A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto was by Warrant dated the twenty-third day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seven, permanently reserved for the preservation of scenery under the provisions of the Land Act, 1892: And whereas it is expedient that the said land should be declared a reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908:

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section twelve of the Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1910, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall, from and after the date hereof, be a scenic reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and its amendments.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the sixteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the eighteenth day of the same month, certain land in the Wellington Land District was set apart as a reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1903, and its amendments:

And whereas part of the land so set apart is no longer suitable for scenic purposes by reason of the destruction of the forest thereon:

And whereas the reservation over an area of three roods (being part of the said reserve) was revoked by Proclamation dated the thirtieth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, published on page 3009 of the *Gazette* of the twelfth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eleven:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the reservation over a larger area of the said reserve (including the aforesaid area of three roods):

Now, therefore, I, John Poynder Dickson-Poynder, Baron Islington, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on me by section eight of the Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1910, do hereby revoke the said reservation over the land described in the Schedule hereto.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule below (being land reserved under the said Act), for the period of three years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), in the undermentioned persons, namely,—

JOHN FADDIS,
FREDERICK GILBERT,
WILLIAM MARTIN,
HERBERT OLLERENSHAW, and
WILLIAM WILSON,

all of Papatowai, and JOHN PETERSON, of Kahuika (herein referred to as "the Board"), in trust for the preservation of scenery, and subject to the conditions and regulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

MEETINGS.

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business at Papatowai, on the first Monday of each month, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held during the month of June, one thousand nine hundred and twelve.
2. The members of the Board shall from time to time elect one of their number to be Chairman of the Board.
3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.
4. Any four members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.
5. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.
6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.
7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.
8. The Board shall not lease any portion of the reserve, or permit any grazing thereon, without the permission of

the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation having been previously obtained.

OFFENCES.

9. Every person is liable to a penalty of one hundred pounds who, without the written consent of the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation first obtained,—

- (a.) Lights a fire within the limits of the reserve; or
 - (b.) Discharges any firearm thereon, or kills or takes any birds or any native or imported game thereon; or
 - (c.) Cuts or removes any timber or bush thereon; or
 - (d.) In any way interferes with or damages the scenic or historic features thereof.
10. No person shall, within the limits of the reserve, without the written consent of the Board first obtained,—
- (a.) Take, carry, or use any fireworks, or any explosive, or any axe, tomahawk, weapon, or instrument of a dangerous nature;
 - (b.) Take or destroy the nests or eggs of any birds;
 - (c.) Injure any animal, or remove any animal therefrom;
 - (d.) Damage any fence, gate, or barrier, or other property belonging to or in the custody of the Board;
 - (e.) Destroy, deface, or injure any inscription, or any label attached to or connected with any article, or tree, or shrub, or other plant, or copy of these conditions hung up or affixed at any entrance to or in any part of the reserve;
 - (f.) Interfere with or damage any water-pipes or water-supply connected with the reserve.

11. No donkeys, sheep, or goats shall be allowed within the limits of the reserve without the written consent of the Board thereto being first obtained by the owners of such animals.

12. Any Inspector or person authorized for that purpose by the Board may drive any animal or animals trespassing in the reserve to the nearest public pound and there impound the same, and any such animal or animals shall not be released therefrom except upon payment of the usual driving fees and poundage charges. Nothing in this regulation contained shall be deemed to limit or prevent the taking of any proceedings for the recovery of any penalty or otherwise in respect of the trespass of such animal.

13. Wild cattle or horses trespassing within the limits of the reserve shall only be destroyed by persons authorized by the Board to do so, and such persons may be authorized to use firearms for that purpose.

14. No person shall, within the limits of the reserve, use any obscene or profane language, or commit any breach of the peace, act of indecency, or other impropriety, or insult or annoy any person.

15. No persons of bad repute, disorderly persons, or vagrants shall be allowed within the limits of the reserve.

16. Every person who commits any breach of regulations Nos. 10 to 15 is liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

ALL that area in the Otago Land District, containing by admeasurement 156 acres 3 roods, more or less, being Sections Nos. 132 to 152 and 154 to 156, inclusive, together with the closed streets, Town of Papatowai. Bounded towards the north generally by Lily Street and by the Esplanade, 2438 and 646 links respectively; towards the east generally by the said Esplanade, 3558 and 1400 links; towards the south-west by Section No. 153 and Laura Street, 608 links; towards the south-east by the said Laura Street, 922 links; towards the north-east by the said Laura Street and by Juliet Street, 510 links; again towards the south-east by the Esplanade, 2435 links; again towards the south-west by the south-western boundaries of Sections Nos. 155 and 156, and by a line across Laura Street to the southern corner of Section No. 143, 2128 links; and towards the west generally by Caroline Street, 5484 links: exclusive of that part of Laura Street which intersects the above-described area: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less: as the same is described in a Proclamation dated the 15th December, 1906, published on page 3220 of *Gazette* No. 109, of the 20th December, 1906.

(true) or S. 22½° E. (magnetic) from the eastern extreme of Crayfish Island. A depth of 2½ fathoms at L.W.S. was found at this position.

The bottom is very uneven, and as the locality has not been closely examined there may be less than that depth.

The existence of the foul ground aforementioned narrows the eastern extreme of Pickersgill Harbour to half a cable, and not "nearly one cable" as stated in the last edition of the "New Zealand Pilot," 1908.

University Bursaries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following are the terms and conditions on which university bursaries, tenable at a university college or other institution recognized by the University of New Zealand, and entitling the holders to free university education, are, subject to the necessary annual appropriation by Parliament, to be awarded.

The notice regarding university bursaries, published under date 26th February, 1907, in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 7th March, 1907, is hereby cancelled.

UNIVERSITY BURSARIES.

Terms and Conditions.

1. A bursary may be awarded on the recommendation of the University of New Zealand to any person of either sex who, being a matriculated student of the University of New Zealand, and being resident in New Zealand for one year immediately preceding the date of application for a bursary,—

- (a.) Satisfies the conditions for a University Junior Scholarship, or for a Senior National Scholarship, and obtains "credit" at the examination for such scholarships; or
- (b.) Has within one year and six months immediately preceding gained a higher leaving certificate; or
- (c.) Has within one year and six months immediately preceding completed his term of service as a pupil-teacher or probationer in some education district in accordance with regulations and to the satisfaction of the Education Board of that district, and declares his intention of entering a recognized training college on the completion of the tenure of his bursary; or
- (d.) Has completed his course of training at a recognized training college; or
- (e.) Has gained a teacher's certificate of a class not lower than Class C.

2. Applications, made in due form and accompanied by the necessary certificates, must be lodged by candidates with the Registrar of the university college attended on or before the 1st day of May in any year.

3. The term of a bursary shall be three years if the holder so long fulfils the prescribed conditions: Provided that on a report from the Professorial Board the Minister may extend any bursary for one year longer.

4. A bursary shall not be tenable with a University Junior Scholarship, a Senior National Scholarship, or any other scholarship, exhibition, or bursary the value of which exceeds £20 a year.

5. A bursary may be held at any university college or at a school of agriculture recognized by the University. In all other respects the holder of a bursary must comply with the conditions prescribed in the case of holders of Senior National Scholarships, and generally what is permitted to the holder of a Senior National Scholarship may, *mutatis mutandis*, be permitted to the holder of a bursary; provided that the holder of a bursary under paragraph (c), (d), or (e) of clause 1 hereof must follow a course in arts, science, or agriculture.

6. There shall be paid to, or on behalf of, each holder of a bursary the amount of the fees payable by him to the university college in respect to such classes as the Professorial Board shall approve for him, and, in addition, the university fees for the degree examinations for which he sits: Provided that if the college and university fees payable by any holder in any year be more than £20 in all, the sum of £20 only shall be paid to or for such holder in respect of such fees.

7. On the receipt of an unfavourable report on the holder of a bursary from the Professorial Board, or from the Council of the university college attended, the tenure of the bursary shall be forthwith determined.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland and Dunedin, but raises it at Wellington and Christchurch.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 657, against 640 in March—an increase of 17. The deaths in April were 220—an increase of 20 as compared with last month. Of the total deaths, males contributed 123, females 92. Thirty-nine of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 17.73 per cent. of the whole number; 33 of these were under one year of age.

There were 71 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, against 57 in March. The following table shows the classification:—

SCHOOL FOR DEAF-MUTES, SUMNER, NEAR CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to use and understand ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act, the education of deaf children between the ages of seven and sixteen is made compulsory. A child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at about the age of six, but advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted:—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in an ordinary school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.
