Prime Minister's Office Frime Minister's Office, Wellington, 21st May, 1912. THE following correspondence is published for general information, at the request of His Majesty's Prin-cipal Secretary of State for the Colonies. THOMAS MACKENZIE,

18th April, 1912. MEMORANDUM.—I have received the following telegram from the Right Hon. the Secretary of State for the Colonies :--

Colonies :--"In the event of increases to the Naval Programmes of European Powers being announced as now seems immi-nent, and likely interests of British Naval supremacy would make it desirable that battle cruiser 'New Zea-land' should instead of serving in China be appointed to Home Fleet for service in North Sea where alone she could be matched against vessels of her size and quality. If your Government approve of this arrangement Ad-miralty will send at once armoured cruiser 'Defence,' sister to the 'Minotaur,' to the China Station, thus effectively securing British preponderance in those seas, and will arrange that the 'New Zealand' should visit Dominion in

October to make a three months' stay including Christ-mas, 1912, in New Zealand ports before taking up her duties with the Home Fleet.--HARCOURT."
