And, lastly, I do proclaim and declare that the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said borough shall be held on Saturday, the fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and that the first meeting of the Council of the said borough shall be held on Saturday, the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, at seven o'clock in the afternoon, at the Miners' Hall, Runanga.

And whereas a resolution was passed by a meeting of assembled owners and duly confirmed by the Aotea District Maori Land Board that the land set out in the Schedule hereto be sold to the Crown:

And whereas the Native Land Purchase Board duly considered and adopted the resolution:

Amended Regulation under the Government Railways Act, 1908.

HEREAS in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Government Railways Act, 1908, and all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, did, on the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and ten, for the purpose of the aforesaid Act, make certain regulations thereunder (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"), that were gazetted on the nineteenth day of May then instant: And whereas it is expedient to amend those regulations:

pedient to amend those regulations:

Now, therefore, in further exercise of the aforesaid powers, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke Regulation 54 of the principal regulations, and doth hereby make the following regulation in lieu thereof; and doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the day of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

REGULATION.

- 54. (a.) No member who is married, or is a widower with a child or children dependent upon him, shall receive a salary of less than £140 17s. per annum.
- (b.) No member who is twenty-two years of age or upwards shall receive a salary of less than £100 per annum.
- (c) For the purpose of giving effect to the last two preceding subclauses, such member shall receive, by way of special allowance, such additional sum as will raise the salary to which he is entitled under the Schedule to the Government Railways Act, 1908, and amendments thereof, to the rate of £140 17s. per annum in case (a), and £100 per annum in case (b).
- (d.) Such additional sum shall, in the case of each such member, be paid in the same manner and subject to the same conditions as his salary under the aforesaid Schedule and its amendments.
- (e.) The right to such additional sum shall be deemed to commence on the date on which the member furnishes to the General Manager satisfactory evidence that he possesses the qualification entitling him thereto; and the first payment shall be made with the first payment of Schedule salary after that date.

Military Training, Dominion of New Zealand.—Notice as to Military Training.

OTICE is hereby given that every male inhabitant liable to military training, who has not already registered, must do so on or before the 31st day of May, 1912, as follows:—

(a.) All male persons who will have, on the 31st May, 1912, attained the age of fourteen years or upwards, but will not have attained the age of twenty-two years, who have not already registered; this does not mean that any one who was over the age of twenty-one last year when the scheme came into operation is affected, the age of twenty-two only refers to those of them who neglected to register last year.

(b.) All boys attending any high school, college, secondary school, or other scholastic institution or organization who will attain or have attained fourteen years of age on 31st May, 1912, must register. Registration may be made by the school authorities on behalf of the boys.

(c.) All boys attending any primary school who will attain or have attained fourteen years of age on 31st May, 1912, must register. Registration of boys attending primary schools may be made by the school authorities on behalf of the boys.

(d.) All male persons temporarily absent from the Dominion, not previously registered, and liable to register in terms of the original notice of 10th April, 1911, must do so within two months of their return.

(e.) All male immigrants between the ages of fourteen and twenty-two must register within six months after arrival in the Dominion.

(f.) All male persons who, owing to change of residence, have ceased to reside in an exempted area, must register within thirty days of such change of residence to an area not so exempted.

All persons liable must fill in a prescribed form of registration in respect of military training under the Defence Acts, and post or deliver same to the Area Sergeant-major of the territorial area in which the applicant for registration resides.

Forms of registration may be obtained at any military office, post or police office.

Any person to whom this notice applies, who fails to take any step necessary to secure his registration as aforesaid, is liable to a fine of £5, and shall not be eligible for employment in any branch of the Government service, or on reaching the age of twenty-one to be enrolled as an elector under Division 1I of the Legislature Act, 1908.

Additional Regulations prescribed for the Manufacture of Methylated Spirits.

Department of Trade and Customs,
Wellington, 1st April, 1912.

In Pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by subsection (10) of section 35 of the Customs Law Act, 1908, I, George Laurenson, Minister of Customs, do hereby make the following regulations for the manufacture, use, and sale of methylated spirits, such regulations to be read with and to form part of the regulations published under Minister's Order No. 916 dated the 16th day of November, 1909, and published in the New Zealand Gazette dated the 18th day of November, 1909.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

1. Spirit methylated by the addition of 1 per cent. of absolute phenol may be manufactured and sold for exclusive use in any public or private hospital, provided that a guarantee satisfactory to the Collector of Customs is given by the licensee of a private hospital, or the medical officer of a public hospital, that spirit delivered on such guarantee will be used exclusively for hospital purposes other than the compounding of medicines.

2. Every receptacle containing spirit methylated with phenol shall be distinctly marked with the words "Methylated spirit for exclusive use in hospitals."

3. Every person holding for sale duty-paid methylated spirit made in accordance with these regulations shall, if required to do so, provide a room or other place of security, approved by the Collector of Customs, for the storage of such spirit under the Crown lock. He shall also, if so required, enter into a bond, with two sufficient sureties, in the form required, and shall undertake not to sell or dispose of any such spirit except in accordance with these regulations.

4. Every manufacturer or holder for sale of methylated. these regulations.

4. Every manufacturer or holder for sale of methylated spirit made in accordance with these regulations shall keep a book in which he shall enter with respect to all such spirit the following particulars:—

(a.) The quantity manufactured.

(b.) The date of manufacture.

(c.) The hospital to which delivered.

(d.) The quantity delivered.

(e.) The date of delivery.

Special Books in Languages and Literature for Class C Certificate and Civil Service Senior Examinations, 1913 and 1914.

Education Department,
Wellington, 28th March, 1912.

In pursuance of regulations under the Education Act, 1908, and under the Civil Service Act, 1908, notice is hereby given that at the examination for Class C and at the Civil Service Senior Examination of January, 1913, and of January, 1914, the special books of which a knowledge will be required will be as follows:—

ENGLISH.—1913: Shakspere, "Romeo and Juliet," "Hamlet"; Macaulay, "Essay on Milton"; Milton, "Samson Agonistes," "L'Allegro," "Il Penseroso," "Lycidas." In the study of the literature special attention must be paid to the authors indicated for the year, but the other authors in the period are not to be neglected. The literary movements and their leaders, the current types and forms of literature and their representatives, as well as the influence of the ancient classics and of the leading Continental literatures on the English literature of the period, must also be examined. [Note.—In lieu of the period of literature prescribed for 1913, a knowledge of the following special books may be substituted if desired: Scott, "Waverley"; Ruskin, "Sesame and Lilies," and "The Two Paths."] 1914. Shakspere, "Henry IV" (Parts I and II), "Henry V"; Pope, "Essay on Criticism"; Swift, "Battle of the Books"; Steele and Addison, "The Spectator," The Club Papers as follows—1, 2, 12, 34, 105, 106, 108, 110, 112, 115, 117, 122, 123, 125, 126, 130, 131, 269, 295, 329, 335, 383, 517, 530, 549, 550; "The Vision of Mirza," 159. In addition, a knowledge of the period of literature, 1688-1744, will be required. In the study of the literature special attention must be paid to Defoe, Steele, Addison, Swift, Pope, and Thomson; but the other authors of the period are not to be neglected. The literary movements and their leaders, the current types and forms of literature and their representatives, as well as the influence of the ancient classics and of the leading Continental literature on the English literature of the period, must also be examined.

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SCHOOL FOR DEAF-MUTES, SUMNER, NEAR CHRISTCHURCH.

FIOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of 7 and 16 is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of six, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted :-

- Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
- 2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
- Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
