

Words in the singular number shall include the plural, and vice versa, and any reference to a person shall extend and apply to a corporation. The ground upon which any dwellinghouse is erected, together with the whole curtilage thereof enclosed within the boundary fences, walls, or lines of the premises, shall be deemed to be the site of such house within the meaning of these by-laws.

With a less frontage than 66 ft. to some public road; (b.) Of a less area than a quarter of an acre. (a.) With a less frontage than 40 ft. to some public road;
(b.) Of a less area than one-sixth of an acre.

(b.) Have its area reduced to less than a quarter of an acre.
