A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section seventy-seven of the New Zealand State-guaranteed Advances Act, 1909, as amended by section twenty-two of the New Zealand State-guaranteed Advances Amendment Act, 1910, it is, amongst other things, enacted that in no case shall any moneys be expended under the provisions of the said section seventy-seven in connection with any block of land unless that block is set apart for selection under that section pursuant to Proclamation in that behalf:

And whereas it is further provided by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, that in the case of any land so purchased, taken, or acquired for a Government work and not required for that purpose, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without complying with any other requirements of the aforesaid section thirty, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

License authorizing the Christchurch Tramway Board to erect an Electric Line from the Trolley-wire on Riccarton Road to a Motor on Ilam Estate, between Ilam and Waimairi Roads.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, put up, place, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor in Council under that Act:

And whereas the Christchurch Tramway Board (hereinafter referred to as "the said Board") desires to erect an electric line from its overhead electric tramway wire on Riccarton Road, in the Waimairi County, to connect with a motor on Ilam Estate between Ilam and Waimairi Roads, in the said county: And whereas the Waimairi County Council has consented to the erection of the said electric line, and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the said Board to erect and maintain an electric line for the purpose of supplying electricity to the aforesaid motor, such electric line being indicated in red ink on the plan marked P.W.D. 31453, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District.

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS.

1. The conductors shall be at a minimum height of 20 ft. above the surface of the ground.
2. The conductors shall be composed of stranded copper or aluminum. The size of the strand shall not be less than No. 20 standard wire gauge, and the number of strands shall not be less than seven.
3. The positive conductor shall be insulated throughout its length with rubber covering of 600-megohm grade.
4. The negative conductor may be uninsulated.
5. A fuses cut-out shall be placed on the positive conductor where it leaves the tramway trolley-wire. A switch and a circuit-breaker fitted with an over-load and no-load release shall be inserted in the positive conductor and placed near the motor. The fuse cut-out and the over-load device of the circuit-breaker shall be of such a rating as shall cause their efficient operation in the event of abnormal conditions arising.
6. The negative conductor shall be continuous throughout its length from the motor terminal to the tramway-rail, to which it shall be effectively bonded.
7. Every support for an aerial line shall be of durable material, and properly strengthened against forces due to wind-pressure, change of direction of the line, and unequal length of span. The factor of safety of such supports shall be at least 4, taking into consideration all possible stresses, including wind-pressure of 30 lb. per square foot on plane surfaces and 18 lb. per square foot on diametrical plane for cylindrical surfaces. The stress in

the aerial conductors shall not exceed 28,000 lb. per square inch for copper and 15,000 lb. per square inch for aluminium in the extreme case of a temperature of 12° F., and a wind-pressure of 18 lb. per square foot of diametrical plane occurring simultaneously.

8. Where the conductors cross telegraph or telephone wires, or if any telegraph or telephone wire is hereinafter installed so as to cross the conductors, substantial guard-wires shall be erected by or at the cost of the said Board. Such guard-wires shall consist of two-stranded galvanized-steel wires, carried on substantial supports at a height of 2 ft. above the conductors if the telegraph or telephone wires pass over the conductors, or 2 ft. above the telegraph or telephone wires if they pass under the conductors.

9. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of July, 1912, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of March, 1913.

10. The said Board shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") at least one month's notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

11. The said Board shall not use the said electric line, or permit the same to be used, for any purpose until the Minister has given notice in writing to the Board that he has received from the Engineer appointed by him to inspect the works a certificate that they have been satisfactorily carried out.

12. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the said Board without the express consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

13. If the said Board fails to comply with any of the above conditions of this license, the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the Board within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice; and if the said Board fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period it shall be liable to a penalty of £10, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.

14. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the said Board fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

15. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the said Board, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the same.

16. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public work, nor shall any compensation be payable to or on behalf of the said Board for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public work as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Customs Duties Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the following regulations—namely, (a) that made under the Preferential and Reciprocal Trade Act, 1903, on the twentieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and four, and gazetted on the twenty-third day of June then instant; and (b) that made under the Tariff Act, 1907, on the twenty-second day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and gazetted on the thirtieth day of

January then instant: and doth hereby make the following regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of section six of the said Act.

REGULATIONS.

1. THE classes of goods which shall be deemed to be the produce or manufacture of the British Dominions for the purposes of the said Act shall be the following:—

- (a.) Goods wholly the produce of the British Dominions.
- (b.) Goods wholly manufactured within the British Dominions from materials produced in such Dominions.
- (c.) Goods wholly manufactured within the British Dominions in which all manufacturing processes are performed in the British Dominions from unmanufactured raw material of foreign origin.
- (d.) Goods partially produced or partially manufactured in the British Dominions, provided that the final process or processes of manufacture have been performed in such Dominions, and also that the expenditure in material produced in such Dominions and [or] labour performed within such Dominions (calculated subject to the qualification hereunder) in each and every article is not less than one-fourth of the factory or works cost of such article in its finished state.

2. In the calculation of such proportion of produce or labour of the British Dominions none of the following items shall be included or considered: Manufacturer's profit, or the profit or remuneration of any trader, agent, broker, or other person dealing in the article in its manufactured finished condition; costs incurred in the mere packing of foreign-made goods in [e.g., cartons or other containers]; cost of outside packages or any cost of packing the goods thereinto; any cost of conveying, insuring, or shipping the goods subsequent to their manufacture.

3. Goods landed in transit. Goods which after shipment from any part of the British Dominions have entered into the commerce of or been subjected to any process of manufacture in any foreign country shall not be deemed to be the produce or manufacture of the British Dominions.

4. In every case where, pursuant to section 6 of the said Act, the full duty under the said Act is payable on any goods owing to the non-production to the Collector of an invoice with the prescribed certificate written or printed thereon, and at the time of importation the importer alleges, and the Collector has reason to believe, that such goods are *bona fide* the produce or manufacture of some part of the British Dominions, and that such non-production is due to accident, the following provisions shall apply:—

- (a.) Any amount of duty so payable in excess of the duty payable upon the like goods being the produce or manufacture of some part of the British Dominions may be held by the Collector at the port of importation on deposit pending the production of an invoice with the prescribed certificate written or printed thereon.
- (b.) Such deposit shall be returned to the importer if the invoice, with certificate as aforesaid, is produced within six months from the date of payment of the deposit, but otherwise the same shall be applied as duty payable under the said Act, unless other action is specially directed by the Minister of Customs.

Alterations to the Scale of Fares, Rates, and Charges in Force upon the New Zealand Government Railways.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1908, I, Arthur Mielziner Myers, Minister of Railways, do hereby make the following alterations in the scale of fares, rates, and charges in force on the New Zealand Government railways open for traffic, such alterations to come into force on and after the 1st day of July, 1912.

PART I.—PASSENGERS.

Cancel—

VOLUNTEER TICKETS.

13. Upon written order from the officer commanding the district, tickets will be issued to Volunteers in uniform without charge.

Volunteers in uniform travelling to drills, encampments, and rifle contests, when not provided with orders for tickets, will be charged half the return fare for either the single or double journey.

OFFICIAL SEASON TICKETS.

38. Official Season Tickets, for use by Government officers travelling on public service only, will be issued at half the rate for ordinary season tickets. Application for these tickets must be made to the General Manager.

SPECIAL TRAINS FOR GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.

48. Except where otherwise specified, a charge of 5s. per mile will be made for all special trains of one large or two small carriages required by any Government Department to convey passengers; 2s. 6d. per mile for each extra vehicle. A charge of 5s. per mile will be made for each special train required by the Postal Department for conveyance of mails, irrespective of the number of vehicles.

A charge of 5s. per mile will be made for each special train required by the Defence Department for conveyance of passengers, provided that the charge made shall in no case be less than the value of the fares for the total number of passengers carried, computed at the rates of 2d. per mile first class and 1d. per mile second class for the actual distance the passengers travel. In computing fares for return tickets the mileage is to be counted one way only. Special trains for which two engines are required will be charged double rate.

The minimum charge for a special train required by any Government Department will be £3. When engine is ordered and not used, half the minimum charge will be made for the first three hours, after which 10s. will be charged for each additional hour that engine is kept in steam waiting orders.

Special trains will be permitted to wait five hours at the station of destination, after which period half special-train rates will be charged for the return journey until seven hours' detention from time of arrival; after which full special-train rates will be charged for the return journey.

The distance which a train has to run empty to commence a service will be charged at the rate of 2s. 6d. per mile.

Special trains will be run only at the option of the Railway Department. The Department reserves to itself the right to forward any of its ordinary traffic by the special train, when such train is not loaded to its full capacity, but no reduction of the special-train rates shall be made on account of the train being so utilized by the Railway Department.
