HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. W HEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), James Drake and John James Abernethy (herein-after called "the licensees") have applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto at Waikouaiti, in Waikouaiti County, in order to erect and maintain a wharf thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, have deposited a plan in the office of the WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered

Marine Department, at Wellington, marked M.D. 3814, showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the wharf: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of naviga-tion, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensees under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as a forestid. approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, on which the wharf is to be erected, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said wharf thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Sche subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Sche-dule hereto.

In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister. 2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the construction of the wharf, as shown on plan marked M.D. 3814. 3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensees shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1 payable in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

supplied with a copy of this Order in Council. 4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon pay-ment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the

5. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment. 6. The licensees shall maintain the above -mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at their own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels : Pro-vided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister. 7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring them, within a reason-able time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made. 8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees

be removed or such repairs to be made. 8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or incon-sistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regu-lation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may

any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.
12. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part.
13. In case the licensees or either of them shall—

Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions here-inbefore set forth, or any of them;
Fail to erect and complete the wharf within eighteen months from the date of this Order in Council;
Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankrupt; or
Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council, without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; the publi-cation in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees and the oll prevents are accounted to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privi-leges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.





BRITISH COLUMBIA.

VANCOUVER ISLAND. — SOUTH-WEST COAST. — LIFE-SAVING SERVICE IMPROVED.—The following information concerning improvements in the facilities for rendering assistance to mariners in distress on the south-west coast of Vancouver Island, British Columbia, has been received from the American Consul-General at Victoria :—. The Canadian Government is now taking active steps to assist vessels in distress on the south-west coast of Vancouver Island.

Vancouver Island.

Vancouver Island. Orders have been issued that the Dominion steamer "Newington" be at once equipped with wireless telegraph and cruise during the winter between Victoria and Estevan, and act as a parent vessel to lifeboats. If any vessel is reported in distress, the "Newington," which is a 12-knot vessel, able to go through heavy seas, and which will always be in communication with shore stations, will at once go to the scene. taking up the nearest lifeboat crew, to render assistance. Work has also been commenced on the building of shelter-stations (some of five rooms each), at intervals of

4 miles, along the south-west coast between Carmanah and Bamfield Creek. The shelter-stations at Taushiat and Seven-mile Creek have been completed and placed in commission, and the Lysle guns and other life-saving apparatus stored at Bamfield have been placed in these stations. A patrol has been started with a base at these two stations, and daily patrols are made by the coast-guards. This service is to be extended, so that the coast-guards and various look-outs in communication by telephone from the many shelters with the telegraph and wireless stations it is expected that if any vessel meets with accident the mishap will be quickly reported and assistance rendered promptly. To further improve the facilities for communication it is intended to lay a cable between Tofino and Lennard Island Lighthouse, off the entrance of Clayoquot Sound, to connect with the telegraph service. Between Cape Cook and the north-west extremity of Vancouver Island, where the settlements are scattered, shelters will be established at various points where any shipwrecked mariner would probably find his way. At these shelters stores of food will be placed and placards in a number of languages posted giving directions as to the nearest settlement, the best way of reaching it, and other information.

STRAIT OF GEORGIA -BALLENAS ISLANDS.-LIGHT MOVED. The light is exhibited 280 ft. above high water from an enclosed wooden building, square in plan, with sloping sides, painted white, surmounted by a square wooden lantern. painted red, located on the summit of the island, 1,240 ft. 162° from the fog-alarm building on the north point of the same island and 5,126 ft. 334° from the old site of the light on the southern island old site of the light on the southern island. The height of the tower from its base to the top of the



FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of six, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted :--

- 1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
- 2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
- 8. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
