the north-west and north-east by Crown land; towards the east generally by Picton Town Sections Nos. 997 and 999 and a public road; and towards the south-west by section numbered 12, Picton Suburban: as the same is delineated on the plan marked L. 5330/6, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

Set apart as a reserve for timber by notification in *Marlborough Provincial Gazette* No. 88, of the 22nd December, 1864, and granted to the Superintendent of Marlborough on the 27th January, 1866, for the purpose of supplying timber for the public service.

PART II.

Description of Portion of Reserve the Purpose of which it is intended to change.

All that area in the Marlborough Land District, containing by admeasurement 10 acres 2 roods 14 perches, more or less, being part of Section 55, Picton Suburban, situated in Block XII, Linkwater Survey District. Bounded towards the north-east by part Section 55, 563.2 links; towards the south-east by a public road, 192.1 links, 325.5 links, 224.7 links, and 739.5 links; towards the south-west by Section 12, Block XII, Linkwater Survey District, 769.5 links; and towards the north-west by part of Section 55, 1500 links: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less: as the same is delineated on the plan marked L. 5330/4, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

Declaring Land in the Wellington Land District to be subject to the Land for Settlements Act, 1908.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section seventy-nine of the Land for Settlements Act, 1908, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby

declare that the area of Crown land described in the Schedule hereto shall be subject to the provisions of the Land for Settlements Act, 1908, and shall hereafter form part of the Longbush Settlement.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, containing by admeasurement 1 acre 1 rood 34 perches, more or less, being portion of a road closed by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 52, page 2042, of the 29th June, 1911, situated in Block VIII, Huangarua Survey District, commencing at a point 37.7 links distant and on a bearing of 23° 52' from the western angle peg of traverse No. XX on the Wangaehu Road; thence by a line bearing 270° 4' for a distance of 1498 links to the Wangaehu Stream; thence in a southerly direction by that stream for a distance of 108 links; thence by a line bearing 90° 4' for a distance of 1427.9 links to the Wangaehu Road; thence by a line bearing 12° 10' for a distance of 66.9 links to the place of commencement: as the same is delineated on the plan marked L. 19264/164, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands, at Wellington, and thereon coloured red.

Warrant authorizing the Oroua County Council to construct a Bridge over the Oroua River, at Menzies Ford, together with the Approaches thereto and Protective Works, and apportioning the Cost.

ISLINGTON, Governor.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and nineteen of the Public Works Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that in any case where the local authority of any district desires to construct a bridge, or to establish a ferry or ford, in any position that will, in its opinion, be of advantage or benefit to the whole of or any considerable portion of the inhabitants of an adjacent district, as well as to the inhabitants of its own district, and where it is, in the opinion of such local authority, reasonable that the local authority of such adjacent district should contribute to the cost of constructing or establishing the said bridge, ferry, or ford, the provisions of the said section shall have effect:

And whereas the Oroua County Council has given notice and taken the steps required by the said Act, and has made application to the Governor to authorize the construction of the bridge, approaches, and protective works mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter referred to as "the said work," and to apportion the cost of constructing and establishing the said work between the said Council and the Feilding Borough Council:

And whereas it is also provided in the said Act that the Governor (with the view of determining whether or not the work should be done, or what proportion, if any, of the cost of the same should fairly be borne by any local authority, or what local authority should do the work) may direct any Magistrate or other person to be a Commissioner to inquire into and report to him on the matter:

And whereas a Commissioner was appointed, and an inquiry was duly held, in the manner provided by the said Act, in respect to the said work, and in respect also to the apportionment of the cost of constructing the said work:

And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor, after due inquiry, his opinion as to the matters respecting which he was appointed to report:

And whereas I am of opinion that the work should be done, and it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purpose and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby authorize the Council of the County of Oroua to execute the work: And I do hereby declare that the cost thereof, less such contributions as may be made thereto by the Government of New Zealand, and less such other contributions as have already been made by private individuals, shall be borne by the Oroua County Council and the Feilding Borough Council in the following proportions—viz., the Feilding Borough Council shall pay £500



towards such cost and the Oroua County Council shall pay the remainder of such cost respectively :

And I do hereby further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Feilding Borough Council shall be paid out of the funds of the said Borough Council, within a period of one month after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Oroua County Council; and such payments shall be made to the Clerk of the Oroua County Council for and on behalf of the said Borough Council.

SCHEDULE.

That bridge over the Oroua River, together with the approaches and protective works thereto, situated on Feilding Road, and known as the Oroua River Bridge at Menzies Ford, in the Oroua County, Wellington Land District; as the site of the said bridge, approaches, and protective works are more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 27990, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District.

The distribution will take place on the 3rd February, 1912, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 27th January, 1912.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be

allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £75—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £100.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. **T**ABLES showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1911, with totals for the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The total number of persons who arrived in the Dominion during 1911 was 41,389, and the departures during the year numbered 37,189, the excess of arrivals over departures for the year being 4,200 persons.

According to returns furnished by the Immigration officers, 11,379 persons arrived from the United Kingdom, and 2,755 persons departed therefor during the year. From the Commonwealth of Australia the arrivals are returned as numbering 26,909 persons, and the departures thereto as 30,918 persons. Arrivals and departures from and to other countries were 3,101 and 3,516 persons respectively.

Of the 41,389 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 4,555, or 11.01 per cent. of the total, were children—i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 37,189 departures the children numbered 3,269, or 8.79 per cent.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The sections for selection lie between the Piako and Waitoa Rivers, and consist of partly drained swamp lands and high, dry, flat ridges. The access is from Waitoa Railway-station by No. 1 Road, distant six miles and three-quarters by formed cart-road, the last mile of which is about to be re-formed.
